Abigania, Gastouniotis, **Dalton Win JBT Main Event Singles Titles** \$55.000+ in Scholarships Awarded!

Californians Costa Gastouniotis and Katelyn Abigania, and Las Vegas' Tristan Dalton, captured singles titles at the JBT's Las Vegas Main Event tournament, hosted by the beautiful South Point Plaza, and sponsored by the Brands of Brunswick, IAM Bowling, South Point, and the Junior Bowlers Tour. A record \$55,888 was awarded to bowlers of all skill levels and ages from all over North America.

Gastouniotis had a breakthrough tournament to claim scratch singles. With only one previous JBT title, he qualified 3rd in a super-strong field, then mowed through Hunter Mayes and Solomon Salama with 279 and 266 to reach the title match. Lucas Finley of Colorado, was up to Costa's torrid pace in the title match, starting with the front five, but could only watch as Gastouniotis extended the string to the front ten. A 2-8 in the eleventh stopped his quest for history, but it's doubtful he cares, as the 288-258 final score (and 833 finals total) was good for the title, his second career JBT win, and enormous \$4,500 first place prize. Finley earned \$3,000 for the excellent runner-up performance.

The girls scratch field was also loaded with talent, with every finalist boasting either Team USA experience, a Main Event title, or both. In the end, San Diego's Abigania continued her breakthrough season with a grindout 181-169 win over 2020 Main Event champ Jennifer Loredo for the title and \$1,800 top prize. She's been beating the boys all season on our weekly JBT Tour, and now adds this accolade to her stellar resume!

DOMBROWSKI DEFEATS CHAMPION TO WIN 2022 PBA REGIONAL PLAYERS INVITATIONAL by Nolan Hughes

Patrick Dombrowski took the scenic route at the 2022 PBA Regional Players Invitational, but the final destination was worth the journey.

With a 267-259 victory over Colin Champion, he claimed the Walter Ray Williams Jr. Championship trophy and the \$16,000 top prize.

In the title match, Champion fired the first seven strikes. But Dombrowski, who began the match with a pair of single-pin spares, wasn't fazed.

Dombrowski struck on every shot from the third through ninth frame, waiting for an opportunity to sneak past the 30-year-old Floridian.

USBC HALL OF FAMER DAVE DAVIS DIES AT AGE 80

ARLINGTON, Texas United States Bowling Congress and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Dave Davis of Lake Placid, Florida, died Dec. 29 at the age of 80.

Davis was elected to the PBA Hall of Fame in 1978 and USBC Hall of Fame for Superior Performance in 1990 as one of the sport's most dominant players through the 1960s and 1970s.

The talented lefthander joined the PBA Tour in 1964 and captured the first of his four major championships in 1965 at the PBA World Championship. He won

You will have to go to the Guinness Book of Records for that information. If I did look, I bet the tallest man in the world is at least 9 feet tall.

Okay, what about BOWLING. Let's talk Bowling. Do you know who is the oldest man to roll three consecutive perfect games and a 900 series? How about the oldest woman to do so?

When I last checked the USBC Record Book the oldest man to bowl a sanctioned 900 series was 70 year old John Buchanan of Evansville, Indiana. He rolled his big series in 2017.

The previous record holder was Dale Gerhard of

Mill Hall, Pennsylvania who at the age of 59 rolled his 900 series in 2016.

On the female side of the ledger there has never been a 900 series bowled. The highest sanctioned series bowled by a female was 890 by New York's (state) PWBA Champion LIZ KUHLKIN on October 17, 2016.

Don't you want to know more about the sport of BOWLING and it's records? I encourage all bowlers to check out the USBC RECORD BOOK to find who is the record holder in hundreds of categories.

We know that "California Bowlers are the best bowlers in the world". Go to the Record Book to find out who are the California bowlers who hold sanctioned bowling records.

A Legend Lives On

Dave Davis, one of the first left-handers to find success on the Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) tour, has died at the age of 80, at his home in Lake Placid, Florida. His smooth delivery and personality were emulated by many lefties, but perhaps most notably by Parker Bohn III.

"Dave was an extreme influence on me," said Bohn in an article posted by Johnny Campos of the PBA. "He and his wife took me under their arm and tried to show me the difference between right and wrong on the lanes. Back then they formulated my game to what it has become today."

Indeed. Anyone that watches Parker Bohn III in action today can immediately recognize the approach that's so reminiscent of Hall of Fame bowler Davis. Their styles were almost identical according to Larry Lichstein, himself a lefty, and the PBA Director of Player Services for many years. "Dave was just so elegant and wonderful to watch that even right-handers couldn't knock him," said Larry.

Remembering Dave Davis and Saratoga Lanes

My first encounter with Dave Davis was during my high school days in Sebastopol, California. Even though it was a school night, my parents agreed to let me accompany a couple of my bowling buddies and one of their parents for the 2 hour drive south to Saratoga Lanes in San Jose, where our chaperone would be bowling in the Pro-Am event on Tuesday night.

Davis was already a fan favorite at this early point in his career, with a jovial personality that played well with the crowd. I remember our chaperone didn't bowl that well, so we all called our parents to see if we could stay a little longer while he bowled the 11:00 p.m. squad. Needless to say, we didn't get home until about 4:00 a.m., and I have no idea how I made it through the next day at school.

I must have been on my best behavior all week because my parents allowed me to go with the same group for the final block of match play competition that Friday night. I had never seen a three game set totaling 800, so you can imagine my great pleasure when for the first three games that night professional bowlers Bob Strampe, Dick Ritger and Jim Stefanich all totaled 800 or more. What a great experience.

It wasn't until a few years later that the lefty-righty controversy had reached a fever pitch and the top 16 bowlers at Saratoga Lanes were all left-handed. The next week, as the story goes, the PBA had a lane man that traveled with the tour. Lenny Nicholson and Sam Baca were the first to perform the task of lane maintenance supervisors, and their responsibility in a nutshell was to keep the 'dominance' of lefty scores in check on a percentage basis.

The date of that eventful telecast from Saratoga Lanes on the ABC Television Network was February 6, 1971. It was the Ebonite Open and featured Earl Anthony, John Petraglia, Skee Foremsky, Larry Lichstein and Dave Davis in the stepladder finals. Lichstein defeated Davis in the final match by a score of 234 to 227. It turned out to be Lichstein's only PBA title. During the telecast, famed analyst Billy Welu commented: "The greatest coverage in bowling history was experienced this week because the top 16 were all left-handed."

Davis and Soutar Overcome the Lefty-Righty Controversy

One of the strangest relationships that existed on the pro tour during those years was the bond between veteran right-hander Dave Soutar and Dave Davis. "The main reason we got together was that I signed with Brunswick in '71," said Soutar during the Campos interview. The two spent about a month in Europe that summer doing exhibitions. "That's when we started rooming together and it never changed."

"In those days, all the right-handers were against left-handers," said Soutar. "But I was never mad about it. That's probably why we could room together." Davis once beat Soutar for the title at the PBA Canadian Open, but a few years later Soutar turned the tables, beating Davis twice in a single month for titles.

Dave and wife Judy Soutar, also a longtime member of the Brunswick Advisory Staff, live near Lake Placid and were able to visit with Davis and wife Joann during his final days. "We talked and laughed with them about the good old days," said Judy. It was during those good old days that Davis first met 'bowling groupie' Joann at the pro stop on Long Island (Garden City Bowl), in 1975. "He called me the next week and I hung up because I didn't think it was him. Then it went on from there. We got married in 1977."

A Trailblazer for Future Left-handers

Dave Davis had a lot of firsts on the tour. "The new bowlers of today have no idea who he was," said Lichstein. "He was the first left-hander to win a major, then two majors, and then Player of the Year in 1967. He was the youngest player to win three majors when he won the Firestone Tournament of Champions at the age of 25." Davis was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1978, and the USBC Hall of Fame in 1990.



Bohn remembers that the best part about his relationship with Davis was that he owned a bowling center in New Jersey about 30 minutes from his home

in Jackson. "I was 16 turning 17 when I met Davis — way before my pro career. It was a dream of mine to bowl on the PBA Tour."

I remember Bohn from those early years while I was working for AMF in New York. Whenever I was at home for a weekend and there was a semiprofessional event being promoted by Mark Brenner, I would try to participate. Parker was a member of the organization and was dominant in those days. He was a cocky kid that was very confident of his ability... a similar attribute that I noticed in a youthful Marshall Holman about a decade earlier. Parker's approach was so much like that of Dave Davis. He was a clone.

Bohn has gone on to achieve more PBA titles than Davis, with 35 on the regular tour and another 10 on the senior circuit. But perhaps none of that would have been possible without the trailblazing efforts of Davis on behalf of all left-handed bowlers. What an idolized character Mr. Davis must have been in the life of Parker Bohn III.

"It truly hurts," said Bohn. "We truly lost a living legend, a gentleman. He was one of the kindest individuals that you could ever meet, on and off the lanes."

the youngest player to claim three majors (25 years and 43 days). The record stood until February 2022 when Anthony Simonsen won his third major at the U.S. Open (25 years and 31 days).

Davis' final major came at the 1975 PBA Tournament of Champions. He also recorded a runner-up finish at the U.S. Open in 1974 and had a top finish of fourth at the USBC Masters in 1970.

After turning 50, Davis continued to find success at the highest level on the PBA50 Tour. He collected five national titles on the senior circuit, including back-to-back wins at the USBC Senior Masters in 1995 and 1996. Fellow USBC and PBA Hall of Famer Tom Baker is the only other competitor to successfully defend a title at the Senior Masters (2006 and 2007).

Another prominent victory for Davis came at the 1968 USBC Open Championships. He was able to claim the Classic Singles title with scores of 275, 235 and 231 for a 741 series.

Davis was named as a member of the Bowlers Journal All-American Team on five occasions between the 1965-1966 and 1975-1976 seasons, and his success on the lanes helped him earn the No. 19 spot on the list of the 50 greatest players in PBA history, published in 2009.

It's Only A Number

A recent news release by the United States Bowling Congress (USBC) announced the national high averages for men, women, and youth bowlers for the 2021-2022 season. To say that the numbers are staggering would be an understatement to anyone that's over the age of 35. You see, that's the year (1988) when scoring forever changed in the game of bowling.

Prior to 1988, bowlers were subject to the whim of local USBC representatives when it came time for approval of honor scores. It was a no-win situation for the bowler, the proprietor, and even the USBC representative. Sure, personalities had to come into play, and I can honestly say that I sweated out some of the decisions.

Interestingly enough, my first encounter with an honor score violation did not involve lane conditions. It happened at Greenbrae Lanes in Greenbrae, Calif., and the infraction was the fault of the league secretary for not submitting the league sanctioning material within the 21-day grace period.

The local USBC association secretary informed me at the time that the infraction would probably be overturned since the lanes and pins both met with approval. The suggestion was made for both the league secretary and myself to send letters of concern to the bowling headquarters in Greendale, Wis., about the league sanctioning material that had been completed but not mailed in a timely manner.

The three game score of 811, an all time record at the time for Greenbrae Lanes, was eventually approved by the USBC, then known as the American Bowling Congress (ABC). I went on to average 252 in the Adult-Junior summer league - a total that was unheard of in 1974, even for a short season summer league. It was also the beginning of a lifelong friendship with AI Matzelle, who was then in charge of the sanctioning department at ABC. Mr. Matzelle passed away in 2017, at the age of 100.

Another humorous incident (although it wasn't at the time) took place at the high scoring Golden Gate Lanes in El Cerrito, Calif., home to future Hall of Fame keglers Mike McGrath and Pat Costello. Just prior to the start of a regional tournament, the western field rep for the ABC made an appearance with a relatively new device that measured the amount of oil on every couple of boards, and then applied those readings onto a chart.

The field representative said that the lanes did not conform to ABC specifications and would have to be cross wiped (from gutter to gutter) before competition could begin. That process took a fair amount of time. Once completed, the field rep measured the lanes again and said that they now met with approval and that competition could begin. The first game out of the box, there were two 300's and two 299's! Needby Dave Williams

During the fourth, fifth and sixth games of that regional event, I rolled games of 235, 300, and 279, for an 814 series, including 26 consecutive strikes. I knew that I had done something special when veteran Ed Bourdase came from a few lanes away to shake my hand after leaving a 10 pin in the tenth frame of the sixth game. Another intriguing coincidence is that the event took place on December 23, 1976, exactly 46 years ago from the date that I'm penning this article.

The scores by the bowlers in the USBC news release are somewhat overwhelming when compared to the standard of almost 50 years ago. Aaron Smith writes that Jesse Hawkins of Pikeville, Ky., posted a 257 average for 90 games at the Hatfield and Mc-Coy Rec Center in Williamson, West Virginia. For the women, an equally impressive average of 247 for 124 games was achieved by professional bowler Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, N.Y., while competing at Schenectady's Towne Bowling Academy.

According to Smith, the youth top averages for the 2021-2022 season went to Wyatt Honecker of Rochester, Minn., with a 242 average for 66 games at Rochester's Bowl-O-City; while Melia Mitskavich of DuBois, Pa., daughter of three time PWBA Tour champion Jackie Mitskavich, led the girls with a 237 standard for 75 games at DuBois Lanes.

As a youngster I used to dream of one day having my name in the The World Almanac, as well as the ABC Yearbook. I would study for hours the list of bowlers with six or more 300 games in The World tournament competition from the ABC Yearbook. I remember in 1972 how impressed I was when Mike Durbin broke the all-time individual league average of 238 that had been established by Skang Mercurio of Cleveland, Ohio, in 1935.

Another fascinating statistic that I noticed while reviewing old ABC Yearbooks were three perfect 900 series tallied in the 1930's by individuals from the National Bowling Congress, reportedly a rival to the ABC in those years. And although my attempts at professional bowling fell short, I was able to accomplish my childhood dreams to be a part of the all time list of 300 games for many years, as well as establishing state record averages in both California and New York.

As someone once said, records are made to be broken. In the end it's only a number. The conditions, equipment and circumstance may change, but eventually the best will rise to the top. Oh, by the way, another three 900 series were recorded during the 2021-22 season, bringing the lifetime certified total to 40. That's not counting the three perfect series from the 1930's... or the most famous of all 900's that was rolled by professional bowler Glenn Allison while competing in the Anchor Girl Trio league at California's La Habra 300 Bowl on July 1st, 1982.

Glenn was using a plastic bowling ball with a conventional grip, on a wooden lane surface with an oil pattern that would most likely be compliant today. It's only a number, so shouldn't Mr. Allison's accomplishment be recognized like all the rest?
