

Agnes "Rose" Duffy Passes at 92

SONOMA — Agnes Duffy, a name synonymous with bowling passed away peacefully on April 8, 2013 in Sonoma, California. Responses to her passing brought numerous comments about all the lessons learned from "Duffy." Named Agnes Rose, she was born in Watertown, New York and eventually migrated to California where she made her home in Richmond and later in Sonoma. Most of her years in California were spent sharing her home with Dottie Schultz, a friend she met when both of their husbands were in the service.

What defines a person like Agnes Duffy? Among the many responses to her death were: "Great lady, dear friend, mentor"; "I thought she would live forever," "Shared knowledge"; "When Duffy spoke, we listened"; "Fortunate she was in our lives"; "Special Person, great gal"; "You knew where you stood with Agnes"; "God has a very special angel"; "Great leader - full of knowledge and strength"; "No one like her!" "One of our absolute best and most enjoyable colleagues, friends and confidants during the "good bowling days"; "Intimidating, but turned into respect and admiration"; "Intelligent, humorous and caring.".....and Agnes Duffy was all of that. Memories were revisited about various adventures, among them when Duffy drove. They said sometimes the driving was good and sometimes well, maybe not so good - usually got lost but all had a ball. She loved driving and we all wondered what her insurance

was because of the number of fender benders she had. The CWBA office was one of her favorite places to assault a small metal pole over and over again! She would tackle anything and she fished bowled and golfed with her long time friend Dolores Ruppel who came from Guaymas, Mexico to ssurprise Agnes on her 90th birthday. In Sonoma she was delighted when the mobile home she purchased had 35 rose bushes and she loved tending them and sharing with anyone who visited. One of her greatest disappointments was giving up driving after she suffered a stroke. Being an indepen-

dent, but logical person - she accepted her fate and sold the car. She was a no-nonsense person and when Duffy spoke - everyone listened. She was never one to hog the conversation in a meeting. She would listen and then, when she did speak it was usually profound. As a leader, she kept her finger on everything going on and said, "I don't ever want to be embarrassed by my flock being unprepared because that reflects on me.'

She was president of the California WBA served on the WIBC board of directors for 18 years. She is a Member Emerita of the WIBC, Life Member of four associations, a Hall of Fame member of continued on page 4

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS by Connie Marchione FORMER BOARDED-UP AMF BOWLERLAND GONE & LEVELED

VAN NUYS — In its 53 years, Southern California Deaf Traveling League had bowled a couple years or more at about 50 different centers in Los Angeles and Orange counties. Many of the centers were no longer in operation including the league's favorite big centers Grand Central Bowl in Glendale, Wonderbowl Downey and South bay Bowling Center in Hawthorne. Also gone were centrally

located Hollywood Legion Bowl, Hollywood Star Bowl and Holiday Bowl. Now there is a surprise that AMF Bowlerland in Van Nuys, which had been closed and boarded up for nearly two decades, is at present gone and leveled. Before AMF Bowlerland was build, a mile north up the boulevard the former 48 lanes Panorama Bowl was changed to roller staking and ice staking rinks. The Los Angeles Kings Champion Hockey team once used to practice there.

DEAF TRAVEL STOPS IN CAL BOWL SUNDAY AT NOON

LAKEWOOD — So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League makes its scheduled stop at Cal Bowl this Sunday at Noon. Because the league rules do not allow subs on the last two sessions, all bowlers must be there.

League leader Leroy MacMonagle's Orange County team with 22 points lead faces 8th place Bob Jones' S. F. Valley team. This will be exciting battle because MacMonagle also led in average with 196 and Jones is second.

The league had decided to have its sweeper on May 18 at a center it never touched before, Yorba Linda Bowl.

Concentration by Robert Ellison

During the game of bowling - we tend to either "under" concentrate or "over" concentrate. Under meaning we are not focusing on what we want to do; over meaning we're thinking too hard on what we want to do. Theres a fine medium in focusing on our game.

The term concentrate means "focus on the subject". This is one of the most important aspect of bowling. Visualize your bowling form as if you are shooting a movie on your form in your mind. This is where you focus on your form: walk, approach, swing of ball, and release of ball. Watch the ball roll down the lane and enter the pocket and STRIKE! This is the power of positive thinking~

We concentrate and thinking about what we want to do prior, during, and after we throw the ball. When you are seated on the lanes- focus on what you want do on your next shot. When we're on the approach- focus on each shot one at a time- focus on the execution and not the outcome. After we throw the shot, we go back to the sitting area and start the cycle again.

Remain calm and stay positive thru out the shot. By staying calm- use breathing technique and relax. Get rid of any negative thoughts- breath in the postive and breath out the negative.

Bowling is a game where we need to focus on each shot- frame- and not think ahead. Its important to remember we are not perfect all 12 frames (if we were - then we'd shoot 300 every game!). The greatest bowlers continue to strive on making each shot importation - Keep you mind focused on what you want to do- remain focused on your target- and finish strong.

WIBC, California State and the Richmond and Alameda County local associations. Her employment years were spent working in the Import Export field in Europe and the Far East and Mid-East areas.

Agnes rose to the leadership ranks in every bowling association of which she was a part and continued to support any and all bowling endeavors. She began bowling in 1940 and bowled in the CWBA Championship tournament 56 years and the WIBC tournament 53 years - something accomplished by very few. She is also a two time trophy winner in CWBA tournaments

The California Golden Nugget newsletter was the brainchild of Agnes Duffy in 1950 and she was its first Editor. She originated California WBA sponsored Clinics; Chaired the Membership Promotion move-ment in California and from that the CWBA sponsored Instructor Course originated. She spearheaded the formation of the California Senior Women's Tournament and the California Princess Tournament and served as the first chairman of both. As chairman of the California BVL Committee she expanded the program to include the men's associations and did the oversight for gift purchases for the VA and Military hospitals.

In the formative years, Agnes was a WIBC State Service Representative for eight years organizing 20 local associations in California and later, National Coordinator of Membership Development and an ARC (Area Recruitment Coordinator.) She was an American Junior Bowling Congress (AJBC) director, National Bowling Council treasurer, National Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum director and president and a Young American Bowling Alliance (YABA) director.

She was Editor of the National Women Bowling Writers publication Knows for News and the recipient of two of their special awards: Mary Jannetto Award for Outstanding Bowling Promotion and the AMF Helen Dual Award for Contribution to Youth Promotion and Coaching. She was the first recipient of the WIBC Membership Development Volunteer of the Year - Agnes Duffy Award, named in her honor. She also served as a Director on the BWAA board of Directors and was President of the California Bowling Writers. She found no task impossible.

In her retirement in Sonoma it was no time at all before she was involved in the mobile home park's home owner's association. She became president and did all the work on incorporating the group. Everything Agnes Duffy was a part of was a success - a life well lived.

FONTANA — We returned to Foothill Lanes where we saw a decent shot and 155 entrants come out on Saturday for a fun day of bowling. The cut scores were +74 for the men and +57for the women, on a medium shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) Sierrie Herradura +43, Glenn Matsumoto +37, and Walter White +30. Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 42 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

High qualifiers for the tournament were Emilio Flores for the men with a +171 and for the women it was Kerry Lucka with a +154. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$2,510. Emilio drew a 662. This week we saw William Garrett be the last one standing for the shot at \$800 in the 3-6-9 roll off. He was not able to convert on the five shots and took home the \$50 consolation. finishing in first were Emilio Flores and Bryan Moore with a 1484 for \$130. Finishing in second was Emilio Flores and Lito Dizon with a 1440 for \$110. There was a total of \$1,660 paid out in doubles and 28 paid spots with low to cash of 1346.

The Semis took the floor. After the three games in first was Gerald Baker with a +137. Coming in a close second was Angela Lung at a +123. Angela would sit out the first round. Gerald had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$2,515. Gerald drew a 261 and after a review of all the scores bowled, no bowler shot that score. So we will estimate the pot at \$3,800 for our next event.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. Now down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$36 Emilio Flores to a high of \$114 Pedro Cintron. In one match, the ninth seed Pedro Cintron ver-
