



Goodbye Canoga Park Bowl Welcome Winnetka Bowl

WINNETKA — The oldest bowling center in the San Fernando Valley, Canoga Park Bowl, while celebrating its 56th anniversary, is completing a name change and a \$1.5 million remodeling.

Now known as Winnetka Bowl, the 32-lane center at Winnetka and Vanowen St. first opened in 1958 under the proprietorship of Nat Rosenfeld.

Nat is long gone, and the completely updated complex which embraces a Best Western Hotel, Lane 33, a sports arcade, billiard and entertainment area; the Winnetka Convention Center and the appetizing Village Café, is emblazoned with new signage in the heart of Winnetka.

"We were never really in Canoga Park, so the change was a long time coming," says managing partner owner Rickey Gelb, chief executive of the Gelb Group, a family of companies based in Encino.

Winnetka Bowl is just one of their properties, which also includes office buildings and even a Taco Bell franchise in Granada Hills.

Gelb, honored many years ago with the Fernando Award, given to the area's historic contributors, has created a major recreational attraction in the Valley. Coincidentally, one of his longtime associates, Gloria Pollack, is also a Fernando winner.

There was a time when bowling alleys (that's what they used to be called) were spread across the Valley, totaling maybe 25 centers such as Encino Bowl, Sherman Square, Van Nuys Bowl, Tarzana Bowl, Starlite Lanes, Panorama Bowl and Bowl-A-Rama. They are history, but Winnetka Bowl has turned a new page, says Gelb. "We have created a total recreational complex to hopefully fulfill the needs of thousands of our neighbors," he declared.

Vidad Wins 2014 Bowling's Senior Women's U.S. Open

ROCKFORD, Ill. - Paula Vidad of Sun City, California, successfully defended her title at Bowling's Senior Women's U.S. Open with a 234-210 win Thursday against United States Bowling Congress Hall of Famer Tish Johnson of Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Vidad, a 54-year-old righthander, started the title tilt at The Cherry Bowl with three consecutive strikes and struck on the first shot of her final frame to lock up the green jacket and \$3,000 top prize.

"Earlier in the day, and even during practice, I was leaving a lot of weak 10s, so I knew I had to do something," said Vidad, who also won the USBC Senior Queens in 2011. "I decided to increase my speed, which helped get the ball down the lane a little better and conserve some energy. It was important to come out strong and put some pressure on her."

Johnson was able to strike early but couldn't carry late in

Pete Weber Wins PBA50 Pro Bowl West Fort Wayne Classic For Third Career PBA50 Tour Title *Weber defeats Randy Pedersen 259-207 for first win of the season*

FORT WAYNE, Ind. – After five top-eight finishes, Professional Bowlers Association Hall of Famer Pete Weber finally broke through to win his first PBA50 Tour title of the season Wednesday by winning the PBA50 Pro Bowl West Fort Wayne Classic presented by Ebonite.

Weber defeated fellow Hall of Famer and PBA Tour telecast color analyst Randy Pedersen of Orlando, Fla., 259-207, in the title match at Pro Bowl West, to also notch his third career PBA50 Tour title. ing in seven of the first eight frames.

"We were all leaving a lot of corner pins so I thought it was a good time to change to a different ball for the final match," said the 51-year-old Weber. "The lane conditions were transitioning pretty quickly and the ball wasn't driving into the pocket like it should so I went to a ball that and 2013 PBA50 Rookie of the Year. "I still look at guys like Walter Ray (Williams Jr.) and the other great bowlers and that's what keeps me going. I still love to bowl and love to travel."

In the all-Hall of Fame semifinals, Weber beat Wayne Webb of Columbus, Ohio, 223-210, and Pedersen defeated Johnny Petraglia of Jack-

Weber took control by the mid-point of the match strikhooked more and revved sooner and it was the right choice."

With his win, Weber, who recently won his fourth ESPY, moved into second in the PBA50 Player of the Year race behind Hall of Famer Norm Duke with three tournaments remaining in the season. Duke did not compete in the Fort Wayne event.

"If you want to be the best, you have to keep at it," said the 37-time PBA Tour winner son, N.J., 207-192, to advance to the championship match.

Bill McCorkle of Westerville, Ohio, who won the PBA50 Dick Weber Super Senior Classic presented by Storm on July 20 at Pro Bowl West, made a run at winning back-to-back tournaments but lost to Pedersen in the Round of 8.

Petraglia, trying for his ninth career PBA50 Tour title, finished second to McCorkle in the Super Senior Classic, losing in the championship match 244-173.

Weber's win marked seven continued on page 7

NATIONAL DEAF BOWLING NEWS by Connie Marchione

FRANK GALLO HITS 300 IN ONE OF PBA50 TOUR QUALIFYING ROUNDS

FORT WAYNE, IN — In one of Professional Bowlers Association July 21st press releases of PBA50 Pro Bowl West Fort Wayne Classic, the name of Frank Gallo, Jr., Jacksonville, Fla. caught my eyes. This was a rare surprise mention of Gallo who is deaf and a member of PBA for four decades. To find Gallo's name written in this release meant that this deaf bowler had done something great among other PBA bowlers.

Indeed what Gallo did in the release about Wayne Webb averaging 250 for 8 games 2003 as first round top qualifier with Pete Weber second with 1969. In rounding out the top eight bowlers, Gallo was mentioned as in sixth place with 1913 (239 average for 8 games).

Unfortunately in the next day's round of 8 games in which Weber took over as high qualifier with 3982 for 16 games as Webb fell to 4th with 3794 and Gallo's name was not mentioned in the July 22nd press release. Anyway Gallo struggled and failed to make the match play cut of 32 bowlers. Gallo's name was found in the list of bowlers as in tie for 54th place with 3444 total for 16 games. The cut off score for top 32 bowlers Match plays was 3578.

Another surprise was while scanning to the bottom of the list of 99 entrants, below there Gallo's name was with two other seniors bowling 300 each in this 2nd round. So Gallo's 300 was best of the 8 games in his poor 1531 set bowled in 2nd round.

Again although he failed to make the match play above, Gallo's 1913 eight games set is his personal best for this 2014 year. His other noteworthy 8 gamers this year were 1844 on May 29 for 6th place in PBA50 Miller Lite Western Open at Starlite Lanes in Flagstaff, 1842 on June 28 for 6th place in PBA50 Winston Salem Open at Northside Bowling Center in Winston Salem, NC and 1828 on June 16 for 19th place in PBA50 Northern California Classic at Harvest Park Bowl. In the last one, Gallo made the best 3 of 5 match plays but he lost all 3 games to Kenny Parks, 234-259, 223-268 and 218-226.

There are still more PBA50 tournaments on schedule and we wish Gallo lots of luck.

She was selected to the Dexter High School All-America Team in 2010-11 and in 2011 and 2012 was a Teen Masters finalist. Locally, she was named the Greater Buffalo USBC Female Bowler of the Year in 2010, 2011 and 2012. She has been involved with the Greater Buffalo USBC Youth Leaders since 2007, serving as president from 2010-2013. She received USBC's Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow Award in 2013.

Among her other bowling accomplishments include three New York State Pepsi Tournament titles (2011, 2012 and 2013), 2011 North Pointe Singles Championship title, and a top finish of sixth in the Junior Gold Championships which came in 2013.

"I'm very honored to win a scholarship where you know there are so many other great candidates who are being considered for it," Hannon said. "Bowling has been very important to me not only because of the lessons I've learned in the sport but what it has also taught me in life including the importance of qualities such as teamwork, persistence and determination."

Hannon, who is studying nursing at Fairleigh Dickinson, holds a 3.76 GPA and is a member of the honor roll.

She will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. To be eligible candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintaining at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent.

Welu, who passed away in 1974, was best known for his expert analysis alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the "Pro Bowlers Tour" series. Welu was a two-time PBA Tour champion and a member of the PBA Hall of Fame's inaugural induction class in 1975.







JOHN ZAMMETTI - LAUGHLIN'S LEGEND

LAUGHLIN, NV - Literature is filled with stories about legendary characters. Pecos Bill, Paul Bunyan, John Henry, Robin Hood and Zorro are known the world over. Every generation is introduced to the legends surrounding these super sized heroes. Honor, loyalty, integrity and bravery guide their every act.

Like literature, bowling has it's legendary characters. We have national heroes and we have "street legends." Some of our national greats include Glenn Allison, Earl Anthony, Don Carter, Hank Marino, Floretta McCutchin, Marion Ladewig, Joe Norris, Andy Varipapa and Dick Weber.

Traveling the byways of America you will find many small centers, many with as few as four lanes. Many of these "Alleys" have their legendary figures and legendary feats. I've heard of Guy Clear's 309 game and Mike Rick's six consecutive perfect games!!! I've heard of William Allen, Allie Brandt, Joe Glenski, Fran Keyes and the tales that surround them. After my latest sweeper trip to Laughlin I will have to add another folk hero to my pantheon of "street legends." Move over guys and make room for JOHN ZAMMETTI.

If you ever go to Laughlin, Nevada take time to visit Riverside Lanes inside the casino of the same name. There you can read all about the legendary bowling career of John Zammetti. Better known as "ZAM" to his friends.

Zam doesn't have the looks of Brian Voss, the size of Wes Malott or the revolutions of Jason Belmonte, but how many





bowlers do? Besides. WHO CARES about looks and all the rest of that when it comes to bowling. I don't.

None of the above matter when someone has the heart of a lion and the guts of a pole cat. I repeat, none of "THAT" matters when someone has guts and heart.

GUTS and HEART, that describes Zam on the lanes. Not even Pete Weber is as tough a competitor as Mr. Zammetti. At least that's my opinion after watching him bowl. This guy is tough, mentally tough, TOUGH AS NAILS. But I digress.

Back to Riverside Lanes. If you look at the trophy cases there, dedicated to Zam, you will find glass shelves full of GOLD RINGS, rings representing 62 perfect games and fourteen 800s. There are shelves of plaques, watches and patches for 298s, 299s, eleven in a row and 700s. The CROWN JEWELS of bowling. IMPRESSIVE.

The display cases are impressive. I have never seen so many bowling rings in one place at the same time. Even more impressive is the fact that all this hardware belongs to one man - John Zammetti. So how did John accumulate this treasure chest of bowling booty?

It all started in the BIG APPLE, New York City, where John spent hours hanging out in bowling alleys. His fascination with bowling kept him off the streets and out of trouble. His friend MIKE LEMONJELLO talked him into giving bowling a try and before long Zam was hooked. You might say that Lemonjello was also hooked. He went on to PBA stardom.

From those early days in the city that never sleeps to the time of his arrival in Laughlin, Zam wanted a bowling career and was always looking for a way to get on the PBA Tour full time. He did have a few looks in the 1960's and 1970's but family obligations never allowed him to be a full time player.

Nevertheless, John's whole career has revolved around bowling. He has managed bowling centers and pro shops in Arizona, California and Oregon before arriving in Laughlin and becoming head mechanic and lane man. All of the time in and around bowling allowed Zam to hone his bowling skills. He developed professional level skills but was forced to compete in amateur tournaments. It was a recipe for success on the lanes. Zammetti won regularly throughout the western United States.

Some of John's successes included wins in the Long Island NY Invitational, Klamath Falls, OR All-Events, South Oregon Scratch Singles, Oregon State Scratch (Team, Doubles, and All-Events), Gold Rush Scratch singles in Yreka, CA, Ft. Mohave Arizona Singles and Arizona State Masters.

So what is Zam's secret? Years ago he told another writer that he had a good turning ball. A ball with movement that turns pins, making his pocket eight to ten inches wider than the pocket of most bowlers. I AGREE.

Years of observation on my part have made me conclude that Mr. Zammetti is right. The proper ball rotation is the key to scoring big and John has it.

Optional Team Side Pots & Brackets for each squad

A system of doubles play where the 2 bowlers on each team play alternate shots throughout the game. The only time one of the pair ever completes a frame on his/her own is when scoring a strike. Example: The first bowler rolls the first ball & leaves 2 pins, the second bowler will try to complete the spare.

Remember Joe Kirkwood, aka JOE PALOOKA, BOXER??

NORWALK — Joe Kirkwood Jr. (born 30 May 1920) is a former professional golfer on the PGA Tour, and motion picture actor. Kirkwood was born in Melbourne, Australia.

His father Joe Kirkwood Sr., who was a golf pro and who taught him to play golf, is acknowledged as having put Australian golf on the world map.

In 1948, he and his father both made the cut at the U.S. Open, the first father and son to do so and a record tied only in 2004. When Joe Kirkwood Jr. defeated Sam Snead to win the 1951 Blue Ribbon Open in Milwaukee, United States, they became the third father-son winner in the history of the PGA Tour which in 2005 still has only six such winners.

In 1945, Joe Kirkwood Jr. was invited by Monogram Pictures to test for the role of boxer Joe Palooka. He got the part and starred in eleven Joe Palooka films between 1946 and 1951 plus in the 1954 television series "The Joe Palooka Story." Later in the 1950s he was one of the reporters on the popular radio program Monitor on NBC Radio.

Joe Kirkwood has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame at 1620 Vine Street. Kirkwood is married to Joyce Kirkwood (1980-present.

Mr. Kirkwood invested in a Studio City bowling center in 1956 and named it Kirkwood Bowl. His special attire in the center was bib over-alls and red socks.

In the late 70's he purchased Porterville Lanes in Porterville, California. A short term run. 1979 was the year to move on to a new life with his love Joyce in Palm Springs where they still abide. "Joe, there are still a few of us who remember Joe Palooka, your red socks and your love of animals". Thanks for the memories. Carol Mancini

over Lucy Sandelin of Tampa, Florida, denying the USBC Hall of Famer a third consecutive shot at the Senior Women's U.S. Open crown.

In the opening match, Sandelin started with six consecutive strikes and cruised to a 254-167 victory over fellow USBC Hall of Famer Linda Kelly of Dayton, Ohio.

This week's event featured a grueling format on a challenging 39-foot lane condition.

All 28 Senior Women's U.S. Open competitors bowled 18 qualifying games over three days before the field was cut to the top eight for round-robin match play Thursday morning.

Vidad initially struggled when the lanes were freshly oiled this week, but she used the long format as an opportunity to try some different things. She also benefited from watching some of the best women in the world, who were competing simultaneously in the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America Women's All-Star Tournament.

After seeing one of the BPAA All-Star participants find success using the outside part of the lane, Vidad made the move, too. The final piece of the puzzle came during match play, when she pulled out a ball she hadn't thrown all week and catapulted to the top seed in the stepladder with a 6-2 record.

"I started the week very slowly and was not comfortable at all," Vidad said. "As the tournament went on, everything started to feel better and better. I guess I have a way of rising to the occasion. When it's a tough shot like this, you really have to pull out all the tricks as you try to figure it out. I was fortunate to be able to do that.'

The first Senior Women's U.S. Open was held in 2012, and USBC Hall of Famer Robin Romeo of Newhall, California, won the inaugural event to become the first bowler in history to win both the U.S. Women's Open as well as the senior edition of the tournament.

This week's Senior Women's U.S. Open also marked the third and final stop of the Senior Women's Triple Crown Series presented by The Orleans. The Triple Crown Series is a special competition for bowlers who compete in the USBC Senior Queens, National Golden Ladies Classic and Senior Women's U.S. Open.

The Triple Crown Shoot-Out, held at The Cherry Bowl on Thursday, featured the top 10 players in the Triple Crown standings, which combined qualifying totals from all three events.

The Shoot-Out final was a Johnson-Sandelin rematch, and Johnson was able to end the week on a high note with a 220-212 win over the defending Triple Crown champion. Johnson, who was the runner-up at all three Triple Crown events this year, took home \$1,000 for the win. Sandelin earned \$750.

"A major is still the one you want to win, but this was a nice way to show that I had a good overall performance this year," said Johnson, who now will head to Fort Lauderdale, Florida, to represent the United States in the Senior Division of the Tournament of the Americas.
