

Rookie Anthony LaCaze, Stefanie Nation Win PBA Earl Anthony Memorial Titles

DUBLIN, Calif. – Anthony LaCaze, a 27-year-old rookie from Melrose Park, Ill., won his first Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour title Sunday, throwing three clutch strikes in the ninth and 10th frames to defeat Michael Machuga of Erie, Pa., 214-206, in the title match of the Earl Anthony Memorial at Earl Anthony's Dublin Bowl.

Stefanie Nation of Grand Prairie, Texas, virtually matched LaCaze, throwing three strikes in her 10th frame to nip Lynda Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 201-181, for the Anthony women's title.

LaCaze, in his second ca-Professional Bowlers reer Association television appearance, trailed until he threw the biggest strike of his life in the ninth frame and followed with two even bigger strikes in the 10th to force Machuga to double in his 10th frame to win. Machuga got the first strike, but left a 10 pin on his second to hand LaCaze the \$25,000 first prize and a berth in next week's PBA Tournament of Champions.

"It's a great feeling," LaCaze said. "I wanted to throw the best shots I could, and make Machuga throw the best shots he could, and whoever did it best would win. I'm speechMachuga was on the same page "My second shot in the

page. "My second shot in the 10tInh frame is as good as I can throw it," he said. "You always have the mindset that your opponent is going to strike out. Anthony stepped up in the 10th frame, bowling for his first title on very difficult lane conditions, and threw it as good as you possibly can. I give him all the credit in the world."

"I always knew I could win," LaCaze added, "but when you actually do it, it's different. I'm up in the clouds right now."

LaCaze and Machuga both survived low-scoring semifinal matches that set the stage for the title match. Machuga nipped Sean Rash of Wichita, Kan., in his semifinal match, 188-183. Machuga didn't have two strikes in a row, but otherwise bowled an error-free game until he failed to convert the 3-10 split in the 10th frame. But Rash missed a pair of single-pin spares and that proved to be his undoing.

LaCaze, a former collegiate All-American bowler with Saginaw Valley State University, slipped past Mike Wolfe of New Albany, Ind., 190-158, in the other semifinal match.

LaCaze had a double late in the game, but a pair of splits and a pair of missed single-pin spares ended Wolfe's hopes.

In the PBA Women's Series presented by BOWL. COM title match, Nation jumped into the lead with strikes in the first and second frames, but couldn't build on her lead. An unconverted split in the sixth frame gave Barnes life, and Barnes then doubled in the eighth and ninth frames to take the lead. Even after she left the 4-6-7 split and opened in the 10th frame, Nation had to mark to win. "I had it and I let it get away," Barnes said. "I grabbed the ball in the 10th frame and pulled it. That's what you tend to do when the lanes are as difficult as they were today."

Nation, who lost the 2009 Earl Anthony women's title with an errant shot in the final frame, threw three strikes in the 10th frame this time to avenge her loss a year earlier.

"I was fortunate things fell my way," said Nation, who won her second PBA Women's Series title. "It was a very difficult lane condition. You had continued on page 7

National Deaf Bowling News

by Connie Marchione Malucci Returns With A 1022 Win In So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers Classic

CERRITOS — Last year when Carl Malucci, Las Vegas, hurt his back in the midst of his record breaking consecutive 700 streak, he had to forgo coming to bowl in the 46th Annual So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers Singles Classic in order to recover and resume his bowling for the record streak. Previously, the smooth stroking lefthander who is the "Earl Anthony" of this Classic had won the 2006, 2007 and 2008 Classics and had to give up his chance for a fourth straight title. In Malucci's absence, Paul Sanchez, Anaheim Hills won last year's Classic at Linbrook Bowl with a 956 score.

Last Saturday, Malucci returned to bowl in the So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers 47th Annual Classic at AMF Cerritos Lanes. His first attempt with 246-205-229-259 for 939 on the 2 p.m. squad was not good enough. So he re-entered on the 4 p.m. squad and started blasting 7 strikes in a row before a 7-pin stopped him. Calmly, he spared and struck out for the tournament high 279 game and added 247-238-258 for the 1022 winning total.

Although the Classic drew only 41 entries, there was a record 13 900 scores with the amazing Ken DeGroff, Sunland making 3 of them and only his highest one 946 counted for the prize list. At 5-1 prize ratio, there were only 8 places paid and sadly the only woman Faith Ranck, Ontario's 903 handicapped total failed to make it.

The 47th Annual Classic started with the Noon squad and at the end Malucci's buddy Joey Harris, Las Vegas made an early lead with 961 total. Like last Wednesday night in their league in Las Vegas, Harris was in a consistent mode with 257-258-258 for 772 and he repeated his consistency here. In his 961 Harris started with 234-236-234 for 704 and finished with a 257.

Whittier's Randy Salazar followed with his 146-202-212-168 for 728 plus194 handicap for 922. Ken DeGroff, Sunland hit 227-203-258-214 for 902. Ed Abakumoff, Riverside one of the Classic directors had a 258 game in his 824 and Bob Jones, Simi Valley started with a 247 but finished with 188-180-203 for 818.

There was more excitement on the 2 p.m. squad with Harris re-entering and starting off with a 267 and then 222-241 for 730 but ran into a couple of splits and many taps for a 178 finish and 908 total. Meanwhile, Francisco Navarro, Riverside hot off his good bowling in last Sunday's Deaf Travel League at Keystone Lanes, started with 194 and finished with 249-246-226 for 915 plus his 76 handicap for the then leading 991 score.

Navarro's 991 and Malucci's 939 in this squad were followed by DeGroff's 2nd attempt 233-227-214-248 for 922, David Howton, Anaheim 212-203-194-174 for 783 plus 136 handicap 919, Harris' 908, Philip Gomez, Bloomington with 163 average hitting a 257 second game and closing with a 136 for 726 plus 180 hanidcap for 906. The 141 average lady, Ranck had 171-140-167-141 for 619 plus 284 handicap for 903. Former 3-time champion Mark Fisser had 204-2136-213-216 for 869 plus 8 handicap for 877 The climax came on the 4 p.m. squad with Malucci blasting a 1022, followed by durable DeGroff's third and best attempt, 258-258-223 for 739 and 207 fihish for 946 and Robert Audette, Chno Heights making the last 900 with his 219-169-174-205 for 767 plus 140 handicap for 907. Fisser's second attempt was ruined by a 7-10 split on a solid pocket hit in the 9th frame of his fourth game after 8 straight pocket strikes. He finished with three strikes in the 10th for a 264. He had 888 plus 8 handicap for 896, 4 pins short of a 900. He could have a 300 there but for that split. Last year's champion Sanchez was hurt by a 143 third game in his 720 plus 168 handicap 888 score, 12 pins short of a 900. Malucci received \$410 for winning his 6th title in the last 9 years plus \$25 for the high scratch series on the 4 p.m. squad and \$40 for his 279 tournament high game. Navarro got \$205 for his second place finish and Harris \$100 for third place plus \$25 for high handicap series on the Noon squad and \$20 for his 267 game. The amazing DeGroff's \$75 for fourth place and \$4.50 for his 258 high game tied with Abakumoff's (\$4.50) 258. The rest of the prizes went to: Randy Salazar \$60 for 5th place, David Howton \$40 for 6th place, Robert Audette \$25 for 7th place and Philip Gomez for 8th place. Special prize of \$25 for ladies high handicap series on the Noon squad went to Tina Hall of Murrieta's 842 score. Mark Fisser got \$15 for his 264 game and Stella Lopez, Ontario \$6 for her ladies 185 high game. So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers thanks AMF Cerritos GM Ron Peter and his staff for hosting our tournament. A great many thanks to the committee of Ed Abakumoff, Sharon Caldwell and Robert Taylor and also to the entrants who came to our 47th annual tournament this year. Hope you all will return for our 48th year.
