WEST BABYLON-Brian Ziesig of Levittown, N.Y., won the Professional Bowlers Association GEICO Mark Roth Plastic Ball Championship Sunday at AMF Babylon Lanes to become the first amateur to win a Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour event since 2002.

Ziesig rolled three strikes in the 10th frame in the championship match to tie Australian two-hander Jason Belmonte 247-247 in regulation which forced a one-ball, suddendeath roll-off that was won by Ziesig with a strike to Belmonte's nine-count in which he left the 7 pin.

"Whenever I tried to overhook the ball, it seemed I wouldn't get the carry so those last few shots I paid special attention to avoiding that," Ziesig said. "Believe it or not I really wasn't that nervous so that helped me throw those shots the way I wanted to."

Ziesig became the first amateur to win a Tour title since Brett Wolfe won the 2002 United States Bowling Congress Masters.

This is my 15 minutes of fame" said the 35-year-old Ziesig, who works for a local bowling supply company. "It's

back to work tomorrow morning. To be able to accomplish this on national TV in front of a hometown crowd is really

kind of a fantasy.' Ziesig, who earned \$25,000 for the win, had been a Touring professional in the 1998, '99 and 2000 seasons with a previous best finish of 10th. He earned his way into the tournament field through a tour qualifying round earlier in the week.

The 26-year-old Belmonte, who earned \$13,000 for second, was hoping to win his second career title having won The Bowling Foundation Long Island Classic here last year to become the first bowler to win a PBA Tour title using a twohanded delivery.

"The best you can hope for is to throw 10 good shots but I threw nine-what can vou do?" said Belmonte, who finished second for the third time this season. "I left that 10 pin in the eighth frame because I got behind the ball too much and I just didn't get the break.'

In the opening stepladder match, Wayne Garber of Modesto, Calif., defeated two-time Tour titlist Michael Michael Machuga of Erie,

pation among women and youth bowlers, a stark contrast to the misperception that bowling is dominated by older males," said Steve Johnson, executive director of the BPAA. "Now more than 60% of all bowlers are under the age of 34 and half are women."

Added Johnson, "Additionally, despite the economy, we are seeing more corporate partners invest their marketing dollars in cost-effective, high impact partnerships with the bowling industry." Current corporate partners include Pepsi, Budweiser, World Wrestling Entertainment, JOLLY TIME Pop Corn, Tony's® Pizza and many others.

The rise of larger Family Entertainment Centers (FECs) and modern upgrades to existing centers has attracted corporate America. These large FECs are equipped with a wide array of amenities that include lounge areas and enhanced entertainment, technology and food/beverage offerings. "Many more companies are recognizing the impact that bowling has on consumer marketing, as more than 150 advertisers have included bowling in their creative messages over the past five years," said Johnson

The industry was also bolstered by consumer and media attention surrounding the historic grand opening of the International Bowling Campus (IBC) in Arlington, Texas, which houses the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame and the International Training and Research Center – a USOC-recognized facility and home to TEAM USA. With the January grand opening of the IBC, the leading entities in bowling are now operating under a single roof, enabling increased cohesion and collaboration across the industry.

The BPAA also reported a 5.6% increase in the number of consumers who consider themselves frequent bowlers. Frequency growth was also significant in the youth and young adult segments, helping contribute to increased revenues at local centers.

The past year also saw heightened participation for bowling on the collegiate and high school levels. High school bowling has seen double-digit growth in five of the last eight seasons and the number of varsity bowlers has more than doubled this decade. This season, 48 states now recognize bowling on the high school varsity or club level – a significant increase from 20 states, eight years ago.

# **Californian's Shine at Golden Ladies**

LAS VEGAS-It is said that "Age is just a state of mind" and the proof was in the pudding at the National Golden Ladies Classic. Do you know about the Golden Ladies Classic? If not, neither did I until I recently had the pleasure of watching 80 fantastic bowlers participate in this tournament for women bowlers 50 years and older at the Orleans Casino/Hotel and bowling center in Las Vegas in March.

Created by tournament director Jeanette Robinson in 1990, this is the 20th annual tournament and participants came from as far as Delaware, Michigan, North Carolina, New York, Kansas, Texas, Florida and points west to meet, renew friendships and bowl. There is a Senior division and a Super Senior division for women over 60. The top 12 who do not make the cut for the regular senior tournament bowl three 4-game blocks of match play to determine the winner of the Super Senior division. There is also a one game roll-off for seniors over 70 and a Last Chance side tournament.

Twenty-one women from California participated and three made the top five stepladder finals! The top five were: Dana Miller Mackie - Alba NM, Virginia Norton - Cypress, CA, Carole Jones -Englewood, CO, Paula Vidad - Los Angeles, CA and 2009 Senior Bowler of the Year for 2009, Robin Romeo of Newhall, CA.

Watching these women perform makes a believer out of you. The scores were fantastic. Over half of the field was 60 years of age and older and 33 average 200 or better. I was fascinated by the accuracy and focus of these bowlers which, of course, is why they are still able to compete at this level.

Dana Miller-Mackie led the field with a 232 average throughout the tournament and rolled a 266 to defeat Virginia Norton in the final match. Norton was hot averaging 228 and in match #3 she edged out Carol Jones 248 - 245. Jones averaged 228 also but shot two 299 games during the tournament. Paula Vidad averaged 223 and defeated Robin Romeo 234-227 in the first stepladder match. It was like a knife in the heart to watch these women who are like well oiled machines throw a perfect ball and leave solid 10's, 8's and sometimes the 7-10 or 8-10! That 10-pin made the difference in Romeo's match with Vidad who took advantage of the opportunity and struck out.

Mackie was so thrilled in having won the tournament she was absolutely giddy. When I asked her how many times she had bowled this she said, "This is my first time!" Owner of a bowling center in Alba, she said they have had a conflicting youth tournament at the same time. She kept saying, "I am so thrilled."

The Last Chance tournament was won by Nanci Johnson of Tulsa, OK. This gives bowlers who do not qualify the opportunity to strike again! When I asked Nanci how many times she had bowled in the GLT she said, "This is my first time!" Nanci bowls one league a week but in order to bone up for the tournament she said she bowled 9-10 games on Saturday and Sunday. Looks like it worked.

Winner of the Super Senior division was long time bowling standout Dee Price of Stockton. Dee, who has not missed one GLT tournament, was bowling in her 20th event.

It's been awhile since I watched a tournament for four days but this one was definitely worth it. Sponsors STORM and Jim Goodwin of Stars & Strikes Newspaper out of Rockwall, TX fattened the prize fund.

## **Bowling for a Cause**

CITRUS HEIGHTS-Emcee Tina Macuha, announcer for Sacramento's Good Day Sacramento on Channel 31, stretched her arm out welcoming 30 lanes full of bowlers and said, "I - am a survivor!" She then related her touching story of having detected breast cancer with a routine exam and her decision to have a double mastectomy. It isn't often an entire bowling center full of people is drop dead quiet, but as Tina spoke, all was quiet at Fireside Lanes in Citrus Heights where the "Bowl for the Cure" tournament was being held on January 16. When you walked in the door the entire bowl was pink. Pink balloons behind every pair of settees and floating above all of the tables set up to check bowlers in, sell items (even homemade cookies and cupcakes,) a variety of items were adorned with the widely recognized pink ribbon and a five foot pink feather tree could not be missed.

Dinger, mascot for the Sacramento Rivercats, was making the rounds giving people a photo op, and 160 women and men alike filled the lanes. It was a three game No-Tap event grossing nearly \$14,000 between entries and merchandise sales to benefit the Susan B. Komen breast cancer fund.

Bowlers are notoriously generous in support of charitable causes and Historian Chuck Pezzano estimates that bowlers, and groups using bowling, have funneled close to 100 million to support various charitable endeavors. California alone has given generously to the Susan B. Komen fund, the International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum, and since the 1940's, the California Bowlers BVL Fund (which used to be known as the Bowlers Victory Legion) has given over 10 million to support California VA and Military hospitals and Outreach Centers.

Numerous organizations continue to utilize bowling to assist in their fundraisers, Big Brothers and Big Sisters for one. The California Bowling Writers raise funds through leagues and donations for their Phone Cards for the Troops charity. Individual leagues and tournament clubs like the Camellia City 500 Club all have charitable endeavors with much going to worthy causes and to help the less fortunate.

Of the nearly 3,000 local and 50 state associations throughout the USBC, one could venture to say that all have some kind of fundraiser for charity.

Behind every event is the one mover and shaker. In the Bowl for the Cure at Fireside Lanes it was Debbie Haggerty, honored national Top 100 Coach, who coaches and runs the youth program. Hundreds of prizes are garnered for drawings including donated bowling balls and small appliances.
