2006 Tournament of Champions Pays Record Amount at AMF Cerritos Lanes

CERRITOS—While junior bowlers and parents at AMF Cerritos Lanes have seen many awesome achievements, nothing was as surprising as the record payout amount of \$12,000 in the 2006 Tournament of Champions (TOC)., the seventh consecutive year this tournament has been held. The TOC represents the end of the 2005/2006 season and this year was one to remember. Fifty five bowlers took to the lanes on Sunday August 26, at 12 noon, with the intent of winning in this prestigious tournament. While every bowler was guaranteed a minimum of \$25.00 in scholarship winnings, the goal of each entrant was to bowl well enough in qualify for the roll-off, and a shot at one of the top prizes, including \$1,300 for first the first place winners in certain divisions.

High scores was the norm this afternoon as evidenced by the numbers that were being posted. In the Lil Raider division, Jason Villa was the only bowler to break the coveted century mark with a well shot 106 game to start his afternoon off. Jason used this score as a springboard as he finished first after three games and won \$200.

In the "A" division, the pool of bowlers was a mixture of striking force bowlers and seniors, which provided for an interesting mix of talent, the future bowling with the present. The scores did not disappoint either of these groups. In this pool of 23 bowlers, over 18 games of 200 or better were posted led by Jaime Ferry and a well shot 277 game. After all the smoke had cleared through four games of qualifying, the top five bowlers took to the lanes where the games were just beginning. In the first match, fifth place qualifier Jennifer Hefner squared off against four seed Glenn Gimeno. Jennifer got hot early, and this veteran bowler won easily 272 to 194 (handicap included). Next up was third seed and Striking Force bowler Steven Bojorquez. This match was close throughout, however in the end, Jennifer had enough to edge Steven 219 to 206. Second seed JJ Robeniol was next. JJ got off to a quick start while Jennifer struggled early as JJ won 220 to 187. Top seed Jaime Ferry was next. In this match, the lanes seemed to break down as both bowlers struggled. JJ did what he could to mark and this proved to be the difference as he won 206 to 165. Congratulations to champion JJ Robeniol for a job well done.

In the "B" division it is very obvious that in this group of bowlers, talent will continue to rise and shine at AMF Cerritos Lanes as these youngsters are truly a great reflection of what is in store for the future. One of the highlights of this division is a 213 scratch game that was posted by Kevin Chen, which propelled him to the top seed as the roll-off was set to begin. In the first match, fifth seed Eric Hefner faced

fourth seed Kevin Johnston. This match was not for the faint of heart as Eric and Kevin went back and forth for ten frames. In the end Kevin barely edged Eric 209 to 204. Next up for Kevin was Karen Dimayuga. This was another nail biter match, as Kevin won another close one 207 to 201. At this point in the roll-off, parents Matt and Cindy Johnston were more nervous than son Kevin. Kevin showed just how relaxed he was as he faced second seed Kevin Robeniol. In this match Kevin Johnston heated up and won easily 265 to 205, sending him to the championship match where top seen Kevin Chen awaited. Kevin Johnston was a little tired but he refused to give up. This match was close but in the last few frames, Kevin Chen pulled away to win 229 to 216. Congratulations to Kevin Chen, first place finisher in his division.

In the scratch division, this is where the best of the best hangs

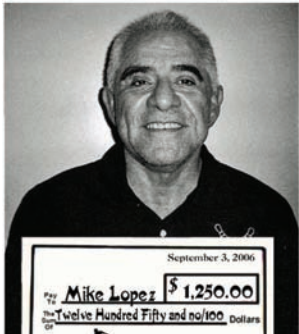

TENPIN SLANTS

It's hard to believe but more than three years have gone by since the Professional Women's Bowling Assn. Tour went broke. And what's being done to revive the Tour? Nothing.

Well, that's not exactly true, as the United States Bowling Congress seems to be the only organization making any attempt to keep women's bowling in the national spotlight.

Last May the USBC staged the innovative "Bowling With the Stars," featuring PWBA champions Carolyn Dorin-Ballard and Kim Terrell and amateur star Diandra Asbaty. The USBC still has hopes of selling a TV pilot of the event to a national network.

The USBC, with the cooperation of Gary Beck's Killer "B" Promotions, produced and taped "The USBC Women's Challenge" on Aug. 29-31 in Las Vegas. Sixteen of the nation's best bowlers competed for a first-place prize of \$25,000 on a specially constructed lane on the runway of the Fashion Show Mall.

According to Jim Dressel, managing editor of the Bowlers Journal International magazine, the event was "the talk of the town." Dressel, rather indiscreetly, announced that the winner was Cara Honeychurch, thus spoiling the enjoyment for anyone watching the tapes, which were to be shown on five consecutive Monday nights beginning Sept. 11 on ESPN2.

Dressel always did like being a killjoy...but that's a story for another day.

What befuddles me is why aren't other integers of this great sport of bowling doing anything to revive the women's pro tour?

There are several reasons why, of course, the main one being it would take several millions of dollars, not to mention the personnel and organization to run such an enormous project.

Many years ago Hall of Fame writers Chuck Pezzano, Dick Evans and John Jowdy each came up with plans to not only finance a women's pro tour, but also to aid the men's tour and youth/collegiate bowling as well. Unfortunately, these plans fell on deaf ears.

Perhaps there's another way. Remember when, about 30 years ago, the five integers of bowling—the ABC, WIBC, BPAA, Brunswick and AMF—each contributed \$200,000 to create and support the National Bowling Council?

It proved to be money down the drain as the NBC was a dismal failure, which dragged on for several years.

This leads to another question: Why don't these five integers contribute enough funds to start a new women's pro tour?

Well, for one thing, there is no more ABC and WIBC, having been replaced by the USBC. But there's still the BPAA, Brunswick and AMF plus other organizations and manufacturers such as Columbia, Storm, Ebonite, Dexter, Etonic, The Kegel Company and others.

A new women's pro tour would certainly benefit everyone...and it also would provide a much-needed goal to inspire bowlers now competing in the burgeoning feminine collegiate program.

As for the personnel and organization to conduct a women's pro tour, the USBC already has an excellent nucleus in Tom Clark, Bill Vint, Jerry Schneider, Jan Schmidt, Mark Miller, Lucas Wiseman, et al.

And I betcha it wouldn't take much to talk USBC Hall of Famer Fran Deken to come out of retirement to assume her former role as the longtime PWBA tournament director.

As they say at Nike, "Just do it!"

In my last column I recounted how Jack Cook, the Director of Bowling at the old Showboat Lanes, went on to become the Vice President of Marketing for NABI (National Amateur Bowlers Inc.)

I had intimated that Cook left the Showboat because it had been sold, became The Castaways, then went belly-up.

Joan McRae, the original Valley Girl—she lives in Northridge—says it didn't quite happen that way. Evidently, she thought I had slanted the news.

McRae, as President of the Western Women Professional Bowlers, e-mailed me that she had helped to stage several WWPB tournaments at the 'Boat. So she has a pretty good handle on what transpired at the famed 106-lane center.

According to McRae, Jack Cook left Showboat during the reign of owner Joe Kelley, or long before the property was sold. "Actually, Jack left to sign up (as executive director) at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno," she said.

"Fran Deken soon followed and then Betty Morris, both of whom worked for Jack at the Showboat," McRae added. "After Jack left, the WWPB floored one or two events there under a new bowling manager."

McRae didn't recall the name of the Showboat's new bowling manager, but it was Bea Goodwin, who was Cook's assistant and replaced him when he went to Reno. Goodwin, incidentally, is now the Vice President of Sales & Marketing for the International Sales Group/ Allure Las Vegas, which is building luxury condominiums in the gambling mecca.

My thanks to Joan McRae for setting me straight.

Speaking of the Showboat, as we were, here's a trivia question about the once-heralded establishment:

Who was the bowler that won the final PBA tournament at the Showboat?

Answer: Lonnie Walicek, on Jan. 23, 2003. (The Showboat hosted PBA tournaments for 34 years, longer than any other tour sponsor.)

FINAL ITEM: Many bowling fans were under the impression that the Showboat, with its 106 lanes, was the largest center in the world. Not so. At one time Tokyo World Bowling Lanes had 512 lanes, but is now down to a mere 28. And Nagoya Grand Bowl, also in Tokyo, had 168 lanes, constructed on three floors with 56 lanes each.

Between 1960 and 1972, more than 120,000 bowling lanes were installed in Japan. Unfortunately, the bowling boom didn't last very long and most of the lanes and equipment were shipped back to the United States, where proprietors had a field day, literally buying the returned goods for pennies on the dollar.

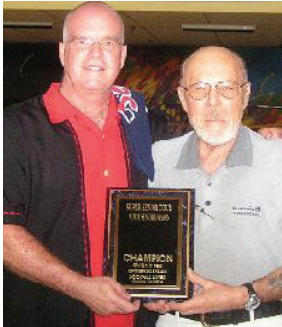

Better Bowlers Tournament Analysis

In 3 Better Bowlers Tournaments we have had a total of 56 bowlers that have tried our events. The first event we had 28 bowlers, 8 left-handers and 20 right-handers. In the second event we had 26 paid entries, plus 3 Charter Members that won free entries from the previous tournament . Of the 29 bowlers, 7 were left-handed and 22 were right-handed. In Better Bowlers Tournament No. 3 we had 26 bowlers, with 9 being left-handed and 17 being right-handed.

In 3 finals, right-handers have averaged 199.14 while left-handers have averaged 221.82. The high game by a right-hander in the finals has been 213. The high game by a left-hander in the finals has been 265. Thus we have 3 left-handed champions, so far. Overall we have had 7 left-handers cash in these events and 12 right-handers have also cashed. There are at least 3 bowlers that have cashed in 2 out of the 3 tournaments. One left-hander and two right-handers have cashed twice.

In each of the first 3 tournaments we have had less than 32 bowlers, so only 4 bowlers made it to the finals. Now that the 2006-2007 season is starting and bowlers are back from their vacations, maybe we can have the necessary 32 bowlers so we can have 8 bowlers in the finals. In an 8 bowler finals, the 5th highest qualifier would bowl the 8th highest qualifier and the 6th highest qualifier would bowl the 7th highest qualifier. In the next round, the 3rd and 4th highest qualifiers would bowl the round 1 winners, then the 1st and 2nd qualifiers would bowl the winners of round 2. With just two bowlers left in round 4, the winner would receive a minimum of \$1000 and the 2nd Place bowler would receive a minimum of \$500. This format gives a bowler who qualifies in 8th place a chance to still win the tournament but also prevents the high qualifier from finishing less than a tie for 3rd and 4th places.

Better Bowlers Tournaments are the best way for up and coming bowlers to test their skills prior to bowling in PBA events and to shoot for decent prize money. These tournaments are also good for senior bowlers to sharpen their skills before bowling in major senior events. There are a few restrictions for PBA members. No National PBA Champion is allowed to bowl in our events and any PBA regional champion will enter our tournaments at a 230 average. Any PBA non-champion must enter our tournaments at a 225 average.

So far, the highest qualifiers have all finished in 2nd place. Below is a listing of the leading money winners after 3 events:

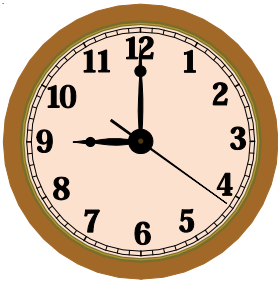
