



# **Bowling Community Brings In More Funds** for Japan Quake Relief

FULLERTON—Altogether, the hastily-composed Japan Bowling Community Quake Relief effort (started here in California) has raised \$13,729 across the country and other nations, towards helping those in the Japanese bowling community get some stability in their lives after the quake and tsunami of March 11th. We sat down to talk with Hero Noda, representative for the Bowling Proprietors of Japan (BPAJ) before he went to the International Bowl Expo in Grapevine, Texas. Mr. Noda told us of a family in the Sendai area. The family lost their livelihood-- their bowling center-- as well as their living space (their house) on that fateful day in March. That family received funds from BPAJ. It is important to note, Noda told us, the most damage came from the severity of the seawater flowing several miles inland.

Recently, the OC Sansei Tournament raised \$2,000 for the Japan Bowling Community Relief effort over the weekend of April 30 - May 1st at their Fountain Bowl tournament location this year.

On June 23rd, the tournament committee presented a check to Hero Noda at AMF Carter Lanes in Fullerton. The total of the latest donations amount to \$2,450, which includes donations from San Jose State University (which held a fundraiser tournament in May); Lydia Rypcinski of Chicago; Tina Cady of Sacramento; and Mark and Elizabeth Gerberich of Akron, OH.

#### **RESULTS OF 64TH ANNUAL P C DEAF WOMEN'S B A TOURNAMENT**

(This writer thanks PCDWBA Secretary-Treasurer Elizabeth Grigsby for the printed results from which this story is made.) HENDERSON—The 64th annual Pacific Coast Deaf Women's Bowling Association tourna-

ment held in conjunction with the men's PCDBA last Memorial Day week-end at Strike Zone Bowl in Sunset Station Hotel and Casino. The event drew 14 women foursome teams (two more than last year's), 26 doubles, 52 singles and 36 all-events.

It's prestigious 46th annual Jean Stokesberry's Deaf Queens drew 15 women and the 16th Lucy Beare Deaf Senior Queens had 13 entries (three more than previous 3 years).

#### LOPEZ & LORENZO LED NOR-SO-WESTERN TO TEAM TITLE WITH 2421

Ontario's Stella Lopez (208/509) and Thousand Oaks' Anita Lorenzo (527) led teammates Glendale, AZ's Araceli Martinez (476) and Sheila Jackson (465) in their Nor-So-Western team's 2421 winning total. The team had games of 716-629-632 for 1977 plus 444 handicap for the \$800 first place prize.

A mere 6 pins behind in 2nd place was April Brown (532) led Purr Ladies' steady 651-648-642/1941 plus 474 for 2415, good for \$400. Las Vegas Gals led by Sara Sain-Jurgens' 203/540 scored the team high game 751-639-616 for high team series 2006 but with 366 handicap got 2372 for 3rd place \$200.

Fourth and last in the money \$60 went to Angel West Gals #1 with 2330 total led by Celia Salcedo's 202/565. Jennifer Kutcka from Indiana rolled the high game 225 and series 581 but her team Just Strike It had 2312 for 5th.

#### NOR-CAL DUO SPANTON & HARTUNG TAKES DOUBLES TITLE WITH 1261

North California duo of Wendy Spanton 202/535 and Coreen Hartung 204/537 tallied 1072 plus 189 handicap for 1261 to take the doubles title and \$400. It is Wendy's 2nd doubles title as she won once back in 1994.

Again a mere 6 pins back in 2nd place were Anna Marie Frizzell, Anaheim 507 and Anita Lorenzo, Thousand Oaks 514 with 234 handicap 1255 total for \$200. In 3rd place 1 pin back with 1254 were Joanna Witulski 557 and Jennifer Kutcka 202/553 for 1110 plus 144 handicap.

Las Vegas' Sara Sain-Jurgens rolled the high game 254 and with 217-202 for the high series 673 which may be a record but there is no such record listed. Her partner Lauri Young with a bad start had 438, together they had steady games of 371-368-372 for 1111 the event's high scratch total but with 117 handicap 1228 good for 4th.

The 7th and last place in the doubles money were Younisi Donegan 453 and Melchora Lee 211-216/588 plus 138 handicap 1179. Their first game total of 373 is the event's team high game.

#### ANNA MARIE FRIZZELL TALLIED 676 FOR SINGLES TITLE

Anaheim's 141 average Anna Marie Frizzell went over her average in 3 stepped up games 164-180-191 for 535 plus 141 handicap for 676 to take the Singles title \$200 prize. Moreno Valley's Becca Gleicher who is PCDWBA President placed 2nd with 533 plus 126 for 659. Joan McCowin 559 and Sheila Jackson 544 were tied for third place with handicapped 655s.

LV's Melchora Lee rolled the tournament high game 269 in her event's high series 642 but with her zero handicap, she placed 7th. Again sadly we do not know where her 269 high game stands because there is no known record listed. For 13th and last place in the money two bowlers were tied with same 617 scores..

#### ANNA MARIE FRIZZELL TAKES ALL-EVENTS WITH 2002

This writer apologize for having lost the All-events results sheet when he fell in the hotel's Strike Zone Lanes. So he could not give any more than the top one who bowled way over her average each game.

Anna Marie Frizzell with 141 average had her day shooting 206/537 in her team event, 507 in doubles and 535 in singles for 1579 plus 423 handicap for her 2002 total. This is the only third 2000 plus (5th overall) in PCDWBA's history since the 80% of 200 handicap was used in 1988. Results of Deaf Queens and Senior Queens will be added next week.

#### Koivuniemi, Barnes, O'Neill, Belmonte Nominated for 2011 Bowling ESPY Fan voting continues through July

Winners to be announced on ESPN July 13

SEATTLE (June 28, 2011) - Reigning PBA Player of the Year Mika Koivuniemi; PBA's newest triple crown winner Chris Barnes along with Bill O'Neill, and Jason Belmonte have been nominated for ESPN's "Best Bowler ESPY" for 2011.

ESPN recently announced nominees in 33 categories and fan voting is now underway through 11:59 p.m. ET on July 9 at espn. com/espys. To vote, click on the "click to get started" tab on the ESPYs homepage, then click on the "vote by category" tab and scroll down the list to locate the "Best Bowler" category. Click on the image of the player to vote. The winners will be announced during the 18th annual ESPYs, live on ESPN at 9 p.m. ET on Wednesday, July 13 from the Nokia Theater in Los Angeles.

Koivuniemi had a career season in 2010-11 winning the PBA Tournament of Champions for his ninth career title and third major while also finishing second in the Lumber Liquidators U.S. Open. He earned \$330,040 becoming only the fourth player in PBA history to earn more than \$300,000 in a season.

Barnes won the PBA World Championship to become the sixth player to win PBA's Triple Crown. The 13-time PBA Tour titlist also finished second in the inaugural Dick Weber Playoffs.

O'Neill won his third career title in the Pepsi Viper Championship and finished second to Barnes in the PBA World Championship.

Belmonte, the only player with a two-handed delivery to win a Lumber Liquidators PBA Tour title, had seven top 10 finishes in 2010-11 including finishing third twice.

LAKEWOOD—Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to Cal Bowl this past weekend for a special Frozen event, and came out with a nice turnout of 269 entries in our one day event. We had a decent shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +65 for the men and +45 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (3 men and 1 female) were Jack Trongale (62), Bud Zajorski (59), Ester Licauco (-11). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 62 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

High Qualifiers for the men, David Owens with a +185, and for the women it was Ginalynn Velarde with +70. Each will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Our top qualifier Owens drew the Match Series. This time it was worth \$472. He drew a 619. We had no bowlers that bowled this score.

(In Las Vegas this week we estimate the Match Series at \$1,600.) For the 3-6-9 qualifying, Vic Santos was the last person standing of all the qualifiers and he would go for the pot. He missed on the second shot and received \$50 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$1,900 at South Point Hotel & Casino.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Sol Cericos and Jeff Taino with a 1415 for \$170. Finishing second was Holden Au and

Ada Wong-Hum with 1414 for \$150. There was a total of \$1950 paid out in doubles and 29 paid spots with low to cash of 1318

In the semis we saw John Licauco jump out and lead the first two games this week, but with a big third game was Vuong Do. That would be enough to capture the lead with a +150 to sit out and bowl for the title. Coming in second was John Licauco with a + 115to sit out the first round. It took a + 57 for the men and + 32 for the guaranteed women.

Vuong our top seed had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. We have another reserve pot worth \$3,500 now with a 3rd pot being added. This makes our Match Game at \$3,500 for at least the next three events. Our top seed drew a 140. After a review of all the scores bowled, we had no bowlers who shot that score. We will have \$3,500 this week at South Point Hotel & Casino!

We had five new bowlers join us. Let us welcome these new bowlers to the club, Steven Alford, Frank Ortega, Mathew Wooton, Sue Mivelaz-West, and Teriece Anderson. By the way Sue's Mother Betty Mivelez is in the So. Cal. Hall of Fame. A wonderfully smooth bowler, I might add.

This would bring us to our top 16 match play finals. In the first round, losing their matches were Jerry Chang, Danny Eguilos, Ada Wong-Hum, David Owens, Tomas Chavez, Shaun Suase, and Art Lindsey.

career

He first started with a business model - bowler retention. Then he added a mission statement - "bowlers who get better and have a good time, don't quit". And then he came up with a business plan which included two "Camp Bakes" per year. Little did he know, he was creating his own little empire. A mecca for professional and serious league bowlers to come to when the need arose. Baker's individualized instruction became known and he was soon sought after by the biggest names in the PBA. Baker reflected on some of his client's stating, "Look in their eye when they're bowling bet-ter" and from that he gets the pure satisfaction that he is hitting home with his work with them

Baker said there are two types of bowlers—serious bowlers and people who bowl for fun. He said the largest demographic of new bowlers these days are those from the ages of 45-60 and the bowling industry needs to address these new bowlers to get them into the sport. Most of them are pretty well off financially and are at an age where they are looking for a sport like bowling to try.

He told an enthusiastic audience what five traits there should be for a good bowling coach:1) Communication: He likes to start by asking a bowler what their highest game was and from that he can tell a lot about that person if they remember when and how they were able to shoot that score. 2) People skills: He felt "expe-

A good coach needs to have

score. He is amazed at how many young bowlers do not know how to keep score! Also included in the six vocabularies is you need to know what this person does for a living since you can't coach all people the same. Baker said he really likes to coach someone who is in the profession of engineering. He next went on to ask the audience who they thought was easier to coach-men or women? Well, the women won out as he said "women deal in reality!" And, lastly, what do you think bowlers are looking for? You'd be surprised, but in all cases, Baker said, "More high fives!

Just back from the most recent Camp Bakes, which took place a couple weeks ago in Las Vegas, a couple of my Women State teammates, Barb Francisco and her daughter, Keri, were fortunate enough to capitalize on Baker's unique instruction just as summer leagues were about to hit the floor. Keri was gracious enough to share some of her own perspectives on being coached by Baker in this, her second time to take his Camp.

"Mark Baker has a plethora of knowledge on the subject of bowling and he has a wonderfully interesting way of conveying that information to bowlers, regardless of ability. Although Mark has a commanding presence when he speaks, he does so in a way that in not intimi-dating. I feel this remains true in terms of his coaching as well. Going into the first Camp Bakes I attended, I was terrified. However, once Mark

the bowler's problem. For example, I complained that I kept pulling the ball but didn't know why. He found that when my backswing swung out, away from my body, it caused my ball to go to the left. It sounds ridiculously simple, but that is what is so wonderful about Mark's coaching style-it's all about getting back to the basics. He takes YOUR game and makes it better! He doesn't want you to look like Chris Barnes or Tommy Jones when you throw the ball, he wants you to look like you, only better!!"

Baker has become the master of working with all levels of bowlers and has the eye for coaching that can relate to his client. His enthusiasm for the sport lives through the bowlers he coaches.

Besides his scheduled Camp Bakes that take place several times a year now, you can also catch him on various weekends coaching at either Fountain Bowl or Cal Bowl down in sunny Southern California. At the end of Mark's presentation, all attendees drew a small bag of M&M candies from a basket. These were specially designed for bowlers with each color for a bowler's specific need. One of these bags held a brown button that resembled an M&M. Whoever drew this bag was the winner of an exclusive lesson from Mark Baker! The winner was Robyn Ballerini of Marin County!! Also an array of raffle prizes were given away thanks to prizes that were donated by Storm, Martini Eyewear and Bowlers Journal.

#### **USBC HALL OF FAMER D.D. JACOBSON DIES AT AGE 90**

ARLINGTON - D.D. Jacobson, a member of the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame, died May 30 at age 90.

Jacobson, a resident of Sandy, Utah, didn't start bowling until she was 29. An avid skier, her doctor suggested she try something less strenuous when she became pregnant, and she turned to bowling.

She won the 1964 Wom-International en's Bowling Congress (now USBC) Queens tournament, having to twice beat future hall of famer Shirley Garms to claim the title. She finished seventh at the Queens in 1965 and third in 1967.

Jacobson rolled a record 737 series to claim the singles title at the 1972 WIBC Championships in Kansas City, Mo. She said she was embarrassed after bowling identical 479 series in team and doubles. "I was ready to pack up, go home and skip the Queens if I didn't do any better in singles,"
