Joan was born in Venice Beach, California and early on in her life lost both of her parents. She was a graduate of the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA) with a degree in physical education. Always up for the challenge, her first job was at a school for wayward girls. She later came to Northern California to work at Napa State Hospital as a State of California Department of Mental health Administrator, a position she held for 19 years.

She was not a great bowler but she loved bowling and all of the people she met and befriended all over the United States many times paying her own way to attend association annual meetings. For many years she shared a home with her good friend Mozelle Walker and "Mo's" mother in Santa Rosa, California. Mo and Joan were collectors and their home was filled with Jim Beam bottles, Toby mugs, antique cookie jars and at one point they actually had 17 antique cars!

Joan was generous to a fault and if you complained about her over-zealous gift giving she would say, "Just stop it -it makes me feel good and I love doing it." Her contributions were many in the bowling world. She was a WIBC/ USBC member nearly 60 years and a NWBW/BWAA member for nearly 50 years. She was president of the California

USBC Halls of Fame. Joan was always fun. Her

email was "JollyJoan!" and that she was. At various meetings and events we were always waiting to see what Joan and Mo were going to come up with.

The objective on her resume submitted when she ran for a BWAA Director pretty much tells what her goals were: "To make an impact that will help make decisions that will bring the organization in touch with the 21st century and gain new members. I believe my experience, knowledge and training gained from serving on a variety of boards within the bowling industry and my knowledge and training in Governance can be beneficial.'

For all who endeared themselves to Joan, the light she brought into our lives will be missed. She was one of a kind.

VINCE WOOD Wins His Third Citrus Belt Masters

REDLANDS - Vince Wood won his third Citrus Belt Masters Title last Sunday at Empire Bowl. He is the first man to become a three time winner of our most prestigious tournament. Other two time winners were ROY DUNN (1963, 1965) and MIKE RICK (1994, 1995). Rick also won our Senior Masters Tournament in 2006.

The annual Citrus Belt KELLY C. MASTERS Tournament features a double elimination match play finals, with each match being decided by total pins for two games. Vince Wood came out of the second chance bracket to win the title. After winning his first three matches, he lost a close one to Ventura's ZARNOFF BENOUT. Undaunted, Vince came back to win his final three matches to win his crown. Our champion finished with a 6 -1 match play record and the second highest overall average (236) for the finals. LAURA LEE DANIEL'S 239 average was high for the finals.

Laura Lee and NICOLE ELLISON were the only women to challenge our best male bowlers. Laura Lee finished tied for seventh place. It is the best finish by a lady since ALISHA HILL came in third several years ago.

Vince had to defeat some great bowlers to win the tournament. He won two matches from PBA National Champion (and our defending champion) MIKE DEVANEY and two from runner-up Zarnoff Benout.

Our competitors rolled four perfect games, one during our three qualifying squads and three during the finals. Eddie Van Daniker led the way with two perfectos, one during qualifying and one during the finals. Justin Ziegler and Vince Wood rolled 300s during match play.

By my last count there were 43 entries, with our champion winning \$1000.00. Vince used his Ebonite Champion ball throughout the finals and told me he only had to change his hand position to keep striking. No ball changes were necessary. He started the finals playing inside but moved right after he saw Justin Ziegler, on the pair of lanes next to him, firing strikes from the right side. The tournament was bowled on Kegel's Abbey Road oil pattern.

Walter Ray Williams Jr. Wins **PBA50 Sun Bowl In The Villages** for 5th Career PBA50 Tour Title



THE VILLAGES, Fla. -In a stepladder final made up of three of the Professional Bowlers Association's all-time greats, Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., prevailed to win his fifth career PBA50 Tour title by capturing the Sun Bowl In The Villages presented by Hammer title Tuesday at Spanish Springs Lanes.

Williams, the reigning PBA50 Player of the Year, defeated fellow Hall of Famer and 2012 PBA50 Rookie of the Year Amleto Monacelli of Venezuela, 276-216, in the championship match to win the second tournament of the 2013 PBA50 Tour season.

Williams found it necessary to implement the unusual technique of using a different ball on each lane of the championship pair in the title match to get the desired ball reaction on each lane.

"It's not something I normally do, but I practiced with a few balls and was able to determine that if I needed to make a change like that I had the equipment I could do it with," Williams said. "It turned out that I made the right decisions at the right time and Amleto had a couple bad breaks and I was fortunate to get the win."

It was a rematch of the last time Williams and Monacelli, a 19-time Tour winner, met in a PBA50 Tour championship match when Monacelli defeated Williams 255-247 to win the 2012 PBA Senior U.S. Open last June in Las Vegas.

"Anytime you can beat Amleto it's an accomplishment," said Williams, who owns 47 PBA Tour titles which tops the all-time list. "There were so many great players in this tournament I feel very fortucontinued on page 8

North Carolina's Joe Scarborough **Rolls First 900 Series in PBA History**

Senior "rookie" starts PBA50 Sun Bowl at The Villages with three consecutive 300 games

THE VILLAGES, Fla. - Joe Scarborough of Charlotte, N.C., rolled three consecutive 300 games to start the first round of qualifying in the PBA50 Sun Bowl at The Villages at Spanish Springs Lanes Sunday, recording the first 900 series in Professional Bowlers Association history.

Scarborough, who turned 50 in October 2012, is bowling in only his second PBA50 Tour event. He qualified 38th in the re-named PBA Senior Tour's season-opener in New Port Richey, Fla., last week, but lost his first best-of-three-game single-elimination match.

The self-employed electrical contractor threw another strike to start his fourth game, but his streak ended at 37 in a row when he left a split on his 38th shot. Three straight sub-200 games then toppled him out of the lead and into a tie for 12th place with 1,921 pins, 77 pins behind leader PBA Hall of Famer Mark Williams of Beaumont, Texas, who averaged 249.75 for eight games to lead the field of 159 bowlers with a 1,998 total.

"I'm pretty surprised," Scarborough said. "I had the shot, I took my time and it worked out. To be honest, no, I wasn't nervous. I was pretending I was at home practicing, and I blocked out the crowd and focused on executing every shot.

"After the first three games, I moved to the other end of the house where the lanes were drier and I just couldn't get the ball down the lane the same way. It wasn't the pressure.

"It's unbelievable, especially to be the first in the PBA to do it," he added. Scarborough said his previous high three-game series was an 838 and he had 14 previous 300 games.

"It's interesting that I used a different ball to start practice, but I switched (to a Storm IQ Tour Pearl) and I threw six strikes in a row to end practice. So I decided to start with that ball. I knew I had something good, but not this good.

"I'm proud of what I've done so far," he added, "but I've still got work to do." Scarborough's perfect start set PBA50 Tour records for consecutive 300 games (the previous record was two by Norb Wetzel of Fond du Lac, Wis., in Albany, N.Y., in 1998 and by Rohn Morton of Portland, Ore., in Tucson, Ariz., in 2005), and highest three-game series. He also tied the record for most 300s by an individual in a PBA50 Tour tournament, shared by Ron Mohr of Eagle River, Alaska (Columbus, Ohio, 2010) and Bob Kelly of Dayton, Ohio (Mooresville, N.C., 2010).

Norm Duke of Clermont, Fla., bowled three consecutive 300s in a standard PBA Tour event in North Brunswick, N.J., in 1996, but the performance didn't count as a 900 series because he ended one round with two perfect games and started the next round with the third perfect game.

Williams, who rolled games of 269, 234, 259, 268, 204, 279, 268 and 217, said he had his only open frame in the 204 game

"The conditions were really good," Williams said. "There was a lot of oil in the front, some hold area and the carry was good. But there are a lot of games to go, so we'll see how things go."

The PBA50 Sun Bowl in The Villages produced another record when 87-year-old Darrell Ducat of Perrysville, Ohio, became the oldest player to compete in a PBA tournament.

Bob Learn Jr. Overcomes Back Injury to Win PBA50 Pasco County Suncoast Open



NEW PORT RICHEY, Fla. - Overcoming a back injury suffered in qualifying, Bob Learn Jr. of Erie, Pa., won the PBA50 Pasco County Suncoast Open Benefiting Wounded Warriors Wednesday at Lane Glo Bowl for his second career PBA50 Tour title.

In the first tournament of the 2013 PBA50 Tour (formerly Senior Tour) season, Learn defeated PBA Hall of Famer Wayne Webb of Columbus, Ohio, 226-206, in the championship match.

Learn, also a five-time PBA Tour winner, injured his back when he slipped slightly on his approach during the fourth frame of the first game of Tuesday's second round of qualifying which caused a sprain in his lower back. He managed to struggle through the rest of the round but didn't know how long he would last.

With the help of Gulf Coast Spinal Center, one of the tournament's sponsors, Learn was able get treatment on Tuesday evening and Wednesday morning to at least make an effort to bowl in Wednesday's match play.

"I thought I might have to withdraw after a couple games in the second round of qualifying but I managed to struggle through it," said the 51-year-"The treatment old Learn. helped to the point where I felt good enough to at least start match play but I had no idea how far I could go after that. The expectation was not to win but maybe make it through a match or two.

"I felt about 20 percent yesterday but felt about 80 percent today," said Learn, who had to win five matches to get to the championship match. "I was actually getting better as the day went on and was probably in my best shape when I had some of my toughest matches toward the end of the day."

One of those matches was the semifinal where Learn defeated Hall of Famer and reigning PBA50 Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., 229-216, to advance to the championship match.

Webb, who was trying to win his sixth PBA50 Tour title, defeated Tim Kauble of Marion, Ohio, in the other semifinal match, 245-206.

Woman amateur standout Lucy Sandelin of Tampa, who qualified third, was eliminated in the Round of 16, losing to Mike Dias of Lafayette, Colo., 3 games to 1. The United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer was making a bid to become the first woman to win a PBA50 Tour tournament.

The next stop for the PBA50 Tour will be The Villages, Fla., for the PBA50 Sun Bowl In The Villages presented by Hammer April 20-23. That would give us 43 bowlers making it to the semi-finals There were no women to add as Super Senior Women made it on their own.

High qualifiers for the tournament were Mike Bousquet for the men with a +146and for the women it was Beth Borci with a +60. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$3,145. Mike would draw the score. He drew a 533. We saw Tim Tran be the last one standing for the shot at \$900 in the 3-6-9 roll off. He missed on

the first shot and got a \$50 consolation for his beer money We will go for \$1,000 next week at Covina Bowl.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Ricardo Baca and Mark Andrews with a 1461 for \$100. Second was Steve Brode and William Garrett with a 1403 for \$80. There was a total of \$1,080 paid out in doubles and 24 paid spots with low to cash of 1309.

It was Beat the Board Finals, where you finish is where you will end. 43 Finalists took to the lanes for the 3 game Finals. After game one, low for the top 10 was a +38 and that was George Marquez and Freddy Zamora. The top five bowlers were Ray Varela in 5th with a +42, in fourth place was Michael Kong with a +48, in third place was Benjamin Chung with a +49, in second place was Ben Bagaoisan with a +52, and in first it was Johnny Tran with a +78. After game two, in 10th was Carla Sanchez with a +65. In ninth place, it was Jack Trongale and Bernie Navarro at a +67. In 7th, it was Hyun Ok Park at a +75. In 6th it was Beth Borci with a +79. 5th was Ben Bagaoisan with a +81, in 4th Steve Brode with a +85, 3rd was Michael Kong with a +87, in 2nd was Benjamin Chung with a +99, and in first it was still Johnny Tran with a +106. We now enter the final game

and there would be changes in the top 10 bowlers. LAURA LEE DANIEL **Nearly Wins Citrus Belt Men's Masters**

by Frank Weiler REDLANDS — Citrus Belt Hall of Famer Laura Lee Daniel nearly beat our best male bowlers last Sunday at Empire Bowl. IN MY OPIN-ION, it was only some bad luck or should I say some bad pin carry that kept her from mak-ing Citrus Belt history. None of our finalists were more consistent than Laura Lee.

Not even our champion, and my good friend Vince Wood, was in the pocket more than Laura Lee.

Ms. Daniel competed against some of Southern California's best male bowlers, including PBA National Multi-titlist MIKE DEVANEY, PBA Regional Champions EDDIE VAN DANIKER and VINCE WOOD, and stalwart PBA Regional competitors BOBBY CAMPAGNALE and RAY COBB, and won as many matches as she lost. In addition to these high rollers she fearlessly faced down such 230 average league bowlers as Zarnoff Benout, Toby Lee, Jeff Lewin, Mike Rick and Justin Ziegler.

Laura Lee performed as well as anyone during qualifying, standing in fourth place after two weeks. Her five game total of 1077 (215 average) outpaced some of her male competitors by over 150 pins, on the tricky Kegel Ab-bey Road oil pattern. After three weeks of qualifying her score was good for ninth place among forty-three entrants. This field included many young power bowlers, including a two-hander and one fella who is a young and bigger version of BOB BENOIT. Benoit was one of the first PBA stars to roll a ball with his thumb outside the thumb hole. He won several national PBA titles doing so.

During the match play fi-nals Laura Lee only got bet-ter. In fact, she led the finals in scoring with a 239.5 average!!! She was one of only three finalists to average 230, with our eventual champion averaging 236.

The finals consisted of double elimination match play format. Each match was decided by total pinfall for two games. Laura Lee's two game match scores were 485 (258 - 227), 460 (226 - 234), 479 (232 - 247), and 492 (246 - 246). No other bowler in the finals was as consistent. She never bowled a game lower than 226!

Unfortunately, the highest scoring bowler doesn't always win a Master's format tournament. The winner is the most successful match play winner.

Sometimes bowlers win matches with low scores. Sometimes a bowler wins a match with a low score because his/her opponent bowls a lower score. Sometimes a bowler loses a match with a high score because his/her opponent rolls a higher score. That's what happened to Laura Lee Daniel. I was there and saw it with my own eyes. While Laura Lee always posted great scores, she lost two close matches. Her first loss was 460 to 470 and her second loss was 492 to 509. Believe me, she was on the brink of winning both of those matches but lost because of a couple of stubborn ten pins. What else could she do? Congratulations Laura Lee, YOU BOWLED LIKE A CHAMPION. You bowled well enough to win, but were unlucky. Those oval shaped pins are unpredictable and don't always react as they should. My thanks to the BOWLING NEWS for supporting you and all the great women bowlers in Southern California.

Williams advanced to the title match by defeating Bo Goer-gen of Sanford, Mich., 258-191, in the semifinal. Goergen, who was trying for his first PBA50 Tour win, made a dramatic jump from seventh in the match play position round to make the final stepladder spot.

In the opening match, Goergen defeated Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 259-256. Weber, a 37-time PBA Tour winner who is competing as a rookie on the PBA50 Tour this season, won the PBA Tournament of Champions on March 31 for a record-tying 10th major title and also became the first player to win PBA's triple crown twice. He was also a member of the New York City WTT KingPins team that won the inaugural PBA League Elias Cup.

League Enas Cup. Several scoring records were set during the Sun Bowl In The Villages which included the first 900 series in PBA history bowled by Joe Scarborough of Mars Hill, N.C., during the tournament's first qualifying round. He ended the tournament finishing in a tie for 49th place. A record 20 300 games were bowled in the tour-nament and Scarborough along with Williams tied the record for most 300 games bowled in one tournament with three

Another milestone was set in the Sun Bowl In The Villages when 87-year-old Darrell Ducat became the oldest player ever to bowl in a PBA event.

Throughout the 2013 PBA50 Tour season, players will be competing for the opportunity to advance to the nationally-televised PBA50 Tour Finals which will be conducted as part of the World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in November. The top three players in points at the conclusion of the season will advance to the PBA50 Tour Finals.

The outcome of many a sports event is decided on the judgement decisions of officials.

There's no other way. You can't have a football, baseball or basketball game without officials. The same holds true for tennis, soccer and boxing. The list of sports is almost end-less, and it's a rare instance in any sport when the losing participants and their fans are not inclined to disagree with reference umpired and indice outfine it mildly. referees, umpires and judges. And that's putting it mildly.

Not so in bowling. It's an exact sport compared to most. On the first ball you knock all the pins down or you don't. If you do, it's a strike. If you don't you receive another ball. If you knock them all down on the second ball you have a spare. If you don't, it's an open frame.

Sure there are rules, and the bowling rule book is of good size, covering practically anything that ever has or ever could happen. The point is that the rule book is seldom necessary.

You must stay behind the foul line. The pinfall must be legal. The equipment you use and the equipment you bowl on must meet standards set forth. At times there are discussions

on some of the above points, even heated arguments. But there are more arguments in a handful of baseball, football and basketball games than there are in millions upon The element of luck plays a minor role in bowling. You

can come up with a lucky strike or a lucky game, and even a lucky night, but no bowler has a lucky season or a lucky career. Bowling is a team game, yet it's the individual that counts most.

Once on the approach, and to the foul line, a bowler is strictly on his own. If things go wrong, the bowler usually has only himself to blame. Seldom is the judgement of a second or third party involved or needed.

There is always talk about sports bringing people and nations together. That's a real laugher in many cases. It's more fact than fiction that in certain sports the officials or judges who vote points or rate performances always favor their own country's participants. That's hardly a good way to make friends and influence people. Boxers who travel to foreign countries, and that includes those coming to the United States from other nations, come to accept the fact that unless they win without any doublt, they will lose. This is particularly true in many of the Olympic sports, with ice skating, gymnastics and diving the most obvious. This problem doesn't exit in bowling. Competition is fierce, but friendly, more so because there is so little decision making by third or more parties. Bowlers roll and the scores tell the story, the whole story. It's bowling balls against pins and nobody between the ball and the pins to stop or rule against the action

Bowlers get angry, real angry, but mostly at the pins, the lanes and themselves. They don't have an official at close proximity they can lean on, cry to, or argue with. Bowling can stand alone as a sport for everyone, everywhere, and it can and does bring people, and nations too, together much quicker than most of the sports that seem to grab most of the space and attention.

Bowlers can argue with the best, and they do, mostly with each other. But rarely is it over something that happened on the lanes in regard to rules or regulations. At least rarely compared to other sports.

Refreshing because too many sports resemble wars be-tween officials and participants, and the sport itself loses something.
