Dorin-Ballard Adds Name to Record Books SEATTLE-For a bowler

who has accomplished so much in her career, Carolyn Dorin-Ballard of North Richland Hills, Texas, was still left stunned at what she achieved Sunday.

Competing in a PBA Regional Tour event, Dorin-Ballard threw back-to-back 300 games in the first round of match play, becoming the first woman to toss consecutive 300s in PBA history.

"After I got done with the second 300, I just stood there and said 'I can't believe I just did that," said Dorin-Ballard, who has 23 career perfect games but had never thrown two back-to-back. "That's not something you do every day. I was think-ing about it again today and looked at Del (her husband and fellow pro bowler) and said 'I still can't believe I did that.' It was really exciting."

Dorin-Ballard accomplished the feat in the PBA Southwest Region Classic Products Fort Worth Open. She advanced through qualifying and the semifinals before defeating Addison Thornton of Shreveport, La., 3-2 (204-237, 300-194, 300-221, 176-253, 214-147) in the round of 16.

She then went on to lose to Chris Johnson of Garland, Texas, 2-1 (268-189, 237-269, 246-214) in the round of eight.

Dorin-Ballard is one of several women who have made the jump to the PBA after the Professional Women's Bowling Association went defunct in 2003. Women were allowed to join the PBA beginning in 2004 and on Aug. 21 Liz Johnson of Cheektowaga, N.Y., made history by becoming the first woman to win a PBA Regional Tour event.

Dorin-Ballard, who recently joined the Storm pro staff, has bowled in many regional events since the PBA allowed women to join, and the more she competes, the stronger she has gotten on the patterns the PBA uses. "I've gotten better at making quicker moves on all the patterns and the one used this weekend has definitely been more conducive to the way I bowl," said Dorin-Ballard, who often competes in the same regional events as her husband, Del. "The more you bowl on these patterns and bowl against the exempt players the more you learn.

Dorin-Ballard has arranged her schedule to be able to compete in regionals and other tournaments that are close to home.

However, when the PBA Tour kicks into full swing it will be difficult for her to compete in PBA Tour Qualifying Rounds on a weekly basis. In fact, she's not planning to compete in this year's USBC Masters simply because she can't take a whole week off.

week off. "I love bowling in the PBA regionals because they are a lot closer, and it's not so long of a drive," Dorin-Ballard said. "I don't really know if I can take a week off to go and bowl the Masters. I am going to bowl the U.S. Open because it's in New Jersey and my mom lives close by and can baby sit." Dorin-Ballard, who said she

Dorin-Ballard, who said she has been fortunate to find a babysitter who is a bowling fan and doesn't mind traveling to the regional events to take care of Alyssa, has found success in past regional events since joining the PBA.

Not long after getting her card, Dorin-Ballard made the final four in the PBA Regional Players Championship in 2004. She also won 20 titles on the PWBA Tour.

But not bowling every week like she did on the PWBA Tour has taken its toll on Dorin-Ballard and she's still trying to get back to the level she was at several years ago.

several years ago. "I've really been practicing hard over the past few weeks almost like I did when I bowled on the PWBA Tour," she said. "I got a little lazy with my mental game and also with my hand. I've really been practicing hard the last month and Del's been working with me on some things with my hand. It's helped and I think it's starting to show." Next up for Dorin-Ballard is a weekend scratch tournament in the Dallas area before heading down to Austin, Texas, for the PBA Southwest Region Young & Pratt Austin Open at Dart Bowl on Oct. 7-9. OC/USBC/Ass'n **Ratified Sun.** At Merger Meet By Frank Kietz

WESTMINSTER-President Bill Huntington presided at the first meeting of the newly formed Orange County United States Bowling Congress Association Sunday (August 28, 2005) at Westminster Lanes.

President Bill said, "We had good response, 64 bowling people, sanctioned by YABA, WIBC, ABC and proprietors (So-Cal Center Owners) registered. They all cooperated to get this new merged group functioning."

We were not perfect, the non-officer members (shareholders) didn't sit on their hands, they asked serious questions, nominated candidates from the floor, challenged the tallies.

Vice-President Cindy Miles pointed out, "We're a non-profit corporation and operates consistent with the requirements of an organization classified as tax exempt under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code ("IRC").

Further, be chartered by USBC and subject to its authority. And to maintain its charter, the association must provide services for men, women and youth (bowlers).

Under the charter a total of 21 will form the governing body, seven each from the ABC/WIBC, five from OCYABA and two proprietors.

Seven each were nominated by committees, two men and one woman from the floor, five from YABA.

Elected by majority were: YABA Directors, Linda Stewart, Arlene Gagan, Debbie Andreff, Jeff Watson and Dexter Harrod.

Elected by majority vote, men, President Bill Huntington; Directors Sam Castrovinci, Mike Schaffner, Alan Thompson, Troy Sucatre, Milt Cisneros; the seventh Director and two proprietor nominees run-off will wait until a ruling comes from USBC headquarters.

Since there is a duly elected quorum it's in order for President Bill Huntington to call a (board) meeting to cover unfinished and new business. An important matter, the selection of an Association Manager (Executive Director) probably will head the agenda.

Executive Directors, Cheryl Huntington and Robert Hartmann, must be given much credit organizing Sunday's meeting. They registered 64 shareholders (members), 32 men, 31 women and one junior, prepared the ballots, agendas and printed the By-Laws and explained the purpose of the meeting. Illness kept past president Jim Farr home. He was the merger architect carrying three spots on the morning's agenda.

Cozad said, he is searching for the reason for the decline and asked the staff for any reason for it. Was it because of the three deaf PBA bowlers allowed to bowl and being too good? But none of them had won the title in the past 3 years although one had been the runner-up twice. NDMBA is a tournament for the best bowler in US and the world and you can not count the deaf PBA members out.

While it is true that almost all the deaf tournaments, big and small forbid the deaf PBA members to bowl in their tournament, these three members just like the tough PBA competition. None of them ever won a title although they cashed sometimes.
