Dickinson **Ready To Defend ABC** Senior **Masters** Title

GREENDALE, Wis. - Despite suffering a heart attack and undergoing quadruple-bypass surgery last November, American Bowling Congress and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Gary Dickinson will be ready to defend his ABC Senior Masters title when the 13th annual event gets underway June 12-16 at the Suncoast Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

As one of senior bowling's richest professional tournaments, the ABC Senior Masters, a United States Bowling Congress event, will feature PBA Senior Tour professionals and non-professional ABC/ USBC members ages 50 and older who will compete for a projected \$140,000 prize fund and \$20,000 first prize.

Dickinson, of Edmond, Okla., won his second Masters last year at the Suncoast by defeating fellow PBA Hall of Famer Roy Buckley of Westerville, Ohio, in the threegame championship match, 638-580, to win the \$20,000 first prize. Dickinson won his first Masters title in 1997.

"It brought back some memories of our days on tour in the '70s," the 62-year-old Dickinson said of his 2004 win. "Roy was a tough player then and still is."

Dickinson suffered his heart attack shortly after winning a Senior All-Star Bowling Association Tournament in Longview, Texas, in late November.

"I started feeling bad while I was bowling - like I had indigestion," Dickinson said. "The weird thing was that it wasn't affecting my bowling at all.

"It wasn't getting better so a couple of days after I got back home I went to the doctor to have it checked out and he told me I was having a heart attack. I was admitted to the hospital where they determined I needed the bypass surgery."

Since then, Dickinson's recovery has gone well and he's been bowling since February, placing second in a recent SABA tournament and competing in the PBA Dexter Tournament of Champions as the ABC Senior Masters representative.

"I'm doing fine now," Dickinson said. "I have to do the usual things like watch my diet and exercise, but I expect to be in good shape when it's time to bowl the Senior Masters.'

Dickinson won't be bowling

With last year's title, Dickinson joined fellow hall of famers Dave Davis and Pete Couture as a two-time Senior Masters champion and brought his total of senior professional titles to 11.

The Senior Masters begins with five-game qualifying blocks for all competitors June 12, 13 and 14. After the 15 games of qualifying, the top 63 players will join Dickinson in three-game, double-elimination match-play competition June 15 and 16. The championship match is scheduled for 4:30 p.m. on June 16. Practice and pro-ams are scheduled for June 11.

SAN DIMAS-Joseph Micheri Jr. came through in the 10th frame as he won his first ABTA title the hard way. He downed five straight opponents in the top 16 Single Elim finals to take hone a nice \$1,300 top prize as he finally downed the "hot" top seed Patrick Ambrose in the title game at friendly Chaparral Lanes.

Joe Jr. bested a nice turnout of 187 bowlers (3 squads only) in the Special Event, which featured Simon Rojas capturing a Match Series pot . and Jose taking home the same amount as his brother with a win in the 3-6-9 roll off for \$1,400.

A nice, fair condition produced nice cut scores of +71 (men).and a nice +50 for the women. Due to the nice turnout we returned 47 bowlers to the Semifinals. Also added to the Semis were the Super Seniors Tom Adams, Frank Menchaca, and "Birthday Girl" Imee Ahorro.

Leading the Semis was a hot Patrick Ambrose with his fine +136 to be top seed to sit out and bowl for the title. It took a + 55 for the men and +29 for the ladies to make the finals which included three women in the top 16 finals.

This tenpin tale features bowling historian Chuck Pezzano, his family and worldrenowned bowling coach John Jowdy.

Not only are Pezzano and Jowdy both members of the ABC and PBA Halls of Fame, they have been close friends for about four decades. And, as well as being among the movers and shakers in the world of tenpins, Pezzano and Jowdy are acquainted with everyone in the bowling biz who is worth knowing

Pezzano, a charter member of the Professional Bowlers Assn., has rolled a flock of 300 games during his distinguished bowling career. He has four sons, and they once bowled as a team in the annual ABC Championships Tournament. All of the four siblings are fine bowlers, with each having recorded at least one perfect game.

Recently, Chuck's granddaughter, Amanda, fired her first perfecto. That means all six members of the Pezzano family now have a 300 game to their credit.

Amanda, a standout high school athlete in New Jersey, was already a 200-average bowler, but she became even better after she recently received two hours of on-the-lane instructions from John Jowdy.

The Bowling Writers Assn. of America awards two \$1,000 scholarships each year. They1re called the Chuck Pezzano Scholarship Awards. This year the BWAA voted to give one of the awards to...Amanda Pezzano.

And she deserves it, for in addition to being an excellent bowler, Amanda is getting straight A'a as a sophomore at the University of Pennsylvania. She¹s hoping to become a lawyer some day, and it1s a cinch she¹ll be a good one, a very good one (my opinion).

The 300s by the Pezzano clan tied a record held by the Eldridge family of Michigan City, Ind., which had father, daughter and four sons posting perfectos.

In an interesting footnote, the family of the late Dick Weber had five members with 300s.

Ever hear of a free bowling tournament in which the winner could win \$1,000? Well, it's true. It's called the Nothing to Lose Free Bowling Tournament, sponsored by Harrah's Hotel & Casino in Reno. So, what's the catch?

The only catch is that bowlers must stay at Harrah's, which entitles them to a free

entry for each night they stay there. Then, you head for nearby AMF Starlite Lanes and bowl three games. The highest threegame series, with handicap (80% of 200), will determine the winner.

All contestants-men and women over 21 years of agemust have a sanctioned league average for at least 21 games. No pros may enter, meaning anyone who has been a member of a professional organization the past five years is not eligible..

The tournament, which is already underway, continues through May 27. You may bowl at Starlite Lanes any time lanes are available from Sunday through Thursday between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. and from 9 p.m. to 11 p.m.

Bowlers may reenter, but they must have an official entry form from Harrah's. There are certain other stipulations, so be sure to read the tournament rules before bowling.

Here's another incentive to enter the Nothing to Lose Tournament: For every member of the California Women's Bowling Assn. and/or the men1s California Bowling Assn. who enters the event, their respective organizations will receive a \$10 rebate, with \$5 going to the local associations. * * :

Speaking of the CWBA reminds me that Newhall1s Robin

Romeo will be among those inducted into the CWBA Hall of Fame on May 21 in Covina. The induction ceremonies will be held during the organization¹s annual Covention Week activities.

It's the latest honor for Robin, who already belongs in several other Halls of Fame, including the big one-the WIBC-in which she was enshrined in 1995.

A six-time All-American, Robin was voted Bowler of the Year in 1987, the year she captured the prestigious U.S. Open. It was one of 17 pro titles Robin won before retiring from the women's pro tour-which promptly fell apart without her (my opinion).

Of all the records Robin set during her long pro career, her late father, Raymond, was proudest of the fact that she had made the cut in 77 straight PWBA tournaments. And she did in the good old days when there more than twice as many entrants as the 35 or so who competed during the years just before the PWBA folded. Those, indeed, were the good

old days.



What Do You Mean, It Makes No Difference? or Two Score Raisers Many Bowlers Don't Know About, or Know But Fail To Do

Since we all know that a bowling ball skids before it rolls and that it will skid longer in heavier oil, one way to get it to roll (grab) earlier is to actually reduce the ball's angle of rotation during the release. This obviously cuts down on the amount of hook, but the earlier roll grabs the lane surface sooner. One way to do this is by using a roll-roll release rather than the usual skid-hook-roll release.

There are at least a couple of different ways to do this. Here we'll describe the easier of two effective ones. What must be accomplished is a change in two things from the normal release. First, the angle of rotation (rev angle) must be reduced; second the ball's axis tilt must also be adjusted (usually lessened) to no more than a few degrees off the horizontal. Why? Because 1, the greater the rotational angle, the more and longer the ball will skid and 2, the greater the axis *tilt* the more the ball will spin like a top, neither of which we want in heavy oil because the ball will go too long, every time.

Here we must remember the following: Since it is the fingers which rotate the ball, the angle of rotation depends upon how far those fingertips bring the bottom of the ball (finger holes) around it's side during the release. So to create the desired lesser rotational angle for this shot, the fingers must move around the ball less...thus reducing the number of boards the ball will hook

In combination with this lesser rotational angle, we also want less axis tilt.

Since axis tilt is controlled by wrist position, it can be reduced by letting the wrist break backwards (collapse) a bit at the release point, so that when the fingers trigger the release, it's almost like rolling a dumbbell down the lane...the axis remains almost horizontal. This release maintains enough revs, yet doesn't let the ball skid too long! Of course a greater outside line must be used for such a shot.

Sure, we always have the option of changing equipment to fit oily conditions. But using the wrong release with the right ball is just as bad as throwing the perfect ball with the wrong release. Doing both correctly will make you a double threat for bigger scores.

B - THE 'FREEZE' AT THE LINE TECHNIQUE or POST YOUR POSITION

This is so simple and easy to develop and do that I consider it ridiculous that it isn't taught more. It's actually so scarce that it's not even done by the vast majority of pros, never mind better amateurs. Yet, when my students do it, their scores virtually always improve. It's simple enough. Just make the following simple rule for yourself and follow it with every shot, strike or spare, until it becomes habit. Trust me, it won't take long:

Whatever position your body happens to be in when you come to a stop at the line, simply freeze in that position ... then hold it, without moving any part of your body, until pin fall, less than 3 seconds or so on average! If this seems silly at first, never mind...do it anyway! (If you happen to be off balance, of course, you'll find that you won't be able to freeze and hold it. No big deal; just keep repeating it and after a few tries, you'll find your balance improving all by itself.)

The point is, if a bowler can't hold his/her position at the line for a couple of seconds after the shot, it means only one thing...the position is usually inconsistent during the shot as well! And if the body position at the line varies from shot to shot, so does the shot itself! This makes the shot inconsistent...which means that even if your position at the line is incorrect, at least it's always the same, which makes it easier to correct!

Incidentally, the term "POST YOUR POSITION" describes this freeze at the line nicely...creating more consistency

THE WRONG AND THE RIGHT

The point of the above observation is that even if you find your position at the line to be incorrect...meaning that it isn't what you want or need to help create the desired release, at least now you know it for sure! On the other hand, the bowler whose body is in motion during and after every shot has no way of knowing where he/she was during the shot ... and therefore has no way of correcting it.

WHY DON'T MOST BETTER BOWLERS DO THIS?

Good question! The answer is simple; they either don't know about it because it's seldom taught, or they don't consider it important because they don't see anyone else doing it. Possibly they think it makes no difference. Obviously, the bowler who doesn't know about it won't be doing it. Nevertheless, it seldom done. I can promise you this...once you do start posting and see the improvement in your game, it will become like a religion! With my students it never fails. The 150 bowler quickly improves to 160, 170 or better. It seems to work for everybody who does

ADITIONAL SCORE RAISING POINTERS

Once you start posting, you'll quickly notice one important thing you probably never noticed before...that you are suddenly keenly aware of just exactly what position your body is in at the line. You may think you always knew, but you'll probably be surprised at what you see and feel while posting. (Those who've had videos taken are the exception, of course.) When bowlers I've worked with first become aware of what they've looked like at the line for years, I hear things like, "My God! Is that what I look like?" Once that happens, then the position improve-ments can begin, and here are a few you should consider:

step in front of the other foot! This keeps the ball's weight from pulling the body off balance sideways because nowmyour front foot is closer to your body's center of balance, making the release far more steady and repeatable.

So...while it is true that posting your position will create more consistency even if that position isn't the best, these three techniques will make it easier to post, plus adding both power and accuracy to the consistency that posting will provide!

1 - Many better bowlers turn their bodies to the right when arriving at the line (left for left handers). This is one of the worst ball score killers of all, because it forces you to steer the ball, which is seldom accurate. Even crankers, despite all their revs, seldom get away with this body turn in today's thicker oils, especially on spares. Bowlers don't do this on purpose; it is caused by two possible things. Either the finishing foot turns inward at the line, turning the whole body with it, or the back leg is pulled too far around behind the body, creating the same wrong body turn

The foot turning on the last step is fixed by consciously turning the foot in the opposite direction (slightly outward) at the line, so it ends up facing slightly toe out. The back leg can be kept from swinging too far around in a circle behind you by thinking of it as a rudder which never turns past 7 o'clock behind the body (5 o'clock for left handers). The late hall of Fame champion Dick Weber, is credited with the rudder idea, by the way. 7 o'clock is far enough to clear the hip for the release...so deliberately kicking the back leg too far sideways behind you (as I've seen taught by some) is actually bad news.

2 - At the line, the chest should end up directly above the front knee. That ancient chest past the foul line body bend doesn't work well in modern conditions, in spite of all the photos you see of old time greats bending forward with the back leg kicked up in the air. I see far too many bowlers still doing this. In many cases it forces hanging on to the ball too long during the release, thus slowing down the revs. So keep that back leg down with at least a slightly bent knee! This also helps avoid having to keep yourself from hopping forward at the line, which I also still see too much of among some supposedly better bowlers

3 - Far too many 190 to 210 bowlers fall off the ball sideways at the release. For a 120 bowler I can understand this, but not for anyone with a 150 plus average. This is a real accuracy killer. The cure is so simple as to be almost laughable. On the last step, whether you slide or not, simply

High School Bowling Program Continues Momentum Under United States Bowling Congress

GREENDALE, Wis.-The bowling industry has been making an investment in bowling's future and it's paying off.

Under the guidance of the United States Bowling Congress, a platform exists to expand bowling opportunities for high school bowlers while also achieving the goal of promoting the sport to younger bowlers.

Initially, as a jointly funded program with USBC, High School Bowling USA was administered in Arlington, Texas, under the supervision of the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America. Now, through mutual agreement, USBC High School is funded and administered through its headquarters in Greendale, Wis. BPAA will continue to provide support and advice through participation on the High School Advisory Board and through their members' support of the high school programs locally across the nation.

For an indication of just how far the program has evolved since its inception on Aug. 1, 2001, just four states had boys and girls varsity level bowling programs, two states had girls varsity programs and 14 states had club level programs. Nearly four years later, 14 states have boys and girls varsity level bowling programs, one state has girls varsity level and 25 states have club programs. The balance of states are either working on or nearing implementation of high school programs.

"With USBC's future role as the sport's national governing body, the infrastructure is in place to best facilitate and support the program's needs as a competitive sport," said USBC Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin. "Since this initiative has evolved from a plan on a piece of paper to a growing and successful program, it's important that we keep the momentum moving and we can best do that as part of USBC."

In most cases, states that have accepted bowling as a varsity sport, bowling must be conducted as a team competition under the jurisdiction of a conference. Like other varsity sports, there must be a system in place to advance teams representing schools to a state championship. There can be exceptions for areas which have smaller programs or are not part of a conference and where travel and other logistics might need to be considered. Some programs also may include a supplemental individual competition at the state championships, if desired. For states that have not received varsity status, high schools conduct bowling as a club sport.

"High school bowling is the fastest growing high school sport in the country," said Director of USBC High School Christine E. Zahn. "We can also take pride in the fact that the National Federation of State High School Associations has been very impressed with the industry's dedication, funding and planning to move this program forward."

ONE BALL AMENDMENT TURNED DOWN

LAKE FOREST — This writer recently received the 2005 Bowling Writers Association of America's Mort Luby Hall of Fame award; it wasn't for how I wrote but what I wrote...mainly about the good and sad things the American Bowling Congress and the local associations did for the bowler.

Being a bowling historian with a long memory covering the area's first sanctioned 300, 800 series then expanded to state, national, even a bit of international stuff.

In-between I wrote a great number of amendments — local, state and national. Years ago it was mandatory that annual ABC sanctioned tournaments teams be composed of five men which I thought was unfair. So I wrote one making the annual event team number optional, and while on the fairness kick amendment #2 placed a limit on the number of bowling balls a man could use.

It was easier to fill four-man teams. With five-man teams going to nationals and state tournaments, an organizer had to get two teams in order to enter five doubles teams — on a five-man team the odd man was out. The "rich" competitor with more than one ball had an edge, he could carry a "strike" and "spare" ball.

Oh, both the ABC and proprietors were against the liberalization. Years later the "Congress" let the locals drop to fours. But, the one-ball per man events didn't make it.

To legalize the multi-ball habit, congress ruled a player could use all the balls he could personally carry from the paddock to the lanes, then amended the rule so the weak, superannuated, rich and poor bowlers could wheel to the lanes as many balls as they could safely handle.

Since then, many things happened to tenpins. Automatic setters, televised scoring, computerized lane dressing machines, synthetic
