**BOWL EXPO - The Trade Show** by Frank Weiler

LAS VEGAS — Today I would like to write about some of the interesting people and innovative products I saw at this summers trade show.

For starters, I had the pleasure of meeting TONY MAR-TIN, Vice President of Sales for Lord Field, a company that represents Lane Masters bowling balls. Tony Martin knows bowling balls and the dynamics of ball motion. He gave me a guided tour of Lane Masters balls and weight blocks. Without leaving the booth, Tony walked me by a series of half balls, explaining the properties and characteristics of each weight block and what they will cause a bowling ball to do.

Tony discussed the benefits of each weight block with the ease of a preacher describing the gifts of the spirit or espousing the blessings of prayer. My favorite weight block was the elongated rectangular "evolution" core in the Advantage ball. The core translates to a 2.496 RG and differential of 0.053. I wish Tony were here with me to explain the advantage of the ADVANTAGE bowling ball.

Next, it was a thrill meeting Mr. JEFFREY LIND, President of LINDS Bowling Products. How often does one meet a CEO? For me it was a first. Best of all, Mr. Lind is a great guy. Success has not gone to his head. If I hadn't noticed his name tag, I wouldn't have known that he was Mr."Numero Uno" at continued on page 4

Jim Hornung's YORBA LINDA BOWL is Closing YORBA LINDA -– The end is here. The end of an era. DOOMSDAY. It is THE END OF BOWLING, as we know it, in Yorba Linda. It is a sign of the times. Another bowling center is closing and the bowling industry continues to shrink.

When I was driving to Yorba Linda, to meet Jim Hornung, a sad but appropriate song came to mind. I believe it was Simon and Garfunkel who sang "they knocked down another building to make room for a parking lot." Well, those lyrics ring true today in Yorba Linda. Yorba Linda Bowl is being torn down to make room for a grocery store.

Yorba Linda Bowl opened in May 1979 when JACK MANN decided to expand his

Seventeen years horizon's. later, on April Fools' Day 1996, Jim Hornung took the reins and never looked back. Since taking over Jim has made Yorba Linda Bowl "A CENTER TO REMEMBER." His personal touch not only increased business but made his center a place where bowlers wanted to bowl and staff wanted to work.

# **Pete Weber Wins Third Best Bowler ESPY Award**

LOS ANGELES - PBA finishes this season. Hall of Famer and 2013 PBA Tournament of Champions winner Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., received his third Best Bowler ESPY Award Wednesday evening during the 2013 ESPY Awards ceremony at the Nokia Theater in downtown Los Angeles.

Weber was among winners in a variety of sports categories and special moments that were determined by fan voting on espn.com with the winners announced during the ESPY Awards telecast on ESPN. Weber, who previously won the Best Bowler ESPY in 2002 and 2004, won his second Tournament of Champions title at age 50 in April to complete the PBA's Triple Crown a second time, a feat no other bowler has accomplished. In winning his 37th career PBA Tour title, he tied Norm Duke for third on the all-time career list and tied Earl Anthony for most major titles with 10. He also has six other top-10 Tour

Competing as a rookie on the PBA50 Tour this season, Weber also notched his first win by capturing the USBC Senior Masters title—a PBA50 Tour major.

Weber's historic win in the Tournament of Champions marked the second consecutive season that his performance in a major made for memorable sports television. In February 2012, he won the U.S. Open and gained widespread media attention for coining the phrase - "Who do you think you are? I am," after defeating Mike Fagan 215-214 in the continued on page 4

### DEAF TEAM USA ON WAY TO DEAFLYMPICS IN SOFIA, BULGARIA

SOFIA - An email was received from Ed Abakumoff that he and the Deaf Team USA are on their way to the 22nd Deaflympics at Sofia, Bulgaria, which is scheduled on July 23 to August 4. Abakumoff, Riverside, CA who is responsible for the Deaf Bowling Team USA sent in the bowling team roster and the Sofia Deaflympics bowling schedule.

The men team members are Robert Ellison CA, Joshua Dalton TX, Johnny McLean IN and Jerry Claborn TX.

The women team members are Jerilyn Keller TX, Cheyenne Bryant (Rogers) LA, Sharon Rutherford PA, and Jennifer Kutcka IN.

The 22nd Deaflympics was originally scheduled to be in Athens, Greece but the Greece government could not guarantee anything. That caused the International Committee of Sport of the Deaf (ICSD), which is responsible for the Deaflympics to drop Greece and search for a replacement. Bulgaria Deaf Sports Organization, which held the Deaflympics at Sofia in 1993 came with its government guarantee to have the Deaflympics in Sofia with only one year of preparation.

The 1993 Deaflympics was supposed to have the sport of bowling for the first time but the ICSD officials cancelled bowling out after one look at the facilities. The new ICSD officers finds nothing wrong with the bowling venue.

The Passing of Burt Bach BELLFLOWER — Burt Started Bach's Bowling Supply in

1959. At one time he had 3 shops but finally closed one and sold one and left the one in Bellflower as his only store.

He employed between 4 to 7 people over the years, He invented the Bach Thumb Hole which is Oval in shape but also has 5 different degrees of Oval shapes. He also invented his own inserts called Mastergrips (with the patented Lockridge). The inserts are made out of real rubber.

There are also many other things this Great Man invented. He has been a great promoter of the sport and has helped more bowlers with their game then can be counted. I went to work for Burt in 1973. He moved the Business to its current location in 1975. At that time he started a Trophy Business which has also been very successful.

I bought the Business in 1983 and it continues to this day. This is a Big Loss to any one who knew Burt. For the ones who didn't, I wish you would have. He was an inspirtation to all. My Heart goes out to his wife Barbara at this very difficult time. Burt was like a Dad to me and I will Love and Miss him for the rest of my life ...

championship match for a record fifth U.S. Open title.

Jason Belmonte of Australia and Scott Norton of Mission Viejo, Calif., were also nominated for the 2013 Best Bowler

ESPY. Belmonte, the Australian two-handed specialist and 2011 ESPY Award winner, won the Lucas Oil PBA Bear Open and the USBC Masters for his first major title this season, bringing his career titles total to seven. He also has five other top-five finishes including runner-up finishes in the PBA World Championship, Tournament of Champions and Chameleon Open.

Norton, who was nominated for the first time, has two titles this season which came in the Chameleon Open and Earl Anthony Players Championship. He also has four other top-10 finishes including a second in the Mark Roth Classic and fifth in the Viper Open.

Both Weber and Norton were also members of the New York City Mylan WTT KingPins PBA League championship team owned by tennis legend Billie Jean King.

WHITTIER — We returned to Friendly Hills Lanes where we saw a tough but fair to all shot throughout the day. 169 entrants joined us for a fun day of bowling. The cut scores were +39 for the men and +8 for the women. The Super seniors added to the board (two men and one Woman) Leo Tartamella (who turned a big 82 on this day) +33, Sun Sundara +31, and for the women it was Estella Ventanilla +4. Super seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women you just need to be a young 55. That would give us 42 bowlers making it to the semi-finals.

The High qualifiers for the tournament, Chris Marquez for the men with a + 140 and for the women it was Gina Velarde with a + 45. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and this time it was worth \$5,000. Chris would draw the score of 675. No Bowler Matched that score. The pot will carry over to Keystone where it is maxed out at \$5,000 and a backup is started.

This week in the 3-6-9 we saw Keith Nahan miss in the final round on his second shot. so he got \$50 and next week we will go for \$2,300 at Keystone Lanes.

In our optional doubles, finishing in first were Louis Evans and Darrow Tiongco with a 1361 for \$110, second place were the "Bowling Licaucos" John and Thomas, with a 1335 for \$90. There was a total of \$930 paid out in doubles and 18 paid spots with low to cash of 1274.

The semi-finals were on, finishing in first was John Licauco with a +153, in second was Tres Catalasan at a +125. The cut scores for the top 16 were a +30 for the men and for the women it was +9. John had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$4,050. He drew a 265! After a review of all scores bowled, no one shot that score so the pot carries over and it should max out at \$5,000 Saturday for sure.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Stan Por, Rithy Ath, Chris Kelly, Ada Wong, Sun Sundara, Ben Bagaoisan, and Kenny Kwan. Each will get \$100. In the second round, the four losers were Freddie Catamisan, Alan Libao, Yen Lach, and Gina Velarde, with each of them getting checks of \$105.

We were down to the final five bowlers. The horses are paying a low of \$34, Tres Catalasan to a high of \$131 for Tomas Chavez. In this round Henry Hoang and Manny Natividad were eliminated and received Checks of \$110. They bowled very well this week. Our semi-final match was

set. The winner of the match would be the Horse Winner also. We would see Tres paying \$34 and Tomas paying \$131 if they win the match. Tomas was getting tired as he opened in his first two frames while Tres was able to mark. Tomas said "don't give up yet" as he was able to come up with a double in the 3rd and fourth frames to give him a lead of 8 pins. Tres then got a four bagger in the fourth thru seventh frames to break this match open. He cruised from that point to a 214/246 to 179/220 to advance to the title match. Tomas Chavez would finish in 3rd place for \$200 and Tres was your horse winner for \$34.

The title game was set and it would be our top qualifier John Licauco vs Tres Catalasan. The match saw Tres start with a spare. John opened in the first and spared in the second frame. Tres was able to come up with a spare and strike and trailed by two pins. The match was tight and going into the eighth frame John held a nine pin lead.

Tres pulled back within one pin, two spares in the 8th and 9th frames! John finishing strong came up in the ninth frame and got a strike, and would follow that with three more in the 10th frame to lock Tres out and take his second ABTA championship with a 201/244 to Tres 186/218. He

# PBA League to Kick Off New Season in Return to Calendar Year Schedule Season includes expanded PBA League, Summer Swing, World Series VI and WBT International events



SEATTLE — The Professional Bowlers Association will return to a traditional calendar year schedule in 2014, beginning with a new season of PBA League competition in Allen Park, Mich., and concluding with the PBA World Series of Bowling VI in Las Vegas and then the Japan Cup presented by Round 1.

The new season - the PBA's 55th consecutive year - will include an expanded PBA League season involving the 40 players on the eight teams in the League, three major championships, a renewal of the PBA Summer Swing and 46 hours of nationally–televised PBA Tour competition, not including a preliminary schedule of nine PBA International Tour events conducted in cooperation with the World Tenpin Bowling Association's World Bowling Tour.

The PBA Tour's current 2012-13 season is concluding with the PBA World Series of Bowling V, hosted by South Point Casino, Hotel and Bowling Center, Oct. 25-Nov. 3, where five ESPN shows will emanate and air this December. The current season will then conclude with four international events.

In 2014, ESPN is slated to carry the finals of three PBA majors (PBA World Championship in Las Vegas, USBC Masters in New Jersey and PBA Tournament of Champions in Indianapolis), plus all WSOB VI events and the entire PBA League schedule. ESPN will air 36 hours of PBA action – up from 25.5 hours in 2013 – as part of the new five-year agreement announced earlier this summer. The CBS Sports Network will once again carry the PBA Summer Swing at a site to be announced and its five shows and 10 hours of action.

Each of the currently scheduled nine WBT/PBA international events in Europe, Asia and the Middle East will award a PBA International Tour title if a PBA member wins, and each will award points toward the annual World Bowling Tour Finals, which has been held as part of the PBA World Series of Bowling since the WBT's inception.

The PBA World Series of Bowling VI will return to South Point Bowling Center next Oct.-Nov. in Las Vegas for the fifth straight year of worldwide professional bowling's greatest festival.

The season will conclude with the 2014 Japan Cup presented by Round 1, featuring the best bowlers from Japan, along with the top 16 PBA players in points determined from the time period starting with the 2013 WSOB V and concluding following the 2014 PBA Summer Swing.

Additional details regarding pba.com's 2014 Xtra Frame live online streaming coverage, full national TV schedule, entry information, formats including revamped PBA League structure, tickets and pro-am entry information will be available soon and on pba. com.
