RENO, Nev. - Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., won his second United States Bowling Congress Masters title Sunday, defeating top seed Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, 290-217, at the National Bowling Stadium.

The victory was Williams' 47th on the Lumber Liquidators Professional Bowlers Association Tour, extending his record for the most in PBA Tour history, while also moving him up to a tie for second with eight career major titles.

"This is just another little feather, it's just awesome," said Williams, who defeated Barnes, 268-239, to win the January 2004 USBC Masters also at the National Bowling Stadium. "It's hard to explain it better than that. To win any tournament is awesome, and the bigger ones are even better.

Williams is now tied with Pete Weber and Mike Aulby with eight career major titles, but all three players trail USBC and PBA Hall of Famer Earl Anthony, who won 10 majors and 43 total titles.

"I really don't envision that I can get to 10, but I'm not giving up yet," said Williams, who turned 50 in 2009. "I'm going to go out there and plug along as good as I can, and the year that I'm no longer exempt out here, that's when I will have had enough."

In the title match against Barnes, Williams got off to a shaky start, going high on his first shot, breaking up a split and leaving a 7 pin. From there, he was perfect, finishing with 11 consecutive strikes to take home the \$50,000 prize and two-year PBA Tour exemption.

Williams said the turning point in the match was when Barnes left a 10 pin in the fourth frame, but he managed to carry a similar shot in the fifth frame.

"The last two Masters here in Reno, I've gone undefeated in match play, I haven't lost a three-game match, yet I haven't won either tournament," said Barnes, who made it through the double-elimination bracket unscathed in both events. "TV is one of the best things the sport has going for it, but it is probably the worst thing I have going for me personally."

To reach the championship match, Williams defeated No. 3 seed Ryan Ciminelli of Buffalo, N.Y., 258-224. Ciminelli advanced with a 246-229 victory over fourth seed Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, in the opening match.

The 2010 USBC Masters featured a field of 267 of the top professional and amateur bowlers in the world, competing for an overall prize fund of \$255.000.

them in the tournament. The righty averaged 230 in three leagues and the lefty averaged about the same. I am not going to mention their names for reasons you will understand as you read on.

Well we get to Vegas and go to the bowling center where the tournament was being held. As I walked down the concourse I was watching the squad in progress and I wasn't impressed. While I wasn't what you would call a great bowler I was always able to hold my own. I mentioned, as I watched one particular bowler, that "hell, I could beat that guy". The lefty said "really, he won the high roller last year" Oops! I watched matches being won 180 to 170. Didn't see anything above 210. Boy, this would be like taking candy from a baby. Well it soon was our turn. My lefty bowled first and got a bad break. His opponent caved a strike in the 10th to win by 2 pins. Oh well, there was still the lovers bracket and I was sure my horse would recover. My righty

to win by 2 pins. Oh well, there was still the losers bracket and I was sure my horse would recover. My righty was next and missed a four pin to lose. A four pin! It wasn't that he missed it, he missed it by two arrows. The ball stuck on his thumb. Oh well, at least we're not out.

The format of the tournament was if you lose in the first match you went to the loser's bracket where you had to win four matches to get your money back and then you could keep going and, hopefully, come out of the loser's bracket to win the tournament. Well my guys win their next three matches. I had this thundering in my ears. I finally figured out it was the sound of the cream rising to the top. I was more convinced than ever that I backed the right guys.

backed the right guys. Well the time had come. If my guys win their next match the worst I could do was break even. Not really if you figure the cost of gas, rooms, food for two bowlers who had seemingly bottomless pits for stomachs and the thousands, yes thousands of dollars I lost gambling, but close enough for government work. My righty bowled the first match. In practice he couldn't keep the ball on the right side of the head pin no matter what he did. The match starts. The first shot is barely right of the head-pin (but at least it's right) leaving the bucket. He throws at the spare and the ball, I kid you not, goes into the left gutter 5 feet in front of the pins. He comes back and says "I can't believe the ball hooked" You can't believe the ball hooked? You couldn't get it to the right side of the head-pin in 50 shots in practice. What did you think it was going to do Einstein? It got worse from there. He lost 151 to 144. I don't want to talk about it. My last chance to salvage something was my lefty's match. I watched his opponent throw the ball dead

My last chance to salvage something was my lefty's match. I watched his opponent throw the ball dead straight in practice and about 12 miles an hour going over the thump hole every so often. Eureka! My guy never missed the pocket and had at least a 99% carry rate in practice. I'm really excited by now. At the end of practice my bowler's opponent comes over to where I am standing and starts talking to the guy next to me. Turns out the guy next to me was his father. He says "Dad, do you see this guy. He's great. I'm dead". Dad say's, "look son, just take your time and make your spares and everything will be fine". Match starts with my guy. Strike! Kid's up. Misses the head pin leaves the 1-3-5-6. Gets up to shoot the spare, sticks on the approach, lets the ball go while almost falling down and it misses the head pin by so far that the ball barely nicks the 6 pin making it fall forward and cave the rest of the pins for a spare. Wonderful. The next shot the kid misses so bad that he gets a runaway Brooklyn The next time my guy is up he rings a 7 and misses it. Next frame 6-8, miss. Well, you can probably guess how the rest of the match went. Let's just say that when it was over my guy's opponent apologized to him for winning the match 168 to 165.

After that experience I vowed to never sponsor another bowler in any tournament. My customer looks at me and says "man I don't blame you for feeling that way but I'm way better than that". I said "Yeah, I know, and so were they".

The perfect game was not to be that night, a solid 10 pin put an end to that, but she moved one step closer having been at the edge yet once more and gaining the experience of the moment. It was a nice end to a league with a 179-290-279 for a new personal best series of 748 and an ending league average of 201. Not bad for a 12 year old girl.

The next day, it's February 9th and this time she is bowling for her Youth league "Pinslayers", also at Brunswick Vista Lanes in Palmdale. Still excited by how well she had bowled the night before she began by throwing the same ball in practice. She wasn't quite confident with the look she was getting from it now so she tried another. Just a bit better, she liked the move it made at the backend so the change was made. Game 1 was nothing special at 193 with a couple of opens, 1 due to a nasty 6-7-10 split, the other a missed 10 pin conversion. Game 2 began with a 10 pin standing, but this time a conversion to open with a spare. The 8th frame saw yet another 10 pin and a conversion, but all the other frames had been solid strikes for a nice 269. Game 3 began following the solid 4 in a row that had ended game 2, first ball....strike. Flash forward to the 3rd ball in the 10th frame and Ashley now had 15 strikes in a row behind her and was just 1 ball away from that elusive perfect game. Again the perfect game was not to be had, as she tugged the ball ever so slightly and left a 3-10 for a new personal best single game of 298 and series of 760. Two days, 2 games of 11 in a row, a 748 and 760 series, a 290 and 298 game, a book average of 201 and a league average in session of 205 Not bad for a 12 year old girl!
