

# **TEAM USA TAKES GOLD**, **SILVER IN TRIOS AT PABCON**

GUADALAJARA, Mexico - Team USA's Bill O'Neill, Mike Fagan and Chris Barnes broke the all-time Pan American Bowling Confederation Men's Championships trios record en route to the gold medal Wednesday.

The Americans totaled 4,179 for six games, an average of 232.17, while competing on dual lane conditions. The 44-foot London pattern was on the left lane, while the 34-foot Stockholm pattern was on the right lane at Bolerama Tapatio.

O'Neill led the way with 1,560, an average of 260, and was followed by Barnes' 1,330 and Fagan's 1,289. The other Team USA squad of Walter Ray Williams Jr., Patrick Allen and Wes Malott earned the silver medal with 4,035. Canada took the bronze with 3,936.

"Our first couple days here were pretty rough, but we're pretty smart and once we see a pattern for six games, we know what it takes out there,"

said O'Neill, who helped the trio break the record of 4,024 set by Team USA in 1989. "We've gotten more comfortable with this bowling center, and we utilized one of our biggest strengths, which is communication." Team USA got off to a strong start as O'Neill began the squad with 11 straight strikes before leaving the 2-4-5-8 on his final shot for a 296 game. Barnes added 230 and Fagan shot 215.

"There are so many great bowlers here, and we just wanted to get our foot on the gas and get going," O'Neill said. "It was nice to throw the ball well today."

Malott led the other Team USA trio with 1,388, while Allen shot 1,348 and Williams had 1,299 as they finished nearly 100 pins ahead of the Canadians.

Dan MacLelland led the Canadian effort with 1,363 and was joined by Michael Schmidt (1,321) and George Lambert (1,252).

With 18 of 24 games completed in the all-events race, O'Neill surged into the lead with 4,198, a 233.22 average, while MacLelland is second with 4,165. Allen is third with 4,158.

Williams sits in fifth place, Fagan is seventh, Barnes is ninth and Malott sits in 10th place. The top 16 players in the all-events standings after 24 games advance to Friday's match-play Masters.

Competition will shift to the marquee event of the PAB-CON Championships, the fiveplayer team event, on Thursday as all teams will complete six games.

The PABCON Men's Championships features teams in the American Zone competing in five-player team, trios, doubles, singles, all-events and match-play Masters.

# Val Wise 3rd ABTA at Valley View

Eddie Katz shoots 299 in Record Turnout for 1 day event Match Game is \$3.500 • Match Series estimate of \$1.200 next week ABTA Returns to BRC Foothill Lanes this Weekend For a Special Handicap Frozen Event • 3-6-9 is \$1.300 at BRC Foothill Lanes

GARDEN GROVE — We returned to popular Valley View Lanes this past weekend and had a huge ABTA record turnout of 338 entries in our One day event. We thank all the members of the ABTA for their support each week. We had a decent shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +58 for the men and +39 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Pablo Castro (+45), John Camisa (+41) and Linda Galsim (+32). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 78 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week. During our 4 pm squad we would see Eddie Katz string the first 11 strikes and come up for number 12 but let up on the shot a little and left the 10 pin, to finish with a very nice 299 game.

For all qualifying squads, our top qualifier for the Men was Danny Guevarra with a +178, and for the women it was Chontida Athiprayoon with a +92. Each of them will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$592. The top seed drew a 612. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during qualifying and at our next event we will estimate the Match Series at \$1,000. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, Anthony Dancel and Danny Guevarra each received a \$25 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$1,300 at Foothill Lanes.

In our optional doubles finishing in first were Gerald Sanchez and Jemerald Soon

with a 1528 for \$200. Finishing second was Danny Guevarra and Vuong Do with 1484 for \$180. There was a total of \$2,010 paid out in doubles and 25 paid spots with low to cash of 1359.

In the semis, which began at approximately 10 pm due to the huge turnout, we saw Som Seng, lead the field with a +144 sit out and bowl for the title this week. Coming in second was Val Wise with a +125 to sit out the first round. It took a + 51 for the men and + 42 for the women.

Wise, top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the match game worth \$3,500, the pot maxed out and we have a back-up pot started. He drew a 236. We had no bowlers who shot that score. We will have \$3,500 next week at BRC Foothill Lanes, and continue to build on the back-up pot. We had ten new bowlers join us. # **Memories - San Hi Lanes**

SAN BERNARDINO—What I remember most about San Hi Lanes are the bowlers. Guys with great talent, who were great competitors. There was Clarke Moore, Donnie Crandall, Ron Sandusky, and Corky DeMaio to name a few. All these guys are members of the Citrus Belt Hall of Fame.

Clarke Moore was probably the best spare shooter the Citrus Belt has ever seen. We were teammates one season, in a Friday night mixed league at San Hi. I remember watching Clarke for thirty-two weeks, and only seeing him miss one ten pin. Yes, a right handed bowler who only missed one ten pin spare in 96 games! I remember that Clarke never had a series below 600 that season. He averaged a league high 227, and exhibited more accuracy than I have ever witnessed on the lanes.

Donnie Crandall regularly averaged 230 plus in the 1990s, and he did it effortlessly. His style was so much like Earl Anthony's. I loved watching this smooth lefty just roll his ball up the five board into the pocket, frame after frame.

Ron Sandusky is the only bowler who has won both the Citrus Belt Masters and Senior Masters tourneys. He has bowled high scores for forty years.

What I liked about Ron was the type of ball he rolled. One of the few guys I ever saw roll a strong spinner. His ball seemed to spin like a top, all the way down the lane. I never saw anyone else spin a bowling ball that way.

Corky DeMaio was ALL CLASS. While most league bowlers in those days wore jeans, T-shirts or shorts, Corky would show up in a Ban Lon shirt and dress slacks. A quiet man, he only spoke when there was something worth saying. He was a REAL PROFESSIONAL. By the way, Corky was just as smooth on the lanes as off.

In addition to these and many other great bowlers from San Hi Lanes, how can I forget the long skinny concourse, the snack bar with the all-American feel and looks of a diner. How can I forget the high control desk that reminded me of the desk of a Superior Court judge. I remember MARV SARGENT'S little pro shop, with Marv's huge California State Masters Championship trophy in the display window. I remember the small front parking lot and the large neon sign out front. Those were the good old days! Thank you CAROL MANCINI and BOWLING NEWS for bringing back some great SAN HI LANES memories.

Rings awarded for a 300 game, 800 or 900 series have all been redesigned as well.

USBC members can earn one award in each category (Game or Series) per season, with the eligibility as follows:

Our last tournament found us at Brunswick West Covina Lanes, all by ourselves, with the Open division taking a bye for Pepsi State finals. I got the word out for all to take advantage of the Farm Club leaders being away, but noooooooo! We had just seventeen bowlers going for their shot at a title. For those that didn't make it out, I don't want to hear any complaining. Even with the small field though, we made a cut to eight for the second round, and five for the finals. We thank the staff and management for a fun and relaxing day.

In the qualifying round, we found the scores to be consistent and very close. No one bowler was going to run away with this tournament. We had reportable scores from Christian Borao 239-237-220, Matt Miller 236, Baujee Harlan 236, Courtney Schultz 233, John Struckman 226, Ashley Dunn 223, and Marguerite Evans 221. As you've probably assumed, Borao led the group at plus 55, with two others on the plus side. The low to make the cut came in at minus 62. I told you it was a close tournament.

In match play we found a few more highs coming in from James Knapp 232, Borao 231-223, and Struckman 222. I always like to point out the Farm Club format and where it covers several skill sets that these bowlers are learning. It was very evident in match play and in the last couple of matches I even pointed out the closeness of the tournament and how one loss could take you from the top, to out-of-luck. Another lesson is endurance. In close tournaments and really needing to be on your game, the least bit of being tired can spell trouble, unless you know how to compensate (a different lesson). Knapp and Struckman took advantage of the match play format and with 4 matches won (additional 120 pins), moved into the top two spots (jump of three positions each). Meanwhile our leader and dominant shooter had only two wins and a miscue at the wrong time. Luckily, he had padded his lead enough to keep him in the finals. And not to pick on him, as the other two leaders of qualifying, bowled their way out of the finals.

Those finals then started out with the 5th seed Jason Tilden (+11) taking on the 4th seed Luke Holley (+33), who also jumped three positions to get into the final five. Holley seemed to favor this pair and proceed to show it with a 231-143 win. Next up to face Holley was the 3rd seed Borao (+52). Even with a respectable game, Holley was too hot taking the quarter final match 243-187. Now working his way through the field, Holley then faced the 2nd seed Struckman (+83). This was a very close match and while I was preparing for a roll-off, Struckman kissed the fat lady dead on the lips in the 10th frame, leaving a solid pocket hit – with the 7 and 9 pin standing. Holley took this match to advance 202-193. Now in the final pairing format (best of three games), Holley had the luck and the line as he faced the top seed Knapp (+123). First game was close 201-191 (just not as climatic), and the second game, well 235-154 speaks for itself. Holley takes his first JAT Farm Club title and the rest of us finally got to see him smile. Congratulations Luke.

Our next tournament is this Sunday (5/22) at La Habra 300. This will be our last regular tournament of the season and we will be using the Open division format of six qualifying games, followed by bracket elimination. This is a very important tournament for those of you wanting to get into or stay within the cut for the Invitational tournament. The JAT points for the La Habra tournament will almost be doubled because of the format.

And why should it be important to get into the Invitational tournament? That tournament IS double JAT points and the points is one of the criteria for our Bowler of the Year, Rookie of the Year, and All-Star team selection at the end of the season. Besides, it's just a fun tournament and you all love bowling so much, I know you will not want to miss the chance.

Now a little detail on the Invitational Tournament and to give you enough information to make a adequate choice. Our Invitational Tournament will be at Mission Hills Bowl on June 5th.

We are inviting the top 20 bowlers in JAT points and the format will be 10 games of match play with a top five finals. The JAT point standings as of and including the West Covina tournament is: Dubia (6510), Chan (4415), Mayfield (3800), Struckman (3615), Dunn (3470), Chui (3240), Beaner (3090), Harlan (2970), Miller (2820), Brooks (2660), for our top 10. But don't get cocky and not show up to La Habra. You might get bumped.

The next ten bowlers (11th – 20th) are: J. Tilden (2450), Borao (2440), Holley (2375), Martinez (2005), K. Tilden (1963), Ma (1690), Van Rijsbergen (1570), Hutchison (1500), Knapp (1370), and Acosta (1168). You are the bowlers that most definitely want to be at La Habra.
