# **Chris Barnes Wins Emir Cup** for 17th PBA Tour Title

DOHA, Qatar – Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, defeated woman bowler New Hui Fen of Singapore, 493-483, in the two-game championship match to win the H.H. Emir Cup, a World Tenpin Bowling Association/PBA International Tour tournament, Friday at Qatar Bowling Center.

The victory gave Barnes his 17th PBA Tour title and his second PBA International Tour title. He previously won the Columbia 300 Vienna Open in Oct. of 2012. His last U.S. PBA Tour title came in the PBA Viper Championship during World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas.

Fen's scores included an eight handicap pins per game,

an equality handicap provided to women in many international events.

Fen got off to an early lead after the first game of the championship match topping Barnes, 275-257, but Barnes overcame the deficit by beating in the second game, 236-208.

In the semifinal matches Fen defeated Bill O'Neill of Langhorne, Pa., 489-397, and Barnes defeated another top international woman player, Shayna Ng of Singapore, 521-445.

# Silver Lake Atom Splitters Advance to PBA League Semifinal Round

#### Chris Barnes and friends just miss sweep over Dallas Strikers in third quarterfinal round match

ALLEN PARK, Mich. – Chris Barnes and his Silver Lake Atom Splitters dominated Norm Duke and the Dallas Strikers to advance to the semifinal round of the Professional Bowlers Association League Elias Cup competition at Thunderbowl Lanes.

Behind a 205-185 victory in the five-man Baker team finale, Silver Lake, presented by Spiceworks, defeated Dallas, presented by the United States Bowling Congress, in a near-sweep, 5-1. The third in a series of four single-elimination first-round matches in the eight-team PBA League competition aired Sunday on ESPN. One point was awarded to the winner in singles, doubles and trios matches, and three points were awarded to the Baker team winner.

In the singles match, Duke – the only PBA League competitor serving the dual role of team manager and team captain – pulled himself out of his match against Barnes after recording four single-pin spares and one strike in five frames while Barnes started with six strikes for a 52-pin lead. Duke replaced himself with left-hander Rhino Page to give Page more practice on the PBA League lane condition, but it didn't matter. Barnes ran his string of strikes to nine before losing his bid for a perfect game. He left the 4-6-7 split in the 10th frame, but still won the singles point comfortably, 265-208.

Neither team could gener-

ate any momentum in alternate ball doubles. Silver Lake's Barnes and Bryon Smith took a one-pin lead into the 10th frame where Duke struck and then converted Mike Machuga's 3-6-9-10 leave. Smith needed a strike to clinch the win for Silver Lake, but left a 10 pin. Barnes converted the spare, but again needing a strike for a one-pin victory, Smith knocked down eight pins to hand Dallas the doubles point, 195-194.

The Atom Splitters, owned by "Nerdist" creator Chris Hardwick, won the Baker trios point, 213-184. Consecutive strikes by Dom Barrett, Wes Malott and Tommy Jones staked Silver Lake to a 31-pin lead after four frames. The Strikers, owned by NFL all-star receiver Terrell Owens, never mounted a threat, recording only three strikes through nine frames. Dallas continued to struggle in the Baker team finale, failing to record back-to-back strikes until the seventh and eighth frames, but the Strikcontinued on page 7

# RASH, KULICK RETAIN WORLD Bowling tour points leads

PBA Tour champions **Sean Rash** of Montgomery, Ill., and **Kelly Kulick** of Union, N.J., remain atop the men's and women's two-year rolling World Bowling Tour points lists as of the conclusion of the USBC Masters and H.H. Emir Cup in Qatar.

Rash, who won the 2013 World Bowling Tour Men's Finals presented by the PBA, had 648 points after last week's WTBA-PBA International Tour event in Doha, Qatar, while Finland's **Mika Koivuniemi** was second with 603 points, Australia's **Jason Belmonte** third with 558 points followed by **Tommy Jones** of Simpsonville, S.C., at 522 and England's **Dom Barrett** at 493. Emir Cup winner **Chris Barnes** of Double Oak, Texas, earned 50 points and sat in seventh place with 409 points.

Kulick, who added 100 points to her total as the highest female finisher in the Masters, now has 740 points and a huge lead over fellow Americans Liz Johnson (505) of Cheektowaga, N.Y., and **Missy Parkin** (495) of Laguna Hills, Calif. Singapore's **Jazreel Tan** earned 35 points in Qatar to move into fourth place on the women's list with 360 points.

PBA players are in the midst of a four-tournament international swing through the Middle East and Germany. The Kingdom of Bahrain Open in Oman, Bahrain, is currently underway and concludes Friday; the Kuwait Open in Kuwait City follows, March 10-14, and Brunswick Euro Challenge at Dream Bowl Palace in Munich, Germany, concludes the series, March 15-23.

# PBA Announces 12 Tournament PBA50 Tour Schedule for 2014

For the second consecutive year, the season begins with the PBA50 Pasco County Open at Lane Glo Bowl in New Port Richey, Fla., April 12-15, and concludes with the PBA50 Treasure Island Resort and Casino Open presented by Hammer in Welch, Minn., Aug. 10-13.

New stops on the schedule include the PBA50 Dick Weber Super Senior Classic presented by Storm (July 18-20) and the PBA50 Pro Bowl West Fort Wayne Classic presented by Ebonite (July 20-23) at Pro Bowl West in Fort Wayne, Ind. Only players 60 years of age and older will be eligible to enter the super senior event.

The other new venue on the schedule will be Cave Man Bowl in Grants Pass, Ore., which will host the PBA50 Grants Pass Open presented by Track June 20-23.

The Suncoast Senior U.S. Open presented by Dexter will be held June 1-6 at the Suncoast Hotel and Casino to be followed by the USBC Senior Masters at the South Point Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center June 8-13.

The 2014 PBA50 Tour season will see a new crop of top-level players from the PBA Tour eligible to compete, including PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J.

PBA will begin taking entries for PBA50 Tour events beginning Feb. 10.
