If needed, there will be a squad available on August 21st at 2pm. Each application must be accompanied by the \$50.00 entry fee in the form of a Personal Check or Money Order, payable to CAUSBC, as well as verification of your average.

We realize this is so-o much to remember but, don't fret, even though (due to the high cost of USPS postage), we will not be mailing entries to those members who bowled our event last year, but, we do have all the details for you on our website CalUSBC. com.

For your convenience, we even have the application in pdf form so you can complete on-line, print out, sign, and slip right into your mailing envelope.

I guarantee you, these squads fill up quickly. So, "the time is now" bowlers!





Did you ever stop to realize that one of the most incredible inanimate objects of all time is a bowling ball?

Many millions, probably more than a hundred million bowling balls have been manufactured since the early groping days of the sport nigh a century ago.

Where are they now? It seems to be part of an unwritten code not to throw bowling balls away. Seldom do you see bowling balls offered for sale at flea markets or garage sales. Often bowling balls are handed down from generation to generation,

Every bowling ball has been loved, hated, petted, booted, praised, scorned, prayed to in heavenly manner and sworn to hell. Some bowlers talk more to their bowling balls than they do to their families. Long before pet rocks there were pet bowling balls.

A bowling ball almost always has and continues to be one of history's great bargains. Most have good guarantees and survive two or three human lifetimes. If the cost of a bowling ball is rated over its useful years, there never has and probably never will be a piece of sporting equipment to match it.

No matter how many bowling balls you may have, and most bowlers are moving into the two and three each category, including juniors, it's oh so hard to part with them, as a general rule. I've seen bowling balls heaved into rivers and oceans and garbage dumps, but that's the exception.

Pros are almost fanatic when it comes to bowling balls. Some have had more than 200 in his garage, practically every one he ever owned. I don't know of a pro bowler who doesn't have a solid store dozen balls scattered around the home or stashed away with relatives, friends or neighbors.

Now for the big questions. What do you do with old bowling balls? And what uses have been made of them in the past? First of all, there is no such thing as an old bowling ball, just mature specimans of a too often overlooked art.

I've seen bowling balls used as fill in construction work and also seen them tossed into a concrete wall, mixed with the soft cement in the form.

Bowling balls have been used as decorative and useful objects between fence posts or on lawns. Bowling balls have been attached to chains and used as battering rams or dropped down through chimneys to help clean them or foce objects down.

Bowling balls have been used as weapons, man against man or man against machine. Criminals have used them to knock down doors and also to break some sturdy showcase windows. Bowling balls have been made into lamps, fish bowls, doorstops, plant holders, center piece decoration for tables and in many ways as weights to hold down everything from paper to boats to cars.

Bowling balls are used in other sports. In addition to bowling as imaginative minds sighting bowling balls come up with all kinds of new games. Bowling balls are revived periodically by bowlers since every bowler figures that every ball always has some life left, and most of the times they're right. Many so called old, discarded balls have won major championships with the help of a bowler,

One of the most beautiful uses of bowling balls came when they were used to form the largest set of rosary beads ever on the lawn of a religious building.

Of course the silliest I've heard about is using a bowling ball as the focal point of a roll-on deodorant — for elephants.

Life is short, for people and things, but bowling balls seem to roll on and live on in one form or another for close to forever.

DAN FLORES' 906 LEADS DEAF TRAVEL AT MISSION HILLS BOWL

MISSION HILLS - Dan Flores rolled his third 4-games 900 of the season, a 906 gem to lead on So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League's stop at Mission Hills Bowl. The smooth rolling right-hander hit all two's games of 226-241-233-206 to top the day's honor roll of 6 bowlers. Flores' best this season was a 300 and 963 rolled last November 17 on league's stop at Gable House Bowl. His perfecto is the only third such game in this all-deaf bowlers scratch 54 years old league. Following Flores on the honor roll was the league average leader Mark Fisser with 873 from games of 210-235-236-192. With this 873 Fisser holds his average at 227. After Fisser, was the league President Ed Abakumoff who finished his 778 series with the day's high game 247. Only last week in his Senior League at Brunswick Moreno Valley Lanes Abakumoff shot three games 740 series. Bob Jones whose league leader Eagle Rock was matched with Fisser's 2nd place Anaheim, dueled with Fisser and beat him in first game match 231 to 210. In other three, Jones could not keep up and ended up with a 771 series. Fisser's teammate Emad Aranki made the honor roll with his 702 and league Secretary-Treasurer Bob Taylor hit a 201. As in above the scheduled match up Fisser's Anaheim with help of Aranki's 5 points sweep beat Jones' Eagle Rock 14-6 to cut Eagle Rock's lead to 10 points. Third place Mid City in a hard fought battle, lost 9-11 to Flores' S F Valley with Flores himself sweeping 5 points. Fourth place Abakumoff's Riverside and last place Orange County were short two bowlers each and Riverside having the strongest league team average, beat Orange County 14.5 to 5.5. The huge win moved Riverside to within 1.5 points behind 3rd place Mid City. This 54 years old traveling league thanks Mario and Dave for having its bowlers use the lanes this season. The next travel stop is at the long time favorite house, Del Rio Lanes on February 23 with bowling time at 12 Noon.

All Bowlers must be members of the NLAC USBC to be eligible to bowl with a verified average in NLAC min 21 games winter 15 games summer

2. Choice of date and time shall be given according to the order which entries are received by the North Los Angeles County USBC Association (NLAC USBC) Association Manager.

- Lineup: Order cannot be changed from original entry form. Subs bowl in the position of original bowler. Substitute bowler forms are available 3. from the NLAC Office before the tournament or on-site, as needed.
- Team Captains must check-in with Tournament Officials at least thirty (30) minutes before scheduled squad time. Both members of doubles team must check-in. All substitutions in team lineup must be made thirty (30) minutes prior to scheduled squad time for bowling except when a replacement is necessary at site. Substitutes must show current USBC membership at check-in.
- Only the Team Captain who signs the entry form may make a change in the schedule and this must be done by either a signed letter or in person at the Association Office or at the Tournament site.
- Attire: Dress appropriately for a championship. No bare midriffs or underwear showing. No cut-offs, tank or halter-tops or derogatory slogans. No sweats or warm up suits. Skirts and shorts must be no shorter than 3 inches above the knee.
- Handicap shall be 80% of 230 Individual handicaps are combined for team and doubles events.
- Team entry fee: \$9.00 lineage + \$18.00 prize fund+ \$3.00 exp. = \$30 per person. Doubles/Singles entry fee: \$9.00 lineage + \$18.00 prize fund + \$3.00 exp. = \$30 per event. Elias Cup champion New York City WTT KingPins, sponsored by GEICO, and Motown Muscle, sponsored by Barbasol, in the semifinal round. The KingPins vs. Muscle contest will air next Sunday at 3 p.m. ET on ESPN. The semifinal round winner will advance to the Elias Cup finals which will be contested on Feb. 23 at Brunswick Zone Carolier in North Brunswick, N.J.

L.A. X, which was eliminated from Elias Cup contention in 2013 by a modest two points, didn't forget last season's close call.

We came into this tournament wanting to do better than last year and we're on our way to doing that," Belmonte said. "We're a very close-knit team even though we're quite diverse, but I felt like we really gelled.

"Last year was last year," the newly-named 2012-13 PBA Player of the Year said. "When 2014 rolled around, that's the only year that matters to us. What happened last year is irrelevant. We just wanted to make sure we performed well, and we'll see what happens.'

L.A. X claimed the first point when team captain Belmonte defeated Brooklyn team captain Sean Rash, 255-223, in a singles contest. Belmonte took the lead after Rash left the 4-6-7 split in the second frame and failed to convert, and Rash was unable to recover.

The STyLES tied the match when PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. and Jason Sterner nipped Mika Koivuniemi and Parker Bohn III, 238-234, in alternate-ball doubles. The second frame again was key when Bohn, a left-hander, left the 7 pin and Koivuniemi, a right-hander, failed to convert the spare. Brooklyn put together a string of five strikes to take the lead, but Sterner left a 10 pin on in the 10th frame, giving L.A. X a chance to double for the win. Bohn struck on the first shot, but Koivuniemi left a 10 pin to hand Brooklyn the point.

In the Baker-format trios match, where three players bowled alternate frames, Rash, Tom Smallwood and Williams combined for seven strikes on their first nine shots in cruising to a 247-218 win over L.A. X's Belmonte, E.J. Tackett and Andres Gomez for a 2-1 lead.

The Baker Team finale, worth three points, involved all five players bowling two frames each. Belmonte's strike in the ninth frame gave Bohn a chance to strike to lock up the win and move his team into the semifinal round.

"Jason set me up with his strike in the ninth," Bohn said. "At that point, we couldn't be shut out. I knew it was a matter of making a quality shot and fortunately I was able to make a perfect shot."

Bohn hasn't done a great deal of team bowling during his career, but he said he called upon his experiences bowling in the old American Bowling Congress Team Challenge program when it came time.

"Our team has great karma," Bohn said of his L.A. X team. "These guys put me in the same kind of situation I was in back in the old Team Challenge days when they asked me to bowl anchor. That's what was going through my mind, even though it's 20 years later and fortunately I was able to deliver.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

NORWALK — Several years ago, I had the opportunity to speak with Billy Myers, Sr. about Glenn's 900. He told me of animosity within the ranks of the San Gabriel Valley Bowling Association; of which La Habra 300 Lanes was a member at the time. Several board members were jealous of Glenn's accomplishment. and decided that "the lanes were rigged."

As a bowler and certified mechanic and lane man, I can attest to the fact that, if the lanes had been "rigged," the wall would have been destroyed by the bowlers from the earlier league. Further, there was no honor score shot on that pair of lanes during the earlier league. If the lanes were walled, there would have been more than one honor score shot on that pair.

In speaking with Glenn himself, he stated that, "...the ABC didn't have an award for a 900 series; only awards for 300s and 800s." Then, '... the ABC let the lane doctoring findings stand." This move by the ABC disallowed Glenn from receiving three 300 rings for his games; even though the ABC had awards for 300 games.

(As a teenager, I had the opportunity to receive a few pointers from Glenn and Andy Marzich when they stopped by the (now gone) Arcadia Lanes on Morlan Place, in Arcadia.)
