The STyLES, owned by Grey's Anatomy actor Jesse Williams, held a two-pin lead heading into the 10th frame. After KingPins' anchor bowler Pete Weber struck and spared in his half of the 10th frame, Rash answered with two strikes to lock up the win.

"It's a great feeling winning by yourself, but winning as a team never gets old," said

Rash, who served as franchise player for his team and drafted an all-star lineup that included PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr., veteran Tour champion Ryan Shafer, and promising young players Ryan Ciminelli and Jason Sterner.

"Every single teammate gave me positive feedback, said they had all the confidence in the world," Rash said. "Ciminelli told me to throw a good shot; I told him I was going to throw the same shot I threw at him to win the Tournament of Champions last year.

"All five of our guys are great players. All of us can throw strikes when we need to," Rash added. "It shows my picks were pretty good. I picked up a team I knew

Sunday's win gave the STyLES 18 points in the race for the top five positions for the end-of-season PBA League Elias Cup finals. Owner Billie Jean King's KingPins earned 12 points as runners-up.

Sunday's PBA League round included the top five of eight five-player teams that had qualified over a span of four days and 32 team games on four different lane conditions as part of the PBA Detroit Winter Swing at Thunderbowl Lanes.

SEATTLE — Los Angeles Clippers star guard Chris Paul, one of the founding owners of the new PBA League, hosts the Chris Paul PBA League All-Stars on ESPN this Sunday at 4 p.m. ET just prior to the Super Bowl.

The fifth annual fundraiser that benefits Paul's CP3 Foundation returns to Lucky Strike LA Live in Los Angeles for the second consecutive year with a celebrity lineup that includes several of his fellow PBA League owners and a host of PBA Tour stars.

In addition to Paul, celebrities competing in the doubles format competition include teammate L.A. Clippers forward Blake Griffin, former NBA star and ESPN analyst Jalen Rose plus PBA League team owners former NFL allpro receiver Terrell Owens, actor/comedian Kevin Hart, comedian Chris Hardwick. Pittsburgh Steelers linebacker LaMarr Woodley, and Grey's Anatomy star Jesse Williams. PBA stars competing are Chris Barnes, Norm Duke, Jason Belmonte, Sean Rash, Osku Palermaa, Bill O'Neill, Mike Fagan and Missy Parkin.

In addition to the doubles portion of the tournament, a best-ball competition returns featuring the celebrity competitors plus actor Quinton Aaron. Williams is hoping to defend his title in the best-ball event.

In last year's trios contest championship match, Belmonte, Hart and Paul trailed PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber, Griffin and actor Jerry Ferrara by only one pin after the seventh frame but consecutive strikes by Ferrara and Griffin set up a dramatic finish heading into the 10th frame. Belmonte's double in the 10th frame forced Weber to strike on his first shot to lock up the 187-180 victory ending Belmonte's bid for three consecutive titles.

Celebrity bowlers who have participated in previous Chris Paul events include NBA stars LeBron James, Dwyane Wade, Rudy Gay and Kevin Durant; National Football League stars Hines Ward and Reggie Bush, and hip-hop stars Chris "Ludacris" Bridges, Lil Wayne and Nelly.

1ST ANNUAL KEN DEGROFF'S DEAF SINGLES CLASSIC AT CHAPARRAL MARCH 2

SAN DIMAS — As announced two weeks ago, Ken DeGroff is starting his first annual Ken DeGroff's Deaf Singles Classic Bowling Tournament (K.D.D.S.C.B.T.) with a big guaranteed \$1,000 first place prize for men and \$500 first place for women. The first event sponsored by K.D.D.S.C.B.T., will be held at 48 lanes Chaparral Bowl in San Dimas on March 2 this year.

The event is certified by USBC and open to all deaf and hard of hearing bowlers with USBC membership cards. K.D.D.S.C.B.T. also welcomes ONLY USBC cards bearing children of deaf adults (CODA), hearing spouses & relatives and sign language interpreters to participate. These without USBC card must pay \$21.00 for USBC membership card. Minimum age is 18 years old.

There is a separate prize fund for men and women. Entry fees are \$50.00 per try for men and \$45.00 per try for women. Each may enter again but cash once. Prize ratio is 1 to 3.

This is a handicap tournament. The average to be used is the highest USBC average of last two USBC yearbooks, 2010-11 or 2011-12. If bowler's current average is 10 pins higher for 21 games or more of January 10, 2013, it must be used with proof copy of league sheet.

The men's handicap is 80% of 220 with 160 pins limit. The women's is 90% of 220 with 200 pins limit. Each bowler is responsible for his or her highest average.

All entrants bowl 4 games across 8 lanes. The squad times are 9:00 AM, 11:00 AM and 1:00 PM. Show up early to sign in at 8:00 AM, 10:00 AM or 12:00 Noon.

Early Bird Special on the 9:00 AM Squad only if over 20 entries will have free re-entries drawings by K.D.D.S.C.B.T. Also K.D.D.S.C.B.T. will give \$25.00 prize to man for 8 strikes in row (split if more than one) and \$25.00 prize to woman for 7 strikes in row (split if more than one).

There is All New scratch optional \$25.00 entry fee each for King of the Hill, one for Seniors (50 years and up) and one for regular division. The first place of \$300 of each King of the Hill is guaranteed. Both are scratch only events with top 5 in one game elimination stepladder.

The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) Bobbie McCollum +24, Sherly Agustin -20, Mike Bousquet + 47, Jack Trongale +47, Tony LeoGrande +40. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 93 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The High qualifiers for the tournament were George Parker for the men with a +164 and for the women it was Annaliza Agoncillo with a + 118. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series. and this time it was worth \$648. George would draw the score and he drew a 388. We had one bowler that bowled the score and it was Lin Lai. The sweet lady took home \$1,092. We will estimate the Match Series at \$400 at Action Lanes event. This week it was Vuong Do that would shoot for the 3-6-9 pot, he would miss on his second shot. He got a \$100 consultation. We will go for \$2,300 next week at Action Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing first were Deborah Sanders and George Parker with a 1421 for \$140. Finishing in second was Ed Del Mundo and Je Je Gabriel with a 1412 for \$120. There was a total of \$1,410 paid out in doubles and 23 paid spots with low to cash of 1331.

After bowling the semifinals; finishing in first was Chris Buck who parlayed a 289 scratch game to lead with a +205. Finishing in second was Don Johnson at a +150. Don sat out the first round. Mr. Buck had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. He drew a 251. We had no bowlers who shot that score. We still have one full pot, so it will be \$3,500 at Action Lanes with a second pot started that is at \$414.

This would bring us to our top 32 Match Play finals. In the first round, the fifteen losers were Mary Huynh, Pattie Brode, Deborah Sanders, Marife Catalasan, Kelly Wynn, George Alford Jr, Fred Galvan, William Gannon, Marina Suos, Justin Ziegler, Steven Alford, Jun Reyes, Robert Ricketts, Rick Masangay, and Bernie Navarro, they got \$200. In the second round, the eight losers were Tessie Sanicolas. Edgardo Talavera, Giang Huynh, Tony Knuth, Lordan Ferguson, Kristine Soliman, David Emrich, and Don Johnson with each getting checks of \$220. In the third round, we would see Shaun Suase down Peechit Butranon 216/259 to 153/182. George Parker bowling John Samson, 237/269 to 149/176. Peter Arsenault fell to Roland Suase by a 234/285 to 190/220. In the final match of the round it was Jon Barraca edging Tony LeoGrandea 223/263 to 154/201 to advance.Losers in round four got \$330.

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$87, George Parker, to a high of \$164, Shaun Suase. In one match, the eighth seed Roland Suase vs Jon Barraca the ninth seed. This was another close match that went down to the end with Jon pulling out this match to deny a possible father /son semi-final match with a 201/246 to Rolands 175/226. Shaun came up in the seventh with a spare but another open in the eighth would open the door wide for Chris. Chris would get strikes in the eighth and ninth frames to take a commanding lead and hold on to his first ABTA title with a 199/235 to 128/181. He would take home \$6,000 for the victory and an additional \$300 for qualifying on Friday night to give him \$6,300. Shaun would take home \$3,000 for his second place finish.
