NORTH BRUNSWICK, N.J. - Australian two-handed star Jason Belmonte picked up his first major title and became just the second foreign player to win the United States Bowling Congress Masters on Sunday in front of a capacity crowd at Brunswick Źone Carolier.

Belmonte defeated Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, 258-245, to win the \$50,000 first-place prize and a major title on the PBA Tour. The victory was his sixth career PBA Tour title.

He finished his Friday Laughlin League with a perfect game and came back Sunday morning to start his Men's Club League with a perfecto. I am not sure what Toby's series was Sunday morning, but he had a 786 (243 - 243 - 300) on Friday night.

After his second consecutive perfecto rumor has it that Toby struck two more times to start his second game Sunday morning. If the rumor is true, that would give him a string of 26 consecutive X's. The Citrus Belt record is held by MATT MURTISHAW with 39 consecutive strikes

I witnessed Matt roll those 39 strikes and was rooting for him to reach forty. Obviously, Matt also rolled B2B 300s and his string of strikes in two different leagues. On his record breaking Thursday night, Matt finished his six o'clock league with eighteen, then started his nine o'clock league with twenty-one X's. I believe the national record is forty-two consecutive strikes. Toby used his new Roto Grip Defiant Soul to strike-alot. The ball was drilled by ZACH JELLSEY of Bowler's Junction Pro Shop. Tops Wes Malott in USBC Masters Title Match

Australia's Jason Belmonte Wins First Major

"This is without a doubt the greatest feeling I've ever had on a pair of the lanes," said Belmonte, who joined Finland's Mika Koivuniemi as the only foreign players to win the Masters. "You come out on the PBA Tour, the hardest tour in the world with the greatest players in the world, and at the top of that tree are the majors. To finally get atop one and check the view out for the first time is golden. It's absolutely beautiful.

The title match was filled with drama in the final frame as Belmonte delivered three strikes, including a heart-stopping second shot in the 10th when a pin darted across to take out the 10 pin at the last second.

Belmonte's perfect 10th frame, capping a string of six strikes in a row, forced Malott to match him with three strikes of his own to take the title by one pin. Malott's first shot barely struck with the 4 pin falling late, but his second shot went high and left the 3-6-10, giving the title to Belmonte.

"Watching that 4 pin fall at first I was like 'oh no,' but then I had an overwhelming feeling that if it was meant to be it would be," said Belmonte, who went undefeated in the double-elimination matchplay bracket to earn the top seed for the finals. "It was like the tension just doubled, and there was already a lot of tension. I can assure you the last thing I thought I was going to see was Wes not get the ball to the pocket.'

After the loss, Malott said a distraction caught his eye on the second shot in the 10th and caused him to pull the ball left.

"Someone in the crowd caught me in the 11th frame. I don't want to say anything against the fans in New Jersey because they've been great, and it happened to some other guys during the week, but it's a bummer, a heart-breaker," Malott said. "It happened durcontinued on page 3

Bigtime Bowling

I didn't know that!

With the upcoming summer season of bowling upon us, we would highlight some facts and maybe some little known or discussed facts about bowling. Lets get started on those 'little known factoids' because a little knowledge goes a long way to helping you enjoy a better and possibly higher scoring season.

Interesting Factoids

- Art Morin of Taunton, Mass., made 22 spares in 30 frames; he failed to get even one strike and ended with a 3-game score of 465.
- A 292 is the rarest score to get.
- The most damage done to a lane on TV was Marshal Holman in 198?, kicked out a foul light.
- The worst dressed award goes to Guppy Troup, for the most unusual pants collection ever seen.
- Lowest series with a 300 game, 476 Reed Townley, Gadsen, Ala.; 89, 87, 300 on Jan. 18, 1989.
- 1800 lbs/sq. inch is the impact when a ball hits the lane.
- The longest slide down the lane without a foul was Josh Blanchard, 6'3" because he never released the ball.
- The highest and longest flight time was a tie between Fagan and/or Belmonte.

• Fastest Bowling ball speed recorded; 24.85mph by Australia bowler Alan Patterson at Hillwood Strike and Spare. Osku Palermaa, a pro two-handed bowler, has a wicked fast one-handed spare ball. Usually when downing particular spares, like the 10, 6-10, 6, 3-6-10, and most splits, he throws it one-handed. His one-handed shot on average is about 27-28 MPH, not too far away from his 22MPH average strike ball. His fastest on television is about 32 MPH but on his website (oskupalermaa.fi) he claims that his fastest recorded is about 35 MPH.

• Highest Rev Rate. Robert Smith - up to 720 RPM.

• I had trouble finding an all-time highest recorded but on multiple searches his name came up as the one with the highest rev rate.

• HIGHEST SCORING TITLE MATCH ON NATIONAL TV, the total was 579, Mike Aulby with a 300 and David Ozio with a 279 (Wichita, KS, 1993).

• Reno, NV is the home to the only Bowling Stadium in the world.

Bowling center with the most lanes. The Tokyo World Lanes Center boasted 252 lanes of bowling pleasure and held the title as the world's largest bowling alley but has since closed. According to the Guinness Book of world records; Japan is the home of the largest bowling alley in the world. Inasawa Grand bowling Centre has 116 lanes. That's a bowling center I'd die to see.

Bowling pin Specs. The weight of a standard wood pin or a plastic coated pin is not less than 3 lbs. 6 ounces and not more than 3 lbs. 10 ounces. The average weight pin is about 24% of the weight of a 15 lb. bowling ball. It is easy to understand how a ball will deflect excessively upon contact with a pin if a fairly precise bowling ball angle of entry is not created. Allowing for pin deflection is an important part of the strike and spare alignment systems.

The most commonly used lane surfaces. Brunswick Pro-Anvilane; this is the hardest bowling surface out there to date. It can, but not always, be put directly in over the old wood lanes. Pro-Anvilane tends to have a smoother and even characteristic to it. In addition it will have the range finders on the last 15 foot of the lane. AMF HPL; this is the second most commonly used synthetic lane out there; its characteristics are not as hard as Pro-Anvilane but harder than wood. This is a very high scoring lane surface when it is freshly dressed, it will have more fiction than pro-anvilane. In addition the shot tends break down faster than pro-anvilane but not as fast as wood.

Lane Specifications. The overall length of a regulation lane is 62 feet 10 3/16ths inches measuring from the foul line to the pit (Not including the tail plank). It must be 60 feet from the foul line to the center of the No. 1 pin spot with a tolerance of 1/2 inch permitted. It must be 2 feet 10 3/16ths inches from the center of the No. 1 pin spot to the pit (Not including the tail plank).

Lane Width

The lane shall be between 41 and 42 inches in width. The lane plus the gutters shall not be less than 60 inches nor more than 60 1/4 inches wide. There will be a test so pay attention.

Lane Surface

The surface must be free of all continuous grooves. A maximum 40/1000th inch will be permitted in levelness and depth depression. No test is scheduled for this week.

The cut scores were high (new Lane Machine) +88 for the men and +55 for the women, with Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman), Ely Cruz +80, Sun Sundara +77, and Carla Sanchez +54. Super seniors are men 63 and over. For the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 66 bowlers to cash in the Semifinals

A Special Congratulations was in order as two of our finest announced their engagement his past week, Godfrey Galsim proposed to his long time girlfriend, the Pretty Kristine Soliman at Jewel City Bowl and she said yes :=)). Congrats from the ABTA. A bright future is in store for this fine young couple.

High qualifiers for the tournament were Kmel Cunanan for the men with a +190. For the women it was Deborah Sanders with a +138. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$478. Kmel drew a 678. We had no bowler that bowled that score. We will estimate the Match Series at \$950 at Bowlium Saturday. This week it was Matt Garcia that would shoot for the 3-6-9 pot of \$2,600. He missed on his second shot, he will get a \$50 consultation. We will go for \$2,700 Saturday.

Finishing first in doubles, were Angel Hilvano and Kmel Cunanan with a 1515 for \$150. Finishing in second Deborah Sanders and Steve Brode with a 1492 for \$130. There was a total of \$2,320 paid out in doubles, and 37 paid spots with low to cash of 1470.

The semis saw Kurt Valmonte with a +143. Finishing in second was Gabriel Martinez at a +128 by a mere 1 pin over the Kurt's older brother Kevin. So he sat out the first round of the elims. Kurt had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$5,000. Kurt drew a 157. After a review of all the scores, we had four bowlers who shot that score. They would split the pot with each getting \$1,250, 3 of the bowlers were fully qualified to receive \$1,250 each. They were Mike J Moore, Donovan Chung, and Lucky Marina Suos. The fourth bowler was bowling in only his 2nd tournament in the calendar year so he would receive 50% of the \$1.250 for a total of \$625. We again have \$5,000 at Bowlium.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Kevin Valmonte, Darrow Tiongco, Tim Lambeth, Angel Hilvano, Veronica Boone, Lord Ferguson, and Kelvin Axel. Each will get \$115. In the second round, the four losers were Cecilia Lung, Amy Galsim, Mamerto Jablan, and Gabriel Martinez with each getting checks of \$125.

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$35. Don Quitangon, to a high of \$218, Natalie Perenishko. In #one match, the sixteenth seed Natalie Perenishko versus Bedell Vasquez the eleventh seed. This was another of Bedell's good games where he was able to find a way to continue his hot bowling this week, it must have been the extra rest he got before coming to West Covina. He would finish with a 243 to 226 and advance to the next round. In the other match, it was Don Quitangon the seventh seed versus Greg Velarde the fifth seed. This match was a close match that would go down to the final frame. In this match it was Don who would punch out in the tenth to force Greg to get a mark. Greg came up in the tenth frame and left the 4-9 split and was not able to convert it. That would send Don to the next round with a 201 to 198 victory. Greg and Natalie finished in fourth and fifth getting checks for \$135 each.

Our semi-final match was set, and would pit the seventh and eleventh seeds. In the weekly "horses", we would see Don paying \$35 and Bedell paying \$90 if they would win their match. I wish there was a way to count the number of bowlers who quit each year out of sheer frustration, helped along by indifference and neglect.

They end up almost convinced that this sport of ours only masquerades as fun, recreation and competition, that in reality, it's some form of torture.

Too many are told too often how easy it is to bowl. The emphasis should be on the fact that though bowling is one of the easiest sports to learn, it remains one of the most dificult to master, even with the rash of easier conditions and gigantic scores. That makes the newcomers and lower averagers feel worse.

Let it be noted that there are many instructors who should be made aware of the fact that beginning bowlers aren't interested in becoming 200 average bowlers right away, at least not until they learn how to keep the ball out of the gutter more often than not.

Most bowling centers do not provide or make available adequate instruction for beginners, middle range or advanced bowlers, free, or at any cost. Many bowlers would love to take lessons, but this area of the game has been sadly neglected. Some bowlers can't afford much, others are willing to pay almost any price. Neither get too much of anyone's attention.

No particular segment of the sport is at fault, though it would be to the advantage of bowling centers if bowlers stopped quitting, and to the membership organizations, and it would certainly be to the advantage of the pros and others if the teaching of bowling grew to even a portion of the type of instruction offered in tennis and golf.

I don't know of any golf course that doesn't have a pro. And tennis is near that position too. How many bowling centers have a home pro?

Over the years the National Bowling Council and each of the groups in bowling have done some good things in the way of bowling instruction. The PBA also moved in that direction with its member schools. But the ends are loose and there is still a long way to go.

There are many fine teachers across the country, some heralded professional names, others whose names are known only to their students and their close friends.

A knowledge of the sport, an interest in all phases, plenty of patience, and the ability to like and get along with people are among the musts. In golf it's an accepted fact that most teaching pros are just that, teaching pros, instructors first, and golfers second.

There many be too much accent on name pros as teachers. Some of them are fine instructors. But some of the great ones, some of the highest scorers, don't realize what they do, don't really know how they do it, and so it's obvious they don't teach. Others know perfectly well what they do and how they do it, but won't or can't impart the knowledge or can't or won't adjust it to a student's game.

All bowling teachers, like all bowling books, help some. A good teacher first must gain the attention of the student, then the respect. Faith in a teach can do wonders, Never discount any instructor because he or she isn't a super star or even a good bowler. Many so so bowlers love the teaching end and spend their effort and energy helping others, and learning more about the sport.
