NEW WORLD RECORD FOR ATTENDANCE AT PROFESSIONAL BOWLING EVENT SET AT 2011 BOWLING'S U.S. WOMEN'S OPEN

Historic Event Shatters Record for the Most Attendees at a Professional Bowling Event

ARLINGTON — The Bowling Proprietors' Association of America (BPAA) and Cowboys Stadium announced today that history was made at the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open. The two organizations reported today that the groundbreaking finals - which were played at the 50yard line of Cowboys Stadium on Thursday, June 30 - set a new world record with 8,017 individuals in attendance, breaking the previous record of 7,212 that was set at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit in 1995. LAS VEGAS—The 2011 revival of the PBA Doubles Championship will be named in honor of two PBA Tour legends – Mark Roth and Marshall Holman - who stamped their names all over the doubles competition back in its formation days.

Roth and Holman teamed up to win PBA Doubles Classic titles in 1977 and 1979 in San Jose, Calif., and again in 1984 after the event moved to Showboat Lanes in Las Vegas. The PBA Hall of Fame legends, who own a combined total of 56 PBA Tour titles, bowled as doubles partners 13 times, cashing 11 times, making match play 10 times and forever propelled into the annals of sports history, when for the first time, a women's Major professional bowling event was held at a non-traditional venue. On June 30, 2011 the Finals of the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open were held from the "Star" on the 50yard line of Cowboys Stadium in Arlington, TX. Leanne Hulsenberg was crowned 2011 Open champion as she held off fellow finalists Kelly Kulick, Lynda Barnes, Liz Johnson and Shannon O'Keefe in front of the largest crowd in bowling history. The Open Finals were broadcast on ESPN2 Saturday, July 2, 2011. "Cowboys Stadium has served as the playing field for some of the greatest moments in recent sports history, and we couldn't be more proud to be the host of this incredible achievement for bowling. We are excited to have been a part of making history at the 2011 Bowling's U.S. Women's Open," said Brett Daniels, Sr. Director of Corporate Communications for the Dallas Cowboys.

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS

MOST MEMORABLE DEAF BOWLING YEAR - 1996

LAS VEGAS-This writer likes to reminisce for the best deaf bowling year overall with record breaking events and memorable happenings in a single year. Looking back 15 years ago the 1996-

year seems to be the best, hands down. That was the year US's largest and oldest deaf bowling organization, Great Lakes Deaf Bowling Association for the first time, went out of its Great Lakes territory to celebrate it's 60th anniversary tournament in Las Vegas. Also in a joint celebration with its companion American Deaf Women's Bowling Association's 50th anniversary event. The men's events set all time deaf bowling entries records with 188 teams, 459 doubles, 918 singles and 855 all-events.

That broke the old record of 171 teams, made by Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association's 50th anniversary event in 1991 at Reno. But GLDWBA's 76 team entries at Las Vegas failed to beat the women's PCDWBA's record holding 82 team entries at 1991 Reno. However in largest number of both men and women bowlers in one city GLDBA/GLDWBA had a record total of 1320 bowlers beating PCDBA/PCDWBA'S 1265 bowlers. Ever since these record numbers remain unbroken.

Also observing its milestone 50th anniversary was the Southwest Deaf Bowling Association, which happened to hold its tournament in Dallas on the same weekend and bowling center as PBA's Quaker State Open. PBA generously respected the deaf tournament by taking an unprecedented one-day bye and in addition invited the 300 deaf bowlers to its Arena Televised Finals. That's a big honor for first time this happened.

That year's greatest record breaking scoring event by one deaf bowler came in one small obscure deaf regional tournament held by Southern Nevada-California Deaf Bowling Association. SN-CDBA drew 14 teams in its 13th annual event on Thanksgiving weekend at Canoga Park Bowl when one bowler, Carl Malucci, Whittier, CA rolled two 300s in one day, a 838 and 2144 all-events while another bowler, Dan Flores hit a 816. Malucci averaged 249 for his 11 games and altogether with his 9 games, averaged 244 for 20 games in this tournament. What was amazing with that is hard to believe in all the mighty GLDBA's 60 years even to now not a single 800 was made in its tournaments. Darrell Stogryn, CA was the first to bowl an 800 in a deaf tournament, 247-288-278/813 in 1992 doubles event Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association at Sacramento, CA. (Note: Flash forward to 2010, Malucci rewrote new SN-CDBA record and also all-time deaf record with 259 average for 9 games 2333 in all-events.) Most noteworthy honor came that year to this same Malucci when both American Athletic Association of the Deaf (now changed to USA Deaf Sports Federation) and US Olympic Committee named him as 1996 Deaf Male Athlete of Year. This is first time a deaf male bowler was honored as back in 1992 Lindy Decker, a left-handed bowler was honored as 1992 Deaf Female Athlete of Year.

A new deaf bowling organization debuted that year, Mark Fisser's West Coast Deaf Bowlers Association, which is unique as a monthly individual event. It was a membership organization holding monthly tournaments is different centers in Southern California. It was a great event but unfortunately lack of deaf bowlers' support compelled Fisser to stop after two years. It was sadly missed by many who participated in it. One woman, Wendy George, Riverside bowled a 300 game in it. Therefore the 1996 year was a good one for the deaf bowling memoirs.

WEST COVINA-Welcome everyone to the weekly edition of ABTA news. We returned to West Covina this past weekend for a regular event. We saw 210 entries in our one day event. We had a decent shot for the tournament making the cut scores of +37 for the men and +17 for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Dan West (+21), Michael Drohan, Sr.(+20), and Mary Robles (-37). Super Seniors are men 63 and over. For the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 52 bowlers making it to the semi-finals this week.

Top qualifiers for the Men was Thomas Chavez with a +215. For the women it was Patricia Lin with a +82. Each of them will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed overall draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$1,924. Chavez drew a 444. We had two bowlers that bowled this score during qualifying. They were Giang Huynh and Marina Suos, each will get \$947. At our next event we will estimate the Match Series at \$500. For the 3-6-9 qualifying, it was Tomas Chavez the last person standing of all the qualifiers. He would go for the pot, but he missed on the second shot and received \$50 consolation. The 3/6/9 will be \$2,100 at Oak Tree Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Chris Kelly and Vuong Do with a 1388 for \$130. Finishing second was Samson Kong and Tao Yang with 1386 for \$110. There was a total of \$1100 paid out in doubles and 19 paid spots with low to cash of 1318.

In the semis we saw Joshua Navarro lead the field with a

+115 to sit out and bowl for the title this week. Coming in second was Jerry Chang with a +100 to sit out the first round. It took a +45 for the men and +7 for the women.

Navarro, the top seed in semi-finals had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. He drew a common 186., and strangely we had no bowlers who shot that score. We will have \$3,500 next week at Oak Tree Lanes, two reserve pots and continue to build on the third back-up pot, which is \$1,875.

This week we had five new bowlers join us. Let us welcome these new bowlers to the club, Mike Berecochea, David Thordsen, Ray Saucedo, Sharlene-Michele Sotto, and Ed Dioniso.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Catherine Cheung, Ada Wong-Hum, John Armenia, Mark Fisser, Roger Amparo, Manny Loria, and Andrew Navarro. They received checks of \$100 each. In the second round, the losers were Marife Catalasan, Leonard Garcia, Michael Kong, and Marvin Galsim Sr, they received checks of \$110 each. This would get us down to the final four bowlers. At this point, our horses would be paying anywhere from a low of \$26 (Jerry Chang) to a high of \$202 (Pablo Castro) depending on who would win. In this round we saw Mark Andrews (12th seed) bowling Jerry Chang (2nd seed). In this match, we would see Mark continue his hot bowling to finish with a 255 to 211 and advanc to the next round. In the other match we saw Pablo Castro (11th seed) bowling Leo "Horseman" Tartamella (10th seed). In this match,

Pablo would be the survivor of the match and finish with a 195 to 170 and advanced. Leo and Jerry finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$120 each.

Our semi-final match was all set now, and it would be bowled on Lanes 11 and 12 this week and pitted our 11th seed against our 13th seed. In the weekly "horses" we would see Mark paying \$113 and Pablo paying \$205 if they would win their match. In a match that was close through the first 6 frames both bowlers would match each other.

It was Pablo who would falter in the 7th thru 9th frames with opens, and that would be enough for Mark to jump into the lead. He would finish with a 183/211 to 134/180 to send him onto the title match this week, while Pablo finished in 3rd place and took home \$200.

For those lucky "investors" that had Mark as a horse, he paid \$113. Pablo is one of our valued Super Seniors. A Regular in the ABTA He bowled very well and could have been the winner.

The title game was set and bowled on Lanes 13 and 14. We would see two of our regular bowlers bowling each other. Both were crowd favorites, Joshua Navarro vs Mark Andrews. Joshua had Mark lead off the match. This was another close match through 4 frames, but an open by Mark in the 5th frame would allow Joshua to pull ahead by 20 pins. That would prove to be enough as he would not look back. Opens in the 8th and 9th frames by Mark did not help. Joshua would take home his 1st ABTA title, with scores of 163/203 to 148/176. \$1,000 for 1st place, \$1,700 for Cash

How Far Can A Kangaroo Jump?

by Frank Weiler MURRIETA — I haven't checked the Guinness Book of Records lately, but my friend JIM CARTER (Don's son) once told me that he saw an oversized kangaroo jump a good sixty feet. That's the length of a bowling lane! Was Jim kidding me?

Anyway, last night I was watching JAMES HAWKINS on the lanes next to me. He was lofting his bowling ball about forty feet down the lane. WOW! I began to wonder if James could loft a ball further than a kangaroo could jump? It is rumored that when the lanes are dry he likes to loft, and has lofted a bowling ball sixty feet for a strike. That kind of airtime takes the oil pattern out of play.

As usual, the lanes were dry last night - BONE DRY. As the frames passed Hawkins started lofting his ball while moving left on the approach.

Before game three was over, his feet were positioned left of the left channel, with his ball landing about the thirtieth board, forty feet down lane.

Hawkins still couldn't carry a strike. One of his problems seem to be ball trajectory. As a two handed bowler, he was lofting the ball upward when

Orange County USBC 2011 Annual Meeting Highlights

FOUNTAIN VALLEY-On July 17 at Fountain Bowl, the OC-US-BC Annual Meeting was called to order around 10 am. 35 members were present (out of 10,000+), which is considered a quorum by OC-USBC. The majority of those present were Directors of the Association. After the Pledge of Allegiance, the previous minutes were approved and a memorial service was held for the OC-USBC members lost during the previous season. Troy Sucatre gave his President's Report, and told the group that over 19,000 awards were handed out to OC-USBC members over the last year, including 225 awarded 11-in-a-row; 150 awarded 300's; 80 awarded 800 series. The Association has seen a drop in membership every year, which creates a problem in finances. He attributed the recent spate of losses to the current economy, people moving to the less-costly Inland Empire, and loss of big industry employers in the area. In 1978, OC had 80,000 bowlers and 35 centers; by 2011, OC has 10,000 members and 12 centers.

The Association Manager, Cheryl Huntington gave a brief report, echoing the issue of membership decline: current season, ending July 31, there was a drop of 647 bowlers and 14 leagues from OC-USBC's previous season. Note that Bowl.com is now listing Summer averages. Check the rules of any tournament you enter to see if they require Summer average -someone was disqualified from this year's CA Women's Tournament because of the wrong average submitted. The association's Average Book will be going to print this week.

When the Budget and Finance Committee report was presented by Gary Forman, the majority of the people in the room (directors) knew about the pending dues increase and appeared resigned to fate. Other members in the room raised questions about what the Association's biggest single expense was (payroll) and whether the \$2 increase would alienate the already USBC-disillusioned bowlers. The \$2 is planned as a major boost to the OC-USBC local awards program, where local bowlers get acknowledged for split conversions, triplicates and stepladders, as well as a hedge against draining the current \$180,000 association surplus, which has been chewed into in the past to "cover the bowlers" from a dues increase, and to make up for deficits for the last few years. The vote was taken, and the dues increase passed--with a few "nays" in the room.

Director Gary Forman discussed what USBC provides to the members. "If you get nothing else for your dues," Forman states, "they provide standardized rules, regulations and benefits." Forman gave an example of a recent "serial cheater" competing in and placing high in an OC-USBC tournament, who, after investigation, had his USBC sanction card pulled and is no longer able to bowl in any USBC tournament, anywhere.

Other highlights: Troy Kendrick was elected as a new Director, while nine were reelected for a new term; All nominees for 2012 National USBC Delegates were elected; Six nominees were elected to represent at 2012 CA-USBC Convention. Entrants from the 2011 OC-USBC tournaments: 71 in the Open, 90 in the Women's and 24 in the Youth. There are no plans for a Hall of Fame ceremony this year. The Lane Certification teams are going to the centers through the next 3 weekends to certify local houses. This year's BVL Tournament had 234 entries as well as a pay-for-parking snafu. The Association will be selling Bowl For The Cure notebooks w/pen for \$4.00 and pocket calendars are coming this fall. The Association is making its website more useful and informative, and setting up email notifications. Fountain Bowl was thanked for their hosting of the Annual Meeting and their hospitality.
