When Ed finger-spelled my name "Connie Marchione" and said it's for you, I was shocked in disbelief. It did not get in me till after Joe told me "it is you and go". Generations Tour is Full Speed Ahead Details Revealed at Bowl Expo

LAS VEGAS—If there were any doubts that dynamic promoter Steve Sanders would pull off his latest project - an all-new senior bowling tour - they were erased June 29 at International Bowl Expo in Las Vegas.

In a press conference attended by over 50 bowling writers and industry dignitaries at the Las Vegas Convention Center, Sanders unveiled the details of his new venture, launched his new website www.gbtour.com, and answered every question from bowling's top writers with candid and honest replies.

Joining Sanders in the conference were more than a dozen new GBT staffers and several legends of the sport that will compete in the events. Bowling legends Mark Roth, Johnny Petraglia, Dave Davis, and David Ozio were at the head table and pledged their support for the new tour. "This is what we've been waiting for," said Roth. Davis also expressed his excitement by saying, "There's snow on the roof, but we still have the fire in the belly. We want to compete and win as much as ever." When asked how he would decide which tour to bowl in, Petraglia said, "I'll bowl in both, and the great thing about this new tour is finally we will get back to a lot of the places we used to bowl and the fans will get to know us again." Another highlight of the conference was the live launching of the official Generations Tour website www.gbtour.com. In front of the entire room, Andrew Aiello, GBT's website director,

navigated the new site to reveal its features at Sanders' direction.

A press kit given attendees contained the full 36-week schedule, feature articles on the tour and its players, and a list of 40 frequently asked questions and answers. At the Bowl Expo trade show, the GBT booth was a popular stop for attendees from across the globe. GBT also announced a regional tour program to support the new national tour.

"This has been a dream of mine since we ran our first big senior event in 1996," said Sanders (his Pinacle Events operated the '96 BPAA Senior U.S. Open and two Brunswick Senior World Opens). "Now it's finally here, and we can't wait to get started. If we can give these great players a chance to have a new career and give the fans something very special, all of the work we've done will be worthwhile," added Sanders.

Division title.

The 38-year-old righthander, who already owns four titles at the USBC Women's Championships and three USBC Queens victories, posted games of 248, 300 and 264 to edge past Norm Titus of Columbia, Tenn., who finished second with 811.

Macpherson's perfect game was the second of the year by a woman and the third in the history of the Open Championships. In addition, she joined Kristal Scott of Wichita, Kan., as the only two women to record an 800 series on the tournament lanes. Scott made headlines when she rolled an 816 series during team event.

"I would never have imagined that something like this could happen," said Macpherson, a 20-time PWBA champion. "I never looked at the top scores, and I didn't really think about it much until I started throwing a lot of strikes. Being announced as a champion is something every bowler thinks about back in the squad room, and I'm just really proud and excited."

USBC Hall of Famer and three-time Open Championships titlist Steve Fehr of Cincinnati waited 24 years to find his way back into the winner's circle at the Open Championships. Since his last title came on the final day of team competition in 1982, he was on the edge of his seat until the very last team finished bowling Sunday night.

Fehr helped Browning Pontiac to a 3,496 effort, the third highest team total in tournament history. George Gohagan III led the way with 715 and was followed by Ken Jessee (710), Jon Murph (710), Ken Abner (696) and Fehr (665).

"It was so hard to wait all of these weeks, but it was such a thrill to sweat it out everyday," said Fehr, who also won the 1994 USBC Masters. "But no matter how good your score is, it's not safe until it's all over. Getting close or being in the hunt are always fun, but nothing compares to grabbing a title, especially after all these years."

In addition to Fehr's return to the top, USBC Director Sam Lantto of Eden Prairie, Minn., led his Linds Lakers 1 teammates to another Team All-Events crown, the same event the group won together at the 2002 event in Billings, Mont.

The group finished its 45 games with a 9,940 total this year. Lantto contributed 2,147 and was followed by USBC Hall of Famer Todd Savoy (2,037), Charles Vashaw (1,952), John Eiss (1,943) and Gary Green (1,861).
