FONTANA - Foothill Lanes Senior Trio League secretary LEE FITZGERALD contacted me regarding a potential Citrus Belt record. A team led by PRENTIS WILLIAMS rolled a 802 scratch team game. We believe the 802 (299 - 258 - 245) is a Citrus Belt record for a senior trio league game.

I know of two other scratch trio team games of 800. Both games were bowled in Cal Oaks 640 Scratch League two years ago. I was on a team with BOB SNOW and MIKE VINYARD, in the 640 league, which bowled a 820 game.

However, while I was a senior bowler, my teammates were not and the league was not a senior league. So until I hear otherwise, I consider the Foothill 802 game a Citrus Belt senior record.

So here are the big scores:

# Foothill Seniors Set Norm Duke Re-Signs Rhino Page For 2014 PBA League "Dallas Strikers" ALLEN PARK - 2014

PBA League signing season is underway. Planning, preparation and strategic movements heading into the 2014 PBA League season are officially underway with team managers beginning the process of resigning players and releasing others to free agency. Under the new rules for the 2014 season - which officially gets underway Jan. 1 at Thunderbowl Lanes in Allen Park, Mich. team managers have until Aug. 31 to re-sign up to three players (in addition to the No. 1 player, who is automatic) from last year's rosters, and assign them to "slot" positions on their 2014 rosters - from No. 2 through No. 5.

"Slot" positions for 2014 rosters are compensated within pre-set salary ranges, starting at \$20,000 for the No. 1 position (formerly known as the "franchise player"). Team managers have a total "cap" of \$71,000 within which they can negotiate player salaries. For No. 2 slots, players must be paid between \$14,000-18,000. For No. 3 slots, the salary

Existing rostered players who are released or unsigned as of Aug. 31 will become free agents, eligible to negotiate with other teams as of Sept. 1.

# **Belmonte Paces PBA Tour Statistics Heading Into PBA World Series of Bowling V**

LAS VEGAS — Australia's Jason Belmonte, with a pair of 2012-13 titles and championship round appearances in all four PBA Tour major championships conducted thus far in the season, continues to pace the overall PBA Tour statistics heading into PBA World Series of Bowling V Oct. 25-Nov. 3 at South Point Casino, Hotel and Bowling Center in

Las Vegas. The "super-sized" 2012-PBA Tour season began with PBA World Series of Bowling IV last November and concludes on Dec. 31, 2013, as the PBA returns to calendar-year scheduling as of Jan. 1, 2014. Belmonte leads the current season earnings list with \$166,386, tops the competition points list with 199,015 points, and in second on the average list, trailing leader Wes Malott of Pflugerville, Texas, by less than half-a-pin. Malott, with

259 games bowled during a season limited by knee surgery, is scoring at a 229.50 pace for 259 games while Belmonte has bowled 334 games in domestic PBA Tour competition, averaging 229.22.

Finnish-American Mika Koivuniemi, who now calls Hartland, Mich., home, has won a pair of PBA International Tour titles and ranks second in earnings with \$163,312 while Malott, the 2013 U.S. Open champion, has moved into second place on the points list with 162,779. In third place in all three statistical races is reigning PBA Player of the Year Sean Rash of Montgomery, Ill. The one race Rash is leading, however, is the WTBA-World Bowling Tour rolling two-year points competition. Koivuniemi is second and Belmonte is third. The top three in continued on page 4

Also note, after the re-signing period and the free agency period, the most players a team can have on its roster is four (including the No. 1 player). That insures every team will have at least one opening for the draft. All 2014 PBA League roster transactions must be approved by PBA Commissioner Tom Clark.

# RALPH MORTON'S FUN-TIME NO-TAP Senior doubles tournament Record Smashing July

LAS VEGAS — Who would have thought that the 24th Fun-Time senior no-tap doubles tournament held July 23-25 at the Orleans Hotel & Casino bowling center would be record setting, but it was. Why Not! It is the best no-tap tournament around with the best senior bowlers knowing it will only get better. Generous prize funds for a Sunday blind draw, Monday thru Wednesday tournament play, Tuesday singles and All Events. Hope you didn't miss it.

July has always taken a back seat to the January event but apparently no more. The hint of things to come appeared on Sunday, July 22, with an early bird no-tap blind draw that drew a record 220 bowlers not seen in any previous tournament. Maybe it was the intrigue of not knowing your partner until the results were posted or maybe the 3-6-9 format or the lure of possibly winning a free entry or maybe just having fun trying to win a share of a great prize fund. Apparently, Edward Ortiz (300,298) & Ming Yee (288) enjoyed it all by capturing first place. Teams following were: Dale Gregory (288,290)/Ethel Bond (278), Dave Barr (300)/Arlene Combs (266), Roger Sears (278)/ Andy Anderson (264) & David Jerome (298)/Georgia Lyles (243) rounding out the top five. No divisional play was needed since the pairings were computer generated to maintain team averages within 10-12 pins. Thirteen (13) 300's & five (5) 298's were recorded.

Officially Monday initiated the regular tournament format. Two (2) daily squads (100% of 220 handicap, three (3) balanced divisions) combining scores to form a single day event. A five (5) pin victory by Brenda & Charlee Kist over Sherry Rizer/Linda Brown in **Div 1** got things started with Dolores Dudek/Pat Zimmerman in third over Rodney & Darnell Owens who finished one (1) pin ahead of fifth place teams of Pam Foster/Rose Parknaven & Frances Huls/Ruth Banks. **Div 2**: Maria/Ted Cozby took first place by a wide margin over 2nd place team Gene/Rose McDonald. They were followed by Larry/Arlene Combs, Irene/Joe Cantu & Linda Keller/Charlene Burnley. **Div 3**: Newcomers led the way in this tough division. Wisconsite Brad Gregory teamed with Bob Brede to edge out brother Dale Gregory & Mike Rech for first place honors. Tournament veterans Ed/Carol Burke managed third with another newcomer team of John Guilfoyle/Robert Vasicek slipping into 4th by a few pins over Frank Mazeikas/Roger Eredia. A record July 458 bowlers recorded (20) 300's on Monday.

Tuesday saw a total of 448 bowlers (July record) take their skills to the lanes. **Div 1**: Charlee Kist is "on a roll" teaming this time with Rich Elgar for honors with the teams of Betty/Lou Stanley, Lillie/Oscar Favela, Ethel Bond/Helen Alexander & Lena/Jack Grace wrapping up the top five. **Div 2**: Phil Guliford/Gloria Anderson "struck" their way to gold over Terrie/Stacy Turner, Oly Olsen/Bob Bracken, Ray Diaz/Deloris Tanabe & the Collins' (Rita & Tom). **Div 3**: The Gregory boys switched partners but came out with the same result, Brad/Rech over Dale/Brede by 6 pins. Frances Huls/O. Favela took third and up pops Rech/Brede for fourth. Obviously the boys bowled in both squads (encouraged) with great results. Fifth place went to Candee/Terry Mar. (23) 300's on Tuesday.

Travel day for many of the bowlers still saw another record 442 attempt one more time for the brass ring. **Div 1**: Some familiar names will appear again. Amazing! Topping out this group is Arlene/Ken Rassman with the Kist's second, Elgar/Tanabe third, Fran Turney/Generosa Issa fourth and Jerry Lawless/Gloria Anderson sitting in fifth. **Div 2**: Peter Malik/Gloria Anderson by one (1) pin over Carol Liaboe/Dick Hounsley. Third went to Diaz/Tanabe followed by Collins in fourth & McDonalds in fifth. **Div 3**: The Gregory saga continues with Dale/Brede grabbing first over Mazeikas/Eredia, Paul Taniguchi/Hector Zavarias, Bill Moore/Trent Moyer & Gary Anderson/ Joyce Dalton-Jensen. Only (10) 300's.

## NOTE TO DEAF & HEARING-IMPAIRED SENIOR BOWLERS: DEADLINE IS SEPT. 12

LAS VEGAS — The 17th annual Deaf Senior Bowlers of America Tournament will be held in The Orleans Hotel, Casino and Bowling Center on October 15-17, 2013. This tournament is open to deaf and hearing impaired senior men 55 years old and up and senior women at least 50 years old and up.

The events are with handicap in separate singles, mixed doubles and Deaf Queens and Deaf Masters Match Plays. The mixed doubles can be man-woman, man-man or woman-woman. The handicap is 100% of 210 for singles and doubles events and 80% of 210 average for both double elimination Match Plays.

Based on entries of 100 men and 100 women, the first place Singles is \$1000, first place Mixed Doubles is \$2000 and first place Match Plays is \$1000.

The entry fees are \$35.00 for Singles and \$35.00 for Doubles and \$15.00 for DSBA dues for total of \$85.00 to start with. If you want to enter in optional all events (Singles and Doubles) that is \$5.00 extra. Also if you want to bowl in optional Queens or Masters Match Plays, that is \$40.00 extra. All that is \$130.00 per bowler or just \$85.00 without the optionals.

# PBA50 Tour Veteran Kerry Painter, Local Star Tom Adcock Win PBA50 Senior/Super Senior Doubles Classic

DECATUR, Ill. – The doubles team of PBA50 Tour veteran Kerry Painter and local standout Tom Adcock combined for their first PBA50 Tour title by winning the PBA50 Senior/Super Senior Doubles Classic presented by Brunswick Tuesday at Spare Time Lanes.

The pair beat two of PBA's all-time greats, Hall of Famers Johnny Petraglia of Jackson, N.J. and Wayne Webb of Columbus, Ohio, 267-187, in the Baker format championship match.

"I could tell within the first five minutes that we were going to click together," said Painter, who owns two PBA50 regional titles and has a best PBA50 Tour finish of third which came in this season's United States Bowling Congress Senior Masters. "I didn't know Tom before we bowled the tournament but it didn't take long at all to develop confidence in each other.

"This is a special moment for me to win after six years bowling on the PBA50 (Tour)," the 60year-old Painter added. "Bowling two of the greats that I watched on TV in a situation like this is something I never would have believed."

For Adcock, a 51-year-old IT specialist from Decatur and a self-described tournament weekend warrior, it was an emotional win.

"It couldn't be any more special to win this tournament," said Adcock who just became a grandfather last week. "I'm just feeling a lot of emotion right now. I'm thankful for PBA having this tournament here because I'm not able to bowl a lot of tournaments because of my work and family commitments.

"Kerry's very positive and I picked up on that right away, Adcock added. "He has a game where he keeps the ball in play which worked well with my game. There were times when he was bowling fantastic and I wasn't and times when maybe I was bowling better but in the end we were able to

work together."

Adcock owns one PBA regional title and also owns a USBC Open Championships team title.

In the semifinal match, Painter and Adcock beat the doubles team of Emilio Mora Jr. of Lakeland, Fla. and Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., 220-194. In the opening match, Mora and Weber beat Bill Henson of Westerville, Ohio and 10-time PBA Tour winner Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kan., 236-226.

The tournament used a doubles format where a senior player (ages 50-59) and a super senior (ages 60 and over) were paired up for match play based on their qualifying positions in their respective divisions. The Baker format requires players to alternate frames in a game to combine for one score.

Arena bowling and the close quarters in bowling championship setups allow spectators and friends and fans to be within short distances of the competitors and that brings up the subject of silence.

For most of bowling's time fans have been urged to cheer and root in their own fastion, except at certain times. Confusing? Sure. But in reality there are a few rules covering silence at bowling's crucial moments except unwritten ones of courtesy and tradition and under the not too specific rules concerning interference and unsportsmanlike behavior. Ambiguous.

Other major sports, golf and tennis, to name two, have traditionally silent areas, and it is fair to say there are others. It should be noted that bowling, golf and tennis are primarily individual sports on the professional level and most competitors are not on salary, must pay fees and expenses to compete and income is the result of playing better than the other guy or gal. In football, baseball, basketball, boxing, hockey and soc-

In football, baseball, basketball, boxing, hockey and soccer, crowds are encouraged to cheer and jeer, and some have cheerleaders to rouse the audience to almost unimaginalble heights—and actions. Athletes who prefer the silence feel they should be free of distraction when lining up a putt, serving and shooting a key spare—particularly since they were paying their own freight.

Yet, in college basketball, 18 and 19 year olds, who don't get paid, are asked to shoot crucial foul shots amid the roar of the crowd and the view of all kinds of waving objects, including hands and heads, through the glass backboards.

cluding hands and heads, through the glass backboards. For many years tradition has called for silence at different points in different spots in different areas. Examples are prior to the approach in bowling, the serve in tennis and putts in golf.

It seems as though the sound of a voice, a cough, a phone ring or the breaking of a twig has the effect of an explosion on the concentration of some participants.

Golfers look menacing into the sky when a jet disturbs a shot process and it has been reported that plane routes were changed to not bother tennis players in action. Many a bowler has almost been destroyed by a baby's cry or the blow of a nose.

Most sports encourage cheering and jeering. Most sports cannot possibly have rules to cover every aspect of silence and officials, judges, referees or tournament directors might have to make judgement calls that would be second guessed over and over again.

There are instances in every sport where the rules, written or unwritten, are pushed and battered.

Silence, as well as unbridled activites, have long been part of every sport—traditional intangibles. Competitors expect certain courtesies, and have received them, on and off the rule book musts and guides.

Spectators seem to be getting more into sports, less controlled, and with the feeling, right or wrong, that their payment or even just their presence, entitles them when to remain silent, not tradition, courtesy or unclear rules.

Strict guidelines on the silence aspect of bowling should always be considered in tournament play, and imparted as many ways as possible.

#### Dallas Strikers' Player/Manager Norm Duke Signs No. 2 Rhino Page

PBA Hall of Famer Norm Duke, the No. 1 player on the Dallas Strikers and Strikers' team manager, was the first manager to initiate a re-signing, securing left-hander Rhino Page of Dade City, Fla., to his No. 2 roster position (\$15,000). Duke also released last year's No. 4 player Bryon Smith of Roseburg, Ore., and "supplemental pick" Mike Wolfe of New Albany, Ind. Both are now on the "free agent" list and will be eligible to sign with any of the other teams when the free agent signing period opens on Sept. 1.

#### Motown Muscle re-signs Mike Scroggins

Muscle manager Del Ballard Jr. has announced the re-signing of veteran left-hander Mike Scroggins of Amarillo, Texas, to his team's No. 4 slot (\$10,000). Mike Fagan retains the No. 1 position. Scroggins was No. 3 in last year's Muscle lineup, but has been sidelined since the PBA Tournament of Champions while battling a painful bout with plantar faciitis. Ballard also has released Jesse Buss of Belvidere, Ill.; supplemental pick Brad Angelo of Lockport, N.Y. (who was acquired in a trade with the New York WTT KingPins for Kelly Kulick), and D.J. Archer of Friendswood, Texas, who replaced Angelo when he withdrew due to injury. The Motown Muscle team is owned by former Pittsburgh Steelers star Jerome Bettis.

#### BROOKLYN STyLES re-signs, elevates Jason Sterner; Walter Ray returns to fold

STyLES manager Johnny Petraglia has not only re-signed Jason Sterner of McDonough, Ga., but elevated last year's No. 5 player to the No. 2 slot (\$15,000) in his 2014 lineup after Sterner won his first PBA Tour title and almost claimed a second earlier in the 2012-13 season. Petraglia also secured the PBA's most successful player ever, Walter Ray Williams Jr., to the No. 3 slot (\$13,000) and released left-hander Ryan Ciminelli of Cheektowaga, N.Y., and Ryan Shafer of Horseheads, N.Y. Sean Rash returns as the STyLES' No. 1 player. The STyLES owner is actor Jesse Williams.

#### Silver Lake Atom Splitters retain England's Dom Barrett

Atom Splitters manager Mark Baker has re-signed England's Dom Barrett to the No. 4 slot (\$11,000) on the team owned by Internet podcast entrepreneur Chris Hardwick. Barrett held the No. 2 position on last year's team. Chris Barnes is Silver Lake's No. 1 player. Baker also released the rest of last year's Atom Splitters roster to free agency: Josh Blanchard of Gilbert, Ariz.; Stuart Williams of England; Nathan Bohr of Wichita, Kan., and supplemental player Jon VanHees of Charlestown, R.I.

New York City WTT KingPins re-sign Norton, Szczerbinski KingPins manager Carolyn Dorin-Ballard - the only woman manager in the PBA League - has re-signed two-time 2012-13 PBA Tour winner Scott Norton to the No. 2 slot(\$17,75) on the only team owned by a woman (women's sports legend Billie Jean King). The defending PBA League Elias Cup champions are led by No. 1 player Pete Weber, a PBA Hall of Famer. Dorin-Ballard (a hall of famer herself) also retained former Wichita State collegiate star John Szczerbinski to the No. 4 slot (\$10,500) on her team. Previous team members Tommy Jones, Jack Jurek and Kelly Kulick all will enter free agency on Sept. 1.

#### Pittsburgh Jack Rabbits keep Allen at No. 3

Continuing the trend in retaining top left-handers, Jack Rabbits manager Tim Mack has re-signed Patrick Allen of Wesley Chapel, Fla., to his team's No. 3 slot (\$13,000), moving Allen up one spot from last season. Finnish two-handed star Osku Palermaa returns as Pittsburgh's No. 1 player. The Jack Rabbits are owned by Pittsburgh Steelers all-pro linebacker LaMarr Woodley, and hold the No. 1 position for the 2014 PBA League player draft

Waiting in the wings: L.A. X and Philadelphia Hitmen It's still early in the re-signing period, but thus far L.A. X manager Andrew Cain and Philadelphia Hitmen manager Jason Couch have yet to make a move. Cain's team is owned by Los Angeles Clippers all-star point guard Chris Paul, with Jason Belmonte as his No. 1 player. Couch's Hitmen are owned by actorcomedian Kevin Hart and his No. 1 player is Bill O'Neill.
