Anyone who is anything in "THE OAKS" bowling universe was there.

CITRUS BELT USBC officers, house management and employees, league officers and ordinary league bowlers all mingled. Even the bartender snuck over to see the introductions. There was electricity in the air, an excitement you would only expect at the US OPEN.

When all the participants were in place, DAVE TENNEY, Cal Oaks general manager and master of ceremonies, called each "actor" on stage and introduced him to the crowd. There was plenty of applause and cheering for all the bowlers, but the house went wild when ROWDY HOUSTON took his bow. Rowdy is a crowd favorite at "The Oaks," because of his colorful personality. You never know what this retired marine may be up to. He may show up in a cowboy outfit or just decide to sing his favorite song, "BLUE SKIES" if he gets his hand on a microphone. If we had played the national anthem, Rowdy would have belted it out with gusto.

When all the formalities were over, and the bowlers were ready to rumble, there was a sudden whooshing sound, a low whooshing sound coming from the direction of the playroom. Everyone turned slowly and there was Rowdy, making his grand entrance, with a toy stick horse between his legs. Wouldn't you know that Rowdy would be up to something. Houston had to get out of the saddle in a hurry though, because he was scheduled to bowl in the first match.

The roll-off featured a six team step ladder format, with three block winners and three wild card teams participating. Each match was two games, total pins, single elimination.

Match play began at 8:30 PM and lasted until 1:30 AM the next morning.

After five hours of pressure packed bowling, the doubles team of Jerry DeYager and myself prevailed, and was crowned league champion. Let me tell you how it all went down.

The first match featured our number six seed ("Cowboy' Rowdy Houston and KEVIN STAPP) against fifth seeded Jerry DeYager and myself. The cowboys got off to a fast start, with Kevin opening up with a five bagger, and Rowdy decking eight wracks out of nine. Together they finished up their first game with a 469 total. My team trailed by forty-three sticks at that point.

The table turned suddenly in the second game though. Five big splits, in the first five frames, spelled doom for those cowpokes. Jerry and I only had to fire a 440 second game to clinch the match by fourteen pins.

We moved to another pair of lanes for our second match, to face the fourth seeded team of KEN CLAY and ALAN MOJA-DO. This duo is known for it's precision bowling. Two stylists, with steady hands, perfect timing and the silky smooth release selAfter a few seconds, Dwaine looked around as if nothing had happened and said: "let's bowl". Seng was okay, what a relief.

Anyway, I have seen Dwaine play power ball on the lanes and put up some big numbers. He shot a 280 earlier in the season to lead his team to a block title. I knew if he carries, we would be in trouble. Fortunately, it was one of those nights when the six pin was so elevated by Dwaine's speedball, that it was just flying over the ten. Teammate MIKE LAUFFER went 214 -

238 but it wasn't enough. My 235 - 237 along with a 233 by Jerry, and we had a fifty-four pin win.

I have seen bowlers throw their bowling ball to the floor, from above their head, after being humiliated in the val-

ley. We had to face the second seeded team of SCOTT FILIPI and JAMES HAWKINS in the valley. What a break it was for us. It is the only pair in the house that Hawkins has difficulties on. He is a nineteen year old two hander, with a 240 average, who happens to struggle on dry lanes.

Hawkins opened the match with a 259, but with Filipi struggling, we were able to go 220 -224 for a twelve pin lead. When Hawkins started to struggle in the second game, the match was over. We won by thirty-nine.

The championship match began at thirty minutes past midnight, with the doors closed for business, and the cleaning crew mopping and vacuuming. As we began, the lights suddenly went out! Well, not all out. Just half the lights were off. We called out to the desk jockey for help. He said the lights were on a timer which couldn't be overruled. We would have to finish with partial lighting or not at all. So the show went on.

With no lights through the heads, I was having trouble getting lined up. I love using the arrows, and now they were in the dark. The first few frames were a challenge for everyone. I guess that should be expected, since Sowell is a San Diego area professional bowler, with years of experience. His 235 average attests to his experience. We were able to keep pace though, and the first game ended

with us leading by eleven. Game two started big for Sowell. eight consecutive strikes. If it wasn't for Mister DeYager, we would have been done. Jerry strung eight of his own ten counts, beginning in the second frame, to keep us in the match. I then put together a mid-game five bagger, and we took a lead into the ninth frame of the final game.

It was the worst ten pin shot I ever saw by a scratch bowler. Jerry was about to kill someone. We both thought that shot cost us \$500 each. Wait a minute. Before Boucher bowled his tenth, he asked the crowd to tally the score and tell him what he needed to win the match. THERESE LLOYD called out: "You need two strikes and five pins". Now I knew we were losing. I've been on this path before.

Boucher's first ball was perfect. His second ball was perfect. Oh my God, the ten pin stood. WE WIN! We win by four pins. "WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS ... WE ARE THE CHAMPIONS... OF THE WORLD." Well, maybe we are only the champions of our world, but that's okay.
