Colombia's Andres Gomez Wins First PBA Tour Title in Carmen Salvino Classic Veteran international player becomes fourth player to win first title during 2011-12 season

LAS VEGAS - Colombian native Andres Gomez became the fourth player to win his first Professional Bowlers Association Tour title during the 2011-12 season when he defeated Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, 246-207, to win the Carmen Salvino Classic.

The finals of the seventh of eight events in the PBA World Series of Bowling, conducted at South Point Casino and Hotel, aired Sunday on ESPN.

Gomez, who began pursuing his dream of winning a PBA title 30 years ago as an 8-year-old living in Bogota, watching PBA Tour videotapes given to the family by American friends, finally added his coveted title after nearly 20 years of success in the international arena, individually and as a member of Colombia's national bowling team.

"I had the experience in international tournaments, I had the experience in open tournaments, but I needed the experience with the PBA in order to win," Gomez said. "It was going to take time."

Gomez, who joined England's Stuart Williams and Dom Barrett, and Scott Newell of Deland, Fla., on the current season's first-time winners list, joined in the PBA in 2005. He bowled full-time for one season but then left touring life for three years before returning for the 2009-10 season. During the 2010 PBA World Series, he made his first PBA television appearance, finishing second in the Pepsi Viper Championship. Later in the season, he finished fourth in the PBA Tournament of Champions.

Winning the Salvino Classic title "means everything to me," he said. "Since I was 8 years old, I watched tapes of Mike Aulby, Walter Ray (Williams Jr.), (Norm) Duke, Pete Weber...and then I'd go practice for six hours (at a four-lane bowling center in a Bogota country club managed by his father). To be able to come here and bowl with these same guys, most of whom are still bowling, means the world to me."

Gomez came out firing, winning the first "eliminator" round with a 253 game. Malott posted a 250, Australia's Jason

Belmonte was third with a 247 and Ronnie Russell of Marion, Ind., was "low man out" with a 215 game.

As the lane conditions changed in round two, Malott rose to the top with a 227. Gomez struggled to a 189, but Belmonte ran into split problems, exiting the finals after a 162 game.

Gomez put his recentlyfound experience to good use in the title game, changing to a more aggressive ball and moving farther left on the lane.

After converting a 10 pin for a spare in the first frame, he ran off a string of six strikes to build a 31-pin lead that Malott couldn't overcome. With his victory, Gomez

Norm Duke Wins Hall of Fame Battle for 37th Career Title in Dick Weber PBA Playoffs Third victory of 2011-12 season moves Duke past Pete Weber into third place on PBA's all-time list

INDIANAPOLIS - Norm

Duke of Clermont, Fla., won a hall of fame strikefest with Parker Bohn III of Jackson, N.J., Sunday night to win the Dick Weber PBA Playoffs presented by Hammer at Woodland Bowl and secure his 37th career title, third best in PBA Tour history.

Duke's third victory of the 2010-11 season also put him into the thick of the PBA Player of the Year race with only the PBA Tournament of Champions remaining on the

schedule. The TOC will be conducted April 9-15 at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas.

Duke put on a stunning performance Sunday, including his 836-766 victory over Bohn, a 32-time PBA Tour title and a fellow PBA Hall of Famer.

"If you would have told me this morning I would shoot 800 in the title match. I'd have said I was going to win the title," Duke said, "but I wouldn't Norm Duke

have believed it."

Just like he had done in three previous elimination rounds, Duke started his match against Bohn with nine strikes for a 289 game and a 60-pin lead with two games to go. It was too much for Bohn to overcome, even though he answered with games of 279 and

Duke said. "It's a very, very difficult tournament to win, but I've been training hard and I live for the majors. I'm ready."

Four other contenders in the PBA Player of the Year race - two-time 2011-12 title winners Jason Belmonte of Australia, Osku Palermaa of Finland and Mike Fagan of Dallas along with five-time U.S. Open champion Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo. - were continued on page 11

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS After 4 Years Frank Gallo, Jr. Finally Wins his 2nd Pba Regional Title

Perservance has helped deaf bowler Frank Gallo Jr.in winning his second Professional Bowlers Association Regional title four years after the Jacksonville, FL right-hander won his first one. Actually the first regional title came after stubbornly trying for 36 years. Gallo, Jr. joined PBA

as it's first deaf member 40 years ago. This writer had known Frank for all 40 years and occasionally followed him on his PBA trials.

On Saturday night March 24 I checked on PBA. com for the qualifying results of PBA South Region Seniors tournament at Fayetteville, NC and found out that Gallo, Jr. had qualified in 9th place. Good, I thought and hoped he would have better luck in this one because in the last one at Franklin, VA Frank led it's qualifying round but lost in the round of 8.

On Monday March 26 through PBA.com I could not find the Fayetteville results and switched to PBA South Region Seniors Statistics. In there Frank had improved in the standings on all categories and on the bottom is the list of winners. Yes! Yeah! It read, La Fayette Lanes, Fayetteville, NC: Frank Gallo, Jr.

Then not being able to how Frank won it on PBA.com, I emailed to him offering my congratulations and to get the results from him plus how he have been doing. Frank emailed back a wealth of information.

In it, he said, "1 led the qualifying round in Franklin, VA but I lost in the round of 8 and was very disappointed. I learned something in match play like pressure and rush/ Then in Fayetteville, I bowled 219-237-233-216-224-233-275-202 in qualifying round for 9th place.

Then I tried to think like, take my time and no rush. So I defeated Harold Starling (236-234, 258-229, 247-182) in round of 16, then defeated Tom Baker (236-234, 256-242) in round of 8. Next I beat Danny Weikel (245-235) in round of 4 and in Championship match beat Jeff Bellinger (236-181). I finally won since 4 years ago."

Frank continued. "Last week I rolled 264-299-226 789 in league. I found out that I feel great when I changed my way last year so far. I changed from holding ball of my waist to very low of my leg like Marshall Holman style so I get perfect timing. My average is 231 in league and I never bowl this high average. Even my age will be 64 in May, so it is best ever in my life. Look below at one year I bowled like I never did before."

Frank said he will bowl Saturday in Indianapolis, for Dick Weber Playoffs that I was entered for qualifying in South Regional Group. Also, I will bowl in Las Vegas for Tournament of Champions at Red Rpck Lanes.

(Note from this writer: I checked PBA.com and Frank Gallo, Jr. failed on Saturday first round qualifying in Dick Weber Playoff which Norm Duke won on Sunday.)

Good luck to Frank Gallo Jr. in the Tournament of Champions. It would be a great history if he wins.

Milestones in PBA Tournament of Champions History

LAS VEGAS — As the 2011-12 PBA Tour season heads down the homestretch, all eyes will be on the 2012 PBA Tournament of Champions when PBA's signature event concludes the season April 8-15 at Red Rock Lanes, Las Vegas.

It will mark the 47th edition of the event which is considered one of the most challenging and prestigious to win because all entrants must have won a PBA title to be eligible to compete.

The TOC culminates with the live ESPN finals at 1 p.m. ET (10 a.m. Pacific) Sunday, April 15 from Red Rock Lanes. Here's a look at some of the milestone moments in TOC history:

1962 - The first PBA Tournament of Champions was contested in 1962 at Play Bowl in Indianapolis, Ind., and was won by Joe Joseph of Lansing, Mich. Joseph won the inaugural event in the twogame three-player final with 480, followed by Billy Golembiewski, 416, and Carmen Salvino third with 409. Joseph won a \$15,000 first prize from the \$50,000 prize fund.

1965 – The event was not contested again until 1965 when it moved to Bowlarama in Akron, Ohio, and Firestone's long-running sponsorship made it possible for the event to be conducted annually. Firestone's involvement was one of the first and longest-running sport sponsorships by a corporation lasting 28 years. Firestone also became the first company to have titled-event sponsorship on a nationally-televised sports event, launching a new era in sports marketing.

PBA Hall of Famer Billy Hardwick won the event and according to a Sports Illustrated article by Joe Jares following the event, Hardwick's \$25,000 prize check was \$5,000 more than Jack Nicklaus won for winning golf's Masters that year.

1966 – The event moved to Riviera Lanes in the Akron suburb of Fairlawn, Ohio, where it would remain through 1994.

1967 - Jack Biondolillo bowled the PBA's first nationally-televised 300 game in a match against Les Schissler. Biondolillo finished third in the event.

1970 - One of the great images in sports was Don Johnson sprawled out on the approach after leaving a 10 pin on the final shot of the championship match when he defeated Dick Ritger, 299-268.

1973 – Jim Godman became the first player to win the event twice (1969 & 1973).

1975 - PBA inducts its first Hall of Fame class (Ray Bluth, Don Carter, Dick Weber, Billy Welu, Harry Smith, Carmen Salvino, Frank Esposito and Chuck Pezzano) in ceremonies during TOC week, a tradition that has continued nearly every year since.

1984 - Mike Durbin, who lived in the nearby Cleveland suburb of Chagrin Falls, Ohio, became the first player to win the TOC three times (1972, 1982 & 1984).

1987 - Hall of Famer Pete Weber wins the PBA Tournament of Champions, a tournament his legendary father, Dick Weber, never won.

1991 - Second-seeded David Ozio overcame the distraction of a 40-minute bomb threat delay from a crank call to defeat Amleto Monacelli, 236-203, for the Firestone Tournament of Champions crown at Riviera Lanes. It was his ninth PBA title and third of the year.

1993 - George Branham III became the first (and, thus far, only) African-American to win the TOC. This event was also the last one sponsored by Firestone.

1994 - Norm Duke won the last TOC contested at Riviera Lanes.

1995 - Brunswick picked up sponsorship of the event (and remained as sponsor through 2000) and moved it to the Chicago suburb of Lake Zurich, with an arena finals in Palatine, Ill. Mike Aulby won the event to become the first player to complete the PBA's "Grand Slam" (wins in the TOC, USBC Masters, PBA National/World Championship and U.S. Open)

1997-2000 - The event moved to Reno (1997), Overland Park, Kan. (1998 & 1999) and then back to Lake Zurich, Ill. (2000).

2002 - After a one-year hiatus, the event returned to Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn., where it remained through 2007. In 2002, Jason Couch became the first and only player to win the TOC three consecutive times (1999, 2000 & 2002, no event held in 2001) and joined Mike Durbin as the event's only three-time winners.

2008 - Event moved to its current home at Red Rock Lanes in Las Vegas.

2010 - Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., made sports history by winning the TOC in Las Vegas, becoming the first woman to win a PBA Tour title. She defeats Chris Barnes in the championship match, 265-195, for the title.

2011 - Eligibility for the event was expanded to include all PBA champions (national tour, senior tour and regionals). The TOC also returned to the ABC Network and its original Saturday afternoon timeslot for the first time in 14 years. Mika Koivuniemi won the record \$250,000 first prize from

the \$1 million prize fund by defeating Tom Smallwood in the championship match 269-207. Koivuniemi also rolled a 299 in the semifinal match for a PBA-record 199-pin margin of victory over Tom Dougherty, who bowled a 100 game, the lowest score ever in a PBA televised match.

In the optional doubles, finishing in first were Teddy Villaroman, and Bart Sanchez with a 1612 for \$100. In second was Je Je Gabriel and Bart Sanchez with 1580 for \$80. There was a total of \$890 paid out in doubles and 20 paid spots with low to cash of 1454.

We advanced to the semifinals, and leading was Kevin Valmonte with a +175. Right behind was Steve Brode at a +166 to sit out the first round of the double elims. Kevin, as the top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$860. Kevin drew a 261. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who shot that score. We will estimate the pot at \$2,000 for West Covina.

This would bring us to our exciting top 16 Match Play

finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Florinda Rosario, Julian Conwi, Mike Moore, Tao Yang, Andrew Navarro, John Samson, and George Parker. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, losers were Deborah Sanders, Bart Sanchez, Brad LeCount, and Steve Brode. They received checks of \$107. 50 each. This would get us to us down to the final five bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$72 (Sun Sundara and Don Quitangon) to a high of \$189 (Iris Daniels) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Sun Sundara (3rd seed) bowling Iris Daniels (15th seed). We would see an exciting match where it was clutch bowling of Iris who would prevail in this match with a 227 to 221 finish to advance. In the other match we saw Dino Cantoria (13th seed) bowling Don Quitangon (12th seed). This was another exciting match that saw each bowler start out hot and continue that way in a very high scoring match. In the end, it would be Don Quitangon that would prevail with a 266 to

Next came the best ball of the game. The ricochet of the ball off the head pin took out the seven. And the headpin took out the 10. What a spare! Congrats Bert!

TIME TRAVEL

It is not often we get to see a glimpse of the past and future all in the same day

Remember when you were in school and your teacher took the class on a field trip? For many of us, those trips to the farm, or factory, or museum are some of our fondest memories of our school days. They were also days when we learned things we could never get from books in the classroom.



From my experience, only the really cool teachers took their students on field trips . . .so the story you are reading was made possible by an ultra cool teacher - USBC Gold Coach Susie Minshew. Susie lives in Texas, and she is without a doubt the hardest working and most innovative bowling coach we have ever met

Minshew goes the extra mile in every aspect of her coaching curriculum. And part of her amazing agenda is to take her students on field trips. In early March, CJ and I were invited to join her group for her annual

tour of the Global 900 Bowling Ball factory in San Antonio; and then we all gathered at the famous Blanco Bowling Club in Blanco, Texas to see one of America's most historic centers and watch a session of 9-pin bowling.

That was not a typo - we said nine pins, not ten . . more later about Blanco.

Joining Susie on this adventure were Stephanie Sims, her mom and step dad Ricky and Donna Bledsoe, Christie Draper, Barbara Armstead, Joe Gonzalez, and Ken and Patti Cooper. Everyone was very engaged; asking a lot of questions . . . probably all "A" students . . . a little out of my league.

How many bowlers do you know who have ever had the privilege of seeing a bowling ball made; all the way from the design phase to putting the finished product in a box for shipping? "Having an understanding of the physics, chemistry, design, and labor that goes into producing the high tech balls of today is fascinating," said Minshew. "I learn a little more every time we do this tour."

resenting the entire industry; but the sales price is a little higher, and the technology is state-of-theart. Garner, assisted by Design Engineer Nick Siefers, generously gave two hours of their time to give Minshew's group the grand tour and answer any and all questions about the science of modern bowling ball manufacturing.

"I loved learning about how the bowling balls are made and seeing the colors being mixed, said Donna Bledsoe. Learning how it goes from design process to finished product was amazing. I'm really glad they take the feedback of all spectrums of bowlers when deciding what to design next. But being a math buff I really enjoyed learning what all the different numbers mean that are attached to a ball and how they affect the track of the ball. This trip was so much fun. I am so glad Susie included us on the trip.

Barbara Armstead also saw, for the first time, the connection between the companies that make bowling balls and consumers. "As the skill level of athletes increases, manufacturers receive better information which aids in product development decision making" she said.

Armstead lives in Philadelphia, and made the day trip at the end of two year assignment working for USBC in Arlington, Texas.

After seeing the new technology and getting a glimpse of new ball design techniques, it was back on the road to visit a place that seemed frozen in time; a place that celebrates history and family and enjoys a game that was around long before American Ten Pins became popular.

Spotted throughout the Texas Hill Country around Austin are several small public and private



Today, according to our 900 Global host, Sales Director Dale Garner, a million is close to rep-



bowling clubs, mostly established by German immigrants who made Texas their new home in the 18th and 19th centuries. They played a game with only nine pins and a very different scoring system.

"The world of 9-pin bowling was foreign to me until this trip," said Armstead. "It was a great experience to see a non-traditional pin set up, a strange scoring system, and a game that really promotes team play, not to mention seeing a real live pin boy in action. Before this, I had only seen the one at the Hall of Fame. I am so glad Susie asked me to go on this trip. It was the perfect finish to the best experience I've had in bowling; working in Texas."

In the game of Ninepins, the pins are further apart than in Ten Pins, and they are arranged in a diamond pattern. Strikes are very difficult, which is one reason why, we are told, a perfect game has never been achieved. The scoring? Don't ask - but we did learn that the center pin is red and that call it the "Kingpin" – it's as if all the others are protecting it.

Blanco is one of 19 such clubs in Central Texas, each preserving a special, more relaxed way of enjoying bowling as a recreation. but there is also competition, between families and between the different clubs.

You won't find any automatic pinspotters in these places, but you will find an abundance of friendly faces. Ball returns are above ground, and food and drink is not just available, it seems to be a requirement.

Blanco Bowling Club is as well known for its famous food and huge slices of meringue pies as it is for bowling; and we sampled a little while enjoying the fellowship and the history lesson. We lingered a little longer, soaking up the atmosphere and remembering a time when people actually had time for each other.

It was a perfect ending to a wonderful day.

became the first Colombian to win a PBA Tour title and he became the sixth international winner in seven PBA World Series of Bowling events. Although he has lived in Florida for nearly 15 years, where he attended Central Florida University and obtained a degree in business administration, Gomez remains the pride of his homeland.

"The international dominance at the World Series is tough to explain," he said. "I don't think anyone expected it. You saw great players like Duke and Weber and Sean Rash and (Chris) Barnes make TV shows. These guys are very, very good. But what happened in title matches is really hard to explain.

"I guess right now I'm just glad I'm Colombian, and not American. Maybe I would have lost."

PBA World Series of Bowling telecasts on ESPN conclude with the Pepsi PBA Elite Players Championship finals on Sunday, April 8, at 1 p.m. ET. Finalists are Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla.; Australia's Jason Belmonte; Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, and Mike DeVaney of Murrieta, Calif.

Duke, who has won two titles during the 2011-12 season, will be trying for his 37th career PBA Tour title which would break a tie with Pete Weber and put him alone in third place on the alltime PBA titles list. Belmonte, a leading candidate for 2011-12 PBA Player of the Year honors, is trying for his third title of the season. Scroggins, an eight-time PBA Tour winner, is trying for his first title in two years. DeVaney is seeking his third career title and first since the 2009 PBA World Series of Bowling.

match began in the Regional Championships round when he struck on 17 of his first 19 shots, racing away from Michael Haugen Jr. of Carefree, Ariz., to win the Southwest Region championship, 792-616.

In the Conference Championship round he defeated Bryon Smith of Roseburg, Ore., 751-657, and he advanced to the championship match with a 789 series in the semifinal round. Bohn won the second spot in the title match with a 632 series, edging Sweden's Martin Larsen by 14 pins.

With his 37 career title, Duke broke a tie with Pete Weber for third on the PBA Tour titles list. Walter Ray Williams Jr. is the all-time leader with 47 titles and the late Earl Anthony is second with 43.
