Ventura County Bowling House Closes Operations

OXNARD — The wheels have come off an Oxnard bowling center.

That's Wagon Wheel Bowl, which closed Sunday after 62 years in business.

The 32-lane bowling center is known for its distinctive wagon wheels that hang from the ceiling as light fixtures along with its neon sign that proclaims "Wagon Wheel Bowling" and can be seen from both sides of the nearby Ventura Freeway.

Seven leagues competed during the week, but the bowling center lost customers because a redevelopment project eliminated neighboring sites.

A 63-acre area that includes the Wagon Wheel Bowl site will ultimately turn into 1,500 homes along with commercial space, parks and trails, the Ventura County Star newspaper reported.

Wagon Wheel's closing follows last month's news that Mission Hills Bowl in the north San Fernando Valley will be shut at the end of this month.

the Thanksgiving tournament drew 58 teams last year, or nearly 250 bowlers.

Wagon Wheel Bowl also was the site of a celebrated performance on Oct. 13, 2008, when local bowler A.J. Calderon smoked a sanctioned 899 (300-300-299) series. The Los Angeles area is still looking for its first 900 series.

The right-handed Calderon left a 10 pin on his final shot. "His first game was sloppy and his last game was better than his first game," said Brilata, witnessed Calderon's who gem

Brilata also said the late Earl Anthony, a Professional Bowlers Assn. Hall-of-Famer, once stopped at Wagon Wheel Bowl en route to bowling in a tournament. Anthony, the first bowler to reach one million dollars in lifetime PBA earnings, took some practice shots and had a sandwich at the site.

Oxnard's Joshua Pinkar, who bowls recreationally three or four times a month at Wagon Wheel Bowl, expressed disappointment at the site's closing. "The balls are old and it's run-down, but it's convenient and something to do," he said. "There's not much to do [in Oxnard]. There's pool and an arcade here and you can have friends and family to bowl with.'

Liz Johnson Wins 2015 USBC Queens

GREEN BAY, Wis. - United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, New York, added to her legacy Tuesday as she became the ninth bowler in history to win multiple titles at the USBC Queens, a Professional Women's Bowling Association event.

Johnson opened the championship match against rookie Erin McCarthy of Omaha, Nebraska, with four consecutive strikes to build a 23-pin lead and never looked back as she cruised to a 256-202 victory at The Ashwaubenon Bowling Alley.

Johnson claimed the coveted Queens tiara and \$20,000 top prize, while McCarthy took home \$10,000 for second place. The 2015 event featured a prize fund of more than \$125,000.

"This is going to sound so cliche, but it's a dream come true," said Johnson, who now owns six major titles, including three U.S. Women's Open titles. "To win one Queens back in 2009, and now be able to win a second one to be in such company on a very short list, words can't describe how happy and excited and proud I am. It has been an amazing week."

USBC Hall of Famers Wendy Macpherson and Millie Ignizio are the only three-time winners at the Queens, while Dorothy Fothergill, Donna Adamek, Katsuko Sugimoto, Aleta Sill, Lynda Barnes and Kelly Kulick all have two titles apiece.

Johnson entered the stepladder Tuesday as the No. 2 seed after falling to McCarthy in the final round of the winners bracket. McCarthy averaged 261 in her last two matches, including a 795-651 win against Johnson, to earn the top seed for the TV show.

"I think having the extra game really helped," Johnson said. "I felt a little more comfortable after making the adjustments on the right lane, and I knew I had a great shot on the left lane. I was making good shots and being aggressive and throwing the best

shots I could."

On the way to the final, Johnson struck 10 times, including her last four shots, to overcome two splits and sneak past 2006 Queens champion Shannon Pluhowsky of Dayton, Ohio, 234-228.

Pluhowsky, the lone lefthander on the show, started her day with a 225-208 win

against defending champion Maria Jose Rodriguez of Austin, Texas, denying Rodriguez the chance to become the first bowler since 1982 to successfully defend a Queens title.

The southpaw was able to pull away with five consecutive strikes in frames five through nine, while Rodricontinued on page 9

Three years earlier, Romeo won the 2012 U.S. Senior Women's Open to become the first woman bowler to claim both a U.S. Women's Open Romeo scored her fifth vic-

tory in a women's major last week by defeating Johnson in a game that wasn't decided until Romeo shut out her opponent by delivering strikes in the ninth and 10th frames. Romeo also had defeated Johnson last year in the Senior Queens unbeaten streak with a 622championship match. 569 victory in the match to determine the top seed.

"I bowled my very first Queens when I was 21 years old and it took me 35 years to win it," Romeo said. "Even the final against Johnson, who at that point was undefeated. "You always want to be the leader, but getting a game un-

The Perfect Game by Steve Felege

DOWNEY — Over the past six weeks, Carol and I have discussed changes to the sport of bowling. We received many responses, both positive and negative. One email stood apart from the others; the subject too poignant to let it slip away as though unnoticed. It discussed a rarely perceived relationship: How the evolution of bowling reflects the changes of society.

Though the author has chosen to remain anonymous, his insights desperately need to be shared. Specifically, he agreed with the reasoning behind Carol's hatred of electronic scoring as expressed in "The Perfect Game" (April 23, 2015 edition of CBN).

This was gratifying for two reasons, the first being Carol appreciates people who agree with her. Second, the message was succinct about the negative effect of this technological "upgrade."

Enter: The law of unintended consequences. In that article Carol asked, "How can kids learn to bowl without learning to keep score?" She then stated, "Understanding scoring is an important part of the game!" This email expanded on that, intimating that understanding scoring is an important part of life! He stated so thusly:

"Keeping score was an excellent opportunity to improve their math skills, as well as encouraged more than one viable approach to viewing mathematical issues. Many young people learned not only to add columns of multiple integers but also the importance of cross checking (cross footing) scores both horizontally and vertically, in an effort to ensure accuracy."

In other words, the e-scoring gizmos are depriving today's young bowlers of the mental stimulation developing minds require. Brains, like muscles, need to be challenged to develop to their full potential.

More important is this next point:

".....I composed my thoughts and opinions while feeling passionate about the dumbing down of our society......"

That revelation should'nt be ignored! It echoes the great John Jowdy who stated it this way:

"This book is directed to serious bowlers who prefer to compete on conditions that demand quality shots; it is not for bowlers who remain content in posting unrealistic averages on blocked lanes." (Excerpt from: Bowling Execution, Preface)

Both remarks reflect the view that, as a business, our sport now caters to bowlers who feel entitled to high scores (balls exaggerate skills and oil patterns lead errant shots to the pocket). But who can blame them? To remain viable, all businesses must cater to their customers.

Does the dumbing down of bowling reflect the dumbing down of our culture? My opinion is, "Yes, it does." But does it really matter? My opinion on this is, "Not so much." Today, beginners still find the sport to be challenging. They will never know conditions from the past, and that isn't as important as many would like to believe. Lamenting the past accomplishes nothing.

My perspective is this: Forty years ago, elite bowlers would be asked, "Have you ever rolled a perfect game?" Today they are asked, "How many have you rolled?" That doesn't mean today's bowlers are more talented. On the contrary, it means technology has ushered in an era requiring less talent to achieve lofty scores.

Perceptions about this trend are moot. While the dumbing down of society seems inevitable, discussions about it lead to another, more positive and immutable aspect of bowling: No matter what changes come our way, *"The cream still rises to the top."*

If the success of today's bowlers is indeed a reflection of society, then we seem to be doing pretty darned well!

guez's undoing was a 4-6-7-10 split in the fourth frame.

In the opening match, Rodriguez downed Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, New York, 10-9 in a one-ball roll-off after the two tied at 227.

Kuhlkin, a two-time national champion at the University of Nebraska, needed three strikes in her final frame to advance but left a 10 pin on her final offering. She left another in the roll-off, allowing Rodriguez to advance.

This week in Green Bay, more than 200 players bowled 15 games of qualifying over three days to determine the 63 bowlers who would join Rodriguez in the double-elimination match-play bracket.

The Queens is the first event of the 2015 PWBA season. The Tour re-launched this year after a 12-year hiatus. The next event is scheduled for July 9-12 in Sacramento, California.

"I'm just very honored and humbled to be in the position, but I'm not done yet," said Johnson, who was inducted into the USBC Hall of Fame earlier this year. "It has been an amazing career so far, but I'm going to keep going. We have the ladies tour coming up in the summer, and we have a lot of good stuff coming up. Hopefully, I can continue the run."



how hard it is to win."

Romeo said her back-to-back Senior Queens titles rank right up there with her most memorable moments - not far from her U.S. Open victory.

Repeating as Senior Queens champion "might be the most exciting because I am older," said Romeo, who won the first West Coast Senior Tournament event in which she competed. And she added: "I still can't believe it happened. It's still a blur to me. It's very exciting."
