California WBA Women Vote to Merge CITY OF INDUSTRY-With

an air of finality, and after much convincing, the 291 delegates at the 81st Annual Meeting of the California Women's Bowling Association voted to merge with the men and youth to form a new association in affiliation with the United States Bowling Congress. After meetings with men and youth and much soul searching, the Transition Committee still couldn't come up with solid reasons to merge but the constant drum beat of "survival" and "one card" and "same dues" resonated with delegates who gave in to what they perceived is the inevitable. The California YABA has already voted to merge if the men and women agree but fate is in the hands of the men who will vote at their June meeting. If they decide this is not for them at this time – it is business as usual. Thanks to Marianne Evans for doing a yeoman's job as chairman.

President Linda Johnson called the meeting to order in the ballroom of the Pacific Palms Resort Convention Center and the absence of organist Ellen Patterson was noticeable. Joel Clifft sat in for her and did an admirable job, but being unaccustomed to the familiar CWBA tunes left a definite void.

Officers and Directors and special guests were introduced, among them Jim Zebehazy representing USBC and Field Representative Gloria Loftus. Earlier, new CWBA pins were presented to Barbara Metzinger and Sherry Howe who took their place as CWBA 1st Vice President and 2nd Vice President respectively. A moment of silence was held in memory of CWBA 3rd Vice President Judy Hodgkinson who died of a heart attack. The traditional Memorial Service was held with special dedication to Judy and Alec Ade, husband of CWBA Tournament Director Melissa Ade. Alec died earlier this year after a long struggle with Cancer.

Hostess Association President Janet Loucks, and Hostess Chairman Rosie Parker welcomed delegates to the San Gabriel Valley promising a special "Magic Carpet Ride" in their area.

President Johnson who served as the state delegate to the WIBC convention in Tulsa, Oklahoma, gave a brief overview of the final convention and announced that the first meeting of the new USBC would be held in Orlando. Florida and the USBC Championship Tournament will held in Reno. Although the unisex meeting is purported to have as many as 5,000 delegates, the echo was that few could afford to attend both the meeting and tournament.

CWBA Secretary-Treasurer Leslie Spears announced that the delegate count is based on the 2003-2004 membership count and nothing changes until 2006.

Tournament Director Melissa Ade announced the "Early Bird Award" winner selected from among the 127 entries that arrived prior to November 30. Rose Marie Williford's Orange County team will get a complete refund of their entry fees!

The President's Recognition Awards went to: Orange County WBA for the *Most Teams Outside the Hostess City* and Imperial Valley WBA for the *Most Teams in Proportion to Membership.* Both associations are repeat winners of this award. As a *Thanks to the Hosting Association* a plaque was presented to the San Gabriel Valley WBA. Delegates were urged to review all reports that were provided as hard copy in their meeting packets. Alameda County WBA in-Alameda County WBA in-

vited us to "Make a Date in 2008" and Stockton WBA asked us to "Come Sailabrate in 2008" with them. The delegates decided to "Sail" and the **Stockton WBA will host the 2008 CWBA Tournament**.

Lemieux and Romeo highlight meeting. Star of Tomorrow inductee April Lemieux was presented by committee chairman Elaine Van Otten and although her impressive credentials spoke for themselves, the young Special Education teacher's acceptance told of her love and dedication to the sport of bowling and her chosen profession. She dedicated her award to all who have helped her and the things bowling has enabled her to do. Hall of Fame inductee Robin Romeo is the ultimate professional as a bowler and when Hall of Fame Chairman Lucille Fahrni read her incredible accomplishments, including 22 perfect games, and the delegates were in awe. She remarked that she has been honored with numerous Hall of Fame honors but the CWBA Hall was the long awaited ultimate honor. Robin retired as a professional in 2002. Family and friends were there in honor of the distinction.

Mary Householder and Mabel Sheasley reported as CWBA **representatives on the California YABA board** noting that \$55,000 was raised for youth scholarships bringing the amount to over \$365,000 in trust for youth bowler's scholarships.

California Nugget Editor Jan Hogue solicited help from the delegates to aid in making the newsletter what they want and cooperating in sharing the newsletter with their board and league members. She empha-
