WESTMINSTER—We returned to Westminster Lanes where we saw 128 entries come out on Saturday on a light day for bowling. The cut scores were good + 81 for the men and +25 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (two men and one female) were Javier Avila +65 and Cliff Higgins+60, and for the women it was Bobbie McCollum +19. Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 44 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

Top Qualifiers for the event were Tomas Chavez +182 and the Ladies were led by Pretty Faye Josef at +117. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$218. Chavez drew a 573. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during the qualifying squads. We will estimate the Match Series at \$600 at Deer Creek event. Three bowlers left in the 3-6-9 were Dom Laguardia, Matthew Goodloe, and Mark Andrews as they all missed on the last shot and will share the \$50 consolation. The pot will be \$1,800 at Deer Creek.

In our optional doubles, fin-

ishing in first were John Phan and Jimmy Wong with a 1521 for \$100. In second Samson Kong and John Phan with a 1493 for \$80. There was a total of \$540 paid out in doubles and 11 paid spots with low to cash of 1423.

This would bring us to the Beat the Board semi-finals. For this event, that meant how they finished in the semi's would be how they finished for the tournament. After the first game of semi's there was a low of +28 for the women and for the men the low was +21 for the 13th spot. Sitting in 5th place was (BK) at a +46, while in 4th place was Jimmy Wong at a +54, and in 3rd was Beth Borci at a +61, and in 2nd was John Armenia at +68, and the leader after game 1 was Rithy Ath at +83, he was also the side-pot winner. This would take us to game-two of semi-finals.

In this game, we would see some changes in the top five. The low after the 2nd game for the 3 women was +67, and for the 13 men it was +45. The top 5 were, 5th place was a tie with Miriam Galluzzo and Teddy Villaroman at +81, 4th place was Mike J. Moore at +88, 3rd place was Beth Borci at +90, 3rd place was Rithy Ath at +91, and 1st place was Jimmy Wong at +131. The 2nd game

side-pot winner was Jimmy Wong with a nice 277.

That would bring us to our final game, and again there would be changes in the top 5 during the 3rd game. Finishing in 5th and 6th place for \$105 were Miriam Galluzzo and Ramon Alliman. Finishing in 4th place for \$110 was Otabek Umarov with a +112, finishing in 3rd place for \$200 was Mighty Giang Huynh with a +124, and in 2nd place with a +126 for \$500 was Rithy Ath. Finishing in 1st place for \$1,000, Cash and Carry of \$1,700 for a total of \$2,700 with a +142 was Jimmy Wong winning his fourth ABTA Title.

Jimmy drew the Match Game worth \$795 and he drew a 247, after review no one bowled that score in game three this week so it will carry over to our next event at Deer Creek. - Pins from qualifying carry over into match play.
- If a tie results for the last qualifying position for match play or the stepladder finals, there will be a one game roll off. If there is still a tie in the roll off game, a 9th and 10th frame will be bowled. For a tie in any game of the step ladder roll off, a 9th and 10th frame will be bowled to determine a winner.
- During match play competition the bowler winning the match will receive 30 bonus pins. If there is a tie in a match play game, bowlers will split the 30 bonus pins and each receive 15.
- If a bowler does not show up for match play or a bowler must quit during match play, the tournament committee will go through the list of alternates who would replace that bowler. The first alternate is the first bowler not to make it into match play. Once an alternate starts to bowl the first match the original bowler may not reclaim the spot. Alternates will use his/her own pin totals as of the last game he/she bowled – he/she will not take over the absent bowlers pin totals. If there are no alternates available to bowl, all matches bowled against this open spot will receive the score they bowled plus 30 bonus pins.
- 2013 Junior Gold Qualifier - \$30.00 membership if you are not already a member. Divisions 1 & 2 will conduct 3 qualifiers. Divisions 3 will conduct 2 qualifiers. Divisions may be combined if not enough entries in a division. May run a U15 division if enough entries. Participants will have the option to withdraw if divisions are combined. Participation is \$40.00 per 6 game block and must be paid prior to the start of each block. 1:5 will advance.
- Spectators – positive comments only. Lane conditions are designed to be challenging and participants need to be encouraged. Bowlers – continue good sportsmanship.
- Changes are at the discretion of the tournament committee. USBC Playing Rules will govern any rule not covered here.

You can't be more amazed than when you spend some time with today's younger generations.

Whether it is them displaying their flying fingers on computers, their flying feet in gymnastics or their rolling the ball and making parents and grandparents take a good second look at their talent, mentally and physically.

All sports and all fields have their child prodigies. There have been teenagers in every major sport, and many in their early teens, particularly in swimming and tennis.

Many of them have been great or gone on to greatness, at great sacrifice, being forced to grow up too quickly, being forced to choose between fame and fortune early, or after a suitable stretch of education.

In the dream world it would be wonderful if every young athlete in every sport was forced to obtain a high school education at a minimum, and college or other advanced training as a recommended path.

But the real world doesn't work out so neatly.

Some really young baseball, basketball, tennis and hockey phenoms can and do make millions of dollars before they can legally drink or vote. How and when do you tell them they are too young or too unprepared? At 17 they can be accepted into the armed services and put their lives on the line.

So how can you realistically ask any youngster talented way beyond their years to put a hold on opportunities and riches that may not be there later.

In many cases it is boys against men, and girls against women. But boys grow up fast these days and women aren't nearly as mere as they used to be.

Bowlers are amazingly adept at early ages. You can visit any junior program and see obvious talent. But, at 15 many bowlers have been bowling for a decade, and bowling at pro class calibre for years. By the time they are ready for college, many are ready for a shot at the pro tours or the big money tournaments.

Look at the Mark Roths, Johnny Petraglias and Pete Webers and a list of thousands and you could see super stars in the making at ages 17 or younger.

Junior bowlers can't be reminded too often that a 200 game is fine, but an "A" in any subject is better. A tournament win is terrific, but the Honor Roll is more terrific. A 300 game or even a 900 series is great, but a diploma is the greatest.

In bowling there is no reason why both areas cannot be encouraged. A high school or college student can utilize his time so much can be spent on bowling and much can be spent on study. And students can map out a schedule that covers both sides, and gives them the best of both worlds.

Parents, bowling coaches and bowling officials have a duty to counsel young bowlers and not to put too much pressure on them in either way, except to use common sense.

Education should always come first, but bowling is an education too, if used wisely, whether you're a shooting star or a struggler. But always hit the books as hard as you hit the pins.
