That's what Dr. Dino Dennis did several nights ago at Foothill Lanes. How can someone bowl 800 with a borrowed bowling ball? My guess is that Dino was able to do so because he is a good bowler. Change that to "DINO DEN-NIS IS A GREAT BOWLER."

When someone does what Dino did he must have superior mental faculties, the ability to focus and a gift for being able to adjust to unfamiliar circumstances. Dino has all of these and more. That is why Dino is a Doctor. He has his PH. D. in Education and had a wonderful career as an educator and administrator.

Dino didn't tell me why he borrowed RICHARD HEN-DERSON'S DV8, but it must have been for a good reason. He didn't even tell me which DV8 he used. He may not know! I wonder how long it will take Dino to purchase his own DV8? Dino's 812 (266 - 279 - 267) was the result of thirty-one strikes, three spares, one open (missed ten pin), and a nine count fill ball to end the first game. This was Dino's fourth 800. He has a high of 847 (300 - 268 - 279) bowled at Landmark Lanes in 1985. He has fourteen perfect games to his credit.

High qualifiers for the tournament Victor Hilvano for the men with a +149 and for the women it was Wendy Soo Hoo with a +119. hey get a paid entry in a future regular ABTA event.

Victor, would draw for the Match Series Pot worth a cool \$3,440. He drew a 617. We had no bowlers who match that score so we will estimate \$5,000 this Saturday at Chaparral "300".

In the 3-6-9 roll off (\$1,300) we saw Shed Smith miss in the final round. He got \$100. The pot goes for \$1,400 Saturday at Chaparral "300". In our optional doubles,

finishing in first were Emilio Flores and Jeff Taino with a 1445 for \$160, second place was Deborah Sanders and Kelly Wynn with a 1426 for \$140.

There was a total of \$2,180 paid out in doubles and 29 paid spots with low to cash of 1334. The semifinalists took to the lanes and after the three games the leader was Tomas Chavez with a +170. In second was Randy Sanicolas at +135. Mr. Chavez, our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$5,000.

He drew a 205 this week. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had three bowlers who shot that score. And after review of their number of squads bowled, we had three winners of different amounts. Danny Guevarra would take home his full share of \$1,666, Angelito Hilvano would take home 75% of the pot or \$1,249 and Michael Morgan would take home 50% or \$833. With that we have a full pot of \$5,000 and a backup pot that is at \$555 next week

The normal "Pot" game will cost you around \$20.00 a game. It should have a minimum of ten players to make it worth a bowler's time. The payout would be something like this: \$100.00 for high game, \$50.00 for second high game, \$20.00 for third high game, after paying for lineage. If a player is bowling well and cashing, he or she would stay

the top two or three bowlers, the money dries up and the bowler usually will pack up for an early exit. Payout for series or for an exceptional performance is not only unheard of, but it is non-existent in normal "Pot" games.

THEYKEN PLANS TO BOWL WITH FRANK GALLO IN USBC SENIOR MASTERS

SAN DIEGO - An email was received from Jim Theyken, San Diego saying that he will fly to Las Vegas early Sunday morning June 9 to bowl in USBC Senior Masters at South Point Hotel and Casino Bowling Center. He added that Frank Gallo, Jr. Jacksonville, FL will be there and asked if I could be there. I regretted not being able to travel alone at my age but assured him that I will be watching the event on bowl.com's YouTube each day.

USBC Senior Masters is a major tournament for USBC and PBA bowlers age 50 up being scheduled on June 9-14 at South Point Hotel Bowling Center. Theyken is entering for the first time and Gallo. Jr., a veteran deaf PBA member had entered many times in the past. So this year may be the first time for this Senior Masters to have two deaf bowlers entered.

Theyken wrote he is averaging 214 in Jake's Monday MatchPlay Singles League in San Diego along with hearing-impaired Robert Ellison at 213. Ellison is a Bronze Level coach, who writes occasional bowling tips in this column in California Bowling News.

At this writing Floridian Gallo, Jr. is bowling in PBA50 West Regional tournament at Johnson Lanes in Sun City West, AZ.

Both Theyken and Gallo, Jr. had experience and titles in Deaf Masters events, which used fewer games than USBC Masters and Senior Masters. Theyken, a left-hander won the 1989 Pacific Coast Deaf Masters. Gallo, Jr. won more with titles in 1980 & 1985 Pacific Coast Deaf Masters and 1984, 1985, 1987 and 1990 National Deaf Masters. In these years both Deaf Masters drew over 100 entrants. GOOD LUCK TO Theyken and Gallo, Jr. in the USBC Senior Masters.

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS

... Injuries, in most sports, particularly football and baseball, can often be the biggest factor in a winning or losing season. Bowling injuries rarely cause long layoffs, though anyone who has lived and bowled through hand, wrist, arm and shoulder problems can attest to the pain and frustration. Proper sympathy should be given, except when the aches and pains are the result of a temper outburst, a fist against a wall, or the kicking of a ball return.

.Doug Schmidt's published book, "They Came To Bowl; How Milwaukee Became America's Tenpin Capital" is a monumental work that traces the history of bowling in one of the solid root cities of the sport. Schmidt, longtime writer and publisher from Milwaukee, shows he also is a first class historian well worth a wide audience.

Since the dawn of the 21st century, opportunites for pro level female bowlers have decreased, yet, in a strange turn of events, the top talent is better than ever. Maybe it is because they must compete against the top men in many cases. Maybe it is because they have the patience and heart to try to keep moving forward, as they have for more than a century.

.Jane Wyman, long one of Hollywood's stars, was also the first wife of President Ronald Reagan. When the late Andy Varipapa, the first bowler to make movie shorts (he was featured in 25) in the 1930's, one of his favorite precision shots was to line up a number of people on a lane. roll the ball between their legs, and score a strike. In Hollywood he did it with as many as nine starlets—and Wyman was one of them.

.On the first night of fall league play many bowlers who didn't practice much in the summer wished they had.

...Though it makes for plenty of heated discussion. trying to compare the stars of the past and the current, usually decide nothing. There are teenagers today who have higher averages and more 300 games, 700 and 800 sets than fabled Hall of Famers. The one fact seems evident. Any real great in any era would also have been great in any other era.

... The best advice to any league or tournament bowler is simple-read all the rules carefully.

...Mika Koivuniemi, a Finland native, lives in the United States and makes his living on the US Pro Tour. The universality of the sport continues to grow. One of the first to show it big time is Amleto Monacelli, an Italian who lives in Venezuela, makes his living on the USA Tour and won his first title in Japan. Koivuniemi and Monacelli are the only two international players to win PBA Player of the Year honors and Amleto is the only international bowler to gain PBA Hall honors. Both speak more than one language but what they speak best is bowling.

.Kevin Dornberger, former USBC CEO, is one of the world's top experts on international bowling. He was one of the first to predict the spread of two handed deliveries by top bowlers and the trend already is making an impact on the world scene. It is the largest change in bowling style since they started drilling holes in bowling balls and when bowlers switched from two to three fingered balls.

...Bill Hoffman has often said, "It's time to find out how good you are." He's right on the ball. Don't hesitate to step up in competition the minute you feel you are ready.

...Bowling can be a funny game, but it's not meant to be that way, though it should be a fun game.
