D.J. Archer Wins First PBA Title in Emotional Chameleon Championship

Runner-up Ronnie Russell bowls first perfect game at South Point Bowling Plaza in opening match

LAS VEGAS — Two months after losing his mother to cardiac failure, D.J. Archer of Friendswood, Texas, bowled the biggest game of his life, winning his first Professional Bowlers Association Tour title in the PBA Chameleon Championship and stealing the spotlight from Ronnie Russell of Marion, Indiana, who bowled the first nationally-televised 300 game in the new, \$35 million South Point Bowling Plaza a game earlier.

The Chameleon finals, the third of five PBA Tour title events conducted during GEICO PBA World Series of Bowling VI, aired Sunday on ESPN.

After starting the championship match with two strikes, Archer left the 1-2-4-7-10 in the third frame and failed to convert. But he quickly righted his ship and closed the match with a string of seven strikes to lock Russell out, winning, 241-215.

"Coming into the finals, with everything that's gone on in my life the past month-and-a-half, I just felt like (my mother) was there," Archer said about the loss of his mother Sharon at age 59 in mid-September. "The only thing that could have happened in the 10th frame was for me to throw two really good shots and that's what I did. I felt like nothing was going to stand up. She knocked the pins over for me, and I'm very grateful."

Archer had finished second once before (in the 2013 Carmen Salvino Classic) during his 12-year PBA Tour career, so he got to experience the thrill of victory for the first time. "I've been chasing this feeling for years, and now that I know what it feels like, I'm going to work harder and get stronger, and hopefully I'll get this feeling more often," he said. "I'm excited, very excited. Those guys have been beating my head in for a long



time and I figured out a way I learned how to bowl."

In the opening three-player shootout match, Russell and Sean Rash of Montgomery, Illinois, each started with six strikes to open a big lead over J.R. Raymond of Bay City, Michigan, who was making his PBA television debut. Raymond opened in the second frame and never had a chance

to catch up.

Rash was the first to end his strike string, leaving a 10 pin in the seventh frame and the 1-2-4-10 "washout" in the eighth, while Russell kept on striking on his way to the PBA's 24th nationally-televised 300 game. Rash finished with a 265 and Raymond a 186. "That was a lot of fun," Russell said, "but you're still trying to get the win. I had three really good breaks where I tripped 4 or 10 pins, and I think that hurt me in the title game because my laydown point went away a little bit. I kept chasing the transition (in the changing lane condition) with my eyes and feet, but I knew I should have changed balls. I just did it two frames too late."

final to air on ESPN will be the Scorpion Championship on Sunday, Jan. 4, at 1 p.m. ET. The Perfect Game

HELLO TO BOWLING: Part IV

Bowling balls are not thrown; they're delivered. What's the difference? Throwing is an undisciplined action that creates random, unreliable results (low scores). Delivery is a series of precise, well-defined steps creating repetitious, reliable performances (high scores). Skills are the recipe to the latter and it's time to learn them. They produce the accuracy you want and need.

Lesson #3: Luck occurs when preparation meets opportunity.

Bowling and practice are two different things. Bowling involves keeping score; it measures how successfully you've practiced. "Practiced what?" The skills you are about to learn. Practice them, master them, trust them. They will make you a winner (your bowling scores will prove that). Without them I can only wish you a lot of luck because, well, you'll need it.

The first skill is the "stance".....but you're not ready to learn it yet. Before you start learning technique, there are some preliminaries to address. First you need to find a ball that fits you. The racks have plenty to choose from. You're a beginner, so you should start with a conventional grip.

You've chosen the right ball if you can (A) insert your two middle fingers to the second knuckle, (B) the span (finger-holes to thumbhole) matches yours, and (C) you can insert your thumb completely into the thumbhole. Make sure that the thumbhole isn't too loose (ball will fall off your hand) or too tight (ball won't come off your hand and could cause other problems). Swing the ball a few times to ensure you can handle it. The heavier the ball is, the better it will serve you.

Next, you'll need a pair of bowling shoes (street shoes are forbidden). You want them to fit like the thumbhole; not too loose or too tight. By the way, clothing should be comfortable and loose. You need freedom of movement to bowl effectively. Let's get started.

As stated, the first skill is **THE STANCE**. It's the most important because it aims your shot and sets up your delivery. There are a bazillion ways to stand with a bowling ball, but the best way is this:

- Place your feet exactly at the starting point previously determined. Stand erect.
- Keep your feet close together with the left foot back a bit. Put your weight on the right foot.
- Take a deep breath and put your hand in the ball (fingers in first, then the thumb).
- Face the second target-arrow from the gutter. Don't take your eyes off that arrow!
- Dip your delivery-shoulder straight down as far as it will go. Don't force it down.
- Rotate your wrist so that your hand is directly under the ball.
- Anchor your elbow tightly to your side.
- Point your forearm straight at the second arrow.

Doing this properly creates a posture which lines up the center of the ball, your shoulder and dominant eye (this alignment must be maintained throughout your delivery). You should be able to swing the ball freely without it touching you. If it does, lean toward the ball a bit to create more space between the hips and your arm-swing. The ball should be held waist-high or lower and be supported by both hands. You and the ball are now aimed at that second arrow.

Of course this feels awkward. Daily practice for a minute or two in front of a full-length mirror (at home) quickly overcomes this. You will have mastered this skill when you can say to yourself, "STANCE!" and snap into it with your eyes closed. Also, when nobody is looking, practice walking with this posture. That will serve you well.

The second skill is **THE PUSH-AWAY** which is incredibly important because it tells the ball where to go. It also influences the speed and timing of your shot. It consists of (literally) pushing the ball toward the second arrow.

It begins with the elbow separating from your side and ends when the elbow is completely straightened. Done properly, you move the ball deliberately (not aggressively) in a straight line toward your target. It must not go upward, sideways or straight down. It's the easiest skill to master (a minute or two in front of a mirror), but also the easiest to forget. Practice giving this command to yourself, "PUSH-AWAY!" then perform the skill itself. Pushing the ball away until your arm is

completely straightened must become a habit.

The third skill is **THE ARM-SWING**. It develops the speed and direction of your shot. Done properly the arm swings freely in the direction of the second arrow. It's the hardest skill to master because the ball is heavy and you instinctively want to throw it as hard as you can.

It's actually very easy to tame this monster once you believe what I've already explained; that power isn't necessary, accuracy is. Trying to develop excessive speed destroys your accuracy. Remember, the pins fall very easily, but you have to hit them!

Here's a tip that will improve your arm-swing ability. Stand in front of a full-length mirror with a weight in your hand. A bowling ball would be ideal, but it can be a soup or pop can, a dumbbell or any weighted object you can handle. Pick a target on the floor in the reflection and face it. Get into your "stance" posture and begin swinging the weight straight toward it (No, don't let go of it!). Now close your eyes and keep swinging. Keep swinging as you open your eyes. Is the weight still swinging directly at the target? Keep practicing until it does.

While your eyes are closed focus on what the swinging motion feels like. That's what you need to learn. When bowling, you can't see your arm-swing. This sense of feel is what you will rely on.

You also need to increase your hand strength. Nothing destroys an effective arm-swing faster than losing your grip on the ball. Here are some suggestions for strengthening your grip:

1. Get a rubber ball and squeeze it for a few minutes several times a day.
2. At the bowling center, find a ball on the racks heavier than the one you choose to use regularly. Pick it up and swing it a few times before bowling. This will make your ball feel lighter.
3. Hang from a tree or do pull-ups in a gym.
4. Do the "Indian Death Grip" with your friends. Instead of shaking hands with them, just clasp your hands together and squeeze until one of you cries "Uncle!" (I told you practice should be fun!)

The fourth skill is **THE RELEASE**. It sends the ball on its way. To release the ball properly, the wrist must be positioned correctly. The thumb should be on top of the ball and the fingers should be behind it. Then it's just a matter of releasing the pressure the thumb exerts on the ball. The thumb will come out first, followed by the ball rolling off your fingers heading merrily toward the second arrow. That sounds easy enough, doesn't it? It is..... if you have confidence. Remember confidence comes from competence and that results from practice.

- Practice your stance because it will aim your shot at the target.
- Practice your push-away because it will move your ball toward the target.
- Practice your arm-swing because it will add ball speed.
- Practice keeping your wrist in position so all you have to do is let the ball go.
- Be creative looking for different ways to practice these skills. Have fun with it!

Those are the four very basic bowling skills needed for you to become a competent bowler. As stated earlier, you need to practice, master and trust them. If you do, you won't need to rely on luck! One lesson to go! See you next week.

Barcelona Wins First ABTA Title Xmas Event at West Covina

WEST COVINA — We held our final event of 2014, the Christmas Special at West Covina Lanes. Many of our loyal members and friends came out for the fun, to bowl and have chances at the many prizes given away during the event.

219 entered the Event and our top qualifiers were Brad LeCount +186 for the Men. Super Sierrre Herradura +166 led the Ladies.

LeCount drew the Match Series and one fine guy Julian Conwi took home \$675 for his 553 Series. He only had 3 events in the 12 months. Sierrre drew a 472 mystery Match Doubles score 472 and no combination had that so it will carry over with an estimate pot of \$1,400 at Bowlm.

In regular doubles it was the Samson brothers John and James taking first place with a 1483 for \$140. 21 places paid out with low of 1371. 

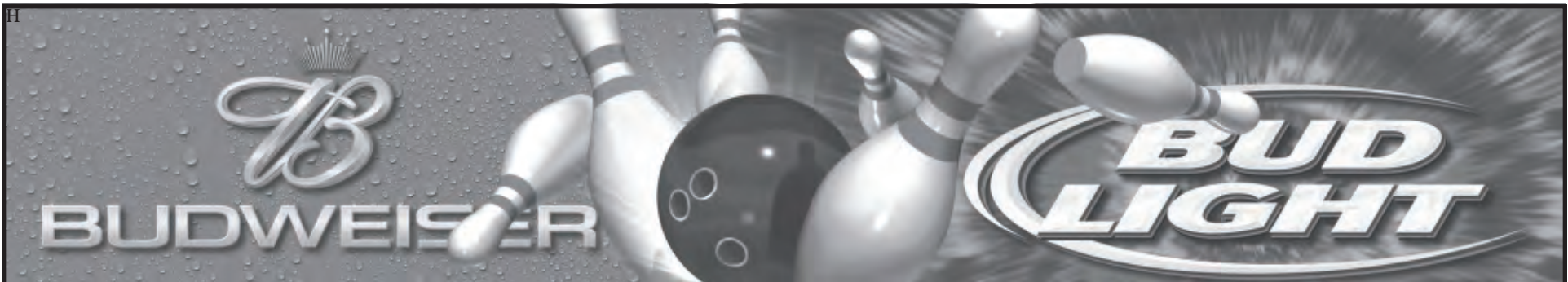
