GRAPEVINE, TX — The Bowling Writers Association of America (BWAA) held their annual meeting at BOWL EXPO 2011 last week. Meeting at the Gaylord Texan Hotel and Convention Center, about fifty writers (representing about 300 other members) gathered to hear reports, pass legislation, and present awards.

After presenting awards for Bowler of the Year; Female, Senior, Amateur and Collegiate Bowlers of the Year, the writers turned their attention



to their own. In the presence of HALL OF FAME writers JOHN JOWDY, ELAINE HA-GEN, SYLVIA BROYLES, and FRAN DEKEN, BWAA President Jackie Wyckoff took the microphone and introduced the judges for this years national writing contest.

Then, without further ado, Wyckoff announced that FRANK WEILER was selected for writing the BEST EDITORIAL during the past year. It was Weiler's first national writing award. He has been writing for the BOWL-ING NEWS since 2004 and on a regular weekly basis since 2009. He has been a member of BWAA since 2004.

The winning editorial "Kelly Kulick Should Have Won Two ESPY Awards" was published in the BOWLING NEWS last August and subsequently published nationwide in the Stars And Strikes Bowling Newspaper, and on JOHN SOWELL'S Website.Frank is grateful to the BOWLING NEWS and CAROL MANCI-NI for giving him the opportunity to write for them.

True Amateur Tournaments- In a finals round in which strikes were abundant - and necessary - Devin Bidwell emerged from the 5-bowler group victorious and a \$20,000 winner! And the 22 year old from Simi Valley, California, did it on his dad's birthday, watching the entire finals! Devin also made the top six in the High Roller the same weekend.

The finals was loaded by bowlers from coast-to-coast, California-to-Florida as local Vegas resident Byron Randolph was 2nd for \$10,000, David Schilke, Nebraska 3rd for \$7,500, David Stouffer, Florida 4th for \$6,000 and Vincent Sica, Las Vegas 5th for \$5,000.

BOWL EXPO 2011 PROVIDES THE CHANCE TO SHOW OFF TEXAS AS SPORT'S NEW HOME

TEXAS—In many ways, International Bowl Expo 2011 was similar to those held in the past. Friendships were made and renewed, people earned awards, thousands of attendees learned the latest information about the sport and business and new products were introduced. What made this year's event different was the location. Instead of the glamour of Las Vegas or glitz of Orlando, this had more of a feel of home. That's certainly the way the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America, United States Bowling Congress and International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame wanted it because the Dallas-Fort Worth area is their home. Even with business as usual up the road at the Gaylord Texan in Grapevine, this was the chance

Even with business as usual up the road at the Gaylord Texan in Grapevine, this was the chance to show off the multiple elements of the International Bowling Campus and its giant Arlington neighbor Cowboys Stadium. Both venues hosted special evening events that attracted the most attention and made this year's Bowl Expo week so special. It definitely made for little sleep and extensive use of maps or GPS systems because there was so much happening in so many places with so much road construction.

The festivities actually started June 24 at AMF Showplace Euless Lanes with the pro-am for Bowling's U.S. Women's Open presented by the brands of Ebonite International that started the next day. More than 200 people competed in the pro-am with a record 286 of the world's best professional and amateur women competitors entered in the main event. "We threw a five-day event and a tournament broke out," BPAA Executive Director Steve Johnson told members of the Bowling Writers' Association of America. "I told our staff 'don't just do a tournament. Do a super event." "The more than 6,000 people who came to Cowboys Stadium for the stepladder finals June 30 learned first-hand what Johnson meant. Four lanes were built by Qubica/AMF to surround the famous Dallas Cowboys Star at midfield of the site of Super Bowl XLV nearly five months earlier. The Dallas Cowboys Cheerleaders provided some of the pre-match entertainment. And then there was the star-studded stepladder taped for showing two days later on ESPN2. There were local stars Shannon O'Keefe and Lynda Barnes. There was 2010 U.S. Women's Open winner Kelly Kulick and runnerup Liz Johnson. And there was 43-year-old Leanne Hulsenburg. As Leanne Barrette, she won 26 professional titles before the Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour folded. In between she married, had a son and was inducted into the United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame.

Hulsenburg won the 2011 U.S. Women's Open to ensure for at least one week, women's bowling had a prominent place in American sports. That appeared in danger when USBC, the event's previous sponsor, was unable to continue in that role after 2010. With Ebonite's help, Johnson returned the Women's U.S. Open to BPAA control after leasing it to USBC for several years. "One person said women's bowling is back. I said women's bowling never left," Johnson said. "Women's bowling never left the industry. The industry left the women." The previous night put the bowling industry on display in an even broader way. The Night at the Campus featured tours of the complex, the grand opening of the new 50 Years of Women's Professional Bowling exhibit at the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame and a proam event at the International Training and Research Center to benefit the IBM/HF. While only 500-600 people were originally expected, more than 2,200 people showed up. That's more than twice the number that came for the grand opening of the Campus in January 2010. Those who came enjoyed an old-fashioned Texas barbeque. They could roll shots on the 1930sera lanes at the IBM/HF with the pins they knocked down re-set by human hands. They could bowl and mingle with the likes of hall of famers Carolyn Dorin-Ballard, Tish Johnson, Norm Duke, Johnny Petraglia and Parker Bohn III and numerous current stars. In short, they saw the full potential of the International Bowling Campus in just a few hours. This Bowl Expo wasn't without some history-making news off the lanes. For example, at 9:02 a.m. June 27, Cathy DeSocio of Wichita, Kan., was selected as BPAA president-elect meaning she will be the organization's first female president next year.

Two days later, Johnson opened the general session in grand style riding down the center aisle on an authentic Texas longhorn. After dusting himself off and still in his cowboy britches, he talked about one of Bowl Expo's other points of emphasis. "The last couple of days we've heard and seen a lot of the importance of youth," Johnson said. "Youth are talking about bowling." Soon thereafter, attendees heard from National Football League Hall of Famer and real estate executive Roger Staubach. He quickly noted the great relationships being forged in Texas at the International Bowling Campus. "I know BPAA and USBC are together and getting along," Staubach said. "Maybe the NFL and NFL Players Association should take a lesson." The next morning was Lucky Strike Lanes Chief Executive Officer Steven Foster's turn to speak.

Foster started in the bowling business by founding the Jillians chain in 1988 and after selling it started Lucky Strike in 2003. The chain has grown to 21 facilities. "This is a tough business," Foster said. "There are a lot of moving parts. We work hard and want to do better. In the end, a lot depends on that we believe in ourselves. "Bowling is a paradigm of life – thought, action, achievement, and fulfillment – everything we do. It makes me feel like a kid. The act of bowling can be done in about four seconds but it generates a kid-like emotion of happiness and joy. There's nothing else I know that does that." Foster's thoughts echoed what Johnson told the write

There's nothing else I know that does that." Foster's thoughts echoed what Johnson told the writers two days earlier. "There's 71 million people coming through our doors," he said. "We need more people coming in the doors. We need them to come often. We need bowling to be the destination of choice. We need to be good at whatever way people want to bowl, casual, league or tournament. "We have a great sport. Keep it positive. Keep it fun and who knows where bowling can go." This year bowling came to Texas, home of nearly all of the organizations that shape it as a recreation, sport and business. Bowl Expo just brought everyone in the industry together to show how.

BPAA The impending BPPA U.S. Women's Open brought CEO Steve Johnson to the floor saying, "They say Women's Bowling is back. Women's bowling never left. It was the industry that left women's bowling." The Open did not disappoint with over 6,000 people in Cowboy Stadium watching a field of outstanding bowlers: **Liz Johnson, Lynda Barnes, Shannon O'Keefe, Kelly Kulick** and the last woman standing with a trophy in her hand was **Leanne Hulsenberg** of Roseville, **California.** Johnson appealed to writers to build awareness about the good things going on in bowling. Among the highlights of the BPAA general meeting was keynote speaker **Roger Staubach**. Credited with inventing the great "Hail Mary" pass, Roger came to the Dallas Cowboys from the U.S. Naval Academy and was touted as a "tremendous competitor" by Cowboy Coach Tom Landry. The epitome of a gentleman, he said he met his wife in a bowling ally. They had gone with another couple and his relationship with his then girlfriend was a little iffy. He doesn't know how, but he bowled a 213 and she said she fell in love with him all over again – 44 years ago. His words: "*Giving back is the most important thing you can do. You need that inner trust and the right people in the right place.*" He spoke of the lackluster Cowboys when he first went there with a "What's in it for me" attitude, no team spirit, no balance and always somebody else's fault. They went from a losing team to world champs by having the right people in the right place and working together. He emphasized, "You gotta' hang in there. Don't blame others. Don't give up – you can't quit – you gotta keep hangin' in – persevere. It doesn't 'mean you are always going to win but you need to gotta keep hangin' in – persevere. It doesn't' mean you are always going to win but you need to deal with it. Following his career with the Cowboys Staubach fulfilled his commitment to the Naval Academy and served in the Navy.

The USBC meeting The USBC meeting was zipped through in about 5 hours. The National Anthem sung by ReCreation was inspirational. ReCreation Director Jay Mueller gave a dissertation on what their visits to over 250 facilities do and fulfilling their grant to every VA and Military hospital plus a variety of other events. BVL will have a new logo and it will contain the name of each association. He says that "Project Music" fills the halls with music and is a powerful medicine that heals bodies, spirits, and self worth. BVL was recognized as one of America's best charities, and honor given to just 2% of charities

Of course, California still leads all associations in BVL fundraising with \$123,000. The next closest was Virginia with \$23,000. Citrus Belt, Orange County and Greater Sacramento USBC were recognized among the top five local associations.

USBC President **Darlene Baker** gave a most meaningful address stating that "*The financial stability of USBC is in question but they will meet the commitment of \$2 million in reserve for two years. The USBC Women's tournament will be sponsored by Tri-Properties in Reno and she said we must* make changes to be relevant or we will cease to be. Everyone who bowls or participates in the sport of bowling is an ambassador.

Elected to the USBC board : Darlene Baker, Jo Dimond, Marci Williams and Bill Vint. The shock of the convention was having the board go back into session to elect the President and find that they elected Jim Sturm of W. Virginia ousting Baker.

CEO Stu Upson noted that USBC has again, had a 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ % decline. USBC and BPAA combined the Youth Development Department; The International Training Center is becoming a venue for the world to use and the good news – they are close to selling the Greendale property.

A new coaching concept is being tried – a coach for each team. The experimental program is going on in a few centers. USBC is making improvements in technology with input from association leaders including tournament on-line registration.

A new Travel Company, Travel Holdings, guarantees bowlers the lowest price. Check it out on mybowlingvacation.com. They have bought into the fact that media marketing is the way of the world "Twitter" and "Facebook." Incentive programs for retention are in the works. They will have a new TV spot and higher eligibility requirements for Awards. These items will be tested in 15-20 markets for key issues and opportunities. Test Plan 2011-2012, Expansion 2012-2013, National Roll-Out 2013-2014.

Over the last 11 years bowling has donated close to nine million to "Bowl for the Cure" and the usual pink sticks were twirled by all.

Voting was done electronically and most important was that USBC tried the *forced merger* for associations again and it was defeated. People do not like the word "FORCED!" Darlene Baker noted that **Debbie Haggerty** was appointed to the Youth Committee. **CEO Stu Upson** says they welcome your suggestions and complaints.

William Garrett Stars in His 1st ABTA Championship Wins Las Vegas Event & \$13,850 Top Prize at the South Point Match Game again is \$3,500 Match Series estimate of \$2,000 3-6-9 is \$2,000 ABTA Returns to West Covina on Saturday

LAS VEGAS—Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to South Point Hotel & Casino over the 4th of July weekend for our annual Vegas Open. We had a nice turnout of 675 entries in our four day event. We had a decent, fair shot for the tournament making the cut scores for the men +68 on Thursday, +69 on Friday, +77 on Saturday, +87 on Sunday, and a +65 for the re-entry squad. For the women we had cut scores +70 on Thursday, +41 on Friday, +51 on Saturday, -25 on Sunday, and +41 for the re-entry squad. The Super Seniors added to the board (3 men and 2 women) were Violeta Arcelona (+41), Beth Willcuts (+36), Phil Magno (+75), Jim Smith (+75), Jack Trongale (+65). Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 140 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this weekend.

Top qualifier for the Men was $\hat{\text{Vic}}$ Santos with a +189. For the women it was Annaliza Agoncillo with a +157. Each of them will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$1554. The top seed drew a 709. We had no bowlers that bowled this score during qualifying. At our next event we will estimate the Match Series at \$1,900. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, Tony Leogrande was the last person standing of all the qualifiers and he would go for the pot. He missed on the second shot and received \$100 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$2,000 at West Covina.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Jonathan Barraca and Jiradej Harnpatanakitpanich with a 1475 for \$170. Finishing second was Je Je Gabriel and Resty Sanchez with 1439 for \$150. There was a total of \$2080 paid out in doubles and 28 paid spots with low to cash of 1383.

In the semis, 139 bowlers took to the floor. We saw J.J. Soon jump out and lead the first game. With a big third game, William Garrett took the top spot and the lead with a +175 to sit out and bowl for the title match. Close was ABTA Veteran Dino Cantoria, who also had a big 3rd game but not enough, with a +167 to sit out the first round. It took a +86 for the men and +63 for the women. Garrett, our top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. The pot is maxed out and we have a back-up pot that is also maxed out, with a third pot now started. That will for sure put the Match Game at \$3,500 for our next three events. He drew a 156. We had 8 bowlers who shot that score, they split the pot and each took home \$437.50. The winners were Tess Li, Carey Durrell, Alan Samatra, Ceazer Moore, Claudio Puglisi, Inger Bortolazzo, Kristine Soliman, and Mathew Kranz. We will have \$3,500 next week at West Covina, and continue to build on the third back-up pot, which is \$605.

This week we had 26 new bowlers join us, plus 10 bowlers returning from being away for over 1 year. Let us welcome these new bowlers to the club, John Carroll, Rick Bertrand, Ricardo Perez, Tess Li, Rick Mousouleas, Charles Brian Richardson, Fick, Larry Corrigan, Karl Ramer, Thomas Caldwell, Dominik Flick, Cindy Hopkins, Cynthia Buck, Charles Vega, Ron Christensen, Wayne Sherrill, Chuck Raz, Peter Flick, Jamie Spector, Preston Rozzell, Gayle Rozzelle, Obie Siburg, Larry Fisher, Joey Adam, Young Choi, and Milton Oaks. The Flicks came all the way from Frankfurt Germany to bowl in the ABTA and nicestpeople you will not find. We also had Members from Ireland, Mexico, and of course the Philippines on hand in our tournament.

This brings us to our top 32 Match Play finals. In the first round, the 15 losers were Ellena Dominguez, Violeta Arcelona, Stephanie Alvarez, In Kyung Youn, Alan Samatra, Danny Guevarra, J.J. Soon, Marvin Crowder, Don Johnson, Melvin Finner, Gerald Sanchez. Norris Montague, Alex Quon, Chris Romero, and Arnold Trias. They received checks of \$245 each. There were many close matches! In the second round, losing out were Fave Josafat, Gil Justiniane, Vuong Do, Deborah Sanders, Dominik Flick, Leo Silva, Dino Cantoria, and Roland Suase. They received checks of \$270 each. In the third round, the 4 losers were Jeff Reyes, Matt Garcia, Bob Butts, and John Phan. They received checks of \$400 each. This would get us down to the final four bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$54 (Kmel Cunanan) to a high of \$273 (Beth Borci) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Beth Borci (24th seed) bowling Sol Cericos (25th seed). In this match, we would see Beth carry almost ALL her shots, no matter where she had the ball hit and Sol could not seem to find the Irish luck work for him. The title game was set and bowled on Lanes 57 and 58. We would see two of our MOST regular bowlers matched up. Both were crowd favorites, William Garrett vs Beth Borci. William elected to have Beth lead off the match. She would start with a double, but opened in the 3rd frame and only picked up 1 of the 4 pins left. William opened with a spare and double, but he too would have an open. His came in the 4th frame. The match was close at this point, but another open by Beth in the 5th allowed William to jump out into the lead with his double
