S.E.D. Founder Barbara Vega Remembered by Youth Champs

PICO RIVERA — Barbara Vega, a longtime bowling coordinator for “hundreds and hundreds of kids” in the Los Angeles area, has died at 81.

Vega, a resident of Pico Rivera for almost 60 years, coached such luminaries as Professional Bowlers Assn. standout Michael Haugen Jr. and elite bowler Michelle Silver while they were growing up.

Vega was well-known as coordinator for L.A. County’s SED (South-east District) youth travel league that bowled at such sites as Keystone Lanes in Norwalk, Del Rio Lanes in Downey and La Habra “300” Bowl. She also ran a second youth travel league (girls all-stars).

In 1992, Vega was selected to the Southeast District’s Bowling Assn. Hall of Fame for her service to youth bowling.

Haugen has gone on to become one of the PBA’s foremost players with winnings close to \$800,000 and six PBA titles, including the 2008 Tournament of Champions.

“She was a great lady,” Haugen said. “Always continued on page 11

Portland, Silver Lake Advance to L.L.Bean PBA League Semifinals

Sudden-death roll-offs continue as field is cut to four

PORTLAND, Maine — Portland’s rabid bowling fans don’t need much to get them started, but they were at their loudest when the L.L.Bean Portland Lumberjacks, along with the two-time Elias Cup champion Live + Work in Maine Silver Lake Atom Splitters, advanced to L.L.Bean PBA League Elias Cup semifinals behind another set of sudden-death victories at Bayside Bowl.

The final two best-of-2-game quarterfinal round matches aired Sunday on ESPN.

The Atom Splitters, the only team to win two previous Elias Cups, got the quarterfinals off to another nerve-wracking start, clos-

ing game one of their best-of-two-game match against the MaineQuarterly.com Brooklyn Styles with six strikes for a 235-222 edge. But the Styles forced the roll-off with a 217-216 game two nail-biter. After

Brooklyn’s Parker Bohn III finished his 10th frame with a strike/nine-spares, Silver Lake’s Jesper Svensson had a chance to clinch a two-game sweep with a strike in his 10th frame, but left a 7 pin on his first shot.

He got the spare and with another chance to strike to tie the game, he left a 9 pin to send the contest in overtime where he struck for the win when Bohn left a 7 pin on his attempt.

“That was a little more exciting than I wanted it to be,” Atom Splitters’ manager Mark Baker said. “We went from having it won easily to, oh, my, we could lose this.”

After his two close chances to win, Baker wasn’t about to give up on his young Swedish two-handed player. “I asked him if he wanted to throw the shot. He said yes, and that’s all I wanted to hear,” Baker said of Svensson continued on page 7

The Most Profitable Year I Ever Had on the Pro Bowler's Tour Was A Summer I Spent in Southern California

After three years of attempting to make the “elite 40” of the Pro Bowler’s Tour, my education from Sonoma State University kicked in, and I decided to accept an offer from Dan Rochin, a Regional Supervisor for AMF, that was stationed at Rocket Bowl in Chatsworth.

One of the top pros of that era, Larry Laub, recommended that I take the position based upon his own experience. A few years earlier Laub had made \$66,000 in earnings, but his take home pay after sponsor’s fees and expenses left him with a net \$16,000.

As a Manager Trainee for AMF, I would be making almost as much net income as Laub, the fourth leading money winner on the tour that year. Now I’m not sure if Larry was recommending that I take the position with AMF to eliminate one of the new “upcoming puppies” from competition, but it turned out to be one of the best decisions I ever made.

After a brief stint at San Diego, and then Las Vegas as an Assistant Manager, the AMF executives in New York decided to make me their inaugural Promotion Specialist, and I would travel most of the western United States as a trouble shooter for the next three years.

I was based at Rocket Bowl, where I shared an office with Mr. Rochin. It was difficult finding a place to live based upon my income, but by the grace of God I was reunited with Gregg Lewis, a youth bowling acquaintance.

Gregg’s brother had just moved out of the area and Shirley Lewis, Gregg’s mom, invited me to move into his room for only \$100 per month! Their home was at the opposite side of the San Fernando Valley in Burbank, but for \$100 per month it was just fine, thank you.

As I settled into my new surroundings, I enjoyed the Burbank location and my morning jogs around Disney’s “Back Lot” and NBC Studios, where the Johnny Carson Show was broadcast five nights a week.

As time went on, I eventually earned some weekends off. That meant time for bowling tournaments, and what better place to be positioned for tournament activity than Southern California. I remember using the California Bowling News to determine what tournaments to bowl each weekend.

Here are just a few of the tournaments that entered into my decision making every Friday afternoon:

- Kwikie Giant at Imperial Bowl (squads all weekend)
- No-Tap Singles at Gable House Bowl (Friday at Midnight)
- Summer No-Tap at Cerritos Lanes (Saturday at 1PM)
- 4 Game No-Tap at Aztec Bowl (Saturday at 3PM)
- Best 3 out of 4 at Alhambra Valley Lanes (Sunday at 11AM)
- Sunday 5 Game Sweeper at Valley View Bowl (Sunday at 11AM)
- 10 Game Sweeper at Rocket Bowl (Sunday at 2PM)
- Rudy’s 6 Game No-Tap Singles at Westbrook Bowl (Sunday at 8:30PM)
- 5 Game No-Tap at Corbin Bowl (Sunday at 9PM)

But the number one tournament on my list was the Hot Pot No Tap at Grand Central Bowl in Glendale. Because the Lewis residence was just a few blocks away, I had ventured to Grand Central to practice, and became a regular at the center on Flower Street.

Easy Anderson, the desk person extraordinaire, would always put me on lanes 1 & 2, away from most of the noise and activity in the 60 lane center.

To say that the lanes were difficult would be polite, but I did find a way to reach the pocket by rolling outside the first arrow with a hard rubber Roto Star SR.

One day after a practice session Easy told me that I should give the Hot Pot a try. Because it only required a nine count on the first roll to be credited with a strike, I decided that my chances would be good, even though it was a handicapped event.

When I came to bowl the event that Saturday night I met Nick Mancini at the sign-in desk. I had read about many of Mancini’s promotions in the California Bowling News over the years, but meeting him made me realize the charisma that went with his advertising credentials.

While the entry fee was only \$20 for the five game test, Mancini encouraged me to get in the Hot Pot side pots for an extra \$5, thereby guaranteeing a \$100 payoff for a no-tap 300 game.

After a couple of weeks, I realized that the Hot Pot side pots were really what this tournament was all about for a scratch bowler.

The culmination of my understanding was one eventful night when I rolled four consecutive no-tap 300’s, and in the fifth game I had the first eleven “real” strikes before leaving the 6-10 on my last roll.

Within another couple of weeks, a lot of local pro’s, having read about the 300’s, began to show up for the event.

Mancini used this as an opportunity to run multiple squads and entries. Top notch players of the day including Fred Conner, Butch Soper, Jack Andolina, Hobo Booth and Phil Kapsimallis, to name a few, would join me in what began to look like a pro regional event.

Each week after the last squad, a group of us would head over to Bob’s Big Boy on West Riverside Drive in Burbank for a late night snack.

It became the tradition for the night’s big winner to spring for the check. Those were happy times... great memories.

And what about those AMF executives in New York that decided to move me to Rocket Bowl as a Promotion Specialist? Well they called me to make sure that everything was okay because I hadn’t cashed a paycheck in over a month. You see, I was making over \$200 a week in the Hot Pot No Tap, which was roughly equivalent to my weekly salary with AMF.

And that’s why I say that the most profitable year I ever had on the Pro Bowler’s Tour was a summer I spent in Southern California.

PBA CHAMPIONS DAVID OZIO, MIKE SHADY ENTER USBC HALL OF FAME

David Ozio, an 11-time PBA Tour champion and member of the PBA Hall of Fame, and one-time PBA titlist Mike Shady were inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame Wednesday during the USBC Annual Meeting at The Orleans in Las Vegas.

Ozio, 63, resides in Beaumont, Texas. His resume includes 1991 PBA Player of the Year honors along with a PBA Tournament of Champions title. He was ranked 34th on the PBA’s list of the 50 greatest players in PBA history during the organization’s 50th anniversary celebration in 2009.

“When you think back to the dedication and the things it took to get here, was it worth it?” Ozio asked during his induction speech. “By all means, I would’ve done it again 10 times over.”

Shady, 51, is a former collegiate star at Nebraska and Wisconsin-LaCrosse who now lives in Girard, Pa. The 1992 Earl Anthony PBA Open winner also is a two-time USBC Open Championships title holder who currently leads the tournament’s lifetime average list with a 222.28 average for 21 years of participation.

Teammates: Englehart 814, Kurtz 798

WINNETKA – There’s nothing like a good old-fashioned high-scoring shootout between two bowlers. Sometimes, it happens with a teammate and sometimes it happens against a member of an opposing team. Four years ago, Mike Weekley and Bill Plummer engaged in a high-energy, spirited duel on Lanes 1 and 2 at AMF Woodlake Lanes in Woodland Hills. The two good friends were on opposing league teams and the left-handed Plummer kept pushing Weekley by nailing nine straight strikes en route to a powerful 269. The right-handed Weekley didn’t blink and matched Plummer strike for strike and then some . . . finishing with a 300. Then there was a Battle Royale last month in Winnetka Bowl’s Mixed Classic Handicap league. This time the two gun-slinging bowlers – Johnnie Englehart and Karl Kurtz – were from the same five-man team. Englehart bowls fourth on the team; Kurtz is the anchor.

The two were crushing it in Game 1 and Englehart won the strike-filled battle, 279-278. Game 2 was won by Englehart, 259-242. The finale was a show-stopper. The two rolled strikes in the first frame and Englehart opened in the second frame after a split. Kurtz, who averages 226, spared in the second frame. “Now, it’s on,” recalled Englehart, who averages 232. The two kept matching strikes . . . nine straight for both. Englehart finished with his 10th strike in a row on his final shot to finish with a 266 and 814 series. It was Englehart’s 68th 800 series. Kurtz, needing a strike on his last ball for an 800 series, rolled his shot through the nose and finished with an eight-count and a 278 and 798 series. “Very exciting for the onlookers as well as the players,” said Englehart about the barrage of strikes between teammates. “I can vouch for that.” Surprisingly, Kurtz said he was not dueling Englehart during the series; he was just bowling his regular game. Kurtz said that Englehart’s sizzling effort was not a motivator for him to keep piling up strikes. “You do get enthused, but you don’t want to go too crazy,” Kurtz said. “That would throw you off your game. I’m looking at the team totals.” Kurtz said he and Englehart have been bowling on the same team for about 20 years. “Sometimes we look at the set [at the end of the night] and we’re within 20 pins,” Kurtz said.

The wild night didn’t stop with the Englehart-Kurtz shoot-out. As Englehart was preparing for the 10th frame, two other league bowlers were enjoying a memorable night. Kevin Gross finished with a perfect game. And Tom Everitt nailed a perfect game as well. Gross is averaging 236, Everitt 234.

Chris Ivey Finds Perfectos Are Habit-Forming

WINNETKA – Ace bowler Joe Curry called it. After Chris Ivey blasted his first perfect game at the end of March, Curry made a prophetic comment about Ivey’s future. “I wouldn’t be surprised if Chris gets another [300] next month,” Curry said. “They come in spurts.” And that’s exactly what happened. Four weeks and one day after Ivey’s perfecto in March, Ivey rolled his second perfect game. This one – like his first – came at Winnetka Bowl. Ivey, who turns 32 in June, blistered games of 300, 204 and 222 for a sterling 726 series in the six-team Wednesday Nite Rollers league. Ivey also rolled his first perfecto in his first game. “It was a total major shock,” said Ivey of his second 300. “I didn’t think I would get it that fast. I can’t believe I got it within a month. I’m so humbled. It’s so crazy how it worked out.” As for Curry’s prediction, Ivey said: “He’s right on.” Curry, for the record, also has two perfect games. And he, too, collected them within a month. In his first perfect game, Ivey admitted he felt “really felt nervous” on his 12th and final shot. This time around, Ivey, a powerful right-hander, was ready for his final attempt. “I had no nerves on this one,” Ivey said. “I just raised my arms in victory. I didn’t feel the shakes or jitters on the last shot. I probably was calling it way too early. But it finished and exploded the rack. I didn’t flinch this time.” There were no cheapie strikes during Ivey’s second 300. All were no-doubt-about-it pocket hits. “I was just trying to stay in a zone,” he said.

Everyone in the crowd thought Darren won that match by one pin but a recheck of the scores showed that in fact he had lost by one pin! Everyone including Darren was in shock. That match pitted the last two bowlers in the winners bracket and probably was the turning point in the finals, leading to Kevin’s championship. In the last match of the tournament Gagnon came back from a fifty pin deficit to win the title (409-382). He rolled the high game of the finals (247) to win that match on the strength of nine strikes. Scoring was difficult at this season’s finals just as it was during the tournament. Our champion averaged 209 while posting a perfect Match Play record (4-0). The only other finalists to average 200 were second place finisher Darron Peters (207) and fifth place finisher Tony Odom (200). Congratulations to our finalists and thanks to everyone who entered this season’s Open Tournament.

- The "KWIKIE" was the rage. The two DICK's (Cole and Goldstein) found the pot at the end of the rainbow. 788 bowlers entered the first week! Over 1500 (at \$7.50 each) stepped up in just 3 weeks. **IMPERIAL BOWL** was the Mecca for tournaments.
- **BOB MARTIN** rolled a 300 game in a squad of Blue Chip at **SOUTHWEST BOWL**. His 25,000 stamps took a lot 'o lickin'.
- **HARRY GRANT** was shouting "\$6,000.00 guaranteed in the Holiday Singles", at **ENCINO BOWL**. **DICK & DICK** tooted \$6,000.00 at **IMPERIAL**. Who could compete??
- 8 Lane Center in Montana for sale. Only \$20,000 down. You can fish, hunt and bowl all in one day within a 3 mile radius.
- The P.B.A. competed at **BOWLING SQUARE**. 160 members entered. **ED BOURDASE**, Fresno, was the victor, beating **JOHNNY PETRAGLIA** and picked up a \$6,000.00 check. **BOURDASE** had the reputation of being a "bad ass". He held the record for fists smashed through ball returns. It was reported that **ED** was out to get everyone that stood between him and winning.
- New name in the news (and still a goody) **LARRY GRAY**, Champion Marathon shooter at **SANTA FE**. **LARRY** now bowls Senior leagues and pops out a good one quite often.
- More on the KWIKIE. **LAMAR KECK** won the High Game \$100.00 plus first place \$400.00. Total payout \$10,450.00. 1773 entries in 12 days. **LAMAR** tied with **JOHN ELAND**, and **JOHN** banked \$400.00.
- **HELP** — Explain this one to me! The ad from **PRO 300 LANES**: "One Game Doubles Scratch Sweeper". I guess you could keep your same partner or switch each game. Bowl, payoff, bowl, payoff, etc, etc. Pot games for two!

son’s roll-off strike. “He threw it exactly the way we thought he would.”

“The first one I threw in the 10th I thought was quite good,” Svensson said. “When I made the spare I should have moved, but I didn’t. That got me a little frustrated but when Mark asked if I was ready to go again, I said yes. I moved and threw it really good, and it struck.

“It’s a great feeling to play in this bowling center with this crowd,” the 22-year-old Swede said. “They really pump you up. I’m the guy who doesn’t show too many emotions when I bowl but around here it’s impossible not to. It’s really cool.”

The already enflamed capacity crowd kept it up as their hometown Lumberjacks rallied in the last three frames of game one to pull out a 227-206 victory over the Barbasol Motown Muscle in the final quarterfinal round match. After starting game two with five strikes, it looked like victory was readily in hand. But “Lumberjill” Liz Johnson failed to convert a 3-10 split, and Kyle Troup, Bryon Smith and anchor Wes Malott spared in three of the next four frames while the Muscle’s Dick Allen, EJ Tackett and anchor Anthony Simonsen put together a string of five strikes to win game two, 248-225.

In the roll-off, Malott struck for Portland and Simonsen left a solid 10 pin to send the Lumberjacks into the semifinal round against the Atom Splitters.

Malott noted the lane condition started to get away from the Lumberjacks after their five-strike start in game two, but when it came to the 10th frame and he knew his team was headed to a roll-off, Malott used that opportunity to get lined up for the roll-off.

“Hats off to Anthony; he made a great shot,” Malott said of Simonsen’s misfortune. “We were fortunate to come away with the win.”

“Anthony threw a great shot, but you could see every one of these roll-offs is coming down to a single pin,” Portland manager Tim Mack added. “Fortunately today we were on the right side of the break.”

Mack said the Lumberjacks were able to pull out the win by remaining under control throughout the match.

“I told our players, even though they’ve all been in position to make huge shots during their careers, to control their emotions and not get too high because we had the crowd behind us,” Mack said. “I told them to just make one good shot in the second half and we’d have a chance to win the game. And they all threw great shots down the stretch.

“In the roll-off, (Malott) had just come off the lane. Every one of our players could have thrown that shot, but (Wes) is bowling fifth in our lineup for a reason.”

Next Sunday’s 1 p.m. EDT semifinal round telecast will feature the Sysco Philadelphia Hitmen against the defending Elias Cup champion Shipyard Dallas Strikers followed by the Live + Work in Maine Silver Lake Atom Splitters vs the L.L.Bean Portland Lumberjacks in the second “best-of-two-game” Baker format match. The winners will meet in the Elias Cup championship telecast on Sunday, May 14, at 1 p.m. Eastern. The Elias Cup finals will include singles, doubles and trios matches worth one point each, and a five-player Baker format team finale worth three points. In case of a tie, the Elias Cup will be decided in a one-ball sudden-death roll-off.

The ESPN telecast will be simultaneously streamed on ESPN3 and the WatchESPN app.

COVINA BOWL

COVINA — Covina Bowl, the Taj Mahal of bowling centers of Southern California, has closed its door after 62 1/2 years. Originally scheduled to close on Sunday, March 12, it instead closed on Saturday night March 11, to the dismay of many people who traveled to the center to say their good byes and get one last look at the one-time palace.

Covina Bowl opened on February 11, 1956, to quite the fanfare. Local sportscaster Gil Stratten wa the MC of the grand opening. The building itself was the star of the show. It was a feat of achitectural brilliance, most notably Bowlers Journal and Bowler Journal Architecture.

Most folks don’t know that the 50 lane center opened as a 32 lane facility. The first 18 lanes weren’t added till the mid 1960’s. The addition of those 18 lanes made Covina Bowl the largest center in the area.

I have many personal memories of the center. My father, Frank Barraco Sr., started working there in 1957. He would later manage the center from the late 1960’s until he retired in the mid 1990’s, and our family got a front row seat to everything that went on there.

Bowling was in it’s heyday then and Covina Bowl was in the limelight. You could not get a lane in the place from 6:00 P.M. to 12:00 A.M., Monday through Saturday. There were leagues every night filling the place. Of course you could come in at 11:00 P.M. and get on the waiting list. If you were lucky you might get one by 12 - 12:30 A.M. It also didn’t hurt that the center was open 24 hours. People would come into bowl after their swing or graveyard shirts, football games, or just for something to do during the middle of the night.

Another feaure of our center was the coffee shop. You could get a meal anytime of day. Nights and weekends were very busy. Really hard to just get a table. Folks around the area would migrate to the coffee shop solely for their famous Monte Cris-to sandwich. Yep, it was that good! There were also several beautiful banquet rooms. The Pyramid Room, The Egyptian Room, and the Garden Room were just a few. They hosted everything. Weddings, wedding receptions, bands, dances, birthday parties, grad nights, service clubs, and church meetings. You name it, we hosted it.

I suppose what really made Covina Bowl were the people. It was one BIG FAMILY! Everyone knew everybody. People even knew who’s kids belonged to who. If you were a kid in that building trying to get away with something you could forget it. Believe me I tried more than once! Never successful. There were eyes everywhere lol. Many friends were made there. Many of those friendships continue today.

There were so many stories and memories we could share, but it would take hours to tell. We played there. We ate there. We build friendships for a life-time there. We learned the art of bowling. We lived at 1060 West San Bernardino Rd.

Unfortunately all good things come to end. It was sold to Brunswick in mid 1990’s and it began to lose it’s luster and family atmosphere. Actually the next 20 years Covina Bowl began a slow painful death. AMF acquired it 2 1/2 years ago and it was even worse. It was very hard for a lot of us to watch this one time palace turn into a creaking old building, never taken care of.

Some are sad. I am not. We had Covina Bowl for 62 1/2 years. Mostly great years. Not a bad run. So goodbye to “The Meeting Place of The San Gabriel Valley”. Thanks for the memories.

positive and encouraging. She cared about all of her bowlers.”

Silver has established herself as one of the top women bowlers in the state, having won titles in the California state Queens in 2003 and the California state women’s singles in 2015. Silver rolled her 20th perfect game in the latter tournament.

“When I met Barbara, she was like a mother figure,” Silver recalled. “She was loving, kind and her door was always open to the juniors. She loved her kids more than anything.”

Silver said Vega’s “nurturing, love and support” made her feel comfortable to be part of the bowling world.

Vega worked as a youth bowling coordinator for about 30 years before she retired in 1999. Those who knew her cite her generosity to her youth bowlers.

“She dedicated her whole life to her kids,” said Carol Mancini, the editor and publisher of the California Bowling News.

“If she found a kid who couldn’t pay [for bowling], she found a way to get it paid. She always denied it, but I think she was the one who paid for it.”

Mancini added: “She did her share for bowling, I can tell you that. She got hundreds and hundreds of kids to bowl. She had no less than 16 teams [with four bowlers each] in her [SED] travel league.

“The fact that she required the kids to act like ladies and gentlemen was so great of her. She expected the most from them and she never heard a kid get nasty on the lanes or kick a ball return.”

Vega, who was born in Paso Robles, Calif., left a husband (Lyle); three sons: Michael (the oldest), Robert and Elias (the youngest); and five grandchildren.

Robert recalled that Vega started her involvement with the sport as a participant “even though she had polio as a child. Still, she was a pretty good bowler herself.”

Later, she would turn to bowling administration where she could work with young bowlers.

Those bowlers included all three of her sons, two of whom (Elias and Michael) went on to blast perfect 300 games.

Elias marveled at her mother’s skill at coaching – and particularly coaching her own children.

“When you’re a teenager, you don’t like to be told anything, particularly from your mother. I was resistant to her teaching, but I still listened,” Elias said with a laugh.

Funeral arrangements are pending.
