The "COLOR BARdavs. RIER" precluded his competing in a league. However, pin setting allowed him to bowl before or after hours. He took advantage of the opportunity and made himself into a scratch bowler.

During his middle years he stepped away from our sport to concentrate on family and career. Bowling was always on his mind and dear to his heart.

Then after twenty-five years he was able to get back on the lanes, in 2003.

He restarted at Riverside Lanes and before long rolled his first 300 at age 70! The perfecto was part of his personal high series 785 (245 - 240 - 300). That's when Elliout got serious, started practicing regularly and joined three leagues. His game took continued on page 2

L.A. X Meets NYC WTT KingPins in First PBA League Semifinal at 2 p.m. Sunday on ESPN



ALLEN PARK, - With actor/comedian Kevin Hart's Philadelphia Hitmen presented by High 5 Gear winning Sundav's PBA League quarterfinal match against NFL linebacker LaMarr Woodley's Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits presented by Hotel Planner.com, the semifinal field is set for the stretch run to capture the 2014 PBA League Elias Cup.

The first semifinal match will pit Los Angeles Clippers star Chris Paul's L.A. X presented by GoBowling.com vs. tennis legend Billie Jean King's defending champion New York City WTT KingPins presented by GEICO this Sunday at 2 p.m. on ESPN.

In each PBA League round, teams are competing for points in a head-to-head series of matches that include singles, alternate-ball doubles, Baker trio and Baker team formats. One point is awarded for a win in the singles, doubles and trios contests with three points awarded for a Baker team win. Should there be a tie at the conclusion of the match. a one-ball sudden-death roll-off will determine the winner.

In Sunday's semifinal, 2012-13 PBA Player of the Year Jason Belmonte of L.A. X

will battle PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of the KingPins in the opening singles match.

In the alternate-shot doubles match, Weber will team with John Szczerbinski in a match against L.A X's 13time Tour winner Mika Koivuniemi and Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III.

In trios, L.A. X's Belmonte, two-time Tour winner Andres Gomez and 2012-13 PBA Rookie of the Year E.J. Tackett will meet the KingPins' Jake Peters, Tour champion Stuart Williams and three-time Tour winner Scott Norton.

the KingPins' Weber, Peters, Szczerbinski, Norton and Williams will bowl against L.A. X's Koivuniemi, Tackett, Gomez, Belmonte and Bohn.

On Sunday, April 6, the second semifinal match will feature the Silver Lake Atom Splitters presented by Spiceworks vs. the Hitmen at 10 a.m. on ESPN.

The winning semifinal teams will advance to the PBA League Elias Cup Finals which will air on Sunday, April 13, at 11 a.m. on ESPN from Brunswick Zone Carolier in North Brunswick, N.J..

900 Series Rolled in Delaware

ARLINGTON, TX - Todd James of East New Market, Md., added three memorable perfect games to his resume as he rolled 36 consecutive strikes for a 900 series at Bryan's Bowling Center in Laurel, Del., on Tuesday night.

The 31-year-old righthander was bowling as a lastminute substitute in the Tuesday Night Mixed league and struck on every shot he threw to become the 23rd bowler in history to record a perfect series. The achievement is pending approval from the United States Bowling Congress and would be the 24th USBC-approved 900. "I don't usually have any problems finding the shot there, but last night, I just couldn't get lined up in practice," James said. "I didn't throw a strike until the last shot, but then I was in the pocket the rest of the night."

James' longest string of strikes previously was 20, and once he got past that point, the nerves started to set in. As he got closer to the end of the third game, he also was in position for the center's strike jackpot, so everyone took notice.

"Once I got through the eighth frame of the third game, people started to realize I hadn't missed all night," said James, whose daughters, Chloe, 11, and Alyssa, 7, got to see him shoot 300 for the first time. "It's not a big place, just 14 lanes of four-person teams, but no one left." A break in the ninth frame of the final game collapsed the 4-6-7-10 split, but James felt good about his last three shots, despite being more nervous than ever before. His final offering briefly left the 10 pin standing, before a messenger continued on page 4

Philadelphia Hitmen Sweep Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits Roll into PBA League Semifinal Round

ALLEN PARK - Bill O'Neill and his Philadelphia Hitmen recorded the first sweep in the 2014 Professional Bowlers Association League Elias Cup eliminations, knocking the Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits out of the tournament at Thunderbowl Lanes and atoning for a disappointing finish to their 2013 campaign.

A 235-225 victory in the five-man Baker team finale completed Philadelphia's 6-0 sweep of the singles, alternate ball doubles, Baker trios and Baker team competition and landed the Hitmen, owned by actor/comedian Kevin Hart, a berth in the semifinal round against the Silver Lake Atom Splitters. The battle of Pennsylvania, the fourth and final single-elimination quarterfinal round match in the eight-team PBA League competition, aired Sunday on ESPN. It was a redeeming performance for the Hitmen, presented by High 5 Gear, who were in position to make the Elias Cup finals in 2013 only to fade in the final qualifying round to finish sixth.

"It bothered me a lot that we did as bad as we did last year," O'Neill said. "We had a bad last day. If we had avoided that, we would have been fine. But we're back this year with a couple of different guys and it's turned out well because they've done nothing but strike so far. We didn't lose a game, so that's about as good as it gets.

"Now we have the supposed 'dream team' next, so hopefully we'll be able to beat their butts," O'Neill added, referring to a Silver Lake team loaded with past PBA Players of the Year Chris Barnes, Tommy Jones and Wes Malott as well as 2013 POY contender Dom Barrett and 2003 USBC Masters champion Bryon Smith.

O'Neill started the sweep of the Jack Rabbits, presented by HotelPlanner.com, with a 215-212 win in the singles match against Jack Rabbits' team captain Osku Palermaa, taking advantage of a pair of splits and open frames by the Finnish two-handed player in the second and third frames. Palermaa recovered from his mistakes with a string of five strikes. Needing two strikes in the 10th frame to complete his rally, he left a 10 pin on his first shot.

Dan MacLelland and Ryan Ciminelli kept the Philadelphia momentum rolling in the alternate ball doubles match, striking on eight of their first nine shots en route to a 257-239 win over Pittsburgh's Ronnie Russell and Eugene McCune. The Jack Rabbits, owned by newly-signed Oakland Raiders all-pro linebacker LaMarr Woodley, never wilted, however. In the Baker trio match, Philadelphia's O'Neill, Josh Blanchard and Mike DeVaney again set a torrid pace, striking on eight of their first nine shots, but led by only one pin heading into ninth frame. O'Neill's spare in the 10th gave Palermaa a chance to win for Pittsburgh with two strikes in his final frame, but he left the 4-9 split to end the threat and Philadelphia won, 256-251.

The Hitmen, who are managed by PBA Hall of Famer Jason Couch, completed the sweep with a dominating team effort. Open frames in the fifth and eighth frames hindered the Jack Rabbits, but they used a barrage of strikes to remain in contention until O'Neill's 10th-frame spare locked up the win. "They never gave us any breathing room," Pittsburgh team manager Tim Mack said. "It was a matter of one shot here and there that made the difference. We were in every match until the 10th frame, but it wasn't our day."

The PBA League now moves into the semifinal round where the defending champion New York City WTT KingPins, owned by women's sports legend Billie Jean King and led by team captain Pete Weber, will meet L.A. X, owned by Los Angeles Clippers star Chris Paul and led by captain Jason Belmonte, on ESPN on Sunday, March 30, at 2 p.m. The Hitmen will bowl the Silver Lake Atom Splitters, owned by "Nerdist" creator Chris Hardwick and led by Barnes, on ESPN on Sunday, April 6, at 10 a.m. The two semifinal round winners will battle for the Elias Cup on ESPN on Sunday, April 13, at 11 a.m.

U.S. Collegiate Star Marshall Kent Wins Brunswick Euro Challenge in Munich Team USA, Robert Morris-Illinois amateur tops Sweden's Daniel Fransson for victory

MUNICH, Germany (March 23, 2014) - Amateur Marshall Kent of Yakima, Wash., a member of Team USA and a collegiate all-American with the Robert Morris University-Illinois team, won the 11th annual Brunswick Euro Challenge at Dream-Bowl Palace Sunday, striking on 10 of his first 11 shots in a near-perfect 277-258 victory over Sweden's Daniel Fransson.

Kent, who reached the television finals in the 2013 U.S. Open and the PBA Scorpion Championship during the PBA World Series of Bowling V, where he competed on a special invitation, earned 11,111 Euros (US\$15,300), but he doesn't get credit for a PBA title because he is an amateur.

The Brunswick Euro Challenge is a World Bowling Tour, PBA International Tour and European Bowling Tour event.

Fransson eliminated the PBA Tour's last hope for the Brunswick Euro Challenge title when he defeated Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio, 255-226, in the semifinal match.

The tournament drew a field of 343 players from 33 countries, including a strong contingent of PBA Tour players. Twenty-one PBA members advanced to Sunday's 64-player final rounds.

The PBA Tour will resume competition in the U.S. May 18-25 with the Oklahoma's Grand Hotel Resort Summer Swing in Shawnee, Okla.

FISSER'S 289-299/1046 HI-LITES DEAF TRAVEL'S GOOD DAY AT JEWEL CITY BOWL

GLENDALE — The bowlers of Southern California Deaf Traveling League wiped off the previous bad overall bowling at Brunswick Covina Lanes and enjoyed a spectacular striking exhibition by Dan Flores, Mark Fisser and Bob Jones at Jewel City Bowl.

The show began with Flores' closing 6 strikes in first game and 2nd game's front 7 strikes for a 13 strikes in row "Varipapa 300" in scores of 226 and 247. Then Fisser, who had 244 and 214 in his duel with Flores, gave a fine display of 10 strikes in row and a pocket hit 7 pin ruined a chance for a 300 game. The bowlers moaned along with Fisser as he spared for a 289.

Surprise! In the 4th game, Fisser was stringing strikes again and this time he had 11 in row all in the pocket. His 12th ball was right in the pocket like the others and the darn 7 pin refused to fall. No 300 for Mark, just a 299 game, the third 299 game in this league's 54 years history joining him with David Bright and Mike Moore.

Quietly and unnoticed by many, Jones who hit his third career 300 game a couple weeks ago in his Monday Night League at Harley's Simi Valley Bowl, strung some strikes in his 4th game for a 265.

For the league day's honor roll, Fisser's games 244-214-289-299 produced a possible league record 1046 four games series. Flores had 226-247-213-190 for 876 and Jones hit 195-190-201-265 for 851. Ed Abakumoff joined them with 189-182-214-199 for 784, Gorman Low too with 702 and Jeff Stansell with his 203.

Also Fisser's 1046 along with teammates Jim Mohr's 657 and Emad Aranki's 669 gave their team Anaheim season high 2372 team series possibly a league record. Anaheim's team games were 565-572-608-627. Previously Abakumoff's Riverside held the season high team series 2256 and Stansell's Mid City retains the season high team game with 640.

On this day the 3 strongest average teams dominated with near sweeps over 2 lesser average teams. Second place Fisser's Anaheim nearly swept Flores' 5th place S F Valley 18.5-1.5 to cut first place Jones' Eagle Rock lead to 9 points. Eagle Rock retains 1st place with 15 to 5 win over MacMonagle's 6th place Orange County. Fourth place Abakumoff's Riverside with a 14-6 win, exchanged places with former 3rd place Stansell's Mid City for the only change in the standings.

Overlooked by Fisser's dominating striking display in his last two games, was his winning the league's optional Masters title finals against Flores. Fate in scheduling had it perfect with the match of both on the same pair of lanes. In prior matches Fisser had no loss and Flores just one loss and after the first two exciting games Flores had a 15 pins (473-458) lead. Fisser made sure there was no need for a rematch of title finals at Gable House Bowl.

The league thanks Jewel City Bowl management and staff for having an excellent lane conditioning for the bowlers. Next stop on schedule will be at Gable House Bowl on April 6 at Noon. Gable House Bowl is the home of Dan Flores' 300 game last November.

solidified his place in the record books.

"Standing there and waiting for that 10 pin to go down felt like forever, like in the movies," said James, who runs an earlymorning snack route. "Afterwards, we were all pretty excited. I couldn't believe it."

Bryan's Bowling Center is about a 30-minute drive from East New Market, but James has been bowling there since it opened in 2009. He recorded a career-high average of 235 there last season and is on pace to beat that this year. He bowls regularly at Bryan's on Monday nights and bowls as a substitute when he can the rest of the week.

Henry Grabowski Jr. previously held the house record at Bryan's Bowling Center with 858, shot in January 2013, while the previous state record belonged to Ron Prettyman, who rolled games of 300, 299 and 300 for an 899 series at Holiday Lanes in Claymont, Del., in February 1996.

The first USBC-approved 900 occurred Feb. 2, 1997 when Jeremy Sonnenfeld rolled three consecutive perfect games in Lincoln, Neb. There never has been a Sport-certified 900 series.

He was elected as a youth director to the St. Louis USBC Board for the 2013-2014 season and also was appointed to the Missouri State USBC Youth Committee.

"In the time that I have been on the St. Louis USBC Youth Committee, I have learned more about bowling than I could have ever imagined," Hochecker said.

Oklahoma's Grand Casino Resort to Host PBA Summer Swing *FireLake Bowling Center in Shawnee to host qualifying, match play in May*

SEATTLE – The Professional Bowlers Association's 2014 Summer Swing, a multi-tournament event that will be televised by CBS Sports Network, will be hosted by Grand Casino Resort and FireLake Bowling Center in Shawnee, Okla., May 18-25, PBA Commissioner Tom Clark announced today.

The Summer Swing will include four PBA Tour title events – the Wolf, Bear and Badger Opens and the PBA Oklahoma Open – and the Oklahoma's Grand Casino Resort Summer King of the Swing special event involving four winners plus a "wild card" player. All five television finals will air on CBS Sports Network on Tuesday nights in June and July. Tournament qualifying and match play rounds will be held at FireLake Bowling Center and the stepladder finals will be conducted on specially-constructed lanes in the Grand Casino Resort Events Center.

"The PBA is really excited about returning to Oklahoma and giving the great bowling fans in that area an opportunity to watch a new generation of PBA stars compete in a challenging series of events in the awesome settings of FireLake Bowling Center and the Grand Casino Resort's Events Center," Clark said. "It's been nearly a decade since the PBA Tour had an event in Oklahoma, so we were extremely happy that Grand Casino Resort and FireLake have invited us back.

"It's going to be a fabulous event," Clark added. "We're going to bowl for four PBA Tour titles, conduct a King of the Swing special event, and provide PBA fans around the world with more than 50 hours of live coverage on Xtra Frame in addition to 10 hours of nationally-televised coverage on CBS Sports Network."

The Summer Swing concept, introduced in 2013 in Milwaukee, produced a pair of first-time PBA Tour titlists (Chris Loschetter of Avon, Ohio, in the Wolf Open and Jake Peters of Decatur, Ill., in the Badger Open) plus victories for Australia's Jason Belmonte (Bear Open), Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas (Milwaukee Open) and "wild card" Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla. (Summer King of the Swing).

The tournaments will be the first PBA Tour events held in Oklahoma since the 2005 Tulsa Championship at The Lanes at Coffee Creek, won by Tommy Jones of Simpsonville, S.C. The eight-day program also will include a PBA Southwest Region tournament over Memorial Day weekend.

The Summer Swing will be limited to a field of 120 players. Entry fee is \$750 for PBA members or \$850 for non-members. Entry fees cover all events; entries are not available for individual tournaments. The Southwest Regional event also will be capped at 120 players. Entry fee will be \$220 (\$285 for non-members).

All qualifying and preliminary match play rounds of the summer swing events will be covered live on PBA's exclusive online bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

Grand Casino Resort is a full-service complex featuring a 262-room Grand Hotel that opened in 2013, restaurants, a golf course and other amenities.

Air dates and times for the PBA Oklahoma Summer Swing will be announced at a later date.

BURBANK — How many times have you heard bowlers complain about their opponent's handicap being so much greater than their own team? Handicap was created to level the playing field, right? The only way this can be effective, in my opinion, is the handicap must be 100% of the highest average. However, if you do that, you may as well bowl scratch.

Team averaging handicap seems to be quite effective though few leagues employ it. I've even heard scratch bowlers complaining about certain teams averages. A team max set in a league is a constant. Rules can be twisted to shift the equality, however. This is why it is important to attend the league meeting.

For everyone, not just the team captains. Be aware of the rules being proposed. My mantra regarding this (as well as governmental issues) is if you don't vote, don't complain. In a nutshell, attend your meeting and participate. After all, it is your league too.

to end up being a contest of who can strike from the furthest point left on the lane. When reigning PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash seemed to be running out of room to the left in the semifinal match against Belmo, it seemed as if PDW would've been doomed to suffer the same outcome.

But come on, we are talking about PDW bowling for a major title. And after watching him dismantle Belmo, it only further cemented in my mind that he is beyond a shadow of a doubt the Greatest Of All Time.

One could make the same arguments for the late Earl Anthony, Walter Ray Williams Jr. and a handful of other great bowlers through the years. And while the two men I just mentioned may possess more accomplishments on their resumes, none of them have overcome what PDW has. He has had to battle things in his personal life that have destroyed the lives of many athletes. Yet he has persevered. He also had a father who not only could hold his own in this debate, but was also the greatest ambassador our sport has ever had in Dick Weber. No player in the history of our sport, or many others, has had a greater shadow to overcome to establish their own legacy to rival or exceed what the other has accomplished. Pete Weber has done this. He sits tied for 3rd most victories in tour history, tied for most major victories, and has the most regional titles in PBA history. No name is more synonymous with greatness in bowling than the Weber name.

Forget the fact that he has never won a Player of the Year award. In all reality there are many years the voters kept him from having that honor. When its all said and done he will have the best title of all...and that's the greatest bowler ever.
