Originally opened approximately 1960 and known as Midtown Bowling Center under Tiger Recreation later under the Active West banner. Midtown established a national presence with its pinnacle Southern California Mixed Doubles Championship tournaments held in the 1980's and early 1990's which paid out as much as \$25,000 top prize and over one million dollars over the years in total prizes. With its imminent closing in a few weeks, It would only be appropriate to have as a grand finale another mixed doubles tournament, hence, the Final Event Mixed Doubles Tournament!

TOM PENNA JOINS GALLO, JR. AND THEYKEN MAKES 3 DEAF BOWLERS IN USBC SENIOR MASTERS

LAS VEGAS — A surprise email was received from Frank Gallo, Jr. who in Flagstaff, AZ wrote that he read my recent National Deaf Bowling News in California Bowling News and wanted to let me know that there are three deaf bowlers entering in USBC Senior Masters. He added, 72 years old deaf Tom Penna of New York will bowl in the event at South Point Hotel and Casino Bowling Center on June 9-13 along with himself and Jim Theyken of San Diego.

That is great. Penna is a long time friend of Gallo, Jr. himself a New York native now residing in Jacksonville, Fl. This will be the historical first time three deaf seniors bowling in a USBC Senior Masters event.

By the way, in Flagstaff Gallo, Jr. wrote, after starting well in the first three PBA50 tour events, he failed to cash in next four straight PBA50 regionals. If he does not bowl well enough in the Flagstaff regional event and remaining events as Senior US Open, USBC Senior Masters and PBA50 event in Brentwood, CA, he will consider retiring from the Tour.

But he added, he would probably bowl in Florida area because at his age of 66, he is tired of traveling long distances a lot now.

Although Gallo admitted failing to cash in the last one at Johnson Bowl in Sun City West, AZ. I am unable to find the results of both Arizona Senior West Regionals at Sun City West and Flagstaff. As I write this, Gallo is bowling in Senior US Open at Suncoast Hotel and Casino Bowling Center in Las Vegas. We wish him good luck there and also good luck to three deaf bowlers in USBC Senior Masters at South Point Bowling Center.

torical event.

The tournament entry fee would be "reasonable" @ \$35 each bowler and just a few limited side pot offerings for men handicap @ \$9.00, women handicap @ \$9.00, and doubles handicap @ \$6.00 per bowler therefore making a total of \$50 per bowler if they participate in all the side pots! This should allow for people to compete in the event multiple times, and optionally with multiple partners. Brackets will also be available for those die hard money bowlers.

The tournament will be held for the next three weekends and approximately 24 squads (we may try to squeeze in more if the demand dictates it) starting on Saturday morning, June 8th at 9am ending on Sunday night, June 23rd at 9pm. Typically there will be a squad on most Saturday and Sunday's at 9am, 11am, 2pm and 4pm There will be a special squad set up exclusively for Jr Alumni bowlers and possibly other groups (seniors and tournament clubs). The top prize will be based on the total number of entries but use the following table as a guide to what the payout will be like: 200 entries pays \$2,000 1st place with 25 total places, 250 entries pays \$2,500 1st place with 32 total places, 400 entries pays \$4,000 1st place with 50 total places etc. Additionally, there will be a \$100 early bird instant pay off to the top team for each of the 9am squads.

Please call to obtain an official entry form with all the rules but here are some of the rule highlights: The team maximum will be 420 and handicap will be 90% of 420 for the team and bowlers must use their highest two year book 4/15/11 or 4/15/12 average. No current PBA card holder may participate. No former PBA champion may participate.

Please note that the first 200 bowlers will receive a historical memory bowling pin after the tournament is completely over. Halls of Fame in many sports have been making headlines in the past few weeks, most on the critical than praise side

The major complaints are that too many or too few worthies are elected and that is in all sports. Numbers range from none to more than a dozen.

Many fans question the practice of some voters not to vote for a first time eligible, or to associate some athletes with fellow stars in times of using substances or conflicting with rules, different for all halls.

With the state of the economy and its ups and downs, donations to sports hall needs dim in comparison to health and charity needs in other sectors. History is great, but you can't eat it.

When the American Bowling Congress started its hall back in 1941 it was a pioneer in the field, following baseball and golf. Now, practically all sports have halls, ranging from simple plaques in simple settings to magnificent structures that need plenty of room for exhibits, displays that give basic historical facts, photos, films and whatever curators and committes determine would be inviting to visitors and donors.

The National Bowling Hall of Fame, after years of searching, found its first home in St. Louis, and remained there until the merge of the American Bowling Congress, Women's International Bowling Congress and other bowling groups to form the United States Bowling Congress, and resettle at the International Bowling Campus in Arlington, Texas.

The move has been difficult because there is less display room and more and more to display. Once the national halls, in bowling and other sports were established, state, and local associations followed. And over the years, particularly in bowling, organizations of every description, manufacturers, sponsors, coaches and the media have come to honor persons with their own little piece of forever with a special bit of notice in a bowling hall.

The National Bowling Hall, because of space limitations in Texas, has created a hall display of women inductees in a special area of the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, a site which in some years draws 100,000 tournament competitors from around the world.

The most feedback I ever received was a hall exhibit which simply showed unique bowling apparel with the fantastic colors and themes that brightened so many eras. Those shirts, women's blouses and other types of dress reminded visitors of the days when almost every team at every level at least wore bowling shirts and in the late 1800s and early 1900s the old time stars often wore long sleeved shirts with stiff colors, and ties. No hats were worn on the lanes.

Over the years I have served on every major bowling organization's Hall of Fame committee, but it didn't stop there. I took the time to count bowling and other sports halls and they add up to 21, ranging from high school halls to the Polish-American Sports Hall.

All have different constitutions, different requirements, and different voters. Some are just for men, others just for women and most of both.

Many have different categories, for pioneers, Meritorious Service, and special accomplishments. The Polish Hall has one section for high visibility sports, football, baseball, basketball and hockey and another for all other sports standouts in such areas as sabre, swimming, bobsledding and trainers and coaches.

Despite whatever criticisms there may be, every sports all deserves your attention and support. And if you can't give a brick, room or building, just donate a buck or two every now and then.
