A Hall of Famer who is best known as "Mr. 900", the first person who legitimately rolled A 900 series, yet was denied ABC official recognition and sanctioning. Glenn has personally conveyed that evening's event to me numerous times. I've seen the documents and I've talked with some of those who were present. What was ABC thinking when they denied such an historical display of talent!!

Since the 80's our game has suffered greatly. Often it is not referred to a "sport", but rather as a "game" and does not carry the same weight or respect bestowed other professional events (referring to the PBA). In fact, many think the television presentation of the PBA Tour is a joke, a "circus", and cannot be taken seriously when compared to World Championship Poker or The Little League World Series! How sad is that? People have lost interest in the game even though the change in equipment and lane conditions have increased averages and caused honor scores to go through the roof. A few decades ago you had to be a "spare shooter" and wait for the strikes to come to you in order to average in the 190's-200. Consistency was the name of continued on page 2

Packard Leads After Day Two

LAS VEGAS–He's one of the most successful bowlers in the history of the PBA Regional Tour. Now Ross Packard is trying to become one of the stars of the PBA Senior Tour.

Packard, who is tied for 7th all-time with 27 PBA Regional Tour titles, averaged 251.40 in his five-game block Monday to take the lead after two days of qualifying in the 2005 Senior ABC Masters at Suncoast Bowling Center.

The 2005 Senior ABC Masters is the second of two majors on the 2005 PBA Senior Tour schedule.

Packard, San Jose, Calif., was on fire in his five games, shooting 248s in games one and three, sandwiched around a 258. He then shot 278 in game four and finished the set with a 225, ending the day with a 2,426 10game pinfall and the lead heading into the final day of qualifying. "I didn't do anything different today than I did yesterday, but my carry was just very good today," said Packard, who was 25th after Sunday's first session. "Last week (in the 2005 PBA Senior Tucson Open) I shot 160 in the last game of qualifying to just miss the cut. I'm in a good spot now but I'd still like to qualify as high as I can."

Junichi Yajima, Tokyo, who has won a record 41 Japan Professional Bowlers Association titles, fired a 279 in his final

As the world's largest participatory sporting event for women, the USBC Women's Championships attracts more

The only undefeated player to come out of the winner's bracket will face the winner of the loser's bracket Thursday at 4 p.m. to determine the winner of the \$20,000 top prize and a berth in next season's PBA Dexter Tournament of Champions.

continuted from page 1 the game. Today, you can throw a ton strikes and shoot 600 without making any spares. Amazing!

Membership in the ABC had continued to decline over the decades due to poor leadership/ management, distrust, the lack of interest in the game, the loss of legitimacy, and the continued closing of bowling establishments. A bowling alley today is a real estate transaction waiting to happen, and it's happening way too often.

So who is to blame for the present condition of our sport? Well, in my opinion, we have to lie part of the blame directly at the feet of the ABC, the PBA, and the bowlers themselves. We need to take control of this game and bring back the glory of days past if we are to ensure this going to be a future. We need to create heroes as well as recognize the hero's of the past that did not get their just awards. We

need to bring back "pot games", big scratch leagues (including the All-star Traveling Leagues), have more local tournaments. Bowlers also need to stop complaining about the cost of league fees and entry fees to tournaments. They need to support this game, take bowling lessons, get serious and get competitive. Furthermore, we should turn our backs on bowlers who are upset and wrongfully complain about the fact another bowler beat them, and shouldn't have.

Anyone on any given day can win, period! A winner should be congratulated and shown the respect they deserve, especially by the loser. Anyone who is not willing to lose should not participate. Leave your equipment at home and go to the movies.

With all that said I now turn back to Glenn Allison. Recall the word "hero" and ask yourself who is more entitled to such recognition in our sport. He has been wrongfully and maliciously denied that which "he earned" and all of us can only wish for? Glenn should be officially recognized for that "900" and the time is now !!!!!! The ABC is no longer and the new national organization has a chance to right a terrible wrong. The PBA, state and local associations should put continued pressure on the USBC and force them do what should have been done many years ago. This is a wonderful opportunity and the USBC should take advantage of it. Recognizing Mr. Allison's "900 series" is the first step to legitimize this sport and correct the mistake. We need hero's in bowling, real hero's! Half the U.S. population is now over 50 years of age and that is something the USBC should think about when it comes to membership and marketing. How many of us are 50 and over? How would sanctioning Glenn's "900" affect potential membership? The bottom line here is, "the USBC should do what is right" and there is no better time than now. What a perfect way

for the new national association to begin.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA DEAF BOWLING NEWS **NEW EVENT WANTED:** DEAF TEAM BRACKET TOURNAMENT

This writer got a fax from Gardy Rodgers requesting an opinion on a new event that he had on his mind and to pick a place and time to discuss on it. So I suggested a lunch at DuPar Restaurant in Studio City. During lunch in DuPar, Gardy started off with that the deaf clubs having teams playing in deaf basketball and softball tournaments and we do not have a bowling tournament for deaf teams competing like that. I told him that we do have team events in Southern Nevada-California Deaf and Pacific Coast Deaf tournaments. Also we used to have the now terminated So. Calif. Deaf Mixed Bowling Tournament and asked if he wanted to revive this tournament for Southern California deaf teams only like the singles classics we have running.

Gardy replied that he knew about the usual team event tournaments and there is no excitement in that. Also that I did not get what he wanted and further explained that the deaf basketball and softball tournaments use bracket system and that is where the excitement and competition is but he never seen any deaf bowling team bracket tournament and want to start one. Also asked if there were one, he would like to copy. Finally I got what he meant and yes; team bracket tournament is exciting and competitive. I told him that there were none around for deaf bowlers but there is one I knew of, which is Intercollegiate Team Championship conducted by USBC. They have separate 16 five men and 16 five-woman bracket tournaments and uses the Baker system scoring format for best 4 of 7 games to save time and money. Gardy did not understand what Baker scoring system was.

I explained, instead of having the 5 men bowl one complete game each which takes too long, so each man bowl two frames like, lead-off (1st) man bowl 1st and 6th frames, 2nd man 2nd and 7th frames, 3rd man 3rd and 8th frames, 4th man 4th and 9th frames and anchor man (5th) bowl 5th and finish the 10th frame. This goes on till the first team to win 4 games in 7 games advance to next round. After that, Gardy said he thought of having eight 4-men teams with each man bowling 3 full games with winner advancing to next round. Also each team pays \$200.00 (\$50.00 per man) entry fees for a prize fund of \$1,600.00. I told him it will take 2 and half hour to finish 3 team games and 12 games each team per round will cost money in bowling lineage.

It can not be a \$1,600 prize fund because who pays for the bowling games? Perhaps consider having best two of 3 games to save some money. Also that double elimination will take longer and more money than single elimination. And of course bowlers might not like to pay entry fees and lose in first round and ousted in single elimination. With that, I asked Gardy if he plan to have scratch or handicap. Nearly all deaf singles classics use handicap. So Gardy wanted handicap and limit each team to have one 200 average bowler. I told him okay but with that limit of one 200 ave. bowler and to be fair with other teams, there should be a cap on team average like 700 or 675 limit per team.

Also I advised that with a limit of 8 teams to start with, it would have to be a first come first served until 8 is filled. How the positions of each team are decided? By draw of numbers? What if he gets more than 8, have a qualifying round from which the top 8 teams enter in match plays? But this would mean more money to pay for the games. At this end, Gatdy said he would contact others for their opinions. By all means yes, get as many bowlers interested in this team concept so that other ideas can be considered and added. Let Gardy and/or this writer know what you think of this.

Entry Fees: While the \$695 entry fee is higher than most megabucks tournaments, the Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge has completed extensive research and analysis on our fee structure. With sweepers/brackets and re-entries serving a common role in most tournaments, it is not out of line for a bowler to spend \$1,000 and up in fees during an event. The Kingpin's unique format enables each division winner to take home at least \$50,000, equal to the top prize in many of the other tournaments.

Tenpin Slants listed several reasons why we definitely thought that the Kingpin Challenge would be conducted as scheduled. One of the reasons was because Dave Husted, the highly-respected PBA Hall of Famer, had been hired as tournament commissioner of the Kingpin Challenge.

Husted, who had read the column, requested the opportunity to respond to some of the material appearing in the article. We were more than happy to oblige, so here's the feedback from Husted...

We appreciate Mr. Joe Lyou's latest column regarding the inaugural Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge. The overall article was very good and we gained a great insight from the input of your chosen bowling professionals (who participated in the poll). However, there were a few comments regarding the event's structure and marketing that we wanted to clarify and hopefully answer any unanswered questions that might arise in the future from this article.

Certification: The USBC has lent its endorsement to the tournament, with a unanimous vote of its Board. The Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge's management team has been working closely with the USBC, using them as a sounding board and garnering their expertise to fine-tune the concept and implementation of the event. The USBC shares our vision in believing that the sport of bowling is ripe for this type of event to take place and we believe it will

The person that wins the 60+. Women's, or Open Divisions will have competed against only 299 of their peers to earn that money. As you know, these are very good odds, given that in other tournaments a player usually competes against 1,000+ bowlers.

Hopefully, this letter has cleared up any points of confusion. Again, we appreciate your interest in the Kingpin Million Dollar Challenge and thank you for including it as a feature in your column. Wiseman said he had met Hornish "two years ago during a PBA Pro-Am event in Indianapolis and we became good friends.

Although results of the Bowling Charity event are not available, we do know that Hornish finished a close second-by 0.534 seconds, or less than a car length-to Thomas Scheckter in the IRL race at the Texas Motor Speedway. In this same race, Danica Patrick, who dazzled Indy 500 fans by placing fourth, struggled this time to a 13th-place finish.

It happened to Debra Orlando of Fort Myers, Fla., who actually won the money while playing a quarter Wheel of Fortune machine at a local casino.
