Jones Wins Another

NORCROSS, GA-Tommy Jones won his third Denny's PBA Tour title of the season as he defeated Mike Scroggins in the title match of the 2006 Bayer Atlanta Classic, 224-191, Sunday at Brunswick Zone Norcross.

Jones, who won \$40,000, leads the Tour with three victories. The 27-year-old from Simpsonville, S.C., now has seven titles over the past two seasons.

"I was very fortunate," said Jones, who capitalized on a Scroggins open 6th frame with strikes in the 8th and 9th. "Scroggins bowled better than me, but I caught all the breaks."

Jones jumped out to a quick lead, converting a single pin spare to start the match before striking twice. Scroggins struck on his first shot, but was forced to convert spares in frames 2-4.

Jones, who took over the lead in the 2005-06 PBA World Point Rankings with the win, advanced to his ninth career title match after he beat the 2005 PBA Player of the Year Patrick Allen, 235-177, in the semifinals. Jones, who used an Ebonite The One and V2 strike balls, bowled a clean game - including seven strikes - while Allen opened in the 3rd and 9th frames.

Scroggins defeated Michael Fagan, making his second career televised finals appearance, 209-196, in the first semifinal. The left-hander trailed for the first eight frames, but took advantage of Fagan's open in the 9th by striking on his next three shots, including a double in the 10th.

Scroggins earned \$20,000 for his 2nd place finish while Allen (Tarrytown, N.Y.) and Fagan (Greenlawn, N.Y.) earned \$10,000 apiece for their respective 3rd and 4th place finishes.

The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Parkersburg, W.Va., for the 2006 West Virginia Championship, Feb. 8-12 at Emerson Lanes. The live ESPN finals take place Sunday, Feb. 12 at 12:30 p.m. EST, with the winner taking home the \$40,000 top prize and an exemption for the 2006-

ing to convert a 2-4-7-10 split. Tommy Jones has made the title match in nine of his 12 career televised finals appearances.

Today marked the first time since the PBA moved to its current match play format in 2002-03 that the top two seeds in standard event met in a title match. Jones, the No. 2 seed, defeated Scroggins, who made his second standard telecast as a top seed.

Frank Gallo Featured In Nation's Capital Area's Bowl Magazine by Connie Marchione

BOWL MAGAZINE, a fine publication of Nation's Capital Area Bowling Association was sent to me by friend writer Bob Cosgrove, Maryland who is its editor. Cosgrove, a past president of Bowling Writers Association of America had asked me to look at the interview he made with the deaf Senior PBA member Frank Gallo, Jr., Lanham,

It is good to know about Gallo's own opinions, which are somewhat

true, and he may be one of the greatest deaf bowlers. Personally I knew that only a couple other deaf bowlers had matched some of his bowling

records in hearing scratch bowling tournaments. TED DATTISMAN HITS 242,280 -279 FOR 801 IN PITTS-BURGH LEAGUE With thanks to Bill Cozad who relayed Ted Dattisman's story to me.

The deaf Pittsburgh lefthander Ted Dattisman emailed that he threw his third career 800 series last Monday night January 23rd. He shot an 801 series from games of 242-280-279. Ted said, he threw 20 BEAUTIFUL STRIKES IN A ROW between his 2nd and 3rd games. After the 2nd game's 2nd frame which he had a 9-pin spared, he threw the last 11 in row and first 9 in row in 3rd game. He threw a good ball on the first ball of 10th frame of third game but the head pin missed the 10-pin. So he spared and threw another beautiful strike on the final ball. Ted said, with 8 strikes in his first game he threw a total of 29 STRIKES out of 36 frames. It was the first time on that night he left NO 7-pin taps on his pocket hits, Ted's average after that night was 217 and now it is down to 216. He had ups and downs this year. We recall Ted had a career high 835 series in 2003.

I met Mark and he told me he did not know that the league was not an USBC certified one. All we knew now is Mark did bowl an 867 but the score was not honored by USBC. Also his 300 got no honor award too. Mark is a good bowler and I hope he will duplicate the feat in a sanctioned league.

This is the second time such thing happened at West Covina Bowl. Few years ago deaf Francisco Navarro was asked to bowl in one of the leagues there. He bowled his first ever 300 game and asked when he will get his 300 ring from ABC. No ring.

Personally I can not blame West Covina Lanes management for allowing a group of bowlers to bowl weekly in its center and not wanting to be sanctioned. They want to meet and bowl for fun and the house needs the money.

An USBC house representative should visit his assigned center to check on each league there. Whenever he sees a group of bowlers, he should talk to them and ask if they come in bowl weekly, bi-weekly or monthly, he should persuade them to join USBC. When you join a league or were invited to bowl in one, the league

secretary or president will give you a card to fill out for USBC member-ship on the first day. If none did that, do not bowl in such league unless you do not care for any honor scores and just wanted to bowl for fun. **ALSO**
