## **Eric Forkel Wins WCST Ebonite Singles Stan Winters The Super Senior Champion**

LAKEWOOD—Eric Forkel (Henderson, NV), captured his 4th WCST Title last weekend at Cal Bowl in Lakewood, CA. This Tournament was very challenging for the bowlers as the lane conditions were very tough, and only 10 Bowlers out of 62 entered were in the plus. Eric led the qualifying for the 10 games with 2139, just 2 pins ahead of Sonny Dew. Many bowlers struggled as the day wore on, and at the end of the qualifying for The Regular Division, plus 18 was the cut score for 10th place. The Super Seniors were all in the minus, and Curt Snyder, the leader at minus 14, with minus 104 the cut score 8th place for the Super Senior Finals. Eric lost the lead only once during the finals, as he won 9 of 10 matches, as 2<sup>nd</sup> place finisher, Sonny Dew, who for one game of 10 enjoyed the lead. Eric won the tournament by 202 pins.

The difference between Sonny Dew and 3rd place finisher, Mike Rick, only 1 pin, with Vaughn Doody, only 29 pins behind Mike in 4th place. 5 Super Seniors made it to the Regular Division Finals. Prize Fund Pay-Off: 25 checks paid out for a total of \$7,655.00, and for 8 tournaments this year, \$62,945.00 paid out, and for 254 tournaments, a total of \$2,860, 888.00 paid out. TOP: 3, 1st Place, Eric Forkel, \$900.00,

2<sup>nd</sup> Place, Sonny Dew (Los Angeles), \$600.00, and 3<sup>rd</sup> Place to Mike Rick, Redlands, \$450.00. Title. He won his 1st Title at Forest Lanes this past May. With the scoring at a low peak in the tournament, Stan, qualified 6th with 1919 for the 10 games, but on Sunday, rolled 1669 for the 8 games, won the tournament in the Position Round, 52 pins down from the leader Jim Gilchrist. Stan beat Jim 233 to 192, and with the Bonus Pins of 30 for the win, ended up winning the tournament by 19 pins. The only other bowler in the plus in the finals was Russell Booth with 1620, after qualifying for the last spot with 1896. Top 3:, 1st Place, Stan Winters, \$500.00, 2nd Place, Jim Gilchrist (Costa Mesa), \$350.00 and  $3^{rd}$  to Russell Booth (Van Nuys), \$325.00.

Format; All bowlers enter the WCST Singles Tournaments for the main prize list, the perk for the Super Seniors, is that if their qualifying scores are high enough, they will bowl in the Regular Division Finals. Super Seniors that do cross over, bring their portion of their prize fund paid from their entry to pay additional places in the regular division finals. A guaranteed amount of super seniors will bowl for their own finals, no matter how many cross over. Once a Super Senior crosses over, he is no longer considered a super senior for that day, and counts as a regular division, and then cashes in the highest prize possible. This format, a perfect example for the Cal Bowl Tournament, as 5 super seniors, crossed over, and 8 super seniors bowled their own finals out of 25 super seniors entered

States Bowling Congress Open Championships is built on 104 years of history and tradition and exemplifies integrity and competition, while providing its participants with a unique and enjoyable

experience.
Challenging lane conditions always have been a staple at the USBC Open Championships and have added to the prestige that comes with beating out more than 60,000 competitors for a title on the tournament lanes.

Beginning with the 2008 event in Albuquerque, N.M., the tournament officially will be USBC Sport Bowling certified for

the first time.

Bowlers already know the conditions they face at the tournament each year are fair, but demanding, with an emphasis on shot making and spare shooting. But what they don't know is that based on revised Sport Bowling parameters unveiled in 2006, tournament conditions in recent years would have conformed to Sport requirements, thus making them

Sport veterans.
"Sport Bowling lane conditions appear regularly at many of USBC's national events for adult and youth bowlers, so it's only natural that we incorporate the same challenge into what has become the biggest bowling tournament in the world," USBC Chief Officer for Tournaments and Events Roseann Kuhn said. "The conditions at the Open Championships have always been challenging, so there won't be a noticeable change on the lanes, but I think the Sport label will bring additional prestige to a tournament

As part of the change, all USBC Sport members competing in the Open Championships will be eligible for Sport awards. Tournament participants will have the opportunity to upgrade their memberships on-site prior to competing in the tournament, while any bowler who is not a Sport member, but rolls an honor score, still will be eligible for traditional USBC awards

Bowlers also will have a sec-ond opportunity to test their skills on a Sport Bowling certified lane condition in 2008 at the spe-cial side tournament that will be conducted on a 12-lane setup adjacent to the 48 lane installation being used for the Open Champi-

The event will feature a unique two-game format, similar to the satellite events that were part of the 2000 Open Championships in Albuquerque and the 2003 tournament in Knoxville, Tenn. Competition will be divided into two average-based divisions with daily and optional year-long prize funds. "With the growing popularity of PBA Experience leagues and the number of USBC bowlers who are Sport members, it only makes sense to designate a tournament that already complies with Sport rules as a Sport certified event," USBC Chief Executive Officer Roger Dalkin said. "This is all part of our new vision that focuses on growing the sport

## **Stephens Strikes on Final Ball** For \$20,000 Brunswick Title

DOWNEY-Spectators at Del Rio Lanes in Downey were treated to a thrilling five game match on Monday night. The teams of Bry Law Accounting and Clyde's Video Games battled back and forth throughout the evening. After fives games over  $3\frac{1}{2}$  hours, it all came down to one ball. It's hard enough to strike without any pressure on our infamous 2<sup>nd</sup> round condition, but with \$20,000 on the line it is even harder, however Larry Stephens was able to carry all ten pins from the Brooklyn side to earn his team the title and the money. That's the end of the story, but how they got to that point was absolutely classic.

The concept of the match is a best three out of five series that incorporates all four of the lane conditions that are bowled on during the season. The conditions for the first four games are randomly drawn, however if the series goes to a fifth and final game, the #1 seed gets to choose the condition, as a reward for being the top seed.

The Bry Law Accounting team consisted of Billy Myers Jr., Damone Hale, Art Jones Jr., and Larry Stephens. Ramon Torres, John VanDerham, Paul Danforth and Jeff Garrison were the members bowling for Clyde's Video Games. Randomly, the match started on the 2<sup>nd</sup> round challenge shot, which if you haven't bowled on it, truly lacks an adjective to describe its difficulty.

Game one was won by Bry Law (704-685). Art Jones Jr. led the way for Bry Law with a 206, and Billy Myers Jr. was right behind him with 191. Damone Hale struggled with only 144 but got a key double in the 10th frame to help seal the victory. Ramon Torres was the high player for Clydes' with a 211 game.

Clyde's evened the series in the second game with a 71 pin victory that was bowled on condition #1, the highest scoring of the four. Ramon Torres shot 225, John Vanderham 201, Paul Danforth 252, and Jeff Garrison 269 for a nice 947 total. Bry Law fell behind early in this game. All the strikes they threw late kept them in the game, but Clyde's never let them get back to even. Bry Law was led by Billy Myers Jr. in this game with a 248 and all three of the other players posted scores in the low 200's for an 873 total.

Game #3 brought us back to another of the difficult conditions, pattern #4. Pattern #4 is one of the sport conditions, and is the 2<sup>nd</sup> hardest shot in the league. Clyde's struggled their way to a 720 total, in spite of the continued good bowling of Ramon Torres who shot 224. On the other side, Billy Myers Jr. strung a 6 bagger at the end for 234 in leading his team to a 780 total and a 60 pin victory to take the lead back in the series, two games to one.

Bry Law had a chance to clinch the match in game #4, and it would be bowled on pattern #3, which is the heavy oil round. The game was very close heading into the 10th frame, with Bry Law holding a slight lead in spite of three of the bowlers from Clyde's coming into the frame working on doubles. Those doubles paid off as Ramon Torres threw three strikes in the 10th and was followed by strikes from John Vanderham, Paul Danforth, and a double from Jeff Garrison. Matched with a missed ten pen from Art Jones Jr., Clyde's was able to come back to win by 26 pins (871-845). Ramon Torres and Jeff Garrison tied for the team lead with 238, and Damone continued on page 11

#### Helpful Hints. Accuracy, Etc.

My articles are mainly "Student driven". This means that those things that have helped make my students successful, comprise the majority what I teach and write about. I'm not the only teacher/coach who does this. I know that many of this sport's top coaches do the same. I know for a fact that gold level coaches such as Susie Minshew, as well as Hall of Fame "Coach of the pros" John Jowdy and many others have developed extremely successful teaching methods based on what works for their students. Hall of Famers such as Carmen Salvino, the late great Don Johnson, Parker Bohn, etc. are just a few who can be included in this category.

True, various coaching certification courses and a lot of reading (and bowling) are the basis of any good coach/instructor/writer's knowledge. But years of experiences with what has worked to make students successful are often responsible for what a good coach teaches and writes about.

Since my students have always been enthusiastic about being the subjects for experimentation with new ideas, those methods that have borne fruit will often appear in these articles. This also means that as our sport changes, be it lane surface differences, new balls, analyzing methods such as CATS machines, etc., teaching methods have to constantly be updated as well, to guarantee student success.

Years ago, a PBA Hall of Famer with whom I studied...a successful teachers and as the instructional balls and teachers are as in the methods and the success and the succession.

teacher and author instructional books and tapes, once said to me, "Rolf, read every book you can lay your hands on, but learn to become selective about what you believe. Do a lot of experimenting before you decide which techniques you'll accept and teach. Keep abreast of changes, because to turn out successful students, the updating of your teaching is critical." Good advice!

Here's my point: The laws of physics never change, but <u>which</u> of those laws to apply and  $\underline{\text{how}}$  to best apply them, may differ vastly.

Result? Some aspects of bowling and teaching have become easier, while others have become more complicated and difficult.

Example: A former student of mine, touring pro and friend of Earl Anthony, Yogi Yoesting, once told me that Earl could split a target board into three parts and hit any part at will. Not every time, but often enough to win. Everybody knows that accuracy was one of Anthony's dominating success factors. His approach was so consistent that it was said a glass of water on his head wouldn't spill. No wonder he

So imagine my shock when a CATS machine chart, documenting the accuracy margin for the best bowlers tested...those averaging 220 and up...showed it to be 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> inches! That's three boards, folks; nearly 2 inches missed on either side of the target board's center! No high level bowler could've gotten away with that 20 or 30 years ago. Yet today's lane conditions allow it.

So Let's Talk Accuracy

Again, there are accepted rules for bowling accuracy. I discovered something, however, that I have not yet seen taught in most coaching seminars. Checking human kinetics as well as the applicable laws of physics, clarified something that improved accuracy. This con-

tinues to work for my students, so we'll cover it here:
Since your bowling arm is attached to the bowling shoulder, approaching with the feet toward the target board is wrong. Why? Because if you were to walk out to your target and stand on it, your bowling arm would be hanging close to the gutter. So, approaching in that direction will force a steered shot, which destroys accuracy.

Walking along the boards is also wrong! Remember, your bowling shoulder won't face the target unless that shoulder (not your body) is deliberately turned to face that target first!

So what's the answer?
Well, if you approach with your bowling shoulder toward the target board, then no matter what your starting position or target location, the angle of your approach will always allow your swing to remain aligned with the intended target.

There's a little trick to help solve the problem. It involves imagining that a string is stretched from your shoulder to the target. Then, to improve accuracy, the following simple steps are used:

The Four Part Accuracy Technique

1 – Stand on your starting board with your bowling shoulder aligned with the string (be sure the feet are facing square to your shoulder line);
2 – Do you pushaway from bowling shoulder toward your mark (target). This is sometimes referred to as "shooting" your target. (Your pushaway now moves your ball along the imaginary string).

3 - Do your approach with the bowling shoulder...not your eyes...moving toward the target. Sort of like making your shoulder

follow that string.

4 – Release the ball and follow through in front of and in line with the bowling shoulder, not the target board! This is critical because your eyes see the target on a different line than the bowling shoulder...so aiming your shot at where the eyes see the target, will cause a pulled

This technique is called a *bee line approach*, meaning simply that the bowling shoulder moves toward the target in a straight line, just as a bee would fly from the hive to its intended target...the

flower...regardless of the angle of that flight.

So obviously the actual angle of approach would vary with different shots, depending on the staring board and target location. This "Shoulder follows the string technique" becomes the rule for every shot ever thrown...no exceptions! This works so well for those who use it, that both accuracy and scores have dramatically improved!

The Lowest Common Denominator

Take that 3¼ inch accuracy quotient mentioned above, for instance. Imagine a high level bowler with that same accuracy quotient who, without improving anything else, reduced that margin from 3 ¼ to, say, 2 inches. I say that bowler's winning percentage would go up

But what about the medium average bowler? Well, I've seen 150 or less average bowlers raise themselves by 20 to 30 pins, just by improving accuracy through tat "shoulder follows the string" technique.

Impossible, you say? Not at all! The only thing necessary is to practice accuracy for its own sake. This is where the so called "area" bowlers get fooled. By targeting a "wide area", they lose two important is to be a situated as a string of the st


items which are critical; accuracy and consistency.

This is also why reading and quickly adjusting to changing lane conditions becomes so tough for many otherwise excellent bowlers. When faced with a super oily, super dry, tracked out or other unusual condition, what difference does it make how well you read the lanes or how correctly you adjust, if lack of accuracy prevents your adjustments from being workable?

#### How New is New?

So what if current "house conditions" make things easier? The majority of bowlers know that already. Please remember one extremely important thing; "easy" is comparative. Easy compared to what? Higher scores than in the 1950s through 1080s, means everybody's scores! That merely indicates that your accuracy must still be better if you intend to improve in league or tournament play. scores may have

been lower back then, but you didn't need as high a score to win. Think about it a moment. True, your overall average of today looks better in the book, but consider the cost



#### Shoulder to target. Follow through is shoulder aligned.

In the so called "old" days one or two balls, each at about \$60 to \$80 or so, would have been enough. Today, the eight ball limit for touring pros, (with four to six carried by many house bowlers), certainly makes it not only much more expensive, but a lot heavier to travel with. At \$140 to \$300 per ball, the only thing lighter is your wallet.

Those same balls of yesterday would often have lasted at least four seasons or more. Today, despite track flare, balls need frequent refinishing to remain viable, which causes them to wear out sooner. Keep in mind that there's a limit to how often a ball can be refinished. Replacement is expen-

Yes, to be competitive back then, you would have been forced to learn several releases and lane play techniques just as today. But show me a high average bowler beyond age 30 who hasn't had to learn more and more release techniques each time lane conditioning rules have changed.

No, I'm not one of those "go back to the good old days" types. I look forward to one day teaching in houses with the new pin-setters which will allow you to set up any spare you want, track your shot, show ball speed, count revs, etc. They already exist in a few test centers. That will help bowlers hone skills! Better golf clubs, tennis rackets, baseball equipment, etc. have created better play and more broken records in virtually all sports. But athletes, in order to win today, still have to develop and hone skills to levels beyond their competi-

tors if they hope to win. And "shoulder-to-target" accuracy is one important key!

GREENDALE, Wis.—For years, the world's top women bowlers have craved for more opportunities to compete at the sport's highest level. With the revival of the U.S. Women's Open, those bowlers are embracing the upcoming chance to compete against the best.

The U.S. Women's Open presented by the United States Bowling Congress will be conducted for the first time since 2003, the same year the Professional Women's Bowling Association ceased operations. The event will be held Aug. 13-18 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nev., with the elimination and championship rounds telecast by ESPN beginning in September.

The return of one of bowling's major events has Team USA standouts Diandra Asbaty of Chicago, Shannon Pluhowsky of Phoenix and Shannon O'Keefe of Rochester, N.Y., excited for the future.

"I'm very hopeful this is the start of something big," said Asbaty, a nine-time Team USA member and 2003 graduate of the University of Nebraska who never got the chance to compete on the PWBA Tour. "I really think people are going to respond to this event in a very positive and major way."

Pluhowsky, a three-time U.S. Amateur champion and the 2006 USBC Queens champion, has traveled the world competing at the highest level. She grew up with ambitions of making a living as a professional bowler.

"We all grow up hoping to be able to bowl professionally," said Pluhowsky, who also bowled at Nebraska. "I think this is a step in the right direction. Hopefully, these events will lead to the creation of another women's pro tour."



tion will conduct four special women's events, called the PBA Women's Series, alongside selected regular Denny's PBA Tour events this fall. Qualifying for these events will take place during the U.S. Women's Open.

"In order for this sport to survive, we have to give the young women something to look forward to," said O'Keefe, who finished fifth at this year's USBC Queens. "The PBA Women's Series and the U.S. Women's Open do just that. I think it's awesome."

The U.S. Women's Open final rounds will feature a bracket elimination format in which the top 16 players will compete on television. In a deal with ESPN, the first four rounds of the fi-

nals will be taped Aug. 17-18 and shown on Sept. 16, 23, 30 and Oct. 7. The final four competitors will return to Reno for a live televised championship round on Oct. 14.

The U.S. Women's Open has an entry fee of \$250 and is open to any female USBC member. The event will feature a guaranteed prize fund of \$150,000, including \$25,000 to the winner. The players who advance to the top 16 are guaranteed at least \$3,000.

Competitors in the U.S. Women's Open will also have the option of paying an additional \$750 entry fee to have a shot at 16 spots available in the PBA Women's Series, which will feature four events with a total

prize fund of \$50,000 for each event, including a top prize of \$10,000 and last cash of \$1,800.

The championship match of all four PBA Women's Series events will be televised as part of the ESPN telecasts for the four Denny's PBA Tour events in which women's events will run concurrently.

Earlier this week, the PBA announced that it would no longer require PBA membership for the 16 players who qualify for the Women's Series. The move allows amateur players, such as those on Team USA, to maintain their amateur status.






