

Feldman Saves Best for Last in Hall of Famer Marion Ladewig **PBA Women's Series Showdown** Dies at Age 95

GRAND RAPIDS — Marion Ladewig, recognized as the greatest woman bowler of all time, died Friday, April 16, in Grand Rapids, Mich. She was 95.

Ladewig was a dominating performer in women's bowling from the mid-1940s until her retirement in 1963. The Bowling Writers' Association of America voted her Bowler of the Year nine times from 1950-63 and in a 1973 poll she was named the greatest of all time.

"It is a sad day for bowling," United States Bowling Congress President Jeff Bojé said. "She was truly great as a bowler and as a person. She was truly an inspiration and a champion of epic proportion."

In 1949, Ladewig captured the first of five consecutive U.S. Women's Open Championships, then known as the BPAA All-Star tournament. From 1949-1960, she won the event eight times and was runner-up twice.

In 1950, she won her first Women's International Bowling Congress (now USBC) All-Events title and was a member of team title winner Fanatorium Majors. The following season she won the All-Events title at the city, state and national level. She would take the WIBC All-Events title in 1955 along with the WIBC doubles title.

Her list of honors includes being selected the first inductee in the Superior Performance category of the WIBC Hall of Fame in 1964 and the first woman bowler inducted into the Women's Sports Foundation Hall of Fame in 1984. She also was named Michigan's Woman Athlete of All Time.

Born in 1914 in Grand Rapids, Ladewig was a sprinter in high school and also played softball. She started bowling in her early twenties and took a job at a local bowling center where she learned the sport. She would win her first bowling title during the 1940-41 season, a doubles title at the Western Michigan Gold Pin Classic.

In 1965, she retired from competitive bowling after winning the World Invitational for a record fifth time. Funeral arrangements are pending.

ARLINGTON—Michelle Feldman of Auburn, N.Y., concluded a personally disappointing season with a resounding victory in the PBA Women's Series Showdown presented by BOWL.COM at the International Training and Research Center.

Feldman, who got into the PBA Tour special event by a sequence of fortunate breaks, was nearly perfect in the competition that aired on ESPN Sunday, defeating Shannon Pluhowsky of Kettering, Ohio, and Stefanie Nation of Grand Prairie, Texas, for a \$25,000 first prize. Feldman, an 11-time Pro-

fessional Women's Bowlers Association champion before the women's tour ceased operations in 2003, survived a tense opening round in the "Petraglia Scoring System" event, but was a pair of 10 pins away from throwing a perfect game in the title match to defeat Pluhowsky and Nation.

It was a rewarding conclusion to a season in which Feldman's two previous television appearances - in the Bayer Don and Paula Carter Mixed Doubles Championship and the United States Bowling Congress Queens - came up short of a title. This time, even the opportunity to participate came her way only because the qualifying rules lined up in her favor.

"I didn't bowl very good in the PBA Women's Series this year," she confessed. "I just didn't click. When you bowl in the same place the whole time and don't get comfortable, it kinda puts a damper on how you think you're going to bowl. I didn't make a show or win a title, but I guess I picked the right week to bowl well, and that was the one that got me into this tournament."

In the Showdown, the Petraglia Scoring System also worked for Feldman. The Petraglia system awards one point for each ball throw to complete a frame, with the lowest score winning. A perfect game is a 10 - 10 strikes in 10 frames. By converting 10-pin spares in the fifth and sixth frames, and striking on her other eight shots, Feldman

Johnson Set To Defend Queens Title in El Paso

EL PASO, Texas - En route to winning the United States Bowling Congress Queens last year, Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., got off to a shaky start in qualifying. That won't be a problem this time around.

Johnson was 71st after the opening round of qualifying last year but bounced back and to capture her first Queens title. This year, Johnson won't have to worry about her qualifying scores since she's automatically seeded in the 64-player double-elimination bracket as the defending champion. Johnson will take on a field of the top women bowlers in the world when the USBC Queens takes place starting Saturday, April 24, at the El Paso Convention and Performing Arts Center. BOWL. com will have wire-to-wire live streaming coverage of the event leading up to the live nationally televised championship round on ESPN2 at 8 p.m.

EDT on Wednesday, April 28. "I'm still going to bowl qualifying this year, but fortunately, it's just for practice," said Johnson, who defeated Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., 247-204 to win the 2009 title. "So I can go in knowing I can get a read of the lanes with a

my usual timing. It's nice to

know that I'm already in the

top 64." A six-time Team USA ember who finished third at the 2008 Queens, Johnson said she isn't doing anything out of the ordinary to prepare for this year's Queens. "I've just been trying to stay sharp by bowling other tournaments around home," Johnson said. "The Buffalo and New York area have a lot of good bowlers and great weekend tournaments to help keep me sharp." The Queens kicks off with 10 qualifying games over two continued on page 4

posted a score of 12 compared to Pluhowsky's 16 and Nation's 20.

Feldman got into the title match by winning a one-ball roll-off against Nation in the first round, after they tied at 14-14. Feldman, who converted the 3-4-6-7 split in the 10th frame to earn the tie, struck to win the roll-off while Nation knocked down only six pins. Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., finished third with 16 points and joined Nation in the Wild Card round.

"In the 10th frame of the first round, I told myself not to throw it bad," she smiled, "and I then threw it worse - as usual. I always have to make things difficult on myself. But I made a really good shot to make the spare."

In the other first-round matchup, Pluhowsky started with nine strikes before leaving a 7 pin, which she converted for a nearly-perfect 11. Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., wasn't far behind, posting a 13 to advance to the Wild Card round, but defending Women's Showdown cham-

pion Carolyn Dorin-Ballard of Keller, Texas, was eliminated because she had the highest score in the opening round – a 17

Feldman and Pluhowsky, as winners of their groups, automatically advanced to the championship match. In the Wild Card contest between the next three lowest scorers, Nation's 13 earned her a berth in the showdown match. Kulick had a 15 and Johnson an 18.

"In the title match, I knew Stefanie had an okay shot and I knew Shannon really had a good look. She almost had a perfect game in the first round. continued on page 11

days before the field is cut to the top 100 for five additional qualifying games. The top 63 then advance to join Johnson in doubleelimination match play, which begins at 1 p.m. MDT April 26. The final five players will advance to the televised stepladder finals, which will be broadcast live on ESPN2 at 8 p.m. EDT on April 28.

Should Johnson come away with another victory, she would become just the fifth woman to successfully defend a Queens title, joining Katsuko Sugimoto (1981, 1982), Donna Adamek (1979, 1980), Dorothy Fathergill (1972, 1973) and Mildred Ignizio (1970-71). Johnson also would become the seventh woman with multiple Queens titles. The qualifying and match play portions of the Queens are open to the public at no charge. A limited number of tickets for the televised finals will be sold for \$10 and can be purchased at the door.

Deadline For 10th Annual National Deaf Mixed Bowling Association May 20

LAS VEGAS — This month's deadlines of two deaf regional tourna-ments, Eastern Deaf Bowling Association and Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association are past. That leaves the last major national deaf tournament of this season, National Deaf Mixed Bowling Association that is due by May 20.

The grandfather of all deaf tournaments, Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association which had its 74th tournament last weekend at Toledo, (this writer was told) drew only 44 teams entries. It's companion ladies tournament, Great Lakes Deaf Women's Bowling Association at the same city got and the women's since 17 teams in 1960 at Milwaukee.

Blame that on bad economics. But most bowlers are saving their money for GLADBA's 75th anniversary tournament in April 2011 at Red Rock Bowl in Las Vegas. That this writer was told had already more than 50 team reservations this early to date.

As for this up and coming National Deaf Mixed Tournament, now in its 10th year is having it at Sunset Station Bowl in Las Vegas on June 21 to24. Previously in the past 9 years, it's tournaments were held in eastern states, Texas and Kansas and for its first time further west.

The entering team must consist of two men and two women, either deaf or hard of hearing bowlers. Besides the team event, it has mixed doubles event which must be a man with a woman only and no singles event. Reason for that is to allow time for other optional companion individual events, Scratch King/Queen, Galaxy (handicap) and Seniors (55 and over).

Be aware that this is a national tournament and the entry fees may be steep. To start with, it is a total of \$114 per bowler for the team and doubles events. Registration fee (\$25) and Membership fee (\$15). There are optional entry fees of \$10 for all-events, \$40 each for Scratch Kings (for men)/Queens (for women), \$40 for Galaxy and \$35 for the Seniors tournament.
