LAS VEGAS — Last weekend, 30 bowlers took to the floor at Santa Fe Lanes in Las Vegas, NV, for the WCST Ebonite Singles. 26 of the 30 bowlers were in the plus. Kevin Gannon (Lakewood), won his 37th WCST Title, and moved his leading WCST Life-Time earnings to over \$100,000.00. Kevin led the qualifying on Saturday by one pin over Dick Baker, 2448 to 2447 for the 10 games. On Sunday for the 8 games finals, Kevin rolled 1888, and fell behind Dick after Game #2, but this great WCST Champion 94 pins back after Game #5, to within 26 pins of the leader going into the position round. Kevin won the match from Dick 248 to 218, and with his bonus pins for the win, ended up winning the tournament by 41 pins. It was a good day for the left side, as they finished 1-2-3, especially a good move by Roger Makemson to finish 3rd. Kevin Gannon on Saturday, a 300 game.10 checks paid out for \$4.080.00, and for 9 tournaments this year, a total of \$54,572.00 paid out, and for 330 Tournaments, a total of \$3,527,530.00 paid out. Top 3: 1st Place, Kevin Gannon, \$825.00, 2nd Place, Dick Baker, \$600.00, and 3rd to Roger Makemson, \$500.00.

For the Regular Division, which is now in a phase of trying to rejunevate entries, in the Nevada area had 8 bowlers on Saturday, bowling 8 games for total pins, paying the top 3 places. This was won by Eric Forkel, with 1980, for \$350.00, 2nd Place: Mike Clemence, 1975, \$250.00, and 3rd to Steve Smith, 1885 for \$160.00. Their entry fee was only \$125.00.

My thanks especially this week-end, because I ended up in the hospital early Sunday Morning, as I blacked out in the Casino Coffee shop area, and stayed in the hospital 5 days, goes to Jackie Baker, Stan Winters, Jerry Calvin, Shelly Forkel, and many others, for their great concern for this organization and me. Proprietor of the Year was awarded to Jim Hornung, Sr. owner of Yorba Linda Bowl and Coach of the Year to Annette Anderson of Pomona and Coach at Oak Tree Lanes. North County USBC was awarded Association of the Year.

The meeting was recessed for lunch just before noon. At our Annual Luncheon held around the pool area, a delicious menu was served to 154 delegates and guests. When the meeting resumed at 1:30, the Nominating Committee presented their Slate of Candidates for a two (2) year term beginning August 1, 2011.
