### **Final Numbers Are In As Entries Close** For 2006 USBC Open Championships CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas \* The 2006 event also prom-

Entries are now closed for the 2006 United States Bowling Congress Open Championships, and this year's event will be the second largest ever held outside of Reno, Nev., when competition begins Feb. 11 at the American Bank Center Convention Center.

The USBC Open Championships (formerly the American Bowling Congress Championships Tournament) returns to Corpus Christi for the first time since 1992 with more than 4,000 additional teams. This year, 12,606 five-player teams will make their way to the American Bank Center. The 2005 event in Baton Rouge, La., the tournament's first visit to Louisiana, was the largest ever held outside of Reno, attracting 13,222 teams.

"We are definitely pleased with the response to this year's event," USBC Chief Tournament Officer Roseann Kuhn said. "We're excited about all of the teams that are making return trips to the Open Championships, and we're looking forward to sharing the tournament experience with all of the newcomers."

More than 30 locally hired carpenters, electricians and laborers have been hard at work transforming the American Bank Center into a 48-lane state of the art bowling stadium, which also includes office space and vendor areas for the event which will run from 7 a.m. until almost 2 a.m. every day from Feb. 11 until July 3.

ises its share of history, as eight bowlers will attempt to find their way into the record books. Roger Tessman, Homosassa, Fla., Bob Hart, Suwanee, Ga., Bert Lindgren, Liberty Lake, Wash., Carl Johansson, St. Charles, Ill., and George Harry, Midway, Ark., are all scheduled to attend the tournament for the 50th time. Glenn Allison, Anaheim, Calif., and Don Ellis, Sugar Land, Texas, will attempt to join the elite 100,000-pin club.

"The city of Corpus Christi has been so welcoming and things are really coming along nicely," Open Championships Tournament Director Brian Lewis said. "The lanes are in place and the scoreboards are hung and we'll be ready for the bowlers before we know it."

Once the facility has been completed, it will take 50 to 75 workers, also hired locally, to keep the event running through its closing date.

When the Open Championships concludes, it will take workers just five days to tear down the installation and return the American Bank Center to as it was before construction started.

# Las Vegas To Host 2006 Coaching/Pro **Shop Summit**

'The Phantom' Nicholson to deliver keynote address

GREENDALE—Great learning and networking opportunities will abound this year at the 2006 International Bowling Pro Shop and Instructors Association International Educational Conference and Bowling Coaches Summit to be held June 25-27 in Las Vegas.

The annual event returns to the Texas Station hotel-casino complex and promises to present valuable coaching and bowling knowledge from a group of toprate speakers and seminars for coaches at all levels. Coaches can advance their certification levels with Level I, Bronze and Silver courses. And, new for 2006, the USBC Athlete Development Drills, aimed primarily at high school and college coaches, will debut.

This cooperative summit organized by United States Bowling Congress Coaching, USBC College, USBC High School, IBPSIA and the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America - is for adult, youth, high school and collegiate coaches and pro shop operators who want to learn from some of the most recognized and respected leaders in the bowling industry.

"This year's lineup of speakers features a variety of new topics," said Director of USBC Coaching Bob Maki. "And of course there will be plenty of chances to network.'

Leading the list of speakers will be Len Nicholson, who will deliver the keynote address June 25. A former director of lane maintenance for the Professional Bowlers Association, Nicholson is host of "The Phantom" weekly internet radio talk show.

Among the other scheduled speakers are Team USA Head Coach Jeri Edwards sports psychologist Dr. Dean Hinitz, USBC certified coaches Del Warren and Mo Pinel, industry experts and members of the USBC Coaching staff.

# **Ritchie Rules Phoenix**

PHOENIX-It was a battle of youth against experience in the title match of the 2006 Motel 6 Phoenix Classic, and the fight wasn't decided until the final frame.

Ritchie Allen, 27-years-old, defeated Del Ballard Jr., a PBA member since 1982, 232-207, to win his second career Denny's PBA Tour title Sunday at AMF Christown Lanes.

Needing to mark in the 10th frame, Allen struck to cap an impressive comeback which found him behind through seven frames

Allen, who had struck just once through the first six frames, credited the victory to a key ball change he made in the 6th frame.

"I was going to make a [ball] change a few weeks ago in Medford," said Allen, referring to his 3rd place finish in the 2006 Earl Anthony Medford Classic. "I told myself not to doubt myself.'

Allen (Columbia, S.C.) fell behind early, striking just once and converting five spares over the first six frames while Ballard, appearing in his first title match since his 1993 U.S. Open win, struck four times over the same span.

Allen's ball change to a Track Threat swung the momentum of the match in his favor.

Allen advanced to his second career title match by defeating Brian Kretzer in the first semi-

final, 215-192. Ballard defeated Mike DeVaney in the semifinals, 226-201.

Ballard (North Richland Hills, Texas) earned \$20,000 for 2nd while DeVaney (Temecula, Calif.) and Kretzer (Dayton, Ohio) earned \$10,000 apiece for their respective 3rd and 4th place finishes.

## Southern California Deaf Bowling News Welcome Back Mr. Malucci, His 941 Wins So. Cal. Deaf Classic at Keystone Lanes

NORWALK—In the late summer of 2004, Carl Malucci was stricken by some kind of ailment that forced him to curtail bowling in the 2004-2005 season. Also the Whittier resident had to decline his appointed position on the Deaf Team USA for the January 2005 Deaflympics in Australia because his illness prevented him from doing the \$4,500.00 fund-raising task for the trip in such a short time. His position on the team was later given to Darrell Stogryn.

When he recovered and returned to bowling this season, Malucci entered in the 43rd annual So. Calif. Deaf Bowlers Classic last Saturday at Keystone Lanes. The smooth rolling lefthander had previously won this deaf Classic twice before back to back in 2002 and 2003. In 2002 Malucci set a record 1029 4-games series and broke it in 2003 with the Classic's first ever 300 game in 40 years in his 1049 series. He failed for a three-peat in 2004 when he finished 6th with the Classic's high scratch 884 series.

Bowling on the 2 PM squad at Keystone Lanes, Malucci showed no ill effects of being away for one year when he put together games of 239-210-236-256 for a terrific 941 series.

His score took over first place from Ken DeGroff, Van Nuys who earlier on the Noon squad rolled 197-235-212-246 for 890. With one more squad at 4 PM left and at the end Malucci's 941 won.

The much heralded DeGroff who travels around bowling in deaf tournaments in US had won the \$1,000 Baton Rouge Deaf Classic last August with (300) 981 and the \$1,200 Indianapolis Deaf Classic last October with 949, re-entered in the 4 PM last squad. He had 703 going into his 4th game but finished with a 189 for an 892. That moved him ahead of last year's winner Mark Fisser, Buena Park who had an 891.

There were only 41 entries in this Classic which offered \$1000 first prize based on 100 entries. So Malucci got \$410.00 for first place plus \$18.00 for his 256 game

The surprise second place \$205.00 winner was much improved Robert Scott, Jr. Fontana who had 775 plus 138 handicap for 913. Scott improved from 155 to 169 average and had all his 4 games over his average, Third place \$100 was taken by a former winner (1998) Javier Hernandez, Anaheim with his 811 plus 96 handicap 907.

Daniel Vasquez, Jr., La Puente closed with a 258 game for 818 plus 88 handicap for 906 and 4th place \$75.00 plus 2nd high game prize \$25.00. Fifth place \$55.00 went to DeGroff's 892 which also took the \$25.00 late bird (4 PM) high scratch series, also his 890 took the Noon squad early bird \$25,00 high handicap series and his 247 game took the \$11.00 last place high game prize.

Three times winner Fisser's 891 placed 6th for \$40.00. Other finishers were 7th place \$30.00 Dan Flores, Granada Hills 843+42/ 885; 8th place \$25.00 Pablo Yoma, Corona 772+104/876 and 9th place \$23.00 Emad Aranki, Covina (146 ave) 667+197/864. Darrell Stogryn, El Camino Village rolled the tournament high game 259 for the \$45.00 prize.

Six women entered in this Classic and Mirna Aranki, Covina's 596/836 was highest but out of money but her 183 game got her \$4.00 while the women's high game \$6.00 prize went to Violet Greenspon, Anaheim's 208. Former winner (2004) Dierdre Alkire, Diamond Bar's 605 got her the women's \$25.00 late bird high scratch series.

With his third win, Malucci ties Fisser as the most with 3 wins. Fisser had won in years 1995, 2000 and 2003. Watch for next year's 44th annual Classic.
