Pound for Pound the Best Bowlers in the Country

TARZANA—Corbin Bowl proudly congratulates youth bowlers Lyndsey Gold, Ryan Santourian and Zoe Rodriguez for bowling the highest game and series in the nation for a three-player team with all members eight years and under. The trio earned the same awards last year making them possibly the best bowlers in the country--pound for pound.

On May 30, 2009 "We Came from Small World" bowled a 394 team game with Lyndsey 131, Ryan 122, and Zoe 141, but they weren't

done yet.

Nearly a month later they claimed the nation's high series with 1114. Lyndsey's 357 and Ryan's 273 were topped off with Zoe's 484.

The 8 and under world can breathe a sigh of relief, as the trio have started turning 9 this season and will be competing in the 9-11 category.

The team was presented with their national team recognition certificates from USBC and plaques recently. The trio has been bowling together for several years.

Voss and Asbaty Victorious in PBA Bayer Don and Paula Carter Mixed Doubles

WHEAT RIDGE — Coming from the fifth qualifying position, Hall of Famers Brian Voss of Alpharetta, Ga., and Diandra Asbaty of Chicago, won four consecutive matches to capture the PBA Bayer Don and Paula Carter Mixed Doubles Sunday at Brunswick Zone Wheat Ridge.

Voss, a member of the PBA Hall of Fame, and Asbaty, a member of the World Bowling Writers Hall of Fame, defeated No. 1 qualifiers Jason Belmonte of Australia and Michelle Feldman of Auburn, N.Y., in the Baker format championship match 234-212.

For Voss it was his 25th career Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour title ranking him 10th on

the all-time list and his first in four years. It was the second PBA Women's Series presented by BOWL.COM title for Asbaty.

"Diandra bowled so well it took a lot of pressure off of me," said the 51-year-old Voss. "Once we got to match play our strategy was that she would start and I would finish and we stuck with that the whole tournament."

"This was special not just for myself but also because you have an opportunity to share it with someone."

The Baker format requires each member of the team to bowl alternate frames in a game to combine for one score.

"Believe me, I couldn't have done it without Brian," Asbaty said. "We had good chemistry right from the start. Even though we qualified fifth for the finals, we had a lot of confidence and the fact that we jumped out to big leads in the first two matches helped make us feel we were in control."

The Voss and Asbaty team had a scare in the championship match when Voss missed a 10 pin spare in the eighth frame.

"I hadn't thrown any shots on the right hand part of the lane all day and just threw a bad shot," Voss said. "Fortunately it didn't cost us."

Voss and Asbaty shared in a \$50,000 first prize and

Belmonte and Feldman split \$26,000 for second.

"I thought after bowling really well at the start it would eventually end for them but it didn't," said Belmonte. "That's the cruel part of bowling one game for the title, but if it's your day it can be the beauty of it as well."

Voss and Asbaty began the finals by defeating 2009 PBA World Championship winner Tom Smallwood and Jodi Woessner 276-224. In the second match they defeated Rhino Page and Shannon Pluhowsky 276-227, and in the semi-final reigning PBA Player of the Year Wes Malott and Shannon O'Keefe 224-202 to get to the championship match.

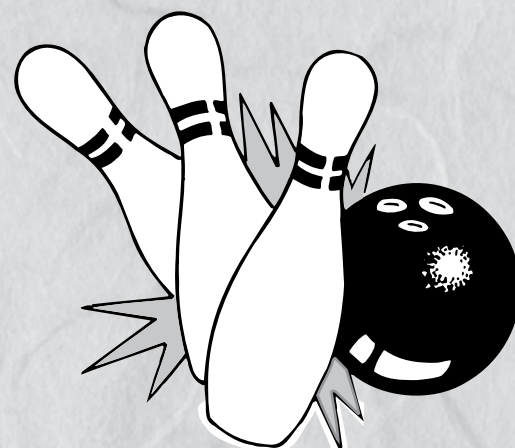
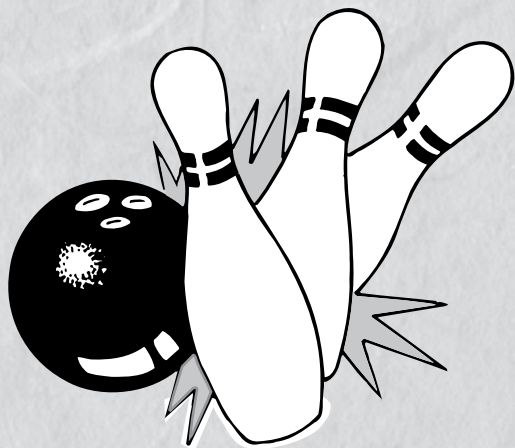

Bowler Wins \$10 Million Jackpot While in Reno for 2010 USBC Open Championships

RENO—Most bowlers at the United States Bowling Congress Open Championships are excited when they bowl well enough to claim a share of the tournament’s prize fund, but John Johnson of Golden, Colo., managed to become a multimillionaire before he even stepped on the tournament lanes this week.

Shortly after exiting his flight to Reno on Sunday, Johnson put \$20 into an airport slot machine, and minutes later, he was the winner of the \$10,422,754.08 Megabucks MegaJackpot.

“When it hit, we all kind of looked at each other and wondered what happened,” Johnson said. “I kept telling my wife that something was going to go well this week, whether it was bowling well or winning something, but I never could have imagined winning \$10 million.”

“The Biggest Little City in the World” has become a special destination for the 36-year-old Johnson and his teammates. Three of Johnson’s six USBC Open Championships appearances have come at Reno’s National Bowling Stadium, and while in town for the 2007 event, he and his wife, Stephanie were married.

“Three years ago, I married my wife, Stephanie, here in Reno,” Johnson said. “All of us use the Open as a vacation every year, and we just come out to have a good time. Plus, bowling is a big part of my life. It’s really the best of everything.”

Johnson, a mechanical designer for BCER Engineering near Denver, tried not to let his big win and the flurry of media requests that followed distract him from helping Kamikaze Keglers on the tournament lanes Monday. The right-hander posted games of 222, 138 and 192 for a 552 series and helped his team to a 2,566 total. Pandorum of Buford, Ga., leads Regular Team with 3,063.

Johnson was joined on the lanes by Aaron Franks (534), Scott Maakestad (509), Clint Cator IV (492) and Jon Hanson (479).

“I don’t think I shot really well, but all in all, I’m pretty happy with how we did,” Johnson said. “I plan to keep coming to the Open wherever it may be, but for tomorrow, I plan on coming in and winning doubles and singles.”

Applications were received from some of the “best” of our youth bowlers in California and after the difficult task of lengthy and careful review of the candidate packages, we take great pride in revealing to you..... The “Best of the Best” for our 2010 Star of Tomorrow \$1,000 Scholarship Award.

Our female recipient Nicole Nalani Shepard is the 18 year old daughter of Tom and Laura Shepard of Santa Barbara, California. Nicole was always an achiever and all during her elementary school her grades were stellar . She entered Dos Pueblos High School in Goleta with high aspirations for a college education. Nicole was selected to Who’s Who for outstanding Middle School and High School student three times and was invited to attend both the National Youth Leadership Forum on Law and Medicine in Washington D.C. She was a member of the Junior Statesman of America, The National Honor Society, and the California Scholastic Federation. (This average converted under USBC Rule #202, is equivalent to a 196 on standard lane conditions) To date, Nicole has to her credit a high series of 755 and a 300 game.

In 2008 Nicole stepped up her bowling competition with commitment to the JAT, (Junior Amateur Tour) winning her first JAT Title at the season opener. She completed that JAT season winning the Tournament of Champions Title, earning the Farm Club Rookie of the Year Award and currently is the strongest girl in the Open Division. This season she averaged 209.4 for 76 games at seven different bowling centers including three sport PBA patterns and is not intimidated when going head-to-head with the more powerful high revving boys. She makes it known she is in the hunt for a spot on the JAT 2009-2010 All Star Team. Nicole is also a member of the JST (Junior Scratch Tour) and the JBT (Junior Bowlers Tour).

Since 2001, Nicole has competed in the Santa Barbara County Youth Association tournaments as well as the SBC Bowling Festival and was awarded the SBC Youth Scholarship Award, which is based on academic and bowling achievements. In 2007 Nicole and sister Maile and two friends won the California State Team Championship. Nicole captured 1st Place twice both in Team Event and All Events and a 1st Place in the SBC Princess Event. She has competed in the California State Youth Tournaments since 2001 and captured a First Place Team finish. Of recent, she won the California State Scratch Tournament in Visalia; was a Pepsi Tournament Regional winner for SBC District; and finished as high as third place in the State Pepsi Finals. When on break from college and in the Santa Barbara area, Nicole earns her community service credits as a Santa Barbara Zoo Camp Counselor; working at several Vacation Bible Schools; and as a nanny to two small children. Nicole is a member of Young Life and the Harvest Christian Fellowship Youth Group and.... the Cake and Bake Club.

Although Nicole strives to strengthen and achieve her goals in higher education and her bowling career, she has not lost sight that her family is the most important part of her life, for they have been and will continue to be, her backbone of support in all her endeavors.

Our male recipient, Spencer Jon Dukes, more often referred to by his middle name, is the 17-year old son of Spencer and Sarina Dukes of San Diego. Jon is currently a senior at the San Diego School of Creative and Performing Arts. Although Jon’s father has traveled at sea a great deal of the time with the United States Navy, Jon never faltered in his responsibilities to his mother; his 15-year old sister Kimberly; and to himself, to excel beyond his own pre-set boundaries. All through elementary school and high school Jon has made the Academic Honor Roll. From 2004 to present he has received numerous Honors of Excellence in Citizenship, English, Math, Music, Religion, Science, and Spanish. as well as an Outstanding Achievement Award in various areas of specific English Assignments and has received personally written letters from Math Teachers complimenting him on being such a wonderful student. Since age five. Jon has kept himself mentally and physically fit through his involvement with Martial Arts. He has the ranking of Third Degree Black-Belt. He serves the Martial Arts Club as Historian and has always lived by the organization’s theory of “living with morality and honor“.

Adding to his versatility in accomplishments, Jon is a CPR Certified and has a California Driver’s License for over a year and proudly has a clean record of no citations or accidents. With the continued loving support of his immediate and extended family members, Jon has his goals set on becoming a Martial Arts Instructor; maintaining the position as Concertmaster and...earning the title as a Professional Bowler.

The formal presentation of awards to both of these wonderful “Stars” will take place at our California USBC Annual Meeting, Sunday, June 13th at the Fremont Marriott-Silicon Valley in Fremont.

Is Youth Bowler Next Jason Belmonte?

NORCO —A youth bowler at Brunswick Classic Lanes Norco might well be the next Jason Belmonte. Jimmy Schmitzer has been raising eyebrows since he began bowling at Classic Lanes. His two handed style of bowling has brought attention to this young phenom. Jimmy is a slender young 16 year old, unassuming and somewhat shy, that is until he picks up his bowling ball. Then his demeanor changes and he becomes an aggressive young bowler who loves to win and has the talent to do just that.

As an example, in January 2010, Jimmy bowled a high scratch game of 288 and a scratch series of 738. He followed that up on February 7 with a high scratch game of 266 and a scratch series of 738. Don't let this fool you into thinking that Jimmy is a “Johny come lately” because he isn't.

Beginning with his first sanctioned junior league at the age of eight in 2001, he has been a very competitive bowler. Bowling at the Concourse Bowling Center in Riverside from 2001 until 2007, he was junior league champion with high game, high series and high average each year.

Some of the highlights of this young man's bowling accomplishments show his deep desire to be the best at his sport. In 2005, he was a People to People Ambassador Program Champion in bowling in the Australian Koala Bowling Tournament in Sydney, Australia. He won a gold medal for high game, a gold medal for high series and a silver medal in team event. Also in 2005, Jimmy was division five National No-Tap second place winner while posting a no-tap 300 to highlight his performance. He was league champion at Keystone Lanes SED Junior Travel League n 2008. In 2009, he was league champion in the Moreno Valley Bowl All Star Junior Scratch league posting a 290 game and an average 213. At the 2009 Pepsi Challenge district six finals he finished in first place with a high scratch game of 277 and a scratch series of 717. In the 2009/2010 first session of the Junior Doubles at Classic Lanes he was league champion posting the aforementioned scratch 288 game and a 738 series and averaging 204. In the second session, still underway, he already has the 266 scratch game and a scratch series of 738. His current average is 213.

As you can see Jimmy Schmitzer has quite a list of bowling accomplishments for a 16 year old. Most adult bowlers would be happy to have his record.

Since there are very few two handed bowlers and even fewer coaches, Jimmy has had to teach himself the technique he uses to attain these scores. His arsenal of bowling balls contains a 13 pound Hammer, Black Widow; a 12 pound Storm, Fired Up and a Brunswick, Mickey plastic ball for his spares. His father and mother, who attend every league game and tournament, contend that he is determined to be the best in the sport of bowling. Remember his name, Jimmy Schmitzer, as I feel sure you will be hearing a lot more about him in the future.
