All WCST Scoring Records Broken at Pahrump Nugget Lanes Erik Forkel Wins Seniors Barry Gurney Wins Super Seniors

PAHRUMP—WOW! What a weekend for high scores, this past week-end as all WCST Scoring records were broken.

At Pahrump Nugget Lanes in Pahrump, NV. Erik Forkel, won his 13th WCST Championship for the Senior Division. 51 bowlers entered this tournament, and only one bowler was minus for the 10 game qualifying. Eric led the qualifying of a small field of only 14 seniors, with a 2569 score, and the 14 players, 140 games, in that division averaged 229 per man in the qualifying, and in the finals, 239.4 per game for 28 games. In the super senior division, for 370 games in qualifying, 223.3 per game, and in the finals, for 100 games, 240.2 per game. 126 games of 250 or better, which included five 300 games, and five 299 games., were bowled in both divisions. The 300 Games bowled by Eric Forkel, Bernie Iwasczynszyn, Craig Spiess, Bill Stempke, and Stan Winters.. In the finals for the Seniors Eric Forkel, the qualifying leader was challenged very well by 2nd place finisher, MikeClemence, for the 7 games, but pulled away to win

by 116 pins, and the top 1st place prize of \$800.00. Eric averaged 252 for the qualifying and finals, a totals of 17 games, 2nd place to Mike Clemence, \$600.00, 3rd, Marc Levy, \$400.00, and 4th to Tom Spigelmoyer, \$380.00. For the tournament 4 places in the seniors paid, and 12 checks to the super seniors, which included 11th place and a high series out of higher money for a 70 years plus. The total money paid out for the tournament. \$7,980.00, giving a total of \$36,710.00 paid out, and for 302 tournaments, a grand total of \$3,512,791.00 paid out. Eric Forkel used a Natural Eurothane ball in this.

USBC Hall of Famer Bill Bunetta Dies at 90

ARLINGTON — Bill Bunetta, a United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame member, died March 22 in Fresno, Calif., of heart failure. He was 90.

A Professional Bowlers Association charter member, he was asked to be the PBA's first commissioner when the pro tour was formed in 1958. But since he still was competitive as a bowler, he turned down the position.

He won his only PBA Tour title in Fairless Hills, Pa., in 1960, and was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame in 1968.

In addition to being a talented competitor on the lanes, Bunetta was one of bowling's most respected instructors. His inventive coaching techniques included the innovative "3-6-9"

Brian Kretzer Ends 167-Event Winless Streak Claims Title in Go RVing Match Play Championship

NORWICH, Conn. — Brian Kretzer of Dayton, Ohio, ended his 167-event winless streak Sunday, defeating 13-time Professional Bowlers Association title winner Patrick Allen of Wesley Chapel, Fla., 629-566, in the three-game title match of the Go RVing Match Play Championship at Norwich Bowling and Entertainment Center Sunday.

Kretzer, at age 43, became the sixth Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour competitor to win his first singles title during the 2009-10 season.

Kretzer, the No. 27 seed entering the 64-player single-elimination match play tournament, took a 192-185 lead after the first game, but ran away from Allen, the No. 21 seed, in the second game, 241-167. With an 81-pin lead going into the final game, it was a matter of filling frames. Allen's 214-196 win in the third game wasn't enough. "It's been a long time," Kretzer said. "I'm



happy and I know my mom's happy. It's nice to win, whether it's your first time or your 10th. I had a lot of success as an amateur before I joined the PBA, but this kind of completes my career. Now I've won at every level."

Kretzer said his new-found success was a matter of turning back the clock. "I went back to what I was doing in the '90s

when I was an amateur," he said. "I was carrying the ball through my approach instead of pushing. Now I can feel the ball again. I can do what I want to do with it. I could always hook the ball, but now I can play straighter, too."

Playing straighter was critical because the Go RVing Match Play Championship used a different lane condition on each lane. The left lane on each pair used a long-oil Shark pattern while the right lane used a shorter Cheetah lane condition. Playing straighter on the Cheetah lane was the key to Kretzer's victory, and the primary reason Allen struggled.

"The Cheetah lane was a little different than yesterday, but I threw a lot of bad shots," Allen said. "I never got com-

fortable on that lane, and when you are playing two extremely different angles, if you're not comfortable on one lane, you're not going to be comfortable on either.

"Brian took advantage. When you get a guy down in a tournament like this, you're supposed to stomp on him, and that's what he did."

Kretzer and Allen both grew up in the game as high-stakes amateurs. "We've know each other since we were kids," Kretzer said. "We crossed paths a lot, even though we didn't bowl each other head-to-head very often.

He went on to win 13 PBA titles and I hadn't won until today, but I do have one thing over him now," Kretzer smiled. "He's never beaten me in a title match."

Desire to Attend His Own Tournament Drives Mark Roth's Recovery Efforts

FULTON, N.Y. - Over the past few weeks, the intensity and desire that carried Mark Roth to 34 Professional Bowlers Association Tour titles has started to return. The 58-year-old hall of famer – the bowler who was recognized as the fifth-best in PBA history just a year ago – has been working harder than he has in years, trying to get ready for his next tournament.

But when Mark Roth makes his appearance at the GEICO Mark Roth Plastic Ball Championship at AMF Babylon Lanes in West Babylon, N.Y., March 24-28, it will be dramatically different than any he has ever made before. He will arrive at the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour event named in his honor in a wheelchair.

The fact of the matter is, since suffering a severe stroke on May 31 that paralyzed the entire left side of his body, Mark Roth has been in a battle for his life, his wife, Denise Roth, disclosed today. The stroke was bad enough, but Roth also suffers from diabetes and heart disease, and complications that seemed to arise on an almost daily basis.

But about six weeks ago, she said, Mark suddenly began to arise from the frustration and despair, and it's all because he wants to attend his own tournament.

"I have some great news," Denise said last Friday. "Mark has not had to go into the emergency room or anything in about six weeks. He seems to be much stronger. He still has very little use of his left arm, leg, ankle and hand, but he has gained some weight and looks more like the old Mark Roth.

"Most of his facial paralysis is gone. Most of his speech is back and pretty clear. He's had a lot of problem with his left shoulder, hand, arm, but he's going to get a Botox treatment that will help him make the trip to Long Island. He has been working so diligently just to get to that tournament. He doesn't want to miss it.

"Oh, boy, at this point I'm just so happy to see him making some progress. That's good medicine for me, too. It's something that's keeping him working hard. For a while, I wasn't sure he was going to be able to make the trip. We're keeping our fingers crossed that he'll hold up."

In the weeks following his stroke, Denise said she did her best to maintain a positive outlook, for herself and for Mark, but things had not been going well. He was in and out of hospital with all kind of complications. I honestly thought things were going to end. But over the last six weeks, everything has all of a sudden started to come together for him.

"He can walk a short distance now – not real good, but he can use a quad cane (Roth is unable to use a walker because he has no use of his left hand). He has all of his long-term memory, but he has some short-term difficulty," she continued. "He is probably going have to rest quite a bit, but this is such good medicine for him. He needs something like this to up-lift him.

"I think people will be surprised to see how well he does look at this point. About six weeks ago, it seemed pretty hopeless."

Denise Roth also said Mark's drive to make the trip to Long Island is also fueled by the couple's desire to say "thank you" to the incredible out-pouring of support they have received.

"Wow, I believe in the power of prayer more than I did before," she said. "I want to thank everyone we can. The prayers and donations have been incredible. Because of the donations we have received, the extra rehab he has been able to get has been astronomical. From now on, it's rehab, rehab, rehab, just to get back as much function as he can.

"We've heard from people in Afghanistan, Israel, from all over the world," she continued. "There actually is a guy named Jeffrey – he's in the U.S. Air Force – who sent Mark a coin he kept in his pocket for good luck while flying missions over Afghanistan. He sent that coin to Mark.

"We got a letter from a cute elderly lady named Lula with a card and \$10. She asked how I was doing, and said she knows the wife usually gets overlooked, and that she'd send me a million dollars if she could. All of the cards and letters have been so touching..."

In another week, Mark and Denise Roth will arrive in West Babylon, where they will try to set aside the stress and anxieties of the past 10 months. Rather than bowling for a 35th career title, to try to break his tie for third place on the all-time list with Pete Weber, Mark Roth will watch today's stars – young and old – try to weave the same kind of magic he produced when his radical grip-it-and-rip-it technique with low-tech plastic bowling balls revolutionized the sport back in the 1970s.

"We both need to have a little fun, and nothing could be better than for him to have a chance to spend some time with his second family," she smiled. "After all, Mark Roth is bowling, and bowling is Mark Roth."

The GEICO Mark Roth Plastic Ball Championship is a unique event in which 64 PBA members will use identical plastic bowling balls bearing Mark Roth's likeness. The special limited-edition bowling balls, created by OnTheBallBowling.com, are available through the company's website for \$100. A portion of the proceeds benefit a Mark Roth medical assistance fund.

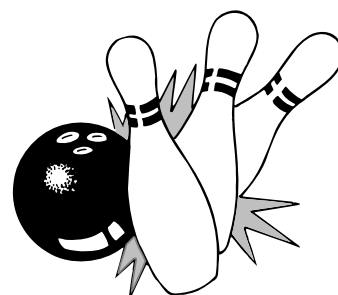
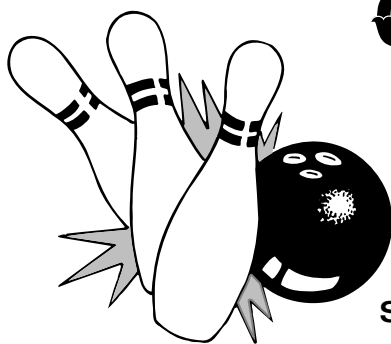



He was a member of the E&B and Pfeiffer teams in Detroit, and the Munsingwear team of Chicago that contributed to his five American Bowl-ing Congress Championships (now USBC Open Championships) titles be-tween 1949 and 1955.

In 1995, at age 76, he became the oldest bowler in history to roll back-to-back 300 games.

Malucci's New Streak Of 15 Consecutive 700 Ends

LAS VEGAS — Carl Malucci, the hearing impaired lefthander who last season crashed into USBC record books with 17 consecutive 700s in two leagues and also in one league at Red Rock Bowl in Las Vegas, had another try at it this season. But it ended at 14 when Malucci e-mailed, “It is what it is (at 15) and it was a good ride”.

Also, “The string has ended at 15 last night (March 15). Had a rough time shooting 630, left 14 solid 7 pins all night. Did shoot 742 the night before but was not able to keep it together last night”.

It was a good try and the 15 is a good number that could get Malucci's name again in the USBC record book as tied for 3rd place with two other bowlers. His Wednesday night league secretary should get busy to send the proof of dates, games and series to Mark Miller at the USBC Bowling Records Office. Last season I was surprised that his league secretary did not do it and luckily I had the proof of Malucci's 17 in a row so I send them to Miller who checked and had it approved as the new record.

Malucci's latest 15 included a 300 and two 800s (857 and 805). Bowling 15 700s in a row is not easy as Ken DeGroof, the other hearing impaired whose name is already in USBC record books for multiple back to back 300s, admitted, Ken tried this season and the bet he did was eight in a row.

This Season May Be Frank Gallo's Best As PBA Senior Bowler

This writer had followed the deaf professional bowler Frank Gallo Jr. ever since he joined the PBA as its first deaf member back in the early 1970's. Gallo of Cape Carteret, NC, now a super senior on the PBA Senior Tour, had his cashes in some tournaments for years and his biggest one was an East Regional tournament title two seasons ago as his first title in 36 years as a member.

Now in his 38th year, this may be his best season for the first time. He is listed so high in several Senior South Regional statistics records to date. If he continues to improve or maintain better positions, he could be the 2nd deaf bowler since Pete Kaczmarczyk to be invited to bowl in the elite PBA Regional Players Invitational (RPI) this December.

According to the rules, the top 5 players from the senior RPI list will be invited to the 2010 RPI. The top 8 players from the senior RPI qualifying tournaments will also be invited to the 2010 RPI. The RPI is scheduled at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, NV in December 2010.

So in March Senior South Regional Senior RPI points (10/1/2009-9/30/2010) has Frank Gallo Jr. (ss) ranked 7th with 43,798 points in 6 events as the great senior bowler Tom Baker is 1st with 100,629 points in 6 events. Last month Gallo was ranked 3rd with 90,714 points in 9 events and Baker 1st with 154,380 in 9 events but the 4 events were removed and Gallo lost 47,000 points and Baker 54,000 points.

For total cashes (Beginning April 1, 2009), Gallo Jr. ranked 4th with 11 events \$4,250.00 while Baker is 1st with 10 events \$8,415.000.

In averages standing, Gallo Jr. is 10th with 211.65 for 131 games as Brian Brazeau, is 1st with 224.29 for 58 and Baker 2nd with 223.75 for 152.

In 96 cashes (Beginning April 1, 2009), Gallo Jr. is third in 8 out of 11 tournamets for 72.73% while Baker is 1st with 10 of 10 for 100%.

In making finals, Gallo Jr. is 7th with 5 in 11 for 45.45% as Baker is 1st, 9 of 10 for 90%. Baker had won two tournaments and we do not know Gallo's best finish.

Also in this season, Gallo competed in PBA East Regional and cashed for \$425. Let's hope that he continues to improve as the PBA Senior Tour starts in April.
