Laurie Soto Is The 2006 CWBA Queen

SACRAMENTO—Laurie Soto of San Fernando Valley was crowned the 41st California Women's Bowling Association Queen on Sunday, July 9 at Fireside Lanes in Citrus Heights. The runner up was Stephanie Sjobom of Citrus Belt.

The two-day format was used for the Queens tournament again this year, beginning with two qualifying squads bowling six games each on Saturday. The top thirty-two ladies returned on Sunday morning and rolled three more games, for total pin fall. In the second round, the top sixteen ladies from the first round bowled another three games for total pin fall and this reduced the field to eight ladies. The eight ladies bowled an additional three games for total pin fall, moving the top five ladies into the step-ladder finals. The ladies bowled one game matches in the step-ladder finals.

In the first match, Jennifer Jones (Alameda County), bowled a 289 game, defeating Robin Romeo (San Fernando Valley), who bowled a 223 game.

In the next match, Jennifer bowled a 186 game, but was defeated by Tish Johnson (Los Angeles WBA), who bowled a 226 game.

Tish then met Stephanie Sjobom (Citrus Belt) in the third match. Stephanie bowled a 247 game, and Tish bowled a 210 game.

In the final game, the high qualifier, Laurie Soto (San Fernando Valley) rolled a 258 game, against Stephanie Sjobom, who bowled a 238 game. Laurie was then crowned the Queen of the Tournament. Her high game was 279; high series, 757; and Laurie averaged 233 for 16 games.

Laurie has been bowling since she was ten years old, but actually "learned" how to bowl at the age of twenty-five. Team-mate, Paula Vidad was very instrumental in teaching her the game.

Laurie said "Paula taught me the basics and introduced me to the women's national tour in 1988. In 1991 I made my first televised show at the WIBC Queens in Cedar Rapids, Iowa and finished in 3rd place. I've really enjoyed competing through the years and meeting many wonderful people who have become part of my bowling family".

Laurie competes regularly in

the Western Women Professional Bowlers organization. She is on the board of directors as the corresponding secretary.

Laurie would like to thank Jack Thomas and Fireside Lanes for hosting the 2006 California Queens tournament this year. We had a wonderful weekend competing in your center. Thank you to the entire CWBA staff for once again running a great tournament. She would also like to thank all the sponsors who supported this tournament and who continue to support women's bowling. Without them, these tournaments would not be possible. Thank you to Sharon Kapsamallis, owner of Personal Touch Pro Shop for drilling my equipment, Steve Hamaguchi (Ebonite staff) for laying out my equipment, and to Juan Fonseca (USBC Silver Certified Coach) for working with me on my game using BowlersMAP. Following are some of Laurie's accomplishments: 1 PWBA National Title (LPBT National Double Tournament, Las Vegas (with Aleta Sill); 1 PWBA Regional Title; 1 WWPB Title; 3 CWBA Queens Titles (1999, 2000 & 2006); 1 CWBA State Team Title (2004) with Sheri Dyer, Diane Parker & Paula Vidad; 2 CWBA State Doubles Titles (1989 & 2004); San Fernando City All Events Champion; 2 National Team Challenge Finals; 10 – 300 games and two 800 series, 839 & 825.

Runner up Stephanie Sjobom averaged 235 during the tournament with a high game of 289, and a high series of 771.

There was an impressive 43% increase in participation this year with 124 entries. \$16,030.50 was awarded in scholarship this year. Another increase! Scholarship awarded year to date for this tournament is \$45,835.00. Scholarship money was earned through the sweeper, brackets, high games and the top 18 in Division 1, top 10 in Division II and top 10 in Division III. The majority of scholarship money collected was from a huge opportunity drawing, silent auction and business advertisement. Thank you once again to all our sponsors, coaches and volunteers for helping to make this year's event another success.

Congratulations to the Champions in each division. Division 3, Cameron Smith of Santee, CA winning \$750.00, Division 2, Bryanna Caldwell of Tucson, AZ winning \$850.00 and Division 1, Mason Sherman of Moorpark, CA winning \$2,200.00. These bowlers also received a patriotic championship plaque.

After 12 games of qualifying in Division 3, the top 10 went on to 10 games of match play and then top-five stepladder. Fifth seed, Allie Ijams of Mission Viejo, CA went against fourth seed James Bael of Carson, CA. James bowled 167 to Allie's 232. Allie proceeded to bowl third seed, Cory Koyanagi of Torrance, CA. The match was Allie 156, Cory 167. Cory moved on to challenge second seed Kyle King of Glendale, AZ. Cory bowled 189 to Kyle's 224 allowing Kyle to challenge the top seed Cameron Smith of Santee, CA. It was a close match, Kyle 190, Cameron 201, making Cameron the Division 3 champion. There were 25 boys and girls in this division. They ranged in age from 11 to 14. There seems to be lots of talent upcoming.

Division 2 saw 21 girl participants and cut to the top 10 after 18 games of qualifying. The girls then bowled 18 games of match play

Frank Esposito Dies at Age 86

Member of USBC and PBA shrines wore many hats in long career

GREENDALE—United States Bowling Congress and Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Frank Esposito died July 12 of a stroke in Deerfield Beach, Fla. He was age 86.

Inducted into the former American Bowling Congress Hall of Fame in 1997, Esposito was the longtime owner of the famed Paramus Bowl in New Jersey and contributed to the sport in many ways during his career. He was perhaps best known for his television affiliations, especially as coordinator for the Professional Bowlers Association Tour on ABC-TV.

His contributions to the sport were far-reaching, being regarded as a pioneer for ideas and innovations over more than 50 years of involvement in the sport. Many of the bowling TV show formats were Esposito brainchilds. He also hosted PBA events and was the first to award merchandise to pro-am entrants.

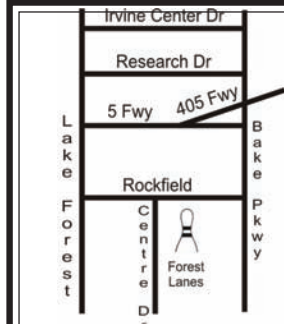
His interest in bowling began when he organized a high school league in 1937. He became one of the East's top players, bowling with star-filled teams and posting a 200-plus average for more than 30 years.

He opened the 24-lane Paramus Bowl in 1955, immediately becoming involved in every aspect of the sport through meetings, clinics, seminars, etc. The establishment grew to 54 lanes and for many years was the testing ground for new equipment, tournaments and TV shows.

He was one of PBA's founding members and served the organization in many capacities. He worked closely with proprietor groups including the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America. Esposito helped raise funds for the Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum by commissioning famed artist Leroy Neiman to do an original painting.

Chad Nelson Wins 25th Anniversary High Roller

LAS VEGAS—The High Roller picked up where it left off in February, dishing out \$1,000 checks like they were just chips! Both the Super Bowl High Roller and the July High Roller have shown increases in participation now in 4 consecutive events! High Roller has recently extended a 3-year agreement with both Sam’s Town and Storm Bowling Products so big things are on the way!

Chad Nelson, from Owatonna, MN, was the recipient of the \$20,000 winner’s share but it wasn’t exactly handed to him. The 33 year old right-hander has logged some great High Roller tournaments, piling up over \$100,000 in the 32 that he has bowled since 1996. With all of that experience, he knew what to expect in match play. Using a Storm Thunderstruck, Nelson whipped opponent after opponent, averaging 232 to his opponents 198, until just Ed Roberts stood in his way.

In the 4-player Championship Shoot-Out, only Roberts was mathematically alive in the 10th frame, but he trailed Nelson as he bowled first in the final frame. A double would force Nelson to mark. Roberts threw

the first one, a beauty that had to make Nelson cringe. But he couldn’t get the next one and Nelson’s count on his first shot wrapped it up 226 to 214! “It’s unbelievable that I actually won a High Roller title!” said Nelson. “Dan Bock and I have traveled together to Vegas for years, he got his and now I finally got mine. With all of that talent out there, you have to get a little lucky and also bowl well. I managed to do both this week.”

Even before the Grand Finals, Nelson, bowling in the 39 & Under division, had a great week, winning \$1,000 & a pair of Dynorooz Shoes in a Sweeper and then winning 2 more \$1,000 prizes during qualifying.

Roberts, the 63 year old from Braintree, Ma., was celebrating High Roller’s 25th anniversary more than anyone because he was a contestant in the very 1st High Roller back in 1982! This event was his 64th High Roller tournament! Roberts, a Team USA member in 1995, picked up \$12,500, his largest prize ever,

for 2nd place. He also won another \$1,000 during qualifying.

Brian Wallace, from Lexington, KY, represented the 205 Average & Under division and finished 3rd for \$7,500 with 182. He also won another \$1,000 during qualifying. Newcomer Marty Hinton, from Las Vegas, shot 175 in the Championship Shoot-Out and won \$5,000 coming out of the 40 to 49 division.

The July High Roller paid \$415,000 including 228 prizes of \$1,000 or more in the main event and many more in the Sweepers and the BIDSingles.

Another Nelson, this time Ron from Bridgewater, IL, won the BIDSingles for \$3,000.

Next up is the New Jersey Red Hot at Laurel Lanes in Maple Shade July 22 & 23. \$7,500 1st and a \$125 entry fee in this 3-gamer with a match play finals. Qualifying for the finals is in age divisions.

National Deaf Bowling News

Frank Gallo Failed By 5 Pins In USBC Senior Masters at Suncoast

LAS VEGAS—After first two 5 games qualifying round, deaf pro Frank Gallo, Newport News, WV felt sure he would qualifying if he continued doing like he did, just averaging 200 plus per game in the next round in the USBC Senior Masters held at Suncoast Hotel Bowling Center last month.

Gallo had 1027 for 31st place in first 5 games and dropped to 43rd place with 2040 total after his 2nd day 5 games.

But unfortunately he did not in the 3rd round final 5 games as he went under 200 and the consequence was bad. His 2993 total for 15 games was 5 pins short qualifying for the 64 bowlers match play. His consolation was \$800.00 for not making the match plays.

Tom Baker won this USBC Senior Masters coming out of the losers bracket to beat Bob Kelly in two 3 games final Championship matches for the \$18,000 prize. Baker after losing to Dale Eagle 643-554 in the 2nd round did something spectacular. Baker won his next 8 matches with 8 straight 700 series with a high of 793 and low of 703 including a 300 game in one of them. That is amazing.

DEAF DOBLMEIER AND HEARING IMPAIRED COULLES IN JUNIOR GOLD CHAMPIONSHIP FORT LAUDERDALE

FL—The recently held USBC Junior Gold Championship in Florida, the tryouts for the Junior Team USA and \$80,000 in scholarships that drew 1450 teenagers. For that big entry, they used three large Don Carter bowling centers nearby in that area with each having Sport Bowling short, medium and long oil condition.

Young Deaf Rai Doblmeier, Rhode Island, a member of Deaf Team USA and hearing impaired Lindsey Coulles, Ohio, a member of 2004 and 2005 Junior Team USA had participated and did not do well in last year’s Junior Gold Championships.

They were entered in this year event again but both did not make it in their three days of 6 qualifying games, each on three different challenging conditions.

Rai had only five 200+ games in his 18 games total of 3192 for 519th place out of 990+ boys. He also had 5 games under 149 which hurt him but his totals was better than last year’s.

For the first two rounds Lindsey was bad like last year, not being herself as she was in 2003 and 2004 when she made the Junior Team USA. She finally caught on and conquered the long oil in third round with games of 198-191-249-188-220-240 for 1289. But her total of 3419 was 60 pins from the cut off for match plays. Lindsey placed 33rd out of 460+ girls and her 1289 was the 2nd highest for the girls in the 3rd round. Another girl’s 1333 was higher but she too had bad first two rounds and failed in two places ahead of Lindsey.

THAT KID WITH TWO 900 COULD NOT MAKE IT IN JUNIOR GOLDEVENT

About the Sport Bowling condition they used there, this is interesting to know because Robert Machture, that 17 years old NY youngster who had his two 900 series approved by USBC, was entering in this Junior Gold Championship for the first time.

That kid never bowled on Sport Bowling condition but his house center put on this condition for him to practice on for this event.

In an interview before bowling in Junior Gold he was sure he would finish high. But he tried and with only five 200 games in 3 rounds, he had 3342 total for 283rd place. He may be nervous because the ESPN cameras were following him for 3 days.

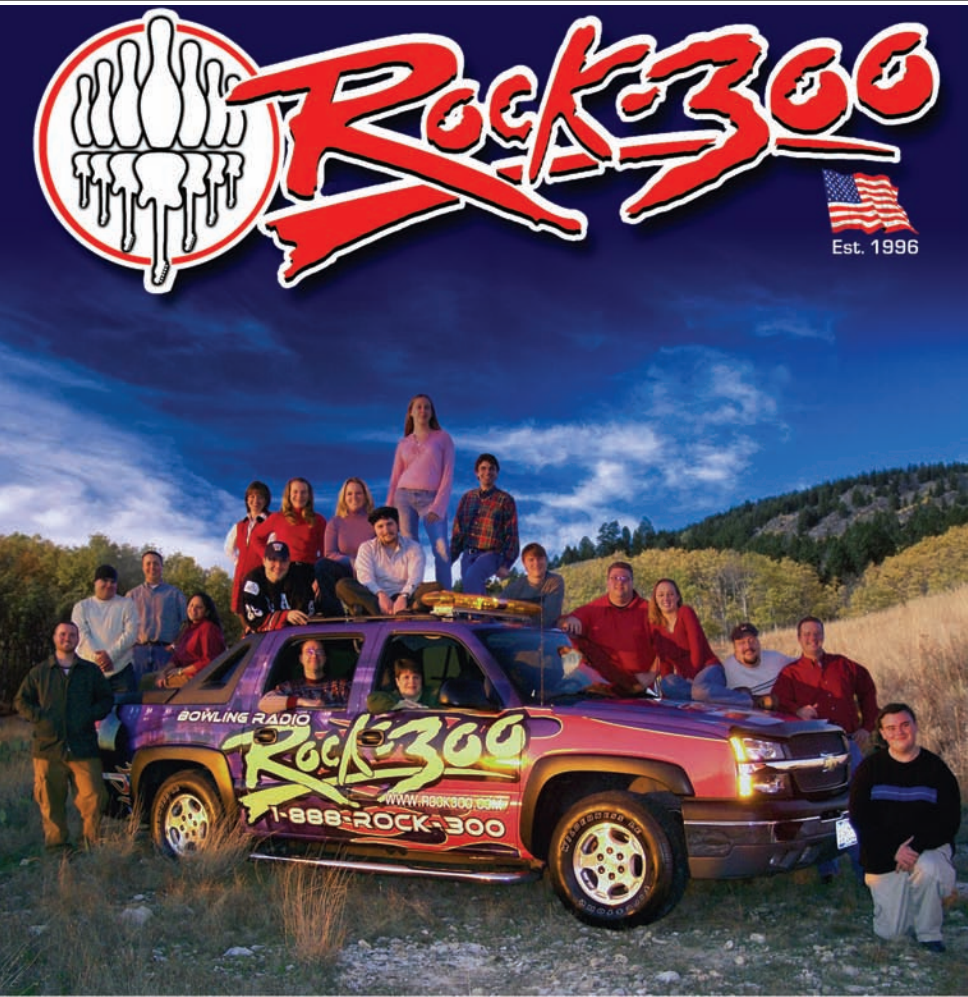

“Chris is not only the consummate bowler, but a tremendous professional and an exceptional person,” said Chip Zielke, Columbia Industries executive vice president of marketing and sales. “Given Columbia 300’s storied history and aggressive goals for the future, there is simply no better choice for the face of the brand than Chris Barnes.”
“We feel this long-term relationship with Chris not only validates his bowling success and passion for the game, but also validates Columbia 300’s passion and commitment to bowling and bowlers everywhere,” Zielke added.
The announcement of the endorsement contract was made June 27 at the Bowling Writers’ Association of America annual awards dinner held at the Las Vegas Hilton. The long-term deal offers financial security for Barnes, his wife, Lynda, and their two twin sons, Ryan and Troy.

Baker Takes Long Road Through Losers Bracket To Win 2006 USBC Senior Masters

RENO—Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Tom Baker reinforced his position as bowling’s dominant senior professional bowler by winning the 2006 United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters Friday at the National Bowling Stadium.
The 51-year-old Baker from King, N.C., defeated winners bracket finalist Bob Kelly of Dayton, Ohio, 686-612, and 645-575, in the three-game double-elimination conclusion to win his first Senior Masters title and the \$18,000 first prize. It was his second senior tour major of the year having won the PBA Senior U.S. Open in June.
To get to the championship match, Baker won nine consecutive losers bracket matches. He won seven matches on Thursday after losing his second match Wednesday evening and then won two more Friday morning. His 12 overall match wins and 13 total matches are Senior Masters records.
“This has been an incredible tournament for me,” Baker said. “It was a real long day yesterday so I was a little worried about how I might feel for this morning’s matches. After taking a few shots this morning it didn’t take long to get comfortable.”
Friday morning Baker defeated three-time Team USA member Ron Mohr of Eagle River Alaska. 693-637, and Tim Ruelle of Racine, Wis., 719-641, before meeting Kelly for the championship.
“I used the same thought process today as I did for the whole tournament,” Baker said. “Read the lanes and make the right moves. I was really in synch with making the right adjustments and changes in equipment all week.
“I’ve really been working on the mental part of the game,” he added. “I’m to the point where I’m really comfortable with the adjustments I have to make.”
