

Andy Marzich Passed Away At 74

NORWALK — I was surprised to read in the July issue of the Bowlers Journal, that Andy Marzich had passed away on May 18 of this year.

Andy was one of the first players to join the Professional Bowlers Assn. and the more local P.C.B.

During his career he won 6 P.B.A. titles, three ABC Tournament Eagles (winning teams) and the National Team Match Game Championship with the Falstaffs.

After retiring from the Tour with \$88,473 career earnings, he turned to teaching and managing centers.

I called a couple of his old buddy's that had not heard of Andy's passing. They had some good stories! (Wish I could share them.)

Andy was a member of the Southern California Bowling Writers Hall of Fame, and always attended their yearly dinners — He was proud to be a member and shared stories about "the good ole days".

I'm sorry that the Bowling News was not contacted at the time of his death.

Walter Ray Williams Jr. Earns Seventh ESPY Award

LOS ANGELES—PBA Hall of Famer Walter Ray Williams Jr., who earned a record seventh PBA Player of the Year honor in the 2009-10 season, matched that accomplishment by receiving a seventh ESPN "Best Bowler" ESPY award Wednesday.

The 2010 winners were announced during the 18th annual ESPYs, televised Wednesday on ESPN from the Nokia Theater in Los Angeles. ESPN announced ESPY winners in 38 sports categories which were determined through fan voting on espn.com.

Williams, who was unable to attend the ceremony because of prior commitments, topped 2010 U.S. Open winner Bill O'Neill of Southampton, Pa., and 2010 Tournament of Champions winner Kelly Kulick of Union, N.J., who were the other two nominees for the honor.

"The two things that make this award special are that it's chosen by the fans and that we are recognized by the sports world in general," Williams said. "I'm very appreciative of the fans' support over the years because we wouldn't be able to do what we do without it.

"I thought Kelly might win it because of the great year she had but all three of us were deserving and I'd just like to thank the fans for voting for me."

July 31st Glover Masters House Spot Roll-Off Tournament Kicks Off National Bowling Week

Bakersfield, CA--With just about two months until the 2010 Don Glover Masters main event which is scheduled the weekend of September 25-26, there are only three remaining Glover Masters House Spot Roll-Offs.

The first of these three is scheduled for Saturday, Jul. 31, at AMF Southwest Lanes in Bakersfield (3610 Wible Road, 93309). Check-in is from 1pm-2pm and the Roll-Off starts at 2pm. Cost to enter is \$30 cash. (The Roll-Off tournaments have not been available the last Saturday of each month because Bakersfield has been hosting the CUSBC Open Championship tournament.) The two other scheduled Roll-Offs are on across twelve lanes. For the \$30 entry fee, it really is a great deal if you are interested in competing in this scratch event. Optional sidepots are also available.

2010 marks the 4th annual Glover Masters event. Defending back-to-back champion/PBA Exempt Player Scott Norton will return to defend his title.

Results Of Pacific Coast Deaf Men's & Women's Tournaments At AMF Carter Lanes

FULLERTON — In the last June 3rd issue this writer did not have enough details and just wrote the winners of each events of the 69th Annual Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association and 63rd Annual Pacific Coast Deaf Bowling Association tournaments held jointly last May Memorial Day Weekend at AMF Carter Lanes. So recently the PCDBA secreatary-treasurer Ed Bazan mailed out the complete final results and prize lists and more can be told about the tournaments. While both men and women's results showed adequate information, there is one glaring error,

which showed the laxity of both secretaries for leaving out the city and/or state of the bowlers in it. This is important not only to any sports writer to mention where the bowler is from and also the USBC to be able to locate the bowler if any problem arises from the tournament.

Due to economic situation in the past three years, the entries of both tournaments were low. The men drew only 20 foursome teams (its lowest since 1962), 40 doubles, 80 singles and 51 in this prestigious Deaf Masters and 17 in its Deaf Senior Masters. The women, thanks to 5 teams entered by the tournament host, Angel West Bowlers improved to 12 foursomes, 22 doubles, 44 singles and 15 in the prestigious Deaf Queens and 9 in their Senior Queens.

UPS Wins Men's Team With 2473 Scratch & 2746 Handicap Powered by Rogue Summers' 573, Gary Nagel's 613, Bert Enos' 610 and Mike Schamow's 677, UPS scored games of 799-847-827 for the tournament high scratch 2473 plus team handicap of 273

OPS scored games of 799-847-827 for the tournament nigh scratch 2473 pits team handicap of 273 for 2746 total to take 1st place \$960 prize. Summers, Enos and Schamow are from Northern California while Nagelis from Blaine, MN. The team's 847 is also the tournament high team game. One of the host's 6 teams entry, Angel West #4 with aid of Francisco Navarro's (267) 682 scored 2680 total to take 2nd place for \$480. Darrell Stogryn, Gardena rolled the only other 700 in this event, 727 from 235-224-269 plus 15

handicap for 743 to place 6th. The last place in the singles money was 20th by Tim Estes, Tacoma with 625 plus 60/685.

Hawkins Beats Meagher Twice To Win \$1,000 PC Deaf Masters The prestigious 49th Annual Pacific Coast Deaf Masters now named Connie Marchione Masters and handicapped, drew 51 entries. Ken DeGroff, Sunland led the 4 games qualifying round with 981 from games of 244-289-237-211. Also qualified were former champions, (2005) Mike Schamow, Dublin 929 in 3rd place and (2009) Philip Smith Jr., Castro Valley 899 in 7th place. The eventual winner Phil Hawkins, Cypress and runner-up Brian Meagher, Rio Linda 861 in 18th and 861 in 11th respectively. Tied with 839 in the cut off 16th place, Jeff Stansell, South Gate beat Brett DeLoss, Riverside for the last match play position

Riverside for the last match play position. In the two games match plays DeGroff won first match and then was eliminated when he lost the next two. Smith Jr. lost his first two matches and was ousted. A giant killer William McDonald, Fresno beat Schamow in first round, then lost to Meagher in next round and beat in sessions Darrell Stogryn, Stansell and Ed Abakumoff before losing to Hawkins in 6th round.

JUNIOR TEAM USA READY FOR WORLD YOUTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

ARLINGTON-When eight Junior Team USA members head to Helsinki, Finland, this week for the 2010 World Tenpin Bowling Association World Youth Championships, they will be focused not only on winning gold medals but enjoying the opportunity of a lifetime.

The World Youth Championships will take place at Tali Bowl in Helsinki from July 24-Aug. 1 and will feature bowlers from an estimated 48 countries. The biennial tournament is the pinnacle event in international youth bowling. "Being able to represent my country in such a major tournament is a huge honor," said Junior Team

USA's Brittini Hamilton, who won the United States Bowling Congress Junior Gold Championships on Friday. "I still can't believe that I get to go to Europe to bowl for the USA. I don't think it will really set in until I am actually on the plane on my way there.

"I can't wait for the tournament to get here, and I hope that we will be bringing back many gold medals when it is all over.

Joining Hamilton, of Webster, N.Y., on the girls side is Christine Bator of Warren, Mich., Jenn Bois-selle of Brandon, Fla., and Kristie Petravich of West Palm Beach, Fla. Competing for the boys will be Jake Peters of Decatur, Ill., Andrew Koff of Miami, Craig Hanson of Orlando, Fla., and Devin Bidwell of Simi Valley, Calif.

"I am most interested in being able to experience a different style of opponent and culture," said Koff, who finished fifth at Junior Gold on Friday. "I look forward to being able to observe first-hand the different approach to bowling adopted by youth bowlers from other countries. In particular, I look forward to studying the techniques used by the Malaysian bowlers

"I want to understand how other countries approach the sport that I love. I also want to make new friends from whom I can continue to learn in the future."

At the most recent World Youth Championships in 2008 in Orlando, Fla., the United States came away with a bronze in boys team and Dean Richards won the silver in Masters match play. The girls did not medal.

In the coveted four-player team event, Junior Team USA last won the gold medal for the girls in 2004 in Tamuning, Guam, while the boys last earned the gold in 2000 in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic

Medals will be awarded in five events at the World Youth Championships - singles, doubles, team, all-events and Masters match-play. Competition begins with girls singles on July 24 and concludes with Masters match-play on Aug. 1.

The Finnish Bowling Federation is planning live video streaming throughout the event and the video will be available on BOWL.com with commentary in English.
