

Belmonte Wins GEICO Shark Open for 2nd World Series Title Australian star wins second World Series of Bowling title, extends international dominance • Barnes Bowls 300

LAS VEGAS - Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, rolled the 22nd nationally-televised 300 game in Professional Bowlers Association history during the GEICO Shark Open finals, but he bowled it one game too soon.

After his perfect effort in the semifinal round, Barnes lost in the GEICO Shark Open title to Australia's Jason Belmonte, 244-213, in a match that extended the international dominance in the PBA World Series of Bowling to five consecutive titles. The finals, conducted at South Point Casino and Hotel, aired Sunday on ESPN.

The title was Belmonte's second in the World Series and the third of his PBA career.

The GEICO Shark Open, the fourth and final PBA "animal pattern" championships contested during the third annual PBA World Series of Bowling, almost got the best of Belmonte, who had struggled in the opening game of three previous eliminationformat finals.

In the opening game of the "low man out" Shark finals, Barnes, who led the Shark field in qualifying, posted a 234. Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill., making his fifth straight final, was next with a 205. Belmonte, with a double in the ninth and 10th frames, finished with a 190 to advance when Mika Koivuniemi of Hartland, Mich., failed to double on his first shot in the 10th, leaving a 2-10 split which he failed to convert for a 172 game.

In game two, Barnes was untouchable on his way to winning a \$10,000 perfect game bonus. Belmonte continued to search for strikes, but Rash left splits in the first, third, fifth and seventh frames. Despite converting three of the four, he couldn't throw two strikes in a row and Belmonte survived their battle for the second berth in the title match, 215-182.

In the title match, Bel-

monte almost turned the tables on Barnes, finding his line to the pocket and running off a string of seven strikes to start the game. Barnes started with three strikes, but he then lost his carry. Barnes' 7-10 split on a soft pocket hit in the seventh frame gave the two-handed Australian power player a 51pin lead. Despite an open frame by Belmonte in his seventh,

Barnes was too far behind to make up the difference. "I would have liked to have

thrown the 300 one game later, but I'll still take it," Barnes said. "I can't blame the last game on a bad start. I got out of the gate okay. But Belmo made a ball change, and moved farther inside. My ball started (hooking) a little quicker.

"The killer shot for me was

in the seventh frame. I made the hand position change I thought I needed to make, but all of a sudden my ball was hitting flat like everyone else who has bowled against Belmo, and I left that 7-10. I was pretty much dead at that point. He forced the action, which is what great bowlers do. That's what happens in one-game matches.

"When someone has just shot 300, you know the next game isn't going to be low,' Belmonte said. "It probably won't be 300, but you know it's going to be good. As long as guys don't shoot 300 at me in the title match and there's still a way for me to get the win, they can bowl as many 300s as they want."

Belmonte, who ended a three-year title drought by winning the Chameleon Open earlier in the World Series, said confidence was the key to getting back into the winner's circle

"My physical game is as

sharp as it's ever been," he said. "If I do everything correct, the ball does the work for me. In the past, I was worried about what the ball was going to do rather than just making the shot and letting the ball do the work.

"When I'm bowling in normal competition, I'm always confident and I'm always ready to bowl strikes. But when you continued on page 11

Then that is my 29th career 300 game and my series were 227-209-300 736."

This writer emailed back, "Congrats, Ken. Been a long time and hope that is just a warm-up to get more soon." I could not believe my words when I got the following Flash News email from DeGroff on Friday night.

"Another perfect game and my 30th 300 rolled on Friday March 2nd in Linda's Las Vegas League at Jewel City Bowl. Just bought a new ball Storm Vivid and started hit 300 in first game then 224 and 190 for a 714 series." Congratulations Ken, for making it again, back-to-back two days apart.

For those who do not know Ken DeGroff. Ken became the first deaf or hearing-impaired bowler to hit back-to-back 300s in the late 1980s and later in 1090.made his name in ABC now USBC record book with another back-to-back 300 as bowler with two of them.

GLENDALE, AZ-Forty-seven men and 14 brave women participated in the 28th annual Southern Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association's prestigious Deaf Eliminations held last Feb. 18-19 at Glenfair Lanes at Phoenix suburb of Glendale. All bowled in the 4 games qualifying

round on Saturday with the top 36 going to Sunday's match play rounds. It was a high scoring round with a near perfect 299 by Tucson's Darrell Stogryn and four 270s and three 268 games. Tom Parker, a long time participate in this event who with his wife traveled from Columbus, Oh led with games of 208-197-278-254 for938 plus 105 handicap 1043 total just 13 pins ahead of Stan Booth of Riverside, CA. Booth who is the SN-CDBA Secretary Treasurer had 223- 192-268-203for

Booth of Riverside, CA. Booth who is the SN-CDBA Secretary Treasurer had 223- 192-268-203for 886 plus 83 handicap 1030 for 2nd. Third place went to the eventual runner- up Edwin Miller of Riverside with 179-206278-2741937 plus 83for 1020. Stogryn. a member of Deaf Team USA started with 268, left a 9 pin for his 299 and finished with 194-224 for tournament high scratch 958 plus 32 handicap 1017 for fourth. Two other members of Deaf Team USA Robert Ellison, Alpine CA and Ed Abakumoff, Riverside had qualified. Ellison hit 197- 236-277-204/914plus 73/987for sixth and Abakumoff had242-213- 474-225/851plus 60/911 for 16th. The high low score for 36th cut off was 864.

In Sunday's first round of 3 games match plays, Tom Parker won all 3 matches for 90 bonus points added with his 671 plus 78 handicap 839for1892total to retain his lead. This round's high series 699 plus two wins for 60 points plus 60 handicap gave Miller 819 for 1829 total to move up to 2nd. A woman Phoenix's Araceli Martinez who with 150 average qualified in 8th with 957total, shot over her average 544 winning two matches for 60 points plus her 204 handicap/808 for 1765 to move up to third.

The eventual winner, Scott Butler a 149 average Phoenix bowler who qualified in 19th place with 914, made his move up to 5th by winning all his 3 matches, hitting over his average 548 plus 192 handicap for1739 total. Booth won only one match and fell to 6th with 1725 total. Stogryn also fell to 9th place, as the cut off low for the second round of 3 games match plays was 1633 for 18th place.

In the second round of 3 games match plays for the top 6 bowlers finals, Parker hit 643 and won all 3 matches for the top total of 2693 to retain his lead. The lady Martinez went over her average with 555, winning 2 matches for 2584 to move up to 2nd spot. Miller had 616 but won one match for 2545 to drop to 3rd, Booth improved with 649 and 2 wins for 2542 moving up to 4th and Butler stood in 5th with 530 and 2 wins for 2521 total.

Overlooked was former first woman champion {2004} Kathleen Ferguson, Glendale, AZ who qualified 12th on Saturday with 931 and moved up to 10th in first round match play with 1688. Then she rallied with 501 and 3 wins for 2431 to grab the 6th and last spot for the finals.

The quarterfinals had #1 Parker and #2 Martinez with byes to the semi finals and the one game

match plays with #3 Miller vs.#6 Ferguson and #4 Booth vs. #5 Butler. Ferguson failed in her try for 2nd title as Miller shot 226 to beat her 145 plus 68 handicap 213. Booth did well with 203 plus 36/239 but 149 average Butler won with 177 plus 64/244.

The semi finals paired Parker against Butler and Martinez against Miller. Parker failed to hit his average with 182 plus 26 for 208, losing to Butler's 161 plus 64 / 225. In a close battle Martinez lost in her try for 2nd woman champion as Miller won 236 plus 20/256 to 180 plus 68/248. Butler and Miller moved to Championship finals.

In the title finals Like Parker Miller did not have it with 184 plus 20/204 and surprised Butler just bowled 3 pins over his average 152 plus 64/216 to win the title and \$800. Miller gets \$400 as runner-up. Both Parker and Martinez cashed for over \$200 each while Booth and Ferguson got \$180 and #150 respectively. The 29th annual SN-CDBA tournaments will be at San Diego in February 2013.

DEAF TRAVEL DONE BAD AS TAYLOR LED WITH 768 AT CAL BOWL LAKEWOOD—Only the So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League Secretary-Treasurer Bob Taylor see nothing wrong with the back end lanes at Cal Bowl while the rest of bowlers did badly. Not only did she attend all the association meetings but participated in all the Local, State and National Championship Tournaments. In 1973 Mancini moved to San Gabriel Valley where she worked diligently for Alhambra Valley Lanes; opened Village Lanes in 1978; and from 1980-83 handled special events for Java Lanes, Gable House Bowl, and Saddleback Lanes. Mancini was elected to the SGVWBA Board of Directors in 1979, serving on or chairing most committees; served as President from 1984-1999 and attended State and National Conventions as an elected Delegate for 14 years. Among her many accomplishments on the lanes, Mancini was selected as the 1969 San Diego Bowler of the Year and 1977 California WBA Doubles Champion. Her honors include recipient of the WIBC Joyce Deitch Trailblazer Award; CWBA Distinguished Service Award; WIBC Life Membership; SGVWBA Life Membership; SGVWBA Hall of Fame; and Southern California Bowling Writers Hall of Fame.

put me into the TV arena, my psyche changes and I can feel myself bowling differently," he continued. "Today I felt like me. I felt great. I knew exactly where the ball was going. That's how I was able to get out of that nervous frame of mind."

Belmonte was at a loss to explain why the United States' top stars had not yet won a World Series title, although he wasn't totally surprised.

"In my opinion, the U.S. has by far the best bowlers in the world, but the world is catching up and I think the World Series of Bowling is proving it," he said. "Stu Williams (England), Dom Barrett (England), Osku (Palermaa, Finland), Martin Larsen (Sweden), Andres Gomez (Colombia), Ildemaro Ruiz (Venezuela)...there are so many international players who have now gone past the amateur level.

"It has taken us time for us to learn the tricks of the trade, and to understand the lifestyle (on the PBA Tour) and how to deal with it. But we're at the point where we can come out here and be successful.

"In the past, (the international players) haven't really come to the U.S. a lot and the Americans haven't come to us, but now the PBA Tour and the World Bowling Tour are causing that to happen. It's a cool thing."

PBA World Series of Bowling competition continues on ESPN on Sunday, March 25, at 2:30 p.m. ET with the Mark Roth-Marshall Holman PBA Doubles Championship. Teams in the finals will include Belmonte bowling with PBA Hall of Famer and newly-crowned U.S. Open champion Pete Weber of St. Anne, Mo.; Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., with 2012 USBC Masters winner Mike Fagan of Dallas; international teammates Gomez and Larsen; PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., with Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, and top qualifiers Ronnie Russell of Marion, Ind., with Rash.
