#### Four Of A Kind For Jones WYOMING, MI-History

w YOMING, MI-History was made on the PBA Tour Sunday as Liz Johnson became the first woman to advance to the title match of a PBA Tour event. Johnson lost the match to

Tommy Jones, 219-192, but made history when she defeated Wes Malott, 235-228, in the semifinals of the 2005 PBA Banquet Open at Spectrum Lanes. Jones' victory marked his 4th

Jones Victory marked his 4th title of the season and his career. He becomes the first bowler to win as many as four titles in a season since Parker Bohn III in 2001-02. Jones, Mauldin, S.C., has now won his last eight matches on television and becomes one of the front-runners for PBA Player of the Year.

"It goes on streaks and you never know when it's going to turn around so you just have to keep riding the wave," Jones said of his 8-0 performance on TV this season. "This summer I learned a couple new tricks with my hand which has helped me in my matches and when I bowl

spared, placing her in the title match.

Jones defeated Steve Jaros, Yorkville, Ill., 268-208, to advance to a title game for the fourth time this season. Jaros fell behind by 51 pins after starting the game with an open frame, three spares and two strikes. After the 5th, Jones threw a sixbagger in frames 5 - 10, clinching a spot in the title match.

Liz Johnson The Day After

MICHIGAN–PBA.com participated in a media conference call with Liz Johnson after Sunday's title match of the 2005 PBA Banquet Open. Check out what Liz had to say:

**Q:** Being a female on TV with the PBA, did you feel like you were carrying women's sports on your shoulders Sunday?

A: "I was definitely trying to make a name for myself, and also it was a push in the right direction for women's bowling and women's sports. I just felt maybe if anyone can do it at this point in time, it could be me. Obviously, I tried to go all the way but came up a little short. It was still a great week for me and everybody."

**Q:** What is the biggest difference bowling with the men?

A: "The difference is there's a lot more power players. Men have more power players than women. You have to bowl against a lot more men out here [than women] on the ladies' tour. It's always hard to make a comparison between the two."

**Q:** Did you ever picture yourself in this position when you were bowling as a kid, or were you thinking more about the women's tour?

ing on TV with the women and now also with the men?

A: "It's definitely comparable as far as the way the lanes break down; the lights are very similar. The energy on PBA shows compared to the women's show is just outrageous. I mean, the enthusiasm and the excitement is just unbelievable. It's just something I never thought I'd be able to be a part of. It's just a great feeling.

Q: The support for you Sunday - what was that like and were you even a little bit surprised by it?

A: "It was unbelievable. I mean, I had more fans this week than I think I had in probably the eight years I've been on the ladies' tour. It's just a great feeling. Being the first female to make finals, everyone was just so supportive and so great this week. I can never thank them enough. They were chanting on show, and it was great ... awesome.'

Q: Did you hear from any other female pros on Saturday?

A: "I talked to Carolyn [Dorin-Ballard] two nights ago. Cathy Lizzi left a message to bowl well. I had a message left from Lisa Wagner...a couple of the ladies I used to bowl with on Tour and I used to room with on Tour – Michelle Mullen and Aleta Sill and Lisa Bishop - they sent me congratulatory flowers and balloons [Saturday] after I was done bowling. I had some good support form them."

Q: Did you sense them on your back as you bowled Sunday? Were you representing this whole "forgotten group"?

A: "I try to make a good name for women's bowling and hopefully it would even make a step in the right direction to bring back ladies' tour again. If I have to be the one to do it, and make the TV show like this, I have to be proud of that."

Q: Did you sense any resentment by any of the men during vour charge this week?

A: "All the guys were really supportive toward me. At the end of bowling [Saturday], Wes Malott came over to me and congratulated me and said 'Nice bowling, I'm your next victim.'

I thought that was really cute. All the guys have been just wonderful. I sat with Pete Weber [Saturday] night, and he was just saying to go out and have fun and just enjoy everything, and that was really awesome coming from him. You know, I mean I watched him growing up, too. The rest of the guys - I had crossed with Norm Duke and was really great. Randy [Pedersen] gave me a lot of good advice, too. So, there was never a bad moment towards my bowling."

Q: How many Regional Tour events have you bowled in and how have you done?

A: "As of right now, I've bowled one regional in Buffalo. Actually, it was the week after I made the cut in Wickliffe. I made the cut and that was it, I didn't go any further. I made the cut as non-member at the time. It's the only regional I've bowled in so far. The Regional Program starts up again this week or next week and there's going to be a lot regionals through the summer. I'm going to be bowling as many as I can." Q: Talk about your run this

week and how you felt making that run?

**BOWLING NEWS** 

A: "I think part of me just couldn't believe I was actually in that position; just to be in the cut and bowl the match play top 32. You go in your first match and you have Chris Barnes. Making match play and being a non-exempt player, you get 'lucky' with bowling one of the top seeds. Bowling against Chris, I knew I had to keep striking and put those striking shoes on. I figured that the matches were going to be high. I had to make good shots and basically make it bowling just one game at a time.

"Going through Barnes, obviously, the second game I struck out in the 10th and the third game we both had the front 10, and he shot 300. I just had to keep striking, basically. In the sixth game, we end up tying...we went to sudden death, and for whatever reason, I thought it was a 9th and 10th and not that sudden death was just one ball. He went flat-10. Then I get up there, and first of all, I get up on the wrong lane and I felt like an idiot. Then I

got back off, and I got up there again, of course not knowing that I had to throw just one ball. I thought I had to throw two. I dead flushed it and I thought I had to bowl another shot, so I showed absolutely no emotion whatsoever. Then all of a sudden, I was like 'I'm all done. I just beat Chris Barnes.' That was almost relief, because if I knew I had to throw another shot, I might have been a little bit tighter."

**Q:** You've now proven that women can win on the PBA Tour. Do you think more women will come out here now, or is it vour hope that the women's tour will start up again?

A: "Actually, I'm hoping for both. As of right now, with us not having a tour, I know there's probably a handful of girls that do have their PBA membership. I'm hoping that we will get more girls out here, but at the same time I'm hoping that maybe it gives us some sponsors that say, 'hey look, women can do just as well as the men. Let's go out and put our name out for them, the PWBA.' It'll make a stride for the women's bowling tour to Thursday, March 24, 2005

come back."

Q: Do you think women have always been able to compete on the PBA Tour, or do you think that recent improvements in equipment technology have made it more possible?

A: "I think it's a little bit of both. I mean, I think the men are stronger physically, but women are just as strong in a mental capacity. In the recent years with the stronger equipment coming out, which has helped me a lot, I may not have the power like some of the men. Definitely the equipment has helped me to score as high as the men.

Q: You said the end of the show was a big relief. What did you mean by that, and looking back, what was most satisfying to you?

A: "I think the whole week has been unbelievably satisfying. I guess going toward the end of the week, when I was bowling match play with Chris and Mike, and then [Saturday] just making the top 8 - my nerves were going like crazy. I didn't get much sleep and I couldn't eat as well as I had hoped. The same thing with [Sunday] - my nerves were just butterflies in my stomach. Once it was all over I just felt everything kind of relax. All that adrenaline got me to where my body at one point was relaxed and almost numb. It was a relief for all those nerves to get out of my system.'

Q: What did you think of Wes's foul in the 10th frame?

A: "Wes fouled in the 3rd frame and he split, but because it was a foul they had to re-rack and he was on a strike, so he picked it up. Then he got up in 10th and did the same thing, he fouled. I thought because of his reaction he just got the ball in a little bit and just didn't like the way he threw it, and he struck. I didn't realize it was a foul. And I'm thinking in the back of my head, 'well, here's another shot.' I just said to myself, 'just do the same thing I've been doing the entire game.' I knew I had a good shot the entire game."

# **Gissendaner Wins 1st ABTA at Forest Lanes**

McIntosh, Harman and Mr. Brackets share \$2,040 Match Game Match Series and 3-6-9 Carry Over to Bowling Square this week

LAKE FOREST-Gilbert Gissendaner, of San Clemente won his first ABTA title in fine style and doing it the hard way as he downed five straight opponents in the top 16 Single Elim finals to take home a nice \$1,040. He downed the "hot" top seed Jeff Taino in the title game to win our first event at Forest Lanes in some time in an early event that featured only three squads and great hospitality.

Gilbert bested a decent turnout of 117 bowlers (3 squads only) in the Special Event, which featured three members sharing a \$2,040 Match game and near perfectos by Ron Chandler and Javier Avila.

The cut scores on a very fair condition were +58(men), and -5 "oops" for the ladies and we returned 39 bowlers to the Semifinals. Also added to the Semis were the Super Seniors Jim Sims, Bobbie Mc Collum and Phil Diaz who bowls anything but a Super Senior :-) Leading the Semis was ABTA Veteran Jeff Taino of Chino Hills with his fine +111 to be top seed, sit out and bowl for the title. He was followed by Super Sr. Phil Diaz at +127 of Temecula who would receive a first round bye in the single elims and enter in round two. It took a +39 men to make the finals which included three women in the top 16 finals.
