## Seventh Heaven

WYOMING, MI—Patrick Allen isn't quite ready to relinquish his PBA Player of the Year title just yet.

The 2005 PBA Player of the Year won his second title of the season, defeating Patrick Healey Jr., 259-193, in the title match of the 2006 Great Lakes Classic at Spectrum Lanes.

Allen, who won four titles last season including the 2005 Denny's World Championship, captured his seventh career title.

"Obviously it's been a long season. This was a tough week with guys trying to get exempt for next year," said Allen (Tarrytown, N.Y.), who took home \$40,000 for the win. "To make the show and get a title this late in the season after the season I had last year is very gratifying, and hopefully silences the critics who said I was a one-year wonder."

Allen started the title match with strikes in the first three frames, and after a spare in the 4th and a strike in the 5th, he got a huge break in the 6th. Allen left a 7-10 split, but the 7-pin fell late, helping Allen avoid a possible open frame.

Healey, meanwhile, suffered through five-consecutive nine-spares in frames 3-7, then opened in the 9th frame. Allen took advantage by striking on his final six shots to clinch the title.

Allen advanced to the title match with a 248-245 win over Pete Weber. Weber took the early lead with four straight strikes in frames 3-6. Two straight spares, however, gave Allen a chance to take control and he did with five consecutive strikes. Allen struck

with his first ball in the 10th and knocked down nine on his next shot to shut Weber out.

Healey advanced to the title match with a 258-188 win over Chris Barnes. Healey struck in nine of his last 10 shots, while Barnes opened in the 6th frame to fall to 1-12 in his last 13 matches on TV. The win for Healey broke a four-match losing streak on TV.

Healey (Flower Mound, Texas) took home \$20,000 for 2nd, while Barnes (Flower Mound, Texas) and Weber (St. Ann, Mo.) earned \$10,000 apiece for the 3rd and 4th place finishes, respectively.

The Denny's PBA Tour heads to Uncasville, Conn., for the final event of the 2005-06 season, the 2006 Dexter Tournament of Champions April 6-9. The live ESPN finals take place Sunday, April 9 at 1 p.m. ET, with the winner taking home \$100,000 and a two-season Tour exemption in the season's fourth Major.

## Optimists, Noble Trios Going For Gil Jay Awards

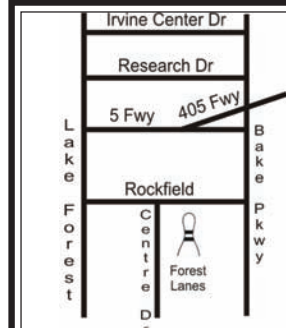

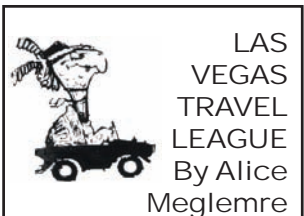

## Audette Scores 1000 To Win Angel West \$1000 Deaf Classic

FULLERTON—Robert Audette had been in a long slump and finally got in a winning way at AMF Carter Bowl in Angel West Deaf Classic which guaranteed \$1000 for first place. The Chino Hills right-hander jumped with a 254 and followed with 210-191-205 for 860 plus 140 handicap for a neat even 1000 total.

Audette's score placed first ahead of Dan Flores of Granada Hills' 956 for the \$1000 prize. Delighted Audette said the money will help pay for the entry fees and hotel costs of the coming PCDBA tournament in San Fernando Valley on Memorial Day weekend. He also got about \$33.00 from sidepots.

The Angel West's one-day tournament ran by Larry Murray and Wesley Kay drew 52 entries and the main prize list paid off 17 places. Second place \$450.00 went to Dan Flores who rolled the event's only all 200 games with his 220-216-203-245 for 884 plus 78 handicap for 956. Flores' 884 got him the Noon squad high scratch series \$50.00 prize and he also received additional \$48.00 from sidepots.

Jack Sickinger, Long Beach placed 3rd for \$220.00 with his (204) 942 total, just one pin ahead of a woman, Melissa Rannells' 941. Melissa, who started with a 213 and 199 but trailed off, received #100.00 for 4th. Another woman Nancy Walsh bowled over her 142 average for a 914 score to place 5th for \$90.00.

From 6th place down to 17th, each placed bowler got \$45.00, which is the amount of prize fee. The 6th placer Francisco Navarro, Van Nuys with 818/84/902 had closed with the tournament high game 266, which got him \$15.00 extra from sidepot. Ed Abakumoff, a 205 average from Riverside turned in 2nd high series 863 (225-254-195-189) with 20 handicap/883 placed 8th.

Two other women cashed, Nicole Elgnably (14th) with 861 and Joyce Roles, San Diego 16th with 858. Randy Salazar, Whittier had a good start with a 255 game but went down in other 3 games to place 15th with 860. Delfino Perez took the last place (17th) money with his 849.

### 76 TEAMS IN COMING 70TH GREAT LAKES DEAF TOURNAMENT AT CHICAGO

CHICAGO—The grandfather of all deaf bowling organizations, Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association is having its 70th anniversary tournament in Chicago on April 20 to 23 with West Suburban Association of the Deaf as the host. GLDBA is the oldest and largest of all deaf bowling organization in number of team entries and prize money paid out.

During its glory years from 1966 to 1978 GLDBA drew 13 consecutive years of 100 or more 5-men teams with a high of 138 teams at Cleveland in 1970. Since 1978 it had only six 100 plus teams including a deaf bowling all-time record high of 188 teams in its special 60th anniversary event out of its Great Lakes area at Las Vegas in 1996.

As the deadline for the Chicago 70th tournament had past last month, Mike Jasko, Cleveland, the only 5th secretary treasurer of GLDBA since its existence, reported that it has 76 teams entries. That is good at this time of year and it is still over 75 since the last 100 in 1997.

Also that number is still more that other deaf bowling organizations are drawing in their tournaments this year. Of the 76 teams, two are from Southern California captained by Connie Marchione and Robert Ellison, San Diego. Marchione had a full team and since Ellison who gathered a strong team lost a bowler and needed one high average bowler. Marchione gave up his best bowler Bob Jones to give Jones a chance to bowl with a better team.

Unfortunately Marchione who had bowled in GLDBA tournaments before he moved to California and again in 1974, 1986 and 1996, could not find a replacement by deadline time and asked GLDBA secretary-treasurer Jasko to put a pick-up bowler on his team. Jasko assured him that there would be a pick-up for his team. We will see how both teams do in Chicago.

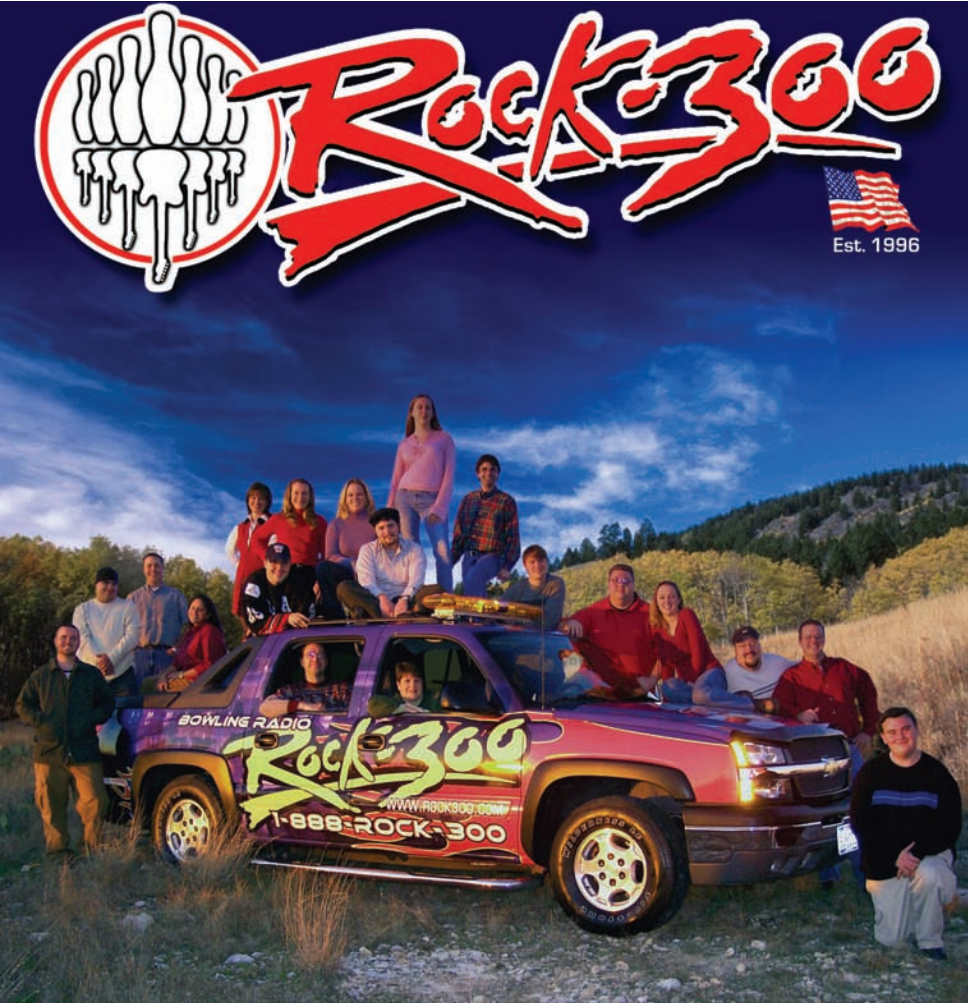

# THE PENDULUM SWING - NO SUCH THING? A PARALLEL VIEW

Back in September 1999, in an article in Bowling This Month magazine, several excellent points about a correct bowling swing were made by former PBA member, Bill Hall. “No Such Thing as a Pendulum Swing” was the main point.

It just so happened that in August, I had written an article named, “The Right Choices and K.I.S.S. for Success”. That concerned itself with how bowlers can avoid the “Who’s Right/Who’s Wrong” pitfall when hearing or reading about coaching techniques and principles which seem to disagree with each other. By sheer accident, then, (in the form of Bill Hall’s article), here came a golden opportunity to exemplify those very points of my August article. In this case, the seeming opposition between the famous and successful coaches who teach pendulum swing (some of whom Bill Hall mentioned) and those who claim there’s no such thing.

Was ol’ Rolf gonna pass up such an opportunity? Not likely!

**A CLOSER LOOK**

“OK”, you ask...“If some teach the swing as “pendulum” and others not, then who is right and who’s wrong?” Well let’s look at the issue by covering just some of Hall’s main points:

That the more popular swing shape, uses the “pendulum” swing going back - the first semicircular part of a “U” (or pendulum) swing.

*No difference so far, because there seems to be universal agreement that after the pushaway, a properly executed, ball-weighted backswing is pendulum actuated. That pendulum action, then, takes the arm to the top of the backswing.*

That the swing shape in modern bowling flattens out coming forward for virtually all bowlers, but that the most successful are able to maintain a long “flat spot” *all the way down*, through the delivery of the ball. That here we can’t have a pendulum swing because bowlers stand more upright when they line up, but then slide lower to the line. That in order for it to be a true pendulum it would have to remain on exactly the same swing path all the way down and through the delivery. That it cannot be a pendulum since the swings backward and forward are not the same height.

*This is where the seeming difference appears to exist between the “pendulum” and “non pendulum”...and that the grandfather clock pictured here, may just be part of the key to the solution of this seeming dilemma.*

**THE CLOCK SLIDES DOWNHILL**

Imagine that grandfather clock, still upright, *starting to slide downhill*, sideways, just as the pendulum begins to swing in the same direction from the apex of its ‘backswing’. If you visualize this clock’s downhill slide, paying close attention to the swing of that pendulum, you would definitely see the direction of that pendulum’s swing flatten out as the clock gets lower!

So the “flattening” action of that clock’s swing is actually created by it’s downhill slide... *a slide, of course, lengthens that approach, thus flattening the swing even more! The longer the slide, the flatter the swing.*

Now, on this grandfather clock, the top of that pendulum arm is attached to the clock’s pivot point, or hub. So...visualize this clock, still pretty much upright, sliding to a stop at the bottom of the hill *just as the pendulum approaches the bottom of its swing*...and while the pendulum is in its forward momentum, imagine that pendulum flying off the arm.

At this moment the arm, even though it has lost the pendulum, still has some momentum left in it and won’t stop swinging until it runs out of momentum. True, it won’t stop at a point exactly as high as its original starting point at the top of the hill. And there’s where part of the difference in opinion between “pendulum” and “non pendulum” advocates is born, *even though they are both looking at the same swing, exactly as described by Bill Hall!*

**THE GRANDFATHER CLOCK BOWLER**

If the bowler is the clock, the ball is the pendulum, the bowler’s arm is the pendulum’s arm and the shoulder is the clock’s pivot point (hub) at the top of the arm then, in the view of some, the bowler’s swing is EXACTLY like the clock’s pendulum. Why? Because, according to “pendulum” advocate coaches, just because the clock is going downhill doesn’t keep the arm from swinging as a pendulum in relation to the body of the clock. The clock *has not changed shape during it’s downhill slide*...and neither has the length of the bowler’s arm. Therefore they still refer to it as a pendulum swing. (Bill Hall very aptly calls the flattening portion of the swing the “fishhook”, which makes it easier to visualize...and he does refer to the correct downswing as a “modified” pendulum, by the way.)

Another excellent point Bill Hall makes is that with the fish-hook, the ball gets to swing’s bottom while still slightly behind the bowler. This, when combined with a slide, results in this long, flat swing...so the ball will be slightly more behind the bowler at the line, which is perfect modern timing.

Still no argument...because it is still the knee bend which lowers the bowler’s body during the approach and thus flattens the swing

(including the path of the ball)...and it is still the slide which lengthens it onto that “fishhook” just as Bill Hall instructs. The “U” (or pendulum) swing, as described, would then flatten out by virtue of this knee bend and slide process, thus also giving the bowler a choice of release positions (in relation to the ankle) during the bottom potion of that flattened swing.

**THE DIFFERENCE?**

Any difference therefore, between “pendulum” and non “pendulum” viewpoints in such circumstances would seem to be just that...*differences in viewpoint!* I know coaches who teach the downswing, knee bend and slide in the same shape Bill Hall describes. Some of these coaches call it a pendulum swing, others don’t. Those who do, don’t teach it as a “starting point back to original starting point” pendulum...but think of it and successfully teach it as complete pendulum action, *but from end of pushaway to release!*

“So how can they both be right?” some of you still ask.

Well, look at it this way: If numbers of coaches teach the swing motion similarly, but use different words for it and call it a different name, wouldn’t you agree that the difference appears to be mostly one of semantics? That’s a big part of the point...that this confusing “Right/Wrong” trap may often exist in the minds of many bowlers. Often this is because similar techniques or principles are explained differently by different coaches, so they sound different enough that the student has difficulty in seeing the similarities, even though they exist.

Other times, of course, it is because there are various different techniques taught by coaches because they know “one size doesn’t fit all”, and are “fitting” a specific student with what will work best for that individual. Bill Hall’s apt and concise descriptions of the “U”, “V” and what he terms “fishhook” swings and releases, for instance, are sure to clarify these concepts for a lot of readers. What difference does it make what words he uses as long they clarify his points?


**SOME REAL DIFFERENCES**

This doesn’t mean that there aren’t methods of doing certain things, which clearly *are* different. For instance, some coaches teach the pushaway to go forward at a *downward* angle, while others teach it forward at an *upward* angle. These two techniques definitely do disagree with each other (but in modern bowling, the upward angled pushaway improves timing, so it is best today).


“Aha!” you say, “Gotcha!” Now who’s right and who’s wrong?” But here, dear readers, is an example of what fits and what doesn’t, because I also know coaches who have switched from teaching downward to upward. Why? Just because it worked better! I know very few teachers of this game who wouldn’t be willing to switch to something different if made their students more successful. After all, coaches become successful through their students’ successes. It would certainly be unfair of us teachers to ask bowlers to keep an open mind about different methods, if *our* minds were closed, wouldn’t it?

The big “trick” then, is for the serious student of this game to accept that there are many excellent, certified, experienced coaches in our sport. And that most such coaches are extremely instrumental in helping their students improve, despite often using different descriptions or teaching methods, without having to be judged “right” or “wrong”. As a matter of fact, most of bowling’s best coaches seldom, if ever, get credit for their work anyway (unless a tournament winning student happens to mention the coach’s name).

Anyhow, if all bowling’s coaches and instructional writers had to be clones of each other to be considered “right”, wouldn’t it be a dull world?


