PBA HALL OF FAMER PETE WEBER SET TO JOIN PBA50 TOUR IN 2013

PBA Hall of Famer Pete Weber of St. Ann, Mo., is ready to join the PBA50 Tour after celebrating his 50th birthday on Tuesday, Aug. 21. Weber, the winner of 35 PBA Tour titles (fourth on the alltime list) and a record 47 PBA Regional titles, is the only player in history to win five U.S. Open titles.

He has bowled in 726 PBA Tour tournaments in a career that began at age 17 in 1979 – when he became the youngest player ever to win a PBA Regional title (St. Louis, 1979). He also is the youngest United States Bowling Congress member to bowl a 300 game in his first game as a certified adult league bowler, a feat he accomplished at age 15 in St. Louis.

Weber, who will begin his 34th season as a PBA Tour competitor when PBA World Series of Bowling IV gets underway Nov. 2-11 in Las Vegas, is expected to make his debut on the newly-renamed PBA50 Tour (formerly PBA Senior Tour) in the spring of 2013. Next year's PBA50 Tour schedule will be announced later in the fall. The PBA's 50and-older players have completed their 2012 season.

Have you ever imagined or dreamt about what it would be like to compete for our nation, and prove you are the best in the world? I'm sure many of you have. If there is one thing that seems to unite us every four years, regardless of our ethnicity, it is the pride we have as citizens when our athletes become world champions. The reality is that for the vast majority of us dreaming about winning in the name of

our country is all we will ever do. Only very few will ever have the chance to compete, let alone actually complete the dream by emerging victorious as the best in the World.

So what does this have to do with bowling you might ask, it's not an Olympic Sport? Well we could debate for hours as to whether it should be or not, but yes you are correct it's not.....yet. Even though the sport of Bowling is not among those contested on the Olympic stage it is a sport that

has numerous International competitions. The International Training and Research Center (ITRC) a joint venture between the USBC and BPAA in Arlington, TX is a United States Olympic Committeerecognized training center. The ITRC is home to Team USA and Junior Team USA bowling, and is the only training facility authorized to send athletes to International bowling competition as official representatives of the United States. SoCal's STEVE SMITH Wins Gold and Silver For USA at PABCON

LAS VEGAS — San Diego's own Steve Smith won a gold medal as a member of TEAM USA at last week's Pan American Bowling Conference (PABCON) Championships at Sunset Station. TEAM USA (five man) fired 6687 for six games (222 average) to win with an astounding 1,483 (224 - 247 - 266 - 245 - 256 - 245) set, averaging 247 with his Ebonite Innovate ball. Steve told me that the ball gets through the front end of the lanes cleanly and reads the midlane well. Janawicz chipped in with a 1294. Smith and

three medals (two gold and one silver) in the 2012 PAB-CON Champion of Champions Tournament and five (three gold and two silver) in the 2011 Tournament of the America's.

In Master's match play Steve won four games and lost

Smith partnered with John Janawicz to win the silver medal in doubles, for the USA. The doubles event was contested on the long, fortyfour foot "London" oil pattern. The short oil "Stockholm" pattern was the other pattern used during the tournament.

Steve led his doubles duo

Janawicz finished just twentyseven pins behind gold medalists Tommy Jones and Bill O'Neill. An early sub par 167 game cost Smith and Janawicz the gold medal.

Steve also finished fifth in Trio's, sixth in the Master's, seventh in all-events and eighth in singles.

The gold and silver medals were Smith's ninth and tenth international medals since joining Team USA. He won three, His victims included PBA Champion Bill O'Neill (203 - 201), PBA star Dan Mc-Clelland

(226 - 223), eventual champion George Lambert (221 -213), and Puerto Rico's young phenom Israel Hernandez (250 - 189). One of Steve's close losses was to PBA Champion Tommy Jones (212 - 223). Steve averaged 216 for the seven games of Masters match play

DEAF TRAVEL TO START 53RD YEAR WITH 8 TEAMS OF TRIOS

NORWALK — More than 20 bowlers showed up at Keystone Lanes Sunday for the So. Calif. Deaf Traveling League's meeting to start off the new bowling season. Other bowlers had notified the officers of their inability to attend the meeting that day but still intend to bowl in the league.

League President Ed Abakumoff announced, with the numbers of bowlers present and counting, the league could have the same number of 8 teams of trios as last season. And on the agenda was to review the league rules, to elect officers for the new season, chose the 8 bowling centers for the new season and chose the dates for league's 2012-13 schedule. The last thing to do was to make up the 8 teams with team averages as close as possibly can.

Accordingly the only change in the rules voted was the addition of \$5.00 to the bowling fees to offset the increase in bowling fees. The same officers were re-elected for another term, Abakumoff as President, Sharon Caldwell as Vice-President and Bob Taylor as Secretary- Treasurer.

In addition a motion to keep the same last season's 8 bowling centers to travel to was defeated as some bowlers were not satisfied with a couple of houses and replacements were made please all. Finally the dates were set up to bowl every other Sundays starting September 9 at Keystone Lanes.

With all these done, the last task was making up the 8 teams of 3 bowlers each. With thanks to Andy Lorenzo who prior to the meeting, made up and printed name tags of each bowler with averages to use for this purpose. That simplify the work and the job was done fast. The 8-team line-ups will be given to the bowlers prior to start at Keystone.

Then Secretary-Treasurer Taylor will start contacting other 7 bowling centers and set up the schedule, which will be given to the bowlers on the opening day at Keystone.

Theyken bowled games of 201-182-213-194-266-245 for 1301 (216.8 ave.). He said, WHEW!! Thanks to the last two games helped him to cash in 10th and last place to cash for \$106.00. Ken Meryman was the top qualifier with 1445 (240.8 ave.).

In parting, Theyken said next year he will bowl in few PBA50 tournaments and USBC Senior Masters. We will watch for that and good luck to Jim Theyken.

numerous International events each year, and continues to grow around the world. These International competitions are a competitive bowlers Olympics, so to speak. You don't just go and signup for a competition, you must have earned your way onto the team or have been selected by the National Selection Committee. Youth and Adults earn their way onto the team at the North Pointe Junior Gold National Championships or Team USA Trials by either winning the event, finishing as runner-up, or meeting the strict selection criteria used by the National Selection Committee and being chosen. Just like the other athletes we watched in the Olympic Games the closest most of us will ever come to getting to compete for the United States is in our dreams.

In mid-June I received an email from Team USA. The email was really for Ashley. It seemed Team USA wanted to know if she was available to compete in the U16 Division at the Tournament of the Americas. They said that she had been selected due to her past achievements and that she had been the highest qualifier at the 2011 Junior Gold National Championships that met the age requirements for the U16 Division, they went on to say they recognized it was fairly short notice and just need to know if she was available. Ashley had learned of this U16 Division of Junior Team USA three years earlier during her first Teen Masters competition when she was only 12 years old. She had met a girl at Teen Masters that had participated in the U16 Division existed. That year Ashley set two personal goals, win Teen Masters and earn the privilege to compete in the Tournament of the Americas. Of course she would be available to compete, short notice or not. What an honor to be asked to bowl for your country, to represent the United States in International competition. She had been recognized as being the most qualified to give Junior Team USA a chance at medaling in that division.

The Tournament of the Americas is sanctioned by the USBC and PABCON and is an invitation only event for the Countries of the American Zone (Canada, United States, Mexico, and all the countries of Central & South America). The tournament is the longest running International Bowling competition in existence and celebrated its 50th Anniversary this year. It offers competition in a U16 Division, U20 Division, Adult, and Seniors. The U20 Division is the age group that is comprised of our Junior Team USA members, the Adults are our Team USA members, the Seniors are sometimes Team USA members and/or specially selected bowlers that have been former members of the team, or have proven themselves in other elite competitions.

The 2012 U16 Team USA was comprised of youth that had proven themselves in the Junior Gold National Championships last year, and in the case of this year one member of Junior Team

USA that fit within the U16 age rule (Kamron Doyle). The 2012 team was; from left to right - Kamron Doyle (Brentwood, TN), Ashley Dunn (Palmdale, CA), Kaitlyn Eder (Lithia, FL), and Wesley Low Jr. (Palmdale, CA).



This year the tournament was held at Sawgrass Lanes in Tamarac, FL, a suburb of Ft. Lauderdale. The competition ran from July 30 to August 4. Participants from 20 countries took part in competition. Teams were comprised of 2 males and 2 females. In addition to the grand finale, Team competition, competitors took part in; Singles (12 games), Doubles (6 games with same gender partner), Mixed Doubles (6 games), and then Team (12 games). The lane conditions were a combination of both a long & short sport pattern, with the patterns alternating from pair to pair. In other words during any given block of an event one game would be bowled on a pair of lanes with the long pattern and then the next game would be bowled on a pair of lanes with the short pattern. All divisions would bowl on the same conditions and move through the same pairs. This format of mixed patterns is fairly common in International competition, which if you've ever bowled on sport conditions you can understand how this type format truly puts the SPORT into bowling. By the time the tournament would end each competitor would have bowled 36 games over the course of 6 consecutive days of competition. Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals would be awarded for each event along with additional medals for Individual All-Events, National All-Events for each age division, Highest 3 Game Series, and Highest Single Game. The maximum number of medals any individual competitor could earn was 8.

Bowling in her first ever International competition, the first event was 12 games of singles on the difficult conditions described. The result was Ashley earning a Gold medal. Not only did

she earn the Gold medal in the event, but she set a new Tournament Record with a score of 2,322, an average of 193.5 for the 12 games, surpassing the previous record of 2,285 set in 2009 by Tatiana Munoz from Colombia. In addition her score was high enough that she would have earned Gold in the U20 Division, as the Gold medal in that division, bowling on the same conditions and same pairs was won by Lorena Bolanos from Guatemala with a score of 2,315.



The U16 Team USA won the team event with a 12 game total of 9,148 out distancing Team Colombia by 292 pins! In all this young team would take home 25 medals, 19 Gold, 4 Silver, and 2 Bronze

Ashley earned 5 Gold (Singles, Mixed Doubles, Team, National All-Events, High 3 Game Series) 2 Silver (Doubles, Individual All-Events) Ashley's High 3 Game Series of 664 not only earned her the Gold medal, but she set a new Tournament Record surpassing the previous record of 659, also set in 2009 by Ana Koff from the USA. Earning 7 medals out of a possible 8 in the name of your country is quite a special accomplishment. I know the pride I felt for all of Team USA's victories, of course Ashley's were especially meaningful to me. I can't imagine the pride that she must have felt at those moments, and even now. I know she is looking forward to next years Tournament of the Americas and other International competitions as she pursues her new goal of earning a spot on the U20 Junior Team USA. Three weeks, seventy-one games of competition, runner-up at Junior Gold National Finals, earned a spot on the Developmental Junior Team USA, earned an entry into the 2013 Team USA Trials, seven medals in International competition, two Tournament Records, and a U18 Teen Masters National Title on a grand stage in Grand Central Terminal. No, the Summer of 2012 will not soon be forgotten!

Once again please allow us to thank the California Bowling News for publishing Ashley's accomplishments. We sincerely hope that in some small way sharing her achievements within the bowling community serves to motivate other youth. To everyone working within the industry, remember that the youth are the future of the sport. Without your involvement, and their participation bowling will not survive. Ashley would like to thank her coach, Mark Baker, for all he does to help her continue to take her game to new levels. She would also like to than her Ball Technician and Advisor, Will Wilson, for helping her select the best balls, layouts, and surface preparations for the variety of conditions she faced across numerous bowling centers this Summer. Lastly, thanks to all of my bowling buddies and their parents for your support. Your kind words and encouragement mean more than you can know.

NORWALK — We gladly returned to Keystone Lanes where we saw 221 enter the event and bowl on a tough, but fair shot. The cut scores in the One Day Event were + 55 for the men and +18for the women. The Super Seniors added to the board (2 men and 1 female) were Art Windsor +56 and Javier Avila +39. For the women it was Sierrie Herradura -7. Super Seniors are men 63 and over, and for the women a young 55. That would give us 54 bowlers making it to the High Qualisemi-finals fier for the Men was Sun Sundara with a +119 and for the women it was Christina Cheung with a +116. They will get a paid entry into a future regular ABTA event. Each week our top seed draws the Match Series, and it was worth \$380. Sun would draw the score and he drew a 662. We had no bowlers matching this score. We will estimate the Match Series at \$1,400 at Cal Bowl this weekend for only a \$2.00 entry. The last up in the 3-6-9 roll-off was Johnny Tran. Johnny would miss on his first shot, so he takes home a consolation of \$50. We will estimate the pot at \$1,500 at Cal Bowl.

In our optional doubles,

tops were Tomas Chavez and

Galdino Chavez with a 1370 for \$170. In second was Faye Josafat and Rey Josafat with a 1364 for \$150. There was a total of \$1,800 paid out in doubles and 23 paid spots with low to cash of 1306.

After bowling the three game semifinals, the leader was Kevin Collier with a +114. Finishing second was David Godinez at a +96. So sat out the first round. Kevin had the honor of drawing the Match Game worth \$3,500. He drew a 288. After a review of all the scores bowled no one matched that score, so it will continue to carry over. There are three full pots, with a 4th pot that is currently at \$3,430.

This would bring us to our top 16 Match Play finals. In the first round, the seven losers were Cesar Marcella. Derrick Brown, Maina Suos, Elvin Godoy, Faye Josafat, Don Quitangon, and Melvin Finner. They received checks of \$105 each. In the second round, the losers were Fel Garcia, Jack Trongale, Marvin Galsim Sr, and David Godienz. They received checks of \$115 each. We are now down to the final five bowlers. With horses paying a low of \$36 (James Samson) to a high of \$186 (Galdino Chavez). In this round we

saw Cecilia Lung (16th seed) bowling Christopher Eguilos (8th seed) where Cecilia continued her good bowling and squeak by with another close win finishing off Chris with a 216 to 213 as she advanced to the semi-final match. In the other match we saw James Samson (5th seed) bowling Galdino Chavez (7th seed). In this match, Galdino would advance with a big 248 to 204 and send James to the bench and he would advance to the semi-final match. James and Chris finished in 4th and 5th getting checks for \$125 each.

Our semi-final match would pit Cecilia paying \$58 and Galdino paying \$186 if they would win the match. It was another that would be close through the whole match. Both bowlers would start with spares in the first frames, and then both would open in the 2nd frame, so they were tied at 25 after two frames, but it was Cecilia who held the advantage with a 12 pin difference in HDCP. From this point forward each of the bowlers would mark in the rest of the frames but it was Galdino who could not muster a double and thus it would be Cecilia who would hold on to finish with the victory with a 181/233 to 180/220. Kevin would mark in the next three frames and Cecilia would mark then open and then mark and that put Kevin up by 3 pins. Both bowlers marked in the 7th frame. Both bowlers got marks, Cecilia had the strike to give her a chance. In the 10th frame Kevin finished out with spare and strike and that brought up Cecilia who needed a strike on her first ball to keep her alive, but she left the 4-7 and that ended her title bid and sent Kevin home his 1st Championship 187/212 to 147/199. He would take home \$1,000 for 1st place. Finishing in 2nd place for \$500 was Cecilia Lung.

IDLE BOWLING THOUGHTS

... Le Roy Neiman, the world famed artist who specialized in sports renderings, was one of the most prolific and popular painters of all-time, died recently at age 91. He did a painting of Earl Anthony when Anthony was the first million dollar pro winner.

It was commissioned by the late Frank Esposito and his son Ralph, and has been displayed at the International Bowling Hall of Fame and Museum. Copies are featured in many bowling centers and bowling venues across the country. The cost was \$50,000.

At an unveiling luncheon in New York City, Neiman revealed that as a youth he was a pinboy. "I wanted to portray the view from back of the pins, an overall picture" said Neiman. Also at the gathering were the late Anthony and Andy Varipapa, and Neiman and Varipapa put on quite a show while Anthony got his comments in like a true champion should.

And I enjoyed my role as MC.

... For many years, some bowlers, more than capable to bowl well on the pro tour, passed it up to stay competing in so called amatuer tournaments, where the prize money was high, but the recognition was low.

... Perfect games are much more plentiful than they used to be, and some of the stats are staggering. At last check, and the numbers could have changed in as little as weeks, the leading perfect game shooter was Jim Hosier with 133. And in the 300s on the pro tour was Parker Bohn III with 88. And one of the most amazing is the 300 rolled by Shawn Beam, first wheelchair bowler to achieve the rare gem.

... Bowling outdoors in major events is only an occasional presentation. Not only do bowlers have to cope with lane conditions that are affected by bright sun or rain but also quick windy blasts that change the whole scene. One consolation is that bowlers have a new excuse — the sun got in their eyes.

The women's U.S. Open finals showed the devastating effect of the unexpected gusts were the major factor in the five finalists, all fine competitive, experienced bowlers, average a combined 162.

... A lot of bowlers don't realize how bad they usually bowl — until they roll a good game.

... More than 50 games are played with some sort of a ball. Joe Hutchinson wasn't impressed. He said he knew some bowlers who play 50 different games with a bowling ball.

... A worthy project all of bowling should endorse is an effort to have Dick Weber and Don Carter immortalized on a postage stamp. There are many other bowlers who rate consideration. In 1971 in Milwaukee, Wis. an envelope with a bowling logo was unveiled in memorializing the World Amateur bowling championship being held there. Persons are not considered until 10 years after their death and a number of athletes and personalities in various sport have been so honored.

... The top 10 pros normally average at least seven strikes per game.

... Good guys never finish last — not if they are good enough.

The Perfect Game by Steve Felege guest appearance by Carol Mancini

Steve: Carol, a new season is beginning. With your permission I'd like to begin this week's article by reading a tribute to an underappreciated group of bowlers. Carol: How could I refuse? Go right ahead.

Steve:

A TRIBUTE (by ME)

What makes the bowling world go round? Proprietors? Equipment manufacturers? Publications? The governing bodies? The bowlers? The answer is, "All of the above." The sport of bowling is like a big machine with lots of moving parts. But who keeps the parts running smoothly? That answer may surprise you. It is a small group of very special people referred to as "League Secretaries." They are the ones who "step up to the plate" and do the work no else will. Without them, leagues would be chaos and the whole system would soon fall apart. Their pay never compensates them fairly for all the time, effort and occasional grief they endure. We are blessed to have them. To the wonderful people like Lucy at Cal Bowl and her husband Ken, I say, "THANK YOU!" I am your biggest fan!

(We now return you to our regularly scheduled program ;-)

Carol: Steve, in the last column you said, "To become a successful bowler, learn and practice good bowling skills." That resulted in an interesting email. Here, I think you should read it.

Steve: Okay, it asks, "What...are...good...bowling...skills?" ---C. Mancini, Del Rio Lanes, Downey, CA.

Carol: Well?

Steve: Uhhh, you sent us an email?

Carol: Don't be ridiculous. I had Dean send it!

Steve: You had Dean send an email from here, to here? That's just weird.

Carol: Why is that weird? I was working on the Sudoku puzzle when that question occurred to me. I didn't want to forget it so I had Dean send it to us.

Steve: Carol, there's a thin line between genius and insanity and.....oh, what the heck, it is a really good question.

Carol: I thought so, too. If there's one thing that drives me crazy, it's empty information. Telling people to, "Use good skills" without describing good skills is like saying, "Focus!", without telling them what to focus on.

Steve: Well, color me "Guilty!" You're absolutely right and we need to address that. With so many different techniques being taught, it is hard for the average bowler to know good skills from bad ones. A quick lesson on bowling theory is key to explaining that.

Carol: Bowling theory? Never heard of such a thing.

Steve: Bowling theory defines the universal principles that apply to all bowlers. Those principles are the pillars upon which effective bowling techniques are based.

Carol: Sounds boring.

Steve: It is, but it's really quite simple. There are only three important principles bowlers need to know. - Bowling is a game of skill, not power.

- What you do determines what the ball does.

- The ball travels a line to its target, the pins.

Carol: That's it?

Steve: Not quite, but that's all we need for now. The last principle is the one that separates good skills from bad ones. Simply put, good bowling skills are techniques that put your ball on a target-line and keep it there throughout your approach. Any skill that doesn't do that is a bad one. Carol: Okay, but a lot of people believe that there's no skill involved in bowling. They think it's just throwing a ball and hoping for the best.

Steve: For beginners and casual bowlers, that's true. Their games rely on the natural talent they were born with, but I'm sure you've noticed how inconsistent those bowlers tend to be. Carol: Oh veah!

Steve: That's the difference between talent and skill. We're all born with different levels of talent, but skills have to be taught. Good skills work for everyone and bring consistency to their performance.

Carol: I get that, but one thing has always bothered me.

Steve: What's that?

Carol: I know a lot of bowlers that struggle with this game no matter how much coaching they get. Are they just hopeless?

Steve: Of course not. They may be victims of good coaches teaching poor skills. Can I let you in on a little secret?

Carol: Sure.

Steve: Don't tell anyone I said this, but many coaches teach people to bowl badly! Shhhh..... that's just between you and me, okay?

Carol: I promise I won't tell a soul, but.....why would they do that?!

Steve: Because that's what they were trained to do. I know that because.....I was one of them. Carol: What!?

Steve: Let me explain. All coaches go to classes to get certified. Right?

Carol: Right.

Steve: Well, if those classes teach poor techniques, then those coaches will teach poor techniques. It's only logical.

Carol: Why would certification classes teach bad techniques?

Steve: Because of a reliance on tradition; old theory vs. new theory. I'm not saying all certification classes are bad, but the ones that rely on old bowling theory, like the first one I attended, should be avoided. As a result of those classes, when I first began coaching, I taught people how to bowl badly.

Carol: I think you better explain that. You just attacked the "Holy Grail" of our sport---COACH-ING! Oh man, I can just see the emails we'll be getting about this! Hey Lillian, can you get me a Tylenol?

Steve: I stand by what I just said. It's the reason I wrote my little manual. It's based on new theories. To make my point, let's take a look at just one of the chills. I was taught you hack in the

apart and weight evenly distributed on them means that some weight must shift sideways, to one foot, on the initial step. A bowler shifting sideways means the ball is shifting sideways. Any sideward movement is off-line movement. That's not helpful!

- Keeping your shoulders level introduces even more problems. Swinging a heavy ball pulls the shoulder down. This changes the position of your head and destroys your ability to focus. If you fight to keep your shoulders level, your muscles quickly tire. This ruins your consistency and that's not helpful! I could go on, but I think you get the message. The classic stance is not a good skill! It actually creates inconsistencies which are magnified by the length of the lane. This one skill has probably ruined more bowlers than you can imagine.

Carol: I was always told that the classic stance was effective because it was perfectly balanced.

Steve: I was told the same thing, but let's think about that. Being perfectly balanced only means that you're not falling over. The Statue of Liberty is perfectly balanced, but I wouldn't recommend her stance to a bowler! The real problem with the old-style stance is it's symmetry. Bowling involves swinging a very heavy weight from only one side. Shifting from a symmetrical stance to an asymmetrical delivery is a recipe for inconsistency!

Carol: Got it! Would you be so kind as to describe a better stance?

Steve: That would be getting ahead of ourselves. I just wanted to make the point that any stance will work, but improving your stance will improve your results. That applies to the other skills as well. That's why I preach that bowlers need to learn and practice the best bowling skills they can find. If they can't deliver a bowling ball like a machine, they need to ask, "Why?" The answer will always be found in the skills they possess.

theories. To make my point, let's take a look at just one of the skills I was taught way back in the seventies.

Carol: Which skill do you want to look at?

Steve: The first and most important one: the stance.

Carol: Why is the stance the most important? Aren't all of the skills equally important? *Steve: They're all important, but the stance aims your shot and sets up the other skills.* Carol: Fair enough, I'll buy that.

Steve: Now, here's "the classic stance" I was taught to teach:

- Stand with your feet several inches apart, one held a few inches back from the other.

- Distribute your weight evenly on both feet

- Hold the ball waist high, centered to the body, and supported by both hands.

- Shoulders should be level to the floor and "square" to your target.

Carol: I'm familiar with that stance. Some coaches still teach it.

Steve: Carol, it may be the worst stance a bowler can possibly use!

Carol: Why do you say that?

Steve: Go back to the third principle; 'the ball travels a line.' The purpose of the stance is to get the ball on that line. It also sets up an approach that keeps it on that line and moving toward the target. In that light, this classic stance actually works against you!

Carol: I see where you're going with this, but explain it to our readers.

Steve: Okay. The balls line of travel begins at the shoulder since that's the point from which the ball swings.

- For the ball to be on that line, it must be held to one side. The old stance has the bowler holding the ball below the chin! That's not helpful!

- Holding the ball centered to the body not only points the ball away from the target, it sets up a push-away which must go forward and sideways to get it onto the target-line. Doing this while walking destroys consistency! That's not helpful!

- For deadly accuracy, the ball must move only toward its target. Standing with the feet spread
