Missy Wins "X Factor" Dick Allen Sweeps Chris Barnes to Win **End-of-Season Dick Weber PBA Playoffs Title**

INDIANAPOLIS (April 17, 2011) - Dick Allen of Columbia, S.C., who called himself the "X Factor" among the three finalists, swept favorite Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas, in the "best-of-twogame" championship match to win the inaugural Dick Weber PBA Playoffs Sunday at Woodland Bowl.

Allen, who earned his third career PBA title and first in five years, threw the last five strikes in the first game in the championship round to overcome a 15-pin deficit and win, 237-218. He put together another strike of five strikes in the second game to take advantage of back-to-back pocket 7-10 splits by Barnes to win the second game, 221-193.

Allen immediately turned over the \$50,000 check to his wife Sarah, but held onto the

crystal trophy. "The money comes and goes. I want the trophy and a banner in the bar at Woodland Bowl along with all of the great players who have won titles here," Allen said. "That means more to me

than anything." Allen said he came into the PBA Playoffs finals under the radar. "A lot of people were cheering for Randy (Weiss) to win his first title, and Barnes was the obvious favorite," Allen said. "So I was happy to be the X Factor. I just kept my head down and tried to get one more pin than the other guys. That's all I did today."

Barnes and Allen advanced to the championship match by rolling 245 and 209 games, respectively, in the opening elimination match when Randy Weiss of Columbia, S.C., was eliminated when he finished

third with a 200 game. Weiss, who was trying for his first PBA title, earned \$13,000.

Barnes threw strikes on six of his first seven shots in the first game against Allen, but Allen staved close despite leaving the 10 pin on four of five shots in the middle of his game. When Barnes left the 4-6-7-10 split in the eighth frame, Allen capitalized with his closing string of strikes.

Allen was the victim of pair of splits in the second game, helping Barnes take a 25-pin lead in the fifth frame, but the consecutive 7-10s "pretty much took the wind out of my sails," he said. "There were a few pocket 7-10s on the left lane earlier in the tournament, so the first one wasn't a huge surprise. But the second one was a stunner. I thought I threw the ball well." The

Johnny bowls three games a week at Forest Lanes, with his buddy Mark Mogansen, who is also in a wheelchair. They have been long time buddies and enjoy competing against each other. Both men are accomplished bowlers and hit games over 200 quite frequently, using ramps. Yes, I said ramps.

Johnny's father, made a stick of PVC that attaches to his wheelchair, Johnny tells his Mom which way to face the ramp (depending on what spare he wants to shoot) He then adjusts his own wheel chair and uses his fingers to push the stick against the ball. His ability and degree of accuracy is uncanny. I wonder if a PVC stick could help my bowling? Few wheel chair bound bowlers in the whole world have ever scored games as high as 279 and far fewer have ever scored over 700 for a three games series. It is considered quite an accomplishment. In addition to bowling, Johnny does Karaoke at the Laguna Wood Village once a week using his voice activated continued on page 11

LAKE FOREST --- Johnny Lombardo 53 was diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy when he was but 8 years old and has been in a wheel chair since he was 12. At age 23 he had a tracheotomy and was put on a ventilator.

EDDIE VAN DANIKER Wins Citrus Belt Masters Tournament

LAKE ELSINORE—National PBA star Eddie Van Daniker came to town on Sunday, won five consecutive matches, and left as Citrus Belt Kelly C. Masters Tournament Champion. Van Daniker won \$1,200.00 for his efforts.

Van Daniker is an exempt player on the national PBA tour, and that makes him one of the top 64 bowlers in the world. He is also one of the smoothest professional bowlers since DAVID OZIO. In the future, we will be seeing more of Eddie in SOCAL, since he is moving here to run a pro shop.

Eddie started his quest for the title slowly, with three close match play wins over GREG NEUER, JIM HARVEY, and BOB-BY CAMPAGNALE. Neuer lost his two game match to Eddie by a mere six pins. Harvey, the pro who will always be remembered for rolling a 296 game on television, pushed Van Daniker but finally lost. Campagnale lost to Eddie by a mere eleven pins, after making the 7 - 10 split in the tenth frame of the second game of the match.

After winning his first three matches, Van Daniker had to face the undefeated and defending Masters Champion, DAVE WOD-KA. These guys are friends, but both wanted to beat the other. Before their match began, they both told me that they would kick the other's (donkey!). Eddie fell behind early, when he couldn't carry on the left lane. However, in second game, Eddie moved right on the approach, started striking and rode a 259 game to victory.

With Wodka out of the way, Van Daniker had one more match to win. He had to face the Citrus Belt's premier two-hander, Bobby Campagnale. The match would be for the title. As winner of the second-chance bracket, Campagnale had to defeat Van Daniker twice.

Campagnale came out of the gate striking, and appeared to be on the road to victory. Van Daniker started with two spares. Bobby's confidence was building and you could see it written all over his face. Then Eddie adjusted his line and struck out for 279. Bobby faltered and managed a 236. Eddie followed up his big first game with a 278, for the title. Counting the 259 with which he finished his prior match, Eddie's last three games totaled 816.

Three bowlers rolled perfect games, DANNY SUSTAITA during qualifying, JOSH BLANCHARD and BOB MARKIE-WICZ during match play. The best match during the finals featured a father versus son duel.

After two games, MATT MURTISHAW and his father (Jim) tied. They then bowled a tenth frame roll-off and tied again. The second tenth frame roll-off was won by father JIM MUR-TISHAW. In the end though, Matt had the last laugh. He finished in fourth place, ahead of his dad's ninth place finish.

When the smoke cleared, Bobby Campagnale finished second (for the second consecutive year), and Dave Wodka was third. All the finalists were grateful to the BOWLING NEWS for reporting on their success. The tournament was conducted by CITRUS BELT officials MIKE RADDEMAN (President) and RICK HILL (Vice President), and ALISHA HILL (Trevi Lanes management). HAMMEL READY TO DEFEND **USBC SENIOR QUEENS TITLE** SYRACUSE-To become a champion, you have to beat the best, and that's exactly what Char Hammel of Las Vegas did at last year's United States Bowling Congress Senior Queens in El Paso, Texas.

Hammel dethroned defending champion Janine Primrose of Gardnerville. Nev., in back-to-back matches to capture the coveted title, and the victory was her most memorable bowling moment.

"It was definitely my greatest win," said Hammel, who won the opening three-game total-pins match, 590-554, to force a deciding match, which she won, 705-520. "I can't believe a year has actually passed since El Paso. I look forward to bowling the Women's Championships and Senior Queens every year."

This week, Hammel looks to become the first woman to repeat as USBC Senior Queens champion when the showcase tournament for women bowlers age 50 and older kicks off at Syracuse's Oncenter Convention Center on Saturday. Competitors will be bowling for a \$3,000 top prize.

Hammel, a poker dealer at Green Valley Ranch in Las Vegas, realizes repeating won't be easy.

"So many things have to go your way to win a tournament," Hammel said. "I think as much as getting good breaks, you have to side step the unfortunate bad breaks, too. Nothing would make me happier than to defend my title."

The Senior Queens consists of 10 qualifying games for all contestants on April 23 and April 24. The top 40 advance to an additional five-game qualifying round on April 25, after which the top 31 will join Hammel in the three-game, double-elimination match-play bracket.

The tournament concludes Wednesday, April 27 at 10 a.m. Eastern with the championship match, which will be broadcast live on BOWL.com.

LAURA LEE DANIEL **On Record Pace**

RANCHO CUCAMONGA - The season is winding down and Laura Lee Daniel is on the verge of setting a new high for Citrus Belt lady bowlers.

The current Citrus Belt record HIGH AVERAGE, by an adult woman, is 226.

The record is shared by Daniel (2010) and STEPHA-NIE SJOBOM (2007). The last time I checked, Laura Lee is averaging 229 in the Vegas Classic League at DEER CREEK LANES. As late as February, she was at 232.

With three game sets of 769, 774, and 762 in December, Daniel's average surged. Recently though she has had to settle for 600s. Can another surge make her the first Citrus Belt woman to average 230? I hope so.

Daniel is also averaging 226 in Deer Creek's Hi Rollers League, and 212 in the Open Commercial League at UPLAND BOWL. All Citrus Belt lady bowlers are grateful that the BOWLING NEWS tracks their on lane exploits.

WITH TARGET ON HER BACK **KULICK LOOKS TO DEFEND QUEENS TITLE**

SYRACUSE, N.Y. - When Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., arrives at the Oncenter Convention Center to defend her United States Bowling Congress Queens title, she knows every bowler in the field will have their sights set on sending her home empty handed.

Last year, Kulick won not only the Queens, but the U.S. Women's Open and beat the men in the PBA Tournament of Champions, so she knows each event she competes in there's a target on her back.

Kulick's Queens title defense begins Saturday with the first round of qualifying. As the defending champion, she's guaranteed a spot in the double-elimination match-play bracket.

"I think my recent success and past performances will always make me a target," said Kulick, who defeated Tennelle Milligan of Arlington, Texas, 232-188, to win the 2010 Queens. "I still look at Carolyn (Dorin-Ballard), Liz (Johnson), Shannon (Pluhowsky) and other top-notch bowlers as fierce competitors. I see them as a threat as much as they see me as a threat."

Kulick's victory at the PBA Tournament of Champions gave her an exemption on the Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour for the second time in her career. The last time Kulick was exempt on the PBA Tour in 2005-06, she put that experience to use and won the 2006 Queens.

People will assume my season on tour will give me an advantage," said Kulick, who will look to join Millie Ignizio and Wendy Macpherson as a three-time Queens champion. "It should give me an edge, but there is no guarantee of winning. I will use my knowledge and experience to give myself the best opportunity possible. At the end of the day, all I can do is my best. Some days it's good enough and others it's not enough."

The Queens kicks off with 10 qualifying games over two days on April 23 and 24 before the field is cut to the top 80 for five additional qualifying games the morning of April 25. The top 63 then advance to join Kulick in the double-elimination match-play bracket, which begins at 1:30 p.m. Eastern on April 25. The final five players will advance to the televised stepladder finals, which will be broadcast live on ESPN2 at 7 p.m. Eastern on April 27.

Should Kulick come away with another victory, she would become just the fifth woman to successfully defend a Queens title, joining Katsuko Sugimoto (1981, 1982), Donna Adamek (1979, 1980), Dorothy Fathergill (1972, 1973) and Ignizio (1970-71).

The qualifying and match-play portions of the Queens are open to the public at no charge. A limited number of tickets for the televised finals will be sold for \$10 and can be purchased on

In our optional doubles finishing in first were Steve Brode and William Garrett with a 1455 for \$130. Finishing second was George Parker and Steve Brode with 1441 for \$110. We had a total of \$1,040 paid out in doubles with low to cash of 1376

In the semis, one of our fine directors, Marvin Crowder, led the field with a +178 to sit out and bowl for the title this week. Coming in second was William Zarek with a +157 to sit out the first round. It took a +48 for the men and a +18 for the women to make the top 16.

Our top seed Crowder, had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$875, and drew a 295. No one matched that score and estimated pot will be \$2,100 at Cal Bowl. We had six new bowlers join us.
