Pete Weber Wins Record Fifth U.S. Open to Surpass Father Dick Weber and Don Carter

NORTH BRUNSWICK, N.J. – Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., became the most successful bowler in U.S Open history Sunday, winning the most challenging major title in bowling for a record fifth time at Brunswick Zone-Carolier with a strike on his final ball in the 10th frame to nip top qualifier Mike Fagan of Dallas, 215-214.

Weber, who came into the stepladder finals as the No. 4 qualifier, threw clutch shots in three matches to win, but none was more critical than his strike on his final ball in the title match. Needing at least a nine-count spare and strike to win, Weber threw a perfect pocket shot on his first ball, but left a 10 pin. After converting the spare, he threw an identical shot that carried for a strike.

In winning the title, Weber broke a tie with his late father, Professional Bowlers Association legend Dick Weber. and his father's close friend, the late Don Carter, who each won the forerunner to the U.S. Open - the BPAA All Star four times.

"Dad, I know you were watching," Weber said as he looked up toward heaven after the win. "I know you're proud, and I'm sorry I broke your record.

"This is my greatest title ever," Weber said. "To win five U.S. Opens and pass Dick Weber and Don Carter says a lot, but I'll never say I'm better than them. They paved the way for us to be here. It was an honor and a privilege to join them when I won my fourth U.S. Open, and it's even more

of an honor to be the first one to win five.

"This is the tournament I look forward to ever year." he added. "I live for the U.S. Open because I know, no matter what, I have a chance to win.'

At age 49 years, 189 days, Weber became the oldest player ever to win the U.S. Open, breaking the record set by 46year-old Norm Duke last year at Carolier. And he moved into second place on the PBA's all-time major title-winners list with his ninth title, behind only Earl Anthony's 10.

"That's probably the calmest I've ever been needing to throw a shot to win," he added. "Not to toot my own horn, but I think I'm prouder of myself than anyone else. I've always wanted to be the one to throw

a strike to win."

In advancing to the title match, Weber threw critical shots in two preliminary matches, coming from behind to defeat Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y., 223-191, in the opening match and Australia's Jason Belmonte, 225-213, in the semifinal contest.

"I threw strikes in the seventh, eighth and ninth in all three games and put pres-sure on those guys," Weber said. "The way those guys performed was excellent. My hat's off to them. They bowled amazing."

Weber earned \$60,000 and an automatic berth in the Round of 36 for the PBA Tournament of Champions in April. Fagan collected \$30,500, Belmonte \$15,000 and Shafer, continued on page 11

LUNGSANITY in the ABTA as Andrew Lung Wins 4th ABTA Chen and Ath share \$3,500 in Match Game at Chaparral 3-6-9 will be \$700 at Mission Hills and Match Series estimated at \$800 ABTA at Mission Hills for 1 Day. Week 3 of the Handican Bonus

SAN DIMAS — We returned to Chaparral Lanes where we saw 208 entries come out across the two days, enjoy the fun and support the ABTA. The cut scores of +93 for the men on Saturday and +49 on Sunday; +25 for the women on Saturday and -20 Sunday. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Jack Trongale (83), Ely Cruz (81), and for the women Carla Sanchez (49). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 52 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Our top qualifier for the Men was Elvin Godoy with a huge +211. For the women, it was Mary Huynh with a +138. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series. This time it was worth \$366. Elvin Godoy drew a 452. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. We will estimate the Match Series at \$800 at Mission Hills event. The last bowlers for the 3-6-9 roll off this week were George Parker and Ken Morris, they will each get \$25 as a consolation. The pot will be \$700 at Mission Hills.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Louis Evans and Mark Andrews with a 1494 for \$130. Finishing second was Sue Okamoto and Kurt Valmonte with 1491 for \$110. There was a total of \$1,240 paid out in doubles and 20 paid spots with low to cash of 1400.

After bowling the three game semi-finals, the leader was Andrew Lung with a +134, he bowled a good second game to jump out in front

and then held on during the 3rd game. Finishing in 2nd was Jesse Boquio at a +113 to sit out the first round. Our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. Andrew Lung drew a 143. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had two bowlers who shot that score, they were Curtis Chen and Rithy Ath. They shared the pot and got \$1,750 each. We will estimate the pot at \$1,400 for Mission Hills.

This would bring us to our exciting top 16 Match Play finals. Finishing in 3rd place was David Emrich this week for \$200. For those lucky "investors" that had Don as a horse, he paid \$31.

The title game was set, and Andrew, as the top qualifier elected to have Don start the match first this week. Don would leave the 4-6-7-10 split in the first frame and only picked three pins. Up came Andrew and he would leave the 5-9 and miss both pins. Both bowlers would spare the 2nd frame, but it was Andrew who got the first double in the 3rd and 4th frames. But an open in the 5th frame brought this back to a 12 pin match. Don opened in the 6th frame and Andrew was once again up by 20+ pins.
