One thing led to another, and through the magic of Facebook and the Internet, Susan found 95 of the 96 bowlers from the 1985-1996 All-California Collegiate Japan Tour teams and invited them to a "25th Reunion" for the entire group at the 2010 International Bowl Expo in Las Vegas.

Team USA Experience Leagues to Provide A New Challenge For Sport Bowlers

ARLINGTON—The United States Bowling Congress will bring an international touch to the sport this fall with the launch of Team USA Experience leagues, a new Sport Bowling option that will allow bowlers to test their skills on the lanes.

Team USA Experience leagues were developed to give bowlers the opportunity to compete on the same challenging lane conditions that members of Team USA face when competing against the terns and that has helped us achieve the success we have had at the international level."

Team USA Experience leagues will be Sport Bowling leagues. Advancements in technology and the prevalence of forgiving lane conditions tend to conceal weaknesses in the games of even the top bowlers, which led to the development of Sport Bowling.

Sport Bowling provides lane oil patterns that are more challenging than typical league conditions. Bowlers who compete in Sport leagues are eligible for exclusive awards, special discounts on equipment through USBC partnerships with pro shops, a monthly e-newsletter that highlights honor scores and access to a members-only page on BOWL.com.The new Team USA Experience leagues will offer a great variety of challenges since there are 12 patterns available - four short, four medium and four long continued on page 8

2010 PBA World Series of Bowling Q & A

LAS VEGAS—The 2010 PBA World Series of Bowling provides a unique opportunity for PBA members to compete at the highest level. With a new format this season, PBA is providing answers to some commonly asked player entry questions. Check back with pba.com for additional developments and information about WSOB in the days and weeks to come.

Q. What are the dates for WSOB events and where are they conducted?

A. The 2010 WSOB will be conducted Oct. 24-Nov. 6 at the

As a special WSOB feature, the top six U.S. and top six international finishers after the 60 games will square off in a U.S. vs. The World made-for-TV match.

Q. What is the WSOB and World Championship prize fund?

A. In all, the WSOB will award six PBA Tour titles and pay \$635,000 in prize money. The top 16 players in each animal pattern event will earn prize money with the winner of each earning \$15,000, a PBA Tour title and a berth in the Tournament of Champions. The PBA World Championship will pay one in four based on 216 entries with a \$2,000 low-to-cash. (Prize ratio is 1 in 3 up to 160 entries; 53 places will be paid for a field of 161-215). First prize in the World Championship will be \$50,000.

top players in the world at international competitions.

These patterns are used by the World Tenpin Bowling Association in major contests such as the World Championships, Pan American Games and QubicaAMF World Cup.

"Taking on these types of conditions can really help a bowler learn more about their game," said Team USA head coach Rod Ross. "Our teams have put in a lot of work to learn the nuances of the patSouth Point Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

Q. What is the breakdown of events during the run of WSOB and how do they relate to the PBA World Championship?

A. Beginning Monday, Oct. 25, and over a span of five consecutive days, WSOB players will bowl 12 games on the Cheetah, Viper, Chameleon, Scorpion and Shark patterns, respectively, with the top 16 from each daily event advancing to match play during the second week. The finals for each animal pattern event will be taped by ESPN over two days (Nov. 5-6) for airing beginning Nov. 28.

The combined pinfall for 60 games across all animal pattern events will determine the standings for the PBA World Championship. The PBA World Championship will also incorporate a unique television format where the top eight qualifiers will advance to a live three-day television finale to be aired Jan. 14, 15

Q. Do I have to be a PBA member to enter WSOB?

A. You must be a "Full PBA Member" and "Standard Members" will have to upgrade to full status. However, the WSOB is also open to all Japan Professional Bowlers Association (JPBA), Korean Professional Bowlers Association (KPBA) and international World Tenpin Bowling Association (WTBA), non-U.S. members. If a prospective entrant does not fall into any of the above categories, he/she must become a PBA member at any time prior to entering the WSOB. *continued on page 4*

Q. How do I become a PBA member?

Q. What is the entry fee?

A. For a \$750 entry fee, bowlers are entered in six events including the PBA World Championship. In previous seasons, the entry fee alone for the PBA World Championship had been \$500 for PBA members and \$600 for non-members.

Q. I'm a member and I'm ready to enter. What is the entry process?

A. Members can enter on-line by clicking on the members' login link on pba.com and then Tournaments/Enter New Tournament and select World Series as the region. An entry form may be downloaded by logging onto the membership site where the entry form is the very first link on the opening page. Entrants also can request an entry form by calling (206) 332-9688. Entries may be scanned and e-mailed back to PBA, faxed to (206) 332-9722, or mailed to the PBA office.

Q. Is there a qualifying process to enter WSOB events?

A. No. There are no TQRs, just one even playing field with wall-to-wall competitive bowling at the highest level. If you aren't a member but believe in your game, the WSOB is your reason to join the PBA.

Q. What is the philosophy behind this year's WSOB concept and schedule?

A. The WSOB was designed to be the ultimate destination event for all PBA members. Multiple

The final rounds of the PBA World Championship will be televised live by ESPN Jan. 14, 15 & 16 from the South Point Bowling Center marking the first time that a Tour event has been televised over multiple days similar to PGA and USTA events.

Bowling 'Em Over by Alan Ross Kelly Kulick knocks down pins and gender barriers

As a youngster, Kelly Kulick dreamed of being a championship bowler. Now she is one.

Kulick, 33, who wrote a prediction in her fifth-grade class yearbook that she would be a professional bowler, in January became the first woman to win a Professional Bowlers Association (PBA) Tour title when she defeated a field of 62 men in the 45th Tournament of Champions in Las Vegas, Nev. The history-making victory catapulted her into the national spotlight, and marked a coup for women's sports and for bowling in general.

"It wasn't just being the lone female in the event; I was competing against all champions," says Kulick, of Union, N.J. (pop. 54,252). "I'm hoping my success will bring more women into the sport."

Kulick first faced a set of bowling pins at age 6, when her paternal grandfather took her to the Four Seasons, a bowling alley in Union. "Don't remember much from that day," says Kulick, whose father, Phil Jr., once worked as a bowling alley pinsetter, "but I do recall my first bowling ball was a blue-and-white Kmart Special."

Her passion for the sport intensified when she began bowling in a junior league at age 10. Her coach encouraged her, and not long after, Kulick found herself in the expert hands of Dick Ritger, who is renowned in bowling circles for his instructional camps. The former PBA bowler-turned-coach immediately recognized the young girl's natural talent.

"At the camps, most kids were 16, 17, 18," says Ritger, 71, of River Falls, Wis. (pop. 14,352). "As a 12-year-old with all the skills, Kelly matched them."

Kulick earned a bowling scholarship to Morehead (Ky.) State University, where she became a four-time All-American, graduating in 2000. The following year, she turned pro and was named Rookie of the Year on the now-defunct women's tour. Then, at a 2003 awards luncheon, PBA men's tour veteran and Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III offered advice that radically changed her bowling strategy for the better.

Bowl the pins, Bohn counseled, not your opponent. "Hearing that just clicked for me," Kulick says. "Mentally it gave me a different outlook."

Two months later, Kulick registered her first-ever professional victory in the Women's U.S. Open, as she continually reminded herself to "bowl the pins!"

Following a disappointing season two years ago, Kulick once again elevated her game by stepping up workouts at the gym and embracing the practice of yoga. The extra effort paved the way for her barrier-breaking win at this year's Tournament of Champions.

"Focusing on breathing and meditation have helped me most," says Kulick, who bowled a 226 average in the tournament.

While Kulick has won five major tournament titles since 2003 and earned \$141,000 on the PBA circuit, it's her passion for the game—not the motivation of money—that makes her a fierce and focused competitor against the best male and female bowlers in the world.

So what are the bowling champ's plans when she retires from the sport? "I'm really looking at culinary school," says Kulick, who is captivated by the shows on the Food Network. "Now I'm into Bobby Flay and the Throwdown."

patterns. Each pattern is named after an Olympic host city.

The short patterns start with Sydney at 33 feet, followed by Stockholm (34 feet), Beijing (35 feet) and Los Angeles (36 feet). Atlanta, at 38 feet, is the first of the medium patterns along with Seoul (39 feet), Athens (40 feet) and Montreal (41 feet). The long patterns include Tokyo (43 feet), London (44 feet), Mexico City (45 feet), and Paris (47 feet).

For Sport Bowlers who wish to compete in PBA Experience leagues, in which bowlers take on the same lane conditions used in PBA competitions, those leagues also will be available this fall.

USBC Coaching to Implement **Re-Certification**, Continuing **Education Programs For Coaches**

ARLINGTON—USBC Coaching will launch a new program early next year to re-certify coaches and also will begin a requisite continuing education program to keep bowling coaches up to date on the latest technology and coaching techniques.

The program will require USBC Gold, Silver and Bronze coaches who were certified prior to Jan. 1, 2006 to take an online certification test by Aug. 1, 2011 to maintain their status. Level I coaches do not have to be re-certified.

Coaches also will be required to continue their education through a variety of ways such as seminars, online courses and other programs to maintain their certification.

With more than 42,000 USBC certified coaches, it is important for USBC to identify the coaches who are active in teaching the sport and also continuing to learn about lane play, ball motion, the physical game and other dynamics.

"We have many great coaches out there and through this process we can make certain that bowlers will receive the best coaching available and proprietors will know what coaches they can call on to teach in their centers," said USBC Director of Coaching David Garber.

There is no cost for the USBC Gold, Silver and Bronze coaches to take the certification tests, which are expected to be available online by early 2011. The tests will consist of multiple choice, true/false, essay and some video aspects.

Coaches will have until Aug. 1, 2011, to take the test. After they have passed the test, coaches will be required to take continuing education classes during the next three years. The con-tinuing education requirements, endorsed by the United States Olympic Committee, will be modeled after such organizations as the National Athletic Trainers' Association. Through an assortment of classes, seminars, etc., coaches will earn credits toward their continuing education requirements. At the end of the threeyear period, coaches will be randomly audited to ensure they are staying current with the latest trends and coaching methods.
