

#### **New PBA Regional Players Invitational** Walter Ray Wins PBA South Region Scorpion Open **Series Will Create Affordable Closer-to-Home Championship Events** CANTON Newly-Senior Tour and three Senior

SEATTLE - The Professional Bowlers Association has created a new PBA Regional Players Invitational series for the 2012-13 season that will give all PBA members an opportunity to qualify for a prestigious new regional championship event closer to home, PBA Commissioner Tom Clark announced today.

The new tournament series, which will be conducted in the PBA's East, South, Central, Midwest, Southwest and joint West-Northwest Regions, will provide dozens of top regional players with international media exposure because all six events will be webcast live, exclusively on PBA's online bowling channel, Xtra Frame.

Each of the six RPIs also will offer prize funds in excess of \$25,000, including \$6,000 to each winner and a 1:2 pavout ratio, and the winner of each will win a paid entry into the 2013 PBA World Series of Bowling.

"In a typical year, the PBA conducts roughly 170 regional tournaments throughout its seven regions, ranging from New England to Hawaii," John Weber, Director of Regional and Senior Tours, said. "In years past, the PBA has conducted two national championship events specifically for regional players - a PBA Regional Players Championship and a PBA Regional Players Invitational.

'We have found, in our

changing economic climate, that regional players are having an increasingly difficult time traveling cross-country to attend those national events," Weber added. "The new RPI program addresses that problem by providing our members with signature tournaments that are more affordable and more easily accessible, but still retain special levels of exclusivity and prestige that will reward performance."

Since the late 1960s, the PBA Regional program has been the proving ground for hundreds of young players who aspire to become the future stars of the PBA Tour, and it continues to provide an affordable, close-to-home competitive arena for many others who love to compete but who are involved in careers other than professional bowling.

"The new RPI series also will provide PBA's Xtra Frame subscribers with the added value of bonus coverage featuring both current and future stars in professional bowling," Clark noted. "This is a level of competition never before available to the general public, but because of Xtra Frame's online reach, it's going to be a great addition to the PBA program for players and fans alike.'

In order to qualify for their home area RPI, players will be required to qualify among the top 48 in competition points within their own regions durcontinued on page 1

crowned PBA Senior Player of the Year Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Ocala, Fla., won Sunday's PBA South Region Scorpion Open at Cherokee Lanes in Canton, Ga., but it was 14-year-old amateur Kamron Doyle of Brentwood, Tenn., who continued to dazzle the bowling world with another eye-opening performance.

Williams, 52, defeated Dick Allen of Columbia, S.C., 255-172 to win the final South Region animal pattern championship of the season. It was Williams' 31st standard PBA Regional title and 85th overall PBA title (47 PBA Tour, four Regional titles). He advanced to the title match after eliminating Doyle in the semifinal round, 226-214.

Doyle's third-place finish was his highest ever in PBA competition, but not his first sterling performance. In 2010, also in Canton, Doyle became the youngest player in PBA history to "cash" in a regional tournament when he finished 30th in an event also won by Williams. Earlier in 2012. Doyle became the youngest player ever (also at age 14) to cash in the U.S. Open, finished 61st in a world-class field of professional and amateur

bowlers in N. Brunswick, N.J. As an amateur, Doyle is not allowed to accept money, but his earnings are deposited into his growing USBC SMART

scholarship account. For the record, the youngest bowler ever to win a PBA Regional title was Pete Weber. who won a PBA Midwest Regional tournament in St. Louis at age 17. Doyle is the youngest ever to finish as high a third place. In April, Wesley Low of Palmdale, Calif., also finished third in a PBA West Region non-champions tournament at the age of 14 years, 344 days. Low is 126 days older than Dovle.

## Kamron Doyle Breaks Another Record at PBA South Region Scorpion Open: A Fan's Take by Christopher A. Brown

NORWALK — Kamron Doyle, the 14-year-old bowler from Brentwood, Tennessee who has already set records. displayed his talent once again on August 26, 2012. As reported by Bill Vint at PBA.com, Doyle placed third at the PBA South Region Scorpion Open in Canton, Georgia. Doyle was knocked out of

the running in the semi-final round by Walter Ray Williams, Jr., who went on to win the tournament. This marked Kamron Doyle's best finish yet at a PBA tournament, and made him the youngest person to have achieved such a feat. but it was certainly not his first time making waves in the sport.

In 2010, at the age of 12, Doyle became the youngest bowler to ever cash out in a PBA tournament. He broke records again in February of 2012 at the age of 14 when he became the youngest bowler in history to win cash at the U.S. Open.

It would seem that the young Kamron Doyle is striving to topple another record. which is currently held by none other than Pete Weber. In 1982, at the age of 17, Weber became the youngest person to ever win a PBA title. At only 14. Dovle still has a little over two years to remove Weber's name from that record and become the youngest-ever PBA title holder. I fully recognized Pete Weber's contribution to the sport of bowling. His skill can't be questioned by anyone who has watched him perform or taken

continued from page 1 ing a season-long points race. Here's how the new Regional Players Invitational program will work:

regions, PBA members who reside within the region and finish 1-15 in the seasonal competition points standings will receive an invitation and free entry into the end-of-season RPI for their home region. Players who finish 16-32 on the points list are invited, but must pay a \$220 entry fee.

• The next 16 spots will go to players on the points list who have participated in a minimum of 50 percent of the region's tournaments during the year. If any spots remain open, invitations will be extended based upon players' rankings on their home region's points list.

• PBA members living outside of the United States will be eligible based upon their participation in events within any given region. The "home region" residency rule will be waived for international players. If international non-residents bowl in more than one region, they will be required to designate the RPI they wish to enter by July 15, 2013.

• Special rules will apply to the joint West-Northwest RPI. West Region points leaders 1-10 and Northwest Region points leaders 1-5 will earn the free entries. West Region leaders 11-23 and Northwest Region points leaders 6-9 will be eligible for the \$220 entry positions. The balance of the field will be offered to the next 12 West Region and next four Northwest Region players who meet the 50 percent participation rule.

• The new RPI program will be open to all PBA members: touring players, senior/ PBA50 members, regional members, PBA24 members and PBA International members. Players will only be eligible to participate in one RPI. RPI points qualifying will begin on Sept. 1, 2012, and end on July 15, 2013. The RPIs will be held between August and October 2013 Dates and locations will be announced later

• Each RPI will consist of a Friday pro-am and two sixgame qualifying rounds on Saturday. The top 16 qualifiers will advance to three rounds of best-of-five-game elimination matches and two rounds of one-game eliminations on

Sunday. Saturday's top four qualifiers will earn two bye rounds and qualifiers five through eight will earn one bye round.

# The Perfect Game by Steve Felege intro by Carol Mancini

**Carol:** I would like to begin this column with a warning to our readers. Last week, we began a discussion of bowling skills. We kept talking about them after that article was completed and I learned something. While Steve may be one of the biggest goofballs I've ever met, he has some interesting ideas about bowling theory. I want to dedicate this column to letting Steve tell you what he explained to me last week. Take it away, coach.

Steve: What's the warning?

Carol: Oh yeah. What Steve is about to tell you is pretty boring and may cause drowsiness. Do not operate machinery while reading this article!

Steve: Very funny! **Carol:** Hey, you're not the only goofball around here! Now, last week you defined good bowling skills as techniques which put the ball on a target-line and keep it there. Right? *Steve: Yup. It's really just that simple.* 

**Carol:** I agree, bowling is simple, but people struggle with it. Your book explains this game more clearly and simply than any instructional manual I've ever seen. That's why I asked for your help with this column. Would you mind sharing your ideas with our readers? I'd like them to know just how simple you really are!

Steve: Gladly! I've always been a firm believer in the KISS principle.

Steve: Glady! I've always been a jum benever in the BISS principul. Carol: That's not what I meant, but go ahead. Steve: Okay. As I explained to Carol, learning to bowl is a bit like learning to play a musical instrument. If you pick up a guitar for the first time and try to play a song, you won't have much luck. You must first learn the basics. Soon, simple notes and chords become music. A bowling delivery isn't as complicated as music, but you must still learn the basics first. Once you do, the music you make will sound like thunder! I think of it like this:

BASIC SKILLS PRODUCE ACCURACY; ADVANCED SKILLS ELEVATE SCORING POTENTIAL The basic skills for bowling are the stance, push-away, arm-swing, and release. These are the foundation for your game.

- The stance aims your shot at a target.
- The push-away gets the ball moving directly toward that target.
- The arm swing develops ball speed along the target-line.
  The release then sends the ball toward the target.

Advanced bowling skills include power, lift, ball control, spare making, footwork, reading and adjusting to oil patterns, etc. Think of these as the building blocks for your game because they provide greater pin-fall, but understand that you can't develop reliable advanced skills without a solid foundation of basic skills. In other words, nothing matters without accuracy. Carol: ZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZZ.

Steve: Carol? Yo, Carol! Hey, Dean! I just put the boss to sleep! What should I do? Dean: Try renegotiating your contract!

Carol: Don't even think about it! (Yawn). I was just resting my eyes! Anyway, that was all pretty standard stuff, coach. Everyone teaches that.

Steve: True, but as we discussed last week, different coaches teach different techniques. Some are bad, some are better, but only one can be the very best. Agreed?

Carol: I guess so Steve: Another problem is that they generally teach the approach from start to finish. I believe a better way is to define the individual skills which comprise a delivery, teach them separately, then knit them into the bowler's natural footwork. This creates a system of fluid and repetitious movements which are key to an effective approach.

**Carol:** So, a bowler can improve by working on one skill at a time? *Steve: Absolutely! The beauty of improving just one skill is that the other skills improve also.* Carol: Explain.

Steve: With pleasure! An improved stance points the ball at its target. This simplifies the push away which produces a more consistent and accurate arm swing. That produces more confidence at the release.

Carol: Who taught you that?

Steve: Ben Hogan.

Carol: Ben Hogan was a great golfer, not a great bowler!

Steve: Ben Hogan was a great teacher. The swing of a golf club is a complicated ordeal to learn. Ben Hogan broke it down into five basic skills, all of which were easy to master. When I read that, It completely changed how I thought about coaching. Carol: How so?

Steve: That's when I realized that bowling should be taught the same way. This style of instruction also cured another problem you brought up last week.

Carol: You'll have to refresh my memory. Steve: You called it, "empty Information."

Carol: Like..... Steve: Like telling bowlers to "focus", but not telling them what to focus on. The Hogan-style approach to coaching solved that. By describing the approach as one skill after another, it became a simple matter to teach bowler's what to focus on.

Carol: I'm listening.

Steve: The entire delivery takes a mere 2-3 seconds. That's not much time, so the mental part of the game must be kept simple. Here's what I have found works best. Step up onto the approach and get your ball. Place your feet at your normal starting spot. Look up and face your target. There! You're aimed without any need to focus at all.

Carol: Then what? Steve: FOCUS on getting into an effective stance. Since the stance aims the ball, take your time. Once in your stance, move on. SHIFT YOUR FOCUS to performing a perfect push-away at a precise moment in your footwork. The very end of the push-away is the "drop" point. At this point, FOCUS on allowing the ball to simply drop. Now, FOCUS on wrist position while keeping your arm swinging backward along the target-line. Once the backswing stops, FOCUS on noth*ing but the release point.* Carol: Sounds complicated.

Steve: Focusing on the stance is easy, and so is the push-away. After just a bit of practice, many bowlers simplify the arm-swing and release to focusing on just three points; the drop point, backswing stop point, and the release point. In other words, "DROP, STOP, AND ROLL." I can't make the mental game any simpler than that!

**Carol:** Amen! But getting back to the skills, you're still giving our readers empty info. You keep
