Bowlmor Joins AMF's Existing Second Lien Lenders, Randy Pedersen is Unlikely Winner **New Chapter 11 Plan for AMF Bowling Worldwide**

The New Company, Bowlmor AMF, To Be Owned by Second Lien Lenders and Bowlmor's Owners, Would Combine the Businesses of Bowlmor and AMF

NEW YORK — AMF Bowling Worldwide, Inc. and certain of its affiliates ("AMF") filed a new chapter 11 plan of reorganization and disclosure statement today sponsored by Strike Holdings LLC (known as "Bowlmor"), and certain of AMF's second lien lenders, including Cerberus Series Four Holdings, LLC ("Cerberus"), and Credit Suisse.

'The combination will not only result in a strong company but also the best bowling experience possible. We are

committed to making Bowlmor AMF a truly great company for the bowling public, our partners and our employees."

The plan provides that AMF will be reorganized and combined with Bowlmor to form a company that will be known as Bowlmor AMF, which would be the largest operator of bowling centers in the world with 7,500 employees, 276 bowling centers and combined annual revenues of approximately \$450 million. The plan provides that

AMF's second lien lenders will convert their debt into equity in Bowlmor AMF, so that Bowlmor AMF will be owned jointly by the financial institutions that hold AMF's second lien debt and by equity holders in Bowlmor. Credit Suisse will provide a term loan facility in the principal amount of \$230 million, and a revolving loan facility in the principal amount of \$30 million. The largest holders of AMF's existing second lien debt have expressed continued on page 2

Throughout the 2013 PBA50 Tour season, players are competing for the opportunity to advance to the nationally-televised PBA50 Tour Finals which will be conducted as part of the World Series of Bowling V in Las Vegas in November. The top three players in points at the conclusion of the season will advance to the PBA50 Tour Finals. The top three after five tournaments this season are Walter Ray Williams Jr., Bob Learn Jr., and Lennie Boresch Jr.

DEAF TRAVEL SWEEPER: ABAKUMOFF 289/849 TOPS BUT AUDETTE TAKES \$\$\$

YORBA LINDA — So. Cal. Deaf Traveling League ends its 53rd season with an exciting sweeper at Yorba Linda Bowl. League President Ed Abakumoff started the day with 10 strikes in row, left a pin standing, spared and closed with a strike for a 289 game. Previously in his last Wednesday league in Moreno Valley, Abakumoff ran 7 strikes in row, then left a pin, spared and finished with 4 strikes for a 279 game. After his 289, Ed followed with yo-yo games if 173-203-184 for the day's high 849 series.

Bowling against Abakumoff was Robert Audette who after a 204 start hit a 254 and 206 before slumping to 169 for 833. Beating Audette's 833 by one pin was Francisco Navarro who finished with a 231 after games of 215-210-178 for 834. After these 800's came Leroy MacMonagle with (206) 766 Bob Jones' (216) 764, Bob Taylor 707, Connie Marchione (202) 706 and Andy Lorenzo 214. The top ladies were Celia Salcedo with 656 and Anita Lorenzo with 176.

For the team scratch sweepstakes, Audette had better help from his Whittier teammates Andy Lorenzo and Randy Salazar as Whittier won with 2168. Abakumoff's Riverside with Celia Salcedo and Dennis Vigil placed 2nd with 2124. Despite Navarro's 834, MacMonagle with Pat Morford and Wesley Kay, their Orange County's 2041 beat Navarro's Covina for 3rd place.

In fairness to lower average bowlers, this travel league uses handicap in single s and doubles sweepstakes. Audette with 122 handicap 955 had 40 pins advantage over Abakumoff and Navarro, took a lion's share of the sweeper singles, doubles and mixed doubles prize pots. Celia Salcedo with 20 handicap advantage over other 3 women took the most if the women's pot money.

The league's team points money were distributed with the bowlers points prize money differs by only \$80 dollars from first place and 8th place. The champion Orange County trio of Patricia Morfard, Wesley Kay and Leroy MacMonagle with 189 leading points taking \$290.48 each. The 8th place S.F. Valley trio of Alphonso Ruelas, Anita Lorenzo and Bob Jones with 137 points took \$210.41 each.

In addition to the league's special prizes, the Champion team Orange County got \$75.00 (\$25.00 each). The 2nd place team Whittier got \$45.00 (\$15.00 each). Whittier also got \$30.00 for its season high series of 2202. Team Covina with 631 took the season high game.

The rest of special prizes were for individual achievements. Francisco Navarro his season high series 879 prize and a memento prize for his 300 game bowled in the season opener. Bob Jones took the season high game 278 game. Prize. The women's prizes went to Anita Lorenzo for her season high series of 714 and Pat Morford for her season high game 205.

The high average prize went to Leroy MacMonagle's 192 and Connie Marchione presented him with the league's Charles R. Hart Memorial Perpetual Trophy. The women's high average prize went to Celia Salcedo's 157. MacMonagle also took the most improved man prize with 7 pins and Morford's 3 pins took the improved woman's prize.

Most points won prize went to Randy Salazar with 53 points and the woman's part went to Anita Lorenzo with 49 points. Second most points were split between MacMonagle and Navarro with 51 each. Taylor took the 3rd place with 47 points.

MacMonagle took the most 200 games prize with 22, also the most 800s prize and tied with Abakumoff with the most 700 or better series. Salcedo took the woman most 600 or better prize with 11.

Finally the league's Masters tournament held during the season prizes were paid out. The winner MacMonagle took \$80.00, Runner up Bob Jones got \$50.00 and 3rd place Navarro \$40.00, 4th Gorman Low \$30 and \$25.00 each went to Abakumoff, William Golyer, Emad Aranki and Randy Salazar.

The league thanks Yorba Linda Bowl management and staff as being excellent hosts and for allowing the league bowl in the center and having a potluck lunch while bowling.

The oldest all deaf scratch traveling league will have its meeting to start its 54th year on August 11th at Keystone lanes. All deaf and hearing-impaired bowlers are welcome.

In addition to second lien lenders, the plan has the support of the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors. AMF's first lien lenders will receive payment in full, in cash, of principal, interest at the non-default rate, and their fees.

"The prospect of combining Bowlmor's proven approach to operations and marketing with the AMF brand, its large number of locations and national market penetration represents an exciting opportunity for both companies," said Bowlmor's Founder and CEO Tom Shannon, who will serve as the Chairman, CEO and President of the combined company. "The combination will not only result in a strong company but also the best bowling experience possible. We are committed to making Bowlmor AMF a truly great company for the bowling public, our partners and our employees."

Joining Shannon on Bowlmor AMF's executive team will be Bowlmor's President and Chief Financial Officer, Brett Parker, who will become Vice Chairman, CFO and EVP of Bowlmor AMF. The new Bowlmor AMF will be jointly owned by AMF's existing second lien lenders, who will hold 77.53%, and Shannon and Parker, who will collectively hold 22.47% of the new company.

The next step in this process is a hearing set for May 23, 2013 at which the Bankruptcy Court in Virginia overseeing AMF's chapter 11 case will be asked to approve the disclosure statement so that the plan can be sent to AMF's creditors for approval. Assuming that the Bankruptcy Court approves the disclosure statement on May 23, the plan will be sent out for a vote and the Bankruptcy Court will schedule a hearing to confirm the plan. What would be the Scratch Bowler's Utopia? The scratch player's Ultimate "Pot" Game, if you will? Wouldn't it give multiple opportunities to cash? Not just winner take all. Wouldn't the ideal "pot" game pay for consistency over time, i.e., totals for numerous games? Not just on a flash-in-the-pan, one game, bowl well, get compensated or bowl bad, tough luck kid, hit the road result. NORWALK - We returned to Keystone Lanes where we saw a semi-tough shot and 195 entries come out on Saturday for a fun day of bowling. The cut scores were + 97 for the men and + 77 for the women, on a medium shot this week. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) Mike Bousquet +89, Ben Bagosian + 74, and Sierrie Herradura +46 for the women at +39. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 49 bowlers making it to the semi-finals

The High qualifiers for the tournament Emilio Flores for the men with a + 174 and for the women it was Deborah Abahazy with a + 155. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$1,500. Emilio drew a 495. We had one bowler who shot that and it was Eric Will Since this was his first event with the ABTA he would take home 25% which was \$385. That means we will have a carry over of \$1,155 to next week at Covina Bowl. This week we saw Gilbert Gissendaner and Kevin Collier miss in the final round, so both will get \$25. We will go for \$1,200 next week at Covina Bowl.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Emilio Flores and Dino Cantoria along with Don Ouitangon and Tim Tran with a 1498 for \$130. There was a total of \$1,370 paid out in doubles and 23 paid spots with low to cash of 1392.

After bowling the semifinals, finishing in first was Jo Jo Barcelona with a +186, and coming in a close second was Derrick Brown at a +154. Derrick sat out the first round. Our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$5,000. Jo Jo Barcelona drew a 252 this week After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who shot that score, so we will estimate the pot at \$5,000 for our next event. We now have a second pot started that is at \$1.625.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Jimmy Wong, Mike Bousquet, Sandy Rosenblum, Bernie Navarro, Joevin Bolanos, Adam McKenzie, and Alan Libao, each will get \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Derrick Brown, Deborah Abahazav, Tomas Chavez, and Beth Borci with each getting checks of \$105.

This would get us down to the final five bowlers. The weekly horses are paying a low of \$44, Don Quitangon, to a high of \$102 for Kent Maruyama. In one of the matches, we saw our tenth seed Don Quitangon bowling the eleventh seed Kent Maruyama.

This match went back and forth and saw both bowlers bowling quite well. But it was Don who in the ninth frame left the greek church and failed to pick it up and that translated to a 247-242 victory for Kent Maruyama. In the other match it was sixth seed Jiradej Harnpatanakiitpach bowling the twelveth seed Freddy Zamora. It was another close match, we saw both bowlers battle throughout. In this one, Jiradej came up on top with a 214 to 208 finish to advance. Finishing in 4th and 5th place this week were Freddy Zamora and Don Quitangon. They each got \$110.

semi-final match Our was all set, and would pit the sixth and tenth seeds from the semis against each other. In the weekly "horses", we would see Jiradej paying \$46 and Kent paying \$102 if they would win their match. This was again another good match from both bowlers. Kent started out with three strikes while Jiradej would start out the match with 2 out of 3 opens to put him down by 41 pins. Nevertheless, Kent's lead did not last long as a pair of splits in the fourth and fifth frames allowed Jiradej a chance to catch back up. He would open in the fourth also but come back with a strike in the fifth that started a string of strikes for him. Both bowlers got strikes in the sixth and seventh frames and the lead was now down to

19 pins. In the eighth frame, it was Jiradej who would blink first as he left the 8 pin and picked up his spare. Kent got a strike and the lead would jump back up to 40 pins. It would finish out this way as both bowlers would string strikes for the ninth and tenth frames. Kent would go on to finish with a 225/261 to Jiradej 203/234 to advance to the title match. Jiradej would finish in 3rd place for \$200 and Kent advanced to the title match and was your horse winner for \$102.

The title game was all set at Keystone Lanes. It would be top our qualifier Jo Jo Barcelona going against the tenth seed Kent Maruyama. We saw both bowlers start out with strikes to open up the match. Kent would spare in his second frame and then Jo Jo left the 4-6-7 split and was down by 20 pins after the second. Both bowlers would mark in the next two frames. Jo Jo then mounted a comeback with three strikes in the 5-6-7 frames to trail by only 3 pins after the seventh frame. In the eighth frame, another 4-6-7 split by Jo Jo left the door open and Kent jumped on it with three

straight strikes to finish it out. Kent went on to finish out with a 216/252 to Jiradej 198/224 to take home his fourth ABTA champsionship. He would take home \$1,000 for the victory and an additional \$595 for Cash and Carry to give him a total of \$1,595. Jo Jo would take home \$500 for his second place finish.

Jiradei Harnpatanakitpanich, Third Place, is from Buena Park and used a Game Breaker Ebonite drilled by David Haynes. He is single and would like to say thank you to Jenny for all her support even though she was not there due to work. A Special thank you to his coach Mark Baker, his staff at Camp Baker, the ABTA and its staff.

• The fifth spot in the stepladder finals will go to the highest-finishing player in Summer Swing points who has not otherwise won a spot in the finals.

• If a player wins more than one event, the next highest finisher in the subsequent tournament will advance to the stepladder (example: if Player A wins the Badger and Wolf Opens, the next highest finisher in the Wolf Open will earn the berth in the finals assuming he/she doesn't win a subsequent event).

• The prize money for the King of the Swing will include \$10,000 for first place, \$6,000 for second, \$4,000 for third, \$3,000 for fourth and \$2,000 for fifth place.
